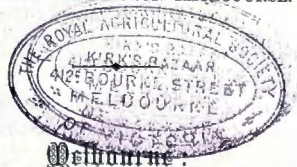

Calved 24th February, 1881; bred by Henry D. Adamson, Balquharn, Alford. Knight of the Shire won the First Prize at the Highland Society's Show at Kelso in 1880, and the First Prize same year at Royal English Society's show at Carlisle. As a two-year-old he gained in 1881 the First Prize at the Royal Northern Show at Aberdeen and the McCombie Challenge Cup as the best animal of the breed. He also gained the First Prize at the Highland Society's Show at Stirling in 1881. Knight of the Shire has an unsurpassed pedigree, coming through the celebrated Pride family, and including the famous cows Queen of Ardovie and Queen Mother, Lola Montes, and Charlotte and the bulls Panmure and Captain. His stock have been realising the highest prices ever paid for Polled Angus cattle, his year-old heifer out of Pride of Aberdeen 9th having fetched 510 guineas; and his eleven-week-old heifer, by the same cow, having brought 250 guineas at Mr. Auld's clearing sale, at Alford, on 13th September, 1883.

Cupbearer, half-brother to Hanton (228.) gained the First Prize in 1851 as a one-year-old at the Eastern Forfarshire Society; the First Prize in 1852 at the Highland Society's Show at Perth as a two-year-old; the First Prize in 1853 as a three-year-old at the Royal Northern Agricultural Society; the First Prize in same

year as the best bull in Angus, Mearns, Aberdeen, and Banff; the First Prize at the Highland Society's Show at Berwick in 1854; the First Prize in 1856 at the Angus Society's Show in Dundee; and was also awarded a prize at the *Concours Agricole* at Paris in the same year.

Old Jock was descended by dam and sire from the old stock of Keillor Doddies, a herd which obtained celebrity so far back as 1800. Old Jock gained the Highland Society's First Prize in 1844, and was sold for one hundred guineas.

Ermin, which was sold to Mr. Wallis, Bradley Hall, Ryton-on-Tyne, for 150 guineas, is of the Ballindalloch Ericas, one of the most famous families of the breed, and tracing direct to Keillor.

At the International Competition at Paris, in 1878, a group of Polled Cattle shown by Mr. McCombie, all, with one exception, under 25 months old, won the prize of honour given by the French Government for "the best animals for breeding purposes" in all the foreign (except French) breeds; and another and greater honour, namely, the prize given by the Society of French Agriculturists for the best group of animals in the entire Exhibition, foreign and French sections, "for beef-producing purposes." This "judgment of Paris," therefore placed the able and hornless beauties of Aberdeen and Angus at the head of the beef-producing breeds of the world.

Nor have the Aberdeen and Angus breed forfeited their pre-eminent position. At the Smithfield show, 1881, a heifer of this breed, bred by Sir William Gordon, Bart, of Altyre, Morayshire, and got by the Polled Bull Black Watch (1242,) bred by Lord Macduff at Duff House, Banffshire, won the champion plate of 100 guineas and the Club's gold medal as the "best beast of the show."

At public sales, high prices have been paid. The bull Young Viscount (736) was sold at Mr. Hannay's sale, 26th September, 1878, at 225 guineas. At the Tillyfour dispersion sale, 26th August, 1880, the cow Pride of Aberdeen 9th (3253,) was bought by Mr. Auld, Bridgend, Alford, for 270 guineas.

A sum of 300 guineas was offered for sire of Waterside Eric, Knight of the Shire (1699,) on account of Mr. R. M. Robertson, and refused.
