# GRAND CHAMPION PRIZES OF AUSTRALIA.

- 1. All exhibits to be the boná fide property of Exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.
- 2. Unless three entries at least have been made, and unless there are not less than two exhibits, Prizes shall not be awarded if the Judges do not report the exhibits to be of exceptional merit, and worthy of the prizes.
  - 3. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.
- 4. In any case where, in the opinion of the Secretary for Agriculture, any mis-statement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be paid.
- 5. Excepting in classes 314 to 324 inclusive (Farm Produce) separate entries are not required for the Grand Champion Prizes, but in those Classes entries must be made as for Society's Prizes, and in accordance with General Regulations, Clauses 3 and 4.
  - 6. All Exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 1. All Exhibits must be bond fide the property of the Exhibitor, and produce must be grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.
- No Exhibit will be allowed to compete in more than one Class, except for a sweepstake, or for a Special, or a Grand Champion Prize.
- 3. General entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and must be in the hands of the Secretary, at the Office, Kirk's Bazaar, Bourke Street West, Melbourne, on or before Monday, the 5th day of August, 1889, at 5 o'clock p.m. On payment of a double entry fee post entries will be received till 5 p.m. on Thursday, 5th August, when all entries close. Entry fees, in accordance with next regulation, to accompany each entry. After the entries close an Entry Ticket will be issued, stating the number of each Exhibit's box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which will correspond with the number of the Exhibit in the Official Catalogue. This Ticket will admit the Exhibit and attendant to the yards. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Secretary on the grounds.
- 4. Members will be charged a fee of five shillings on each entry (except for dogs and poultry), and Non-members ten per cent. on the money value of the first

prize in each Class in which they enter, provided always that no entry fee in any Class (except in those for dogs other than those in Class 248, and poultry, in which the entry fee is two shillings and sixpence) shall be less than five shillings, which amount covers entries in Classes in which medals are offered as first prizes. Entry fees to accompany entries. N.B.—Special Entry Fee in Classes 31, 32, and 248.

- 5. Separate entries must be made for Special Prizes, also for Grand Champion Prizes in Classes 314 to 324 inclusive (Farm Produce) as stated in Special Regulations, clause 5.
- 6. The correct age of Exhibits of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the Exhibit.
- 7. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for horses, and 1st of July in each year for cattle. Colonial bred, shall mean bred in any of the Australasian Colonies.
- 8. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense, and the disarrangement of the show yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and of 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class for which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at the future meetings of the Society.
- 9. Persons or firms intending to exhibit single Exhibits or Stands for exhibition only must apply early for space. A charge will be made in proportion to frontage and position allotted. Entries of this description of Exhibits must be made on the Society's forms, and properly described for insertion in the Catalogue.
- 10. All Exhibits of Machinery and Implements must be in their places in the Yards on Tuesday night, the 27th August. All other Exhibits, except hunters, jumpers, carriage pairs, and wines (see foot of this regulation) and those in Class 110 (which must be in the Yards on Monday evening) must be in their places in the Yards by 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 28th August, when the Judges will commence adjudication. Hunters, jumpers, and carriage pairs will only be required to be in the Yards on the day on which they perform. Boxes will not be allotted to horses in these Classes. Wines must be lodged in the wine-room on or before Wednesday, 14th August.
- 11. Exhibits will not be received in the Yards after the date and hour specified. No Exhibit which has not been duly entered will be admitted to the Yards.
- 12. All Exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition.
- 13. The Owner or Exhibitor of any Exhibit disapproved of as an Exhibit by the Council of the Society, must immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such Exhibit from the Society's grounds.
- 14. As many men will be allowed into the Yards free as the Council may deem necessary to take charge of Exhibits after the entries are made, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.
- 15. When ordered by the Stewards, attendants on horses and cattle must take the Exhibits out on parade. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of 5s. in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed.
- 16. No Exhibitor (except in the case of an owner riding or driving his Exhibit) will be allowed in that Section of the Yard in which his Exhibit is placed

during the adjudication of the Judges, and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the Yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the Judges, unless authorised by the Stewards of the Exhibition.

- 17. The Judges may award a Second or a Third Prize instead of a First one; or may withhold a Prize altogether, where the Exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Any Exhibit (not classified) likely to benefit the colony, which may be brought forward, may be recommended a Prize or certificate of merit as an Extra, if considered meritorious.
- 18. The Judges are requested to make a reserve number of the Exhibit next in merit beyond those to which Prizes are awarded, in every Class where the number of entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in their opinion, the Exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; they are also requested to give commendations when deserved.
- 19. No Prize can be recommended by the Judges for extra Exhibits if the Prize List contains a Class or Section in which the same can compete.
- 20. The Council may withhold any Prize when statements have been erroneously or fradulently made regarding an Exhibit; and Exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if members, will be liable to expulsion from the Society.
- 21. Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges during the Show will be subject to removal from the Yards, and the Prizes, if any, awarded to them, forfeited.
- 22. Any Exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any Exhibit to which a Prize is awarded, and to keep the same on during the hours of Exhibition, will, on proof thereof to the Council, be disqualified from receiving all Prizes awarded to the said Exhibit during the Show.
- 23. Should any Exhibit having gained a Prize be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same Prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judges, shall decide the question.
- 24. All persons Exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society, and in the case of protests the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.
- 25. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society, if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.
- 26. No Exhibit (except Live Stock) can be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, when all Exhibits, except Machinery and Implements, can leave the Yards. Machinery and Implements must remain on the Grounds till Tuesday, 3rd September.
- 27. Live Stock may be removed from the Yards each day of the Exhibition after 5 p.m., on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for Dogs, £2; see Special Regulations under Section 28, Clause 3), as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the Yards next morning before 9 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned, the cheque, together with all prize money (if any) it has won will be forfeited, but on the animal's return each day the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.
- 28. Water will be provided in the Yards for Live Stock and the working of Machinery.
- 29. Exhibitors of Stock will require to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the Yards at Melbourne prices); and Exhibitors of Machinery, fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coals being allowed) and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the Regulations.

- 30. No person will be permitted to make drawings or photographs of any Exhibit without the written consent of the Exhibitor.
- 31. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements, or other documents is restricted exclusively to Exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this Regulation will incur expulsion from the Yards.
- 32. Every possible care will be taken of Exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
- 33. All Exhibits of Live Stock must be removed from the Show Grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made for boxes.
- 34. The Exhibition will be opened to the public on Wednesday at 10 a.m., during the adjudication of the Judges, admission 5s.; on Thursday from 9 a.m., admission 2s. 6d.; on Friday from 9 a.m., admission 2s. and on Saturday from 9 a.m., admission 1s. Admission to Grand Stand on Wednesday, 2s. 6d.; on Thursday and Friday, 5s.; and on Saturday, 2s. 6d. On Monday and Tuesday (sale days), when machinery, implements, etc., will remain on exhibition, admission to the Grounds, 1s. each day.
- 35. Members, on presentation of their cards, will be admitted, with two-ladies, free to the Exhibition.
- 36. Cheques for Prizes awarded at this Show will be passed for payment on Tuesday, 10th September, 1889, after which date they will be payable on application to the Secretary.
- 37. Any Prize or Prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

#### SALES.

SALES OF EXHIBITS (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) WILL BE HELD ON THE SHOW GROUNDS ON MONDAY AND TUESDAY, 2ND AND 3RD SEPTEMBER. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

Prize lists and entry forms and every information on application to the Secretary, Kirk's Bazaar, Melbourne; or Secretary of any Agricultural Society in Victoria.

Member's Tickets, £1 each, may be had on application to the Secretary, or to-Mr. Hedrick, Collector.

Intending competitors are particularly requested to observe the date fixed for the reception of Entries at the Office, as the rule will be STRICTLY ENFORCED.
