RULES.

As the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has resolved to hold their Shows under the rules of the English Kennel Club as adopted by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, and has recognised that Society as the local custodian of a Stud Register kept in accordance with the Kennel Club Rules, the following code is published for the guidance of the Society's Dog Shows.

1. Every dog exhibited at the show must, at or before the time of entry for such show, be entered in a registry of names kept by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society at their Offices, 195 Collins-street, Melbourne. A charge of one shilling each dog will be made for registration. A name that has been already assumed and duly registered in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*, or entered in any published number of the *Kennel Club Calendar or Stud Book*, by the owner of a dog of the same breed, cannot be registered except by a distinguishing name or number. If the name of a dog be changed, or an old name be re-assumed, such name shall be required to be registered previous to the time of entry.

NOTE.—Any dog not previously registered in accordance with Rule 1. may be registered at this Society's Office at the time of entry for Show on payment of the registration fee of one shilling.

2. Dogs that are already entered in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*, or in any published number of the *Kennel Club Calendar or Stud Book*, are exempt from the above rule, provided their names remain unchanged. Puppies exhibited in classes exclusively for litters of puppies are also exempt.

3. Any dog which is to be exhibited at a Show held under the rules must be the *bona-fide* property of the exhibitor in whose name he is entered, and must have been so fourteen clear days before the first day of the Show. Each dog must, on the entry form, be clearly identified by name, by date of birth, and by the name of his sire or dam, and of the breeder, each and every one of them, if known (as registered in accordance with Rule 1); and if the dam was covered by more than one dog, the names of all must be given. If the age, pedigree, or breeder's name be not known, the dog must be entered at each Show as breeder, age, or pedigree unknown, any or all, as the case may be.

4. The *bona-fide* owner of the dam at the time she whelps, shall be considered to be the breeder of the litter. In cases, however, where a bitch is lent for breeding purposes, the person to whom the bitch is lent shall be considered the breeder of the puppies born during the period of such loan, provided he or she, before the litter is born, send to the Secretary of this Society, or the Secretary of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, a statement of the facts, signed by himself or herself and the owner of the bitch.

5. If the name of the dog which has won a prize has been changed, it is necessary in entering the said dog to give his old name as well as his new name, every time he is exhibited until the change has been duly published in the *Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Stud Book*; and if his name be changed again, all his names must be repeated for a like period.

6. If a dog shall be entered except as before directed by Rules 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, he shall forfeit any prize that may have been awarded him; and if the omission be detected in time, he shall not be allowed to compete, and shall in either case forfeit all entrance fees and subscriptions.

7. The Council or authorities may reserve to themselves the right of refusing any entries they may think fit to exclude.

8. A castrated dog or spayed bitch shall be disqualified from competing or receiving a prize if awarded.

9. Total blindness shall absolutely disqualify; partial blindness shall have great weight against a dog. Should a dog appear to be deaf or lame, it shall be in the power of the Judge to disqualify, unless he is satisfied that such defects are temporary.

10. No dog shall be qualified to compete who shall be declared by the duly qualified and appointed Veterinary Inspector during the Show to exhibit any form of any contagious or infectious disease, neither shall such dog be entitled, if in that condition, to receive a prize if awarded, unless the Council shall consider that the owner of the dog was not to blame in the matter. The Veterinary Inspector shall give his decision in writing, duly signed, to the Secretary of

Committee of the Show before its close, and such opinion shall be final as regards the condition of the dog.

11. Any person who is proved to the satisfaction of the Council to have been guilty of fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with dogs, dog shows, or field trials, may, in addition to any pecuniary penalty to which he may be liable, be declared incapable of competing for or winning a prize at any show or field trials held under these Rules, for such period as the Council may decide upon.

12. An equal (champion) or first prize shall be counted as a win to both dogs. In estimating the number of prizes a dog has won, the number of prizes won shall be calculated up to 12 noon of the day previous to the original day of closing entries for the Show.

13. No dog shall be allowed to compete in a novice class that has won a first prize up to the time of judging such class, but in the event of a winner being barred, his entry money shall be returned.

14. The Committee of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society shall, from time to time, forward to the governing bodies of all Shows held under the Society's Rules a list of Shows selected by them as being worthy to rank as two-point Shows. A first prize at any one of such Shows shall, for all purposes of a champion class qualification, count two points. A first prize at any other Show held under the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society's Rules shall count one point. In calculating the points necessary to qualify for a champion class, a prize won in a novice class shall not count. No dog shall be qualified to compete in a champion class that has won less than six points at Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or at Shows registered in and for the *Kennel Club Calendar and Stud Book*; and no dog shall compete in an open class that is qualified to compete in a champion class at any Show where champion classes are provided for that breed. The prizes must be won in open classes, or in classes provided for colonial-bred dogs of any breed, or in varieties of the same breed, divided by weight, colour, sex or age, in adult classes; and one of the prizes must be won at a Show held by the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society, or at a two-point Show held under the Rules of the Kennel Club. This Society's Shows and the Shows of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society shall rank as two-point Shows. All other Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Dog Society shall rank as one-point Shows.

15. No dog shall be entitled to be called a champion that has not won a first prize in a champion class at a Show held under these Rules, or in a challenge class at a Show held under Kennel Club Rules. No dog entitled to be called a champion, shall be allowed to compete in an open class at any Show held under these Rules, whether a champion class be provided at the Show or not.

N.B. to Rules 14 and 15. These Rules shall come into operation upon July 1st, 1890, and any dog which shall have qualified previously to that date for competition in a champion class must compete in a champion class where such class is provided. Any dog entitled to be called a champion before that date shall not be deprived of his title. A first prize won at any Show under these Rules, previous to July 1st, 1890, by any dog not fully qualified to compete in a champion class under the Old Rules, will score one or two points as provided in the New Rules.

16. If any dog be disqualified by the Judge, or formally objected to during the Show, for being improperly tampered with, the Veterinary Inspector shall examine the dog, and give his opinion to the Secretary in writing before the close of the Show.

17. Any objection to a dog may be made by any person; it must be made to the Council or Secretary of the Society not later than the Friday preceding the close of the Show. The objection must be in writing, and the objector must (unless in cases where the objection is laid by the Council or by the regularly constituted Committee of a Show, in which cases a deposit shall not be necessary) at the same time lodge a sum of £1 in the hands of the Council or Secretary, which deposit shall, if the objection be proved frivolous, be forfeited.

18. In the foregoing Rules, the word "dog" shall be interpreted to include both sexes.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. All dogs must have chains and collars, without names, attached to enable them to be taken out if required.

2. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

3. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for exercise for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove the same from the Yards without a written order from the Secretary, and a deposit of £2. (See General Regulations, Clause 28.)

4. Dogs considered by the Stewards and Hon. Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

5. Dogs to be in their places in the Yards on Tuesday by ten o'clock.

NOTE.—The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to take charge of the Dogs.

(The Gift of the Parliament of Victoria through the Department of Agriculture.)

1. All Exhibits to be the *bona-fide* property of Exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.

2. Unless three entries at least have been made, and unless there are not less than two Exhibits, prizes shall not be awarded if the Judges do not report the Exhibits to be of exceptional merit, and worthy of the prizes.

3. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

4. In any case where, in the opinion of the Secretary for Agriculture, any miss-statement has been made regarding any Exhibit, the prize shall not be paid.

5. All Exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes of Australia.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

1. All Exhibits must be *bona-fide* the property of the Exhibitor; and produce, which must be the growth of the present year, must be grown or made by the Exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being Exhibitors.

2. No Exhibit will be allowed to enter in more than one Class, except for a sweepstake, or for a special prize.

3. General entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and must be in the hands of the Secretary, at the Office, Kirk's Bazaar, 412c Bourke-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 5th day of August 1893, at 12 o'clock noon. On payment of a double entry fee, double-fee entries will be received till 5 p.m. on Tuesday, August 8th, when all entries close. Entry fees in accordance with next regulation, to accompany each entry. After the entries close an Entry Ticket will be issued stating the number of each Exhibit's box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which will correspond with the number of the Exhibit in the Official Catalogue. This ticket will admit the Exhibit and attendant to the Yards. It must be retained, and again produced when the

Exhibit leaves the Show Grounds. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary on the Grounds.

4. Members will be charged a fee of five shillings on each entry, except for Poultry and Wines, in which Sections the entry fee in each Class is 2s. 6d. Non-members will be charged 10 per cent. on the money value of the first prize in each Class in which they enter, provided always that no entry fee in any Class (except for Poultry and Wines) shall be less than five shillings, which amount covers entries in Classes in which medals are offered for first prizes. Entry fees must accompany entries. N.B.—Special entry fee in Classes 29, 30, and 31.

5. Separate entries (with fees in accordance with Regulation 3) must be made for Special Prizes in cases in which the prizes have Class numbers. When the Special Prize is not in a numbered Class, a separate entry is not required.

6. The correct age of Exhibits of Live Stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the Exhibit.

7. In addition to other particulars the date on which sheep were shorn must be stated on the entry-form.

8. The breeding year dates from August 1st in each year for horses, and July 1st in each year for cattle. Colonial-bred shall mean bred in any of the Australasian Colonies.

9. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and of 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised Agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the Class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at the future meetings of the Society.

10. Persons or firms intending to exhibit stands of Machinery and Implements, single Exhibits or Articles or Goods for exhibition only, must apply for space on or before Friday, June 30th, 1898. A charge will be made in proportion to frontage and position allotted. Entries of this description of Exhibits must afterwards be duly made on the Society's forms, and properly described for insertion in the Catalogue.

11. All Exhibits of Carriages, Buggies, &c. (Section 34), and Machinery, Implements, and miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 41), must be in their places in the Yards on Monday night, August 28th. All other Exhibits, except Hunters, Jumpers, Carriage Pairs, and Wines,

&c. (see foot of this regulation), must be *in their places* in the Yards by 10 a.m. on Tuesday, August 29th, when the Judges will commence adjudication. Hunters, High-jumpers, and Carriage Pairs will only be required to be in the Yards on the day or days on which they perform. Boxes will not be allotted to horses in these Classes. Wines, &c. (Section 38), must be lodged in the cellars of the Exhibition Building, Carlton Gardens, on or before Monday, July 31st, 1893, at 5 p.m.

12. Exhibits will not be received in the Yards after the date and hour specified. No animal or article, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered.

13. All Exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulations) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition.

14. The Owner or Exhibitor of any Exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such Exhibit from the Society's Grounds.

15. As many men will be allowed into the Yards free as the Council may deem necessary, to take charge of Exhibits after the entries are made; and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary at the Show Grounds.

16. When ordered by the Stewards, attendants on horses and cattle must take the Exhibits out on parade. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of 10s. in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any Prize awarded to their Exhibit or Exhibits.

17. No Exhibitor or Manager of an Exhibiting Company (except in the case of an Owner riding or driving his Exhibit) will be allowed in that section of the Yard in which his Exhibit is placed during the adjudication of the Judges; and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges, and if necessary to order the removal of such offender from the Yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the Judges, unless authorised by the Stewards of the Section in which they are exhibiting.

18. The Judges may award a Second or a Third Prize instead of a First one, or may withhold a Prize altogether where the Exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Any Exhibit (for which no Class is provided) likely to benefit the colony, if entered as an extra in a competing section, may be recommended a Prize or Certificate if considered meritorious.

19. The Judges are requested to make a reserve number of the Exhibit next in merit beyond those to which Prizes are awarded in every Class where the number of entries exceeds the number of prizes

offered if, in their opinion, the Exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a Prize ; they are also requested to give commendations when deserved.

20. No prizes can be recommended by the Judges for extra Exhibits if the Prize-list contains a Class in which the same can compete.

21. The Council may withhold any Prize when statements have been erroneously or fraudulently made regarding an Exhibit ; and Exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if members, will be liable to expulsion from the Society.

22. Any persons insulting or interfering with the Judges during the Show will be subject to removal from the Yards, and the Prizes, if any, awarded to them forfeited.

23. Any Exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any Exhibit to which a Prize is awarded, and to keep the same on during the hours of Exhibition, will, on proof thereof to the Council, be disqualified from receiving all prizes awarded to the said Exhibit during the Show.

24. Should any Exhibit, having gained a Prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same Prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judges, shall decide the question.

25. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society, and in the case of protests the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

26. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary *in writing*, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

27. No Exhibit (except Live Stock) can be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, when all Exhibits may leave the Yards.

28. Live Stock may be removed from the Yards each day of the Exhibition after 5 p.m. on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for dogs, £2 ; see Special Regulation under Section 33, Clause 3) as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the Yards next morning before 9 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned, the cheque, together with all prize money (if any) it has won will be forfeited ; but on the animal's return each day, the cheque will be refunded to the Exhibitor.

29. Water will be provided in the Yards for Live Stock and the working of Machinery.

30. Exhibitors of Stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the Yards at Melbourne prices) ; and

Exhibitors of Machinery, fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the Regulations.

31. No person will be permitted to make drawings or photographs of any Exhibit without the written consent of the Exhibitor.

32. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements, or other documents, is restricted exclusively to Exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the Yards.

33. Every reasonable care will be taken of Exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.

34. All Exhibits of Live Stock must be removed from the Show Grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made for boxes.

35. The Exhibition will be open to the public on Tuesday at 10 a.m. during the adjudication of the Judges, admission 2s. 6d.; on Wednesday (vice-regal day), from 9 a.m., admission 2s. 6d.; on Thursday from 9 a.m., admission 2s.; and on Friday and Saturday from 9 a.m., admission 1s. Admission to Grand Stand on Tuesday, 2s. 6d.; on Wednesday and Thursday, 5s.; and on Friday and Saturday, 2s. 6d.

36. Members on presentation of their cards will be admitted, with two ladies, free to the Exhibition.

37. Cheques for Prizes awarded at the Show will be passed for payment on Tuesday, September 12th, 1893, after which date they will be payable on application to the Secretary.

38. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

SALES.

SALES OF EXHIBITS (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility), WILL BE HELD ON THE SHOW GROUNDS; on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday; the order in which stock from the different sections is to be sold to be arranged after the entries close. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

Prize-lists, entry-forms, and every information on application to the Secretary, Kirk's Bazaar, 412c Bourke-street, Melbourne; or Secretary of any Agricultural Society in Victoria.

Members' Tickets, £1 each, may be had on application to the Secretary, or to Mr. J. Hedrick, Collector, 432 Collins-street.


