The Knife-Bar is made with a Malleable Cast Head, which is rivetted on to the Bar, and which can easily be replaced should the Eye become worn. The Knife-Bar is kept in its place by the Shoe projecting over the top, and the Connecting-Rod is pushed in from the side and held by a plate. When travelling, the Finger-Bar can be folded over the front of the Machine without taking out the Knife, and by simply pushing the Pawl-Springs off the Ratchet Wheels, all the gearing is stopped, nothing being in motion but the two large Driving Wheels. All the bearings are filled in with Patent Metal.

The “STOVER” WINDMILL is used principally to pump water for railroads, private residences, farms, hotels, breweries, etc., in places which do not enjoy the advantages of a continuous water supply, and it is also largely made use of for irrigation purposes.

The turn-table of this Mill is of chilled iron, on this rest chilled balls, the main casting of the Mill resting on the balls. These balls are entirely covered from rain and storm. The connection is made with ball and socket joint, which makes a swivel, ENABLING THE MILL TO CHANGE AS THE WIND CHANGES, at the same time making a strong joint to draw on. The wheel is a solid rosette, the vane or rudder being hinged. Its motion or speed is governed by a graduating weight, which works exactly like the governors of a steam engine, an increased pressure of the wind folding the wheel in line with the vane, which raises the governor, and as the wind diminishes, the weight of the governor brings the wheel back into the wind.

For HOTELS or PRIVATE RESIDENCES this Mill possesses the great advantage of RUNNING WITHOUT NOISE, while the comparatively insignificant cost of keeping it in working order renders it a valuable substitute for the expensive system of pumping by hand labour.



BOCCACCIO is admitted now by all critical horsemen to be the purest-gaited, best-topped, and best-shaped trotting stallion yet imported, and it is questionable whether, if trained, he would not also prove the fastest. As it is, his record, as above noted, gives no idea of his real speed. The record was gained on 15th April, and he only left off stud duties on 15th February. During his two months' training he showed quarter miles in 36sec. and half miles in 1m. 16sec., equal to a 2m. 32sec. gait.

Boccaccio is 16<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hands high, his colour is very dark, a blood-bay, with black points. He has a magnificent mane and tail. His carriage is superb, his temper docility itself, and his action the perfection of trotting.

Boccaccio's breeding is of the highest order, combining the cross of Mambrino on Hambletonian, with a dash of thoroughbred, which gives him his wonderful staying power. His peculiar excellence as a sire is the uniformity with which he stamps his image, and impresses his own remarkable qualities on his offspring. All his foals, out of all classes of mares, are born with a disposition to trot—in fact are natural born trotters. There is no gainsaying this assertion. His foals can now be seen, and their action, speed, shape and size noted by intending breeders. One of his colts, now 20 months old, is under engagement to trot a mile in three minutes before he is two years old, and he will surely do it.

This colt, when fifteen months old, was 14½ hands high, and promises to rival Boccaccio in colour, shape, and size, as well as action.

Boccaccio has never been beaten at shows either in this colony or America.

### TROTTING AND TROTTERS.

(From the *Sydney Daily Telegraph*, 22nd November, 1880.)

Evidently a new and brighter era is about to dawn on the sport of trotting and trotting races in other colonies, if not in this. We are forced to this conclusion after inspecting, at Fennelly's Bazaar (where he has been located since his arrival in Australia), the magnificent trotting stallion, Boccaccio. This horse has been imported purely for stud purposes, by our late fellow-townsmen, Mr. James A. Roberts, who purposes taking him on to Melbourne overland by to-night's train. Mr. Roberts has a small stud farm there, and intends devoting his spare time to the improvement in the breeding of trotting horses. Boccaccio was selected in San Francisco by Mr. H. P. Gregory, is 16½ hands high, a dark bay with black points, and possesses one of the kindest tempers imaginable; no boy's pony could be wished more amiable. His action in trotting is described as being perfection; his speed undoubted. He combines all the best trotting blood in America. He is by Woodford out of Rising Star, Rising Star by Logan's Gaze, Woodford by Woodford, Mambrino out of Mahala, Logan's Gaze by Hambletonian (Kysdyk's) out of Lady Wallace, &c., &c. Boccaccio is related to Abbotsoford, whose turf record of last year was 2-21½. Boccaccio has never been beaten at the fairs or agricultural shows in America, taking first honours, as a matter of course. This year he took the gold medal at Golden Gate Show; also first premium at the State Fair, Sacramento. Perhaps the best testimony to the super-excellence of this horse is an unsolicited letter, addressed to Mr. Gregory by Rollin P. Saxe, the well-known dealer in thoroughbred stock, California. He says:—"Knowing his blood and his owner, and his Kentucky reputation, I brag on him. I don't know what he was sold for. His value is 5000 to 10,000 dols. (£2000) if only for a stud horse, to put his blood into future generations. I wish him every success in his new home, and hope he has fallen into good hands. He is a worthy son of a noble sire, and in American trotting blood second to none." Boccaccio will be on view at Fennelly's Bazaar until 6 o'clock this evening, and those interested in good horses should avail themselves of this opportunity of inspecting the grandest trotting horse yet imported.

Before the agent closed for the purchase of Boccaccio he insisted upon testing his gait; and then on trial, while long out of training, and actually unfit, he showed a gait of 2m. 28sec. per mile.

(From the *Spirit of the Times*, San Francisco.)

We consider the choice of Boccaccio very good. He has size, breeding, style, and with a fair share of speed. His action will suit those who have the prevailing English notion of what a trotter should be, as his gait is lofty, and the knee rather more bent when at speed than is usual. While this may be inimical in sustaining a very high rate of speed, to cross on the highly-bred mares of that country it will be just the thing. The thoroughbred has usually a gliding manner of progression, the machinery moving with the least possible friction. There may be a vast amount of energy in the gallop, while the trot is marked by pointing and dwelling as the foot touches the ground. Practice will, in a measure, overcome this defect, though the selection of a sire of the contrary kind will remedy it in the progeny. The Australian movement will be watched with great interest on this shore of the Pacific, and success hailed with pleasure.

"Hinda Rose" is the granddaughter of "Minne-ha-ha," with the still more wonderful performance of 2-26½ as a yearling.

NOTE.—"Annie Laurie," as a three-year-old, later on, obtained a record of 2m. 30sec.

As a three-year-old he obtained a record of 2m. 45sec., and has beaten such horses (for second places) as "Alexander Button" (record of 2m. 26½sec.), "Honesty" (record of 2m. 25½secs.); in races for three-year-old trotted in 2m. 32½sec.

In the *Californian Spirit of the Times*, 7th January, 1882, speaking of "A. W. Richmond"—"A. W. Richmond" is the sire of 'Romero,' who has the fastest record (2m. 22½sec.) for a four-year-old stallion; also of 'San Diego,' who has shown very fast trials, and was driven to the pole, with trotting mate, by C. S. Crittenden, to a top road waggon weighing 350 lbs., on the Bay District Course, in 2m. 34sec. Mr. Crittenden weighs nearly 200 lbs., and the horse was not in training at the time. He ("A. W. Any horseman can see Arabian in his large, prominent eyes, crest, mane, and long, handsome neck, and fine-pointed ears, and thoroughbred in his dead game qualities." The year I bought 'Richmond' I bred him to five mares only. The produce was 'Washington,' 'Chanate,' 'Ela,' 'Len Rose,' and 'Romero.' 'Len Rose' beat all previous performances in California as a two-year-old, and you gave an account of his races, and as a three-year-old was always in the race with 'Belle Echo' and 'Alex. Button.' No gamer colt ever lived than he. I challenge any stallion that ever lived to show two such colts as 'Len Rose' and 'Romero,' and I challenge any stallion, except 'Echo' ('Belle Echo' and 'Annie Laurie'), to show two colts, foaled same year, out of any number of mares up to fifty." ("Belle Echo," as four-year-old, obtained a record of 2m. 23½sec., and "Annie Laurie," as three-year-old, 2m. 30sec.)

"Len Rose" has come direct from the world-renowned Palo Alto Stud, being displaced therefrom by the champion stallion of America, the celebrated "Piedmont" (2m. 17sec.), lately purchased by Governor Stanford, and for whom he gave 35,000 dol.—equal to £7000.

"Len Rose" has joined "Boccaccio" in stud duties at Fairlawn Stud Farm, Ringwood.

Clay out of daughter of Abdallah; C. M. Clay by Henry Clay out of Jersey Kate; Almont by Abdallah out of Sally Anderson; Dolly Spanker by Hunt's Commodore out of daughter of Brown Highlander.

Bald Chief sired Minne-ha-ha the dam of Sweetheart (2-year old record, 2.26½; 3-year old record, 2.22½); Beautiful Bells, 2.26½; Eva (2-year old record, 2.26½); and Hinda Rose, the granddaughter of Minne-ha-ha, who has the wonderful record of 2.36 as a yearling.

Bald Chief also sired Tom Brown (record, 2.27½) and many others, including Barbara, who is the dam of my stallion "Len Rose," and has himself a record of 2.32.

PIONEER is, in all probability, the highest and purest type of what may be termed the Thoroughbred Trotting Horse that ever left America. He is almost full brother to that equine wonder, Durango (description of whom see below), being by the same sire, out of a mare by the same sire as Durango.

As it may interest intending breeders, I copy as to the merits of the Clay and Almont families of trotting horses. The following is from *Wallace's Monthly*, July, 1881:—

DURANGO, by Strader's C. M. Clay, Jr., dam Mattie West, by Almont. About as near an approach to the thoroughbred trotting horse as is possible is the subject of this sketch.

In his early colthood Durango showed his capacity for speed in a commendable way. As a two-year-old he trotted at the Illinois Central Fair, distancing Milburn King, Balsora Eoy, and other promising Kentucky youngsters in the first heat, being kept well within his limit. He never made another essay as a public performer, but since, without a day's training, and after making a season of fifty-five mares, he showed a half-mile on a rough track at a 2.16 gait. This for a three-year-old is a remarkable performance.

The *New York Spirit of the Times*, 25th November, 1882, thus writes re Clay horses and their breeding:—

"No matter where you go or where Clay blood turns up, it is sure to trot fast, and that too without culture and hardly permission and if permitted, its blood and breeding is disputed.

"Now for Henry Clay. He was born of the highest and most royal types of equine blood, christened a legitimate name, and was begot by the fastest known trotting stallion in the world, whose sire, Young Bashaw, was both a trotter and a runner, and whose sire, Grand Bashaw, possessed the most royally pure blood of all horses known to man upon the earth."

So highly is the influence of the blood of Henry Clay recognised in America as being the great factor in producing the perfect trotting horse, that, after death, his skeleton was set up in the Smithsonian Institute at Washington, and on the pedestal under the horse was fastened a neat tablet, reading:—

OLD HENRY CLAY,

The progenitor of the entire family of Clay horses  
and foundation, blood, and instinct of the  
American road or trotting horse.

Respecting the sire of Pioneer's dam, I extract the following from Gen. Withers' Catalogue for 1883:—

ALMONT—The Great Sire of Trotters, not only sires fast trotters himself, but transmits with great uniformity to his sons the ability to sire fast and game trotters. This demonstrates his wonderful prepotency as a trotting sire. The chief glory of a sire is that his descendants shall be an improvement on himself. Twenty of the sons and daughters of Almont now have records of 2.30 or better, and three of them have records below 2.20. This is about double as many as any trotting stallion now living, or that ever lived, had at same age.

The peculiar excellence of Almont as a sire is the uniformity with which he stamps his image and impresses his own remarkable qualities on his offspring. All of his foals, out of all classes of mares, are born with a disposition to trot. As a uniform sire of fast trotters he stands without an equal. This might be expected from the great amount of speed-producing blood that is concentrated in his veins. He comes by his great prepotency honestly—by right of inheritance.

In gait Almont is a square, steady, slashing, enormously-gaited trotter, with a full, rolling knee-action and a wonderfully powerful hock-action. His legs and feet are so well placed under him, and so perfectly adjusted in their relations to one another that when he is under full headway there is no striking the fore feet with the hind ones, no cuffing of ankles, no hitting of joints. In a word, Almont is in confirmation a perfect trotter, and therefore, shin-boots, quarter-boots and all other artificial appliances are utterly superfluous in his case.

Such is the sire of Pioneer, and such is the sire of his dam. The latter, besides being on her own merits a first-class performer, is now celebrated for having produced so wonderful a son as Bald Chief—the sire of Minne-ha-ha, &c., as noted above.

With such royal breeding—as can be claimed by Pioneer—I hope not only to prove that he is a trotter of the highest order of merit, but that he will command the favour of the owners of first-class mares who may require the services of a trotting sire.






