

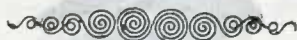

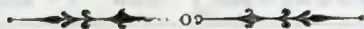

THE THIRTIETH ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be opened on Tuesday, 4th September, 1900, and will be visited by His Excellency the Acting-Governor of Victoria on

Thursday, 6th September, at 12 noon.

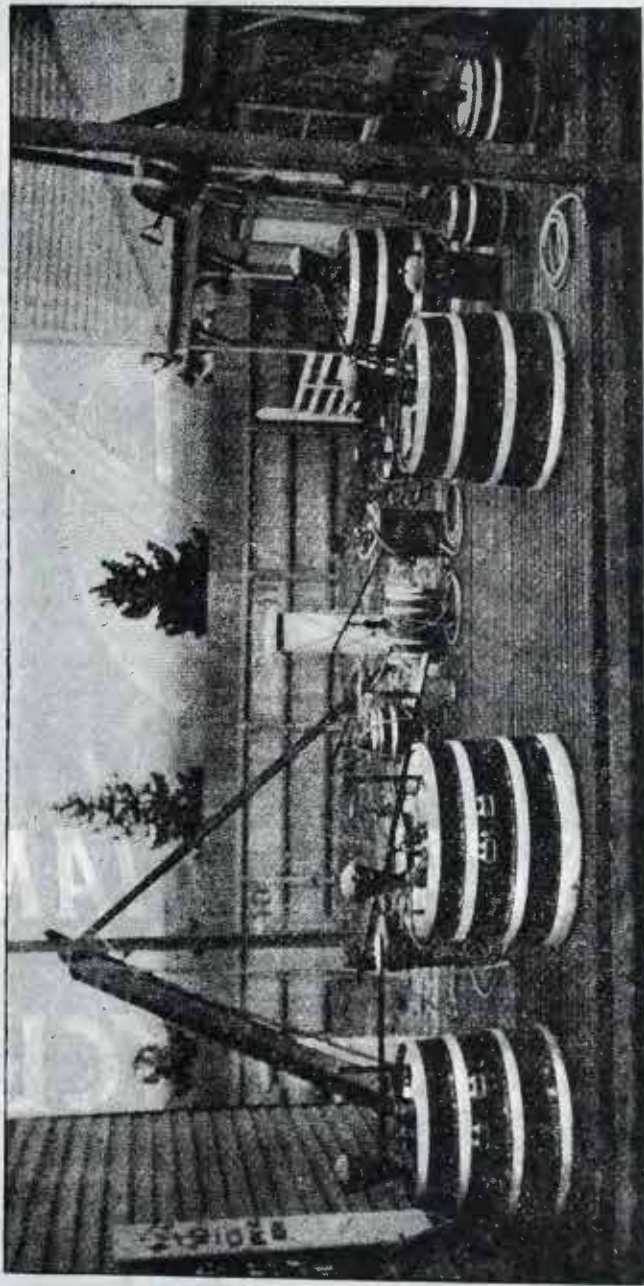

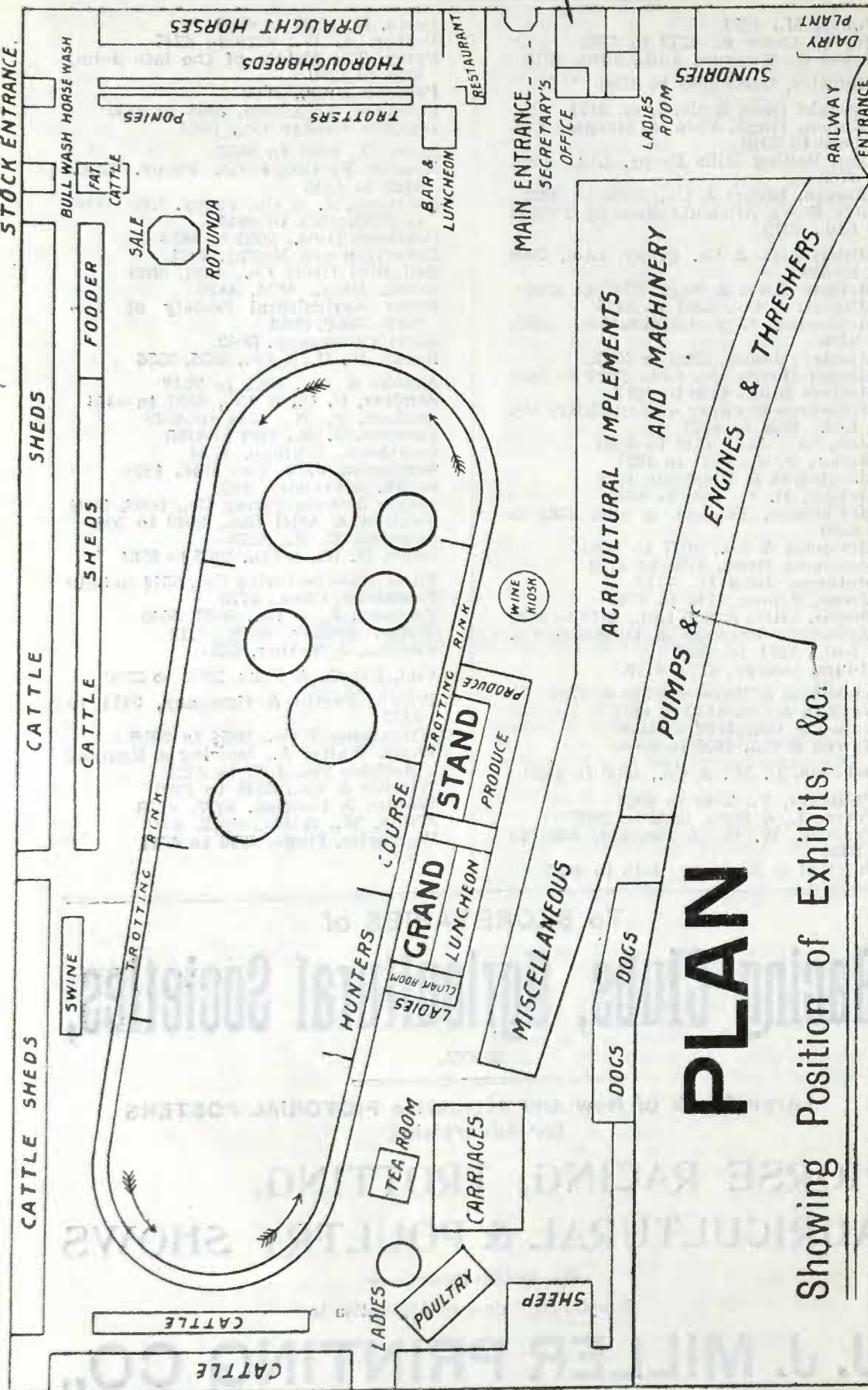

## Rules.

The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria having resolved to hold their Shows as far as practicable under the rules of the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club, and having recognised that Society as the local custodian of a Stud Register kept in accordance with the Kennel Club Rules, the following code is published for the guidance of the Society's Dog Shows:—

1. Every dog exhibited at the Show must, at or before the time of entry for such Show, be entered in a registry of names kept by the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club at their offices, 195 Collins-street, Melbourne. A charge of 1s. each dog will be made for registration. A name that has been already assumed and duly registered in the "Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club's Stud Book," or entered in any published number of the "Kennel Club Calendar" or "Stud Book," by the owner of a dog of the same breed, cannot be registered except by a distinguishing name or number. If the name of a dog be changed, or an old name be re-assumed, such name shall be required to be registered previous to the time of entry.

Note.—Any dog not previously registered in accordance with Rule 1 may be registered at this Society's office at the time of entry for Show on payment of the registration fee of one shilling.

2. Dogs that are already entered in the "Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club's Stud Book," or in any published number of the "Kennel Club Calendar" or "Stud Book," are exempt from the above rule, provided their name remains unchanged. Puppies exhibited in classes exclusively for litters of puppies are also exempt.

3. Any dog which is to be exhibited at a Show held under the Rules must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor in whose name he is entered, and must have been so fourteen clear days before the first day of the Show. Each dog must, on the entry form, be clearly identified by name, by date of birth, and by the name of his sire or dam, and of the breeder, each and every one of them, if known (as registered in accordance with Rule 1); and if the dam was covered by more than one dog, the names of all must be given. If the age, pedigree, or breeder's name be not known, the dog must be entered at each Show as breeder, aged, or pedigree unknown, any or all, as the case may be.

4. The bona-fide owner of the dam at the time she whelps shall be considered to be the breeder of the litter. In cases, however, where a bitch is lent for breeding purposes, the person to whom the bitch is lent shall be considered the breeder of the puppies born during the period of such loan, provided he or she, before the litter is born, send to the Secretary of the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club, a statement of the facts, signed by himself or herself and the owner of the bitch.

5. If the name of the dog which has won a prize has been changed, it is necessary in entering the said dog to give his old name as well as his new name every time he is exhibited, until the change has been duly

published in the "Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club's Stud Book" and if his name be changed again, all his names must be repeated for a like period.

6. If a dog shall be entered except as before directed by Rules 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, he shall forfeit any prize that may have been awarded him, and if the omission be detected in time, he shall not be allowed to compete, and shall in either case forfeit all entrance fees and subscriptions.

7. The Council or authorities may reserve to themselves the right of refusing any entries they may think fit to exclude.

8. A castrated dog or spayed bitch shall be disqualified from competing or receiving a prize if awarded.

9. Total blindness shall absolutely disqualify; partial blindness shall have great weight against a dog. Should a dog appear to be deaf or lame, it shall be in the power of the judge to disqualify, unless he is satisfied that such defects are temporary.

10. No dog shall be qualified to compete who shall be declared by the duly qualified and appointed Veterinary Inspector during the Show to exhibit any form of any contagious or infectious disease, neither shall such dog be entitled, if in that condition, to receive a prize if awarded, unless the Council shall consider that the owner of the dog was not to blame in the matter. The Veterinary Inspector shall give his decision in writing, duly signed, to the Secretary or Committee of the Show before its close, and such opinion shall be final as regards the condition of the dog.

11. Any person who is proved to the satisfaction of the Council to have been guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with dogs, dog shows, or field trials, may, in addition to any pecuniary penalty to which he may be liable, be declared incapable of competing for or winning a prize at any Show or field trials held under these rules, for such period as the Council may decide upon.

12. An equal (champion) or first prize shall be counted as a win to both dogs. In estimating the number of prizes a dog has won, the number of prizes won shall be calculated up to 12 noon of the day previous to the original day of closing entries for the Show.

13. No dog shall be allowed to compete in a novice class that has won a first prize up to the time of judging such class, but in the event of a winner being barred, his entry money shall be returned.

14. The Committee of the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club shall, from time to time, forward to the governing bodies of all Shows held under the Club's Rules, a list of Shows selected by them as being worthy to rank as Championship, or two-point, Shows. A first prize at any one of such Shows shall, for all purposes of a winners' class qualification, count two points. A first prize at any other Show held under the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club's Rules shall count one point. No dog shall be qualified to compete in a winners' class that has won less than six points at Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club, or at Shows registered in and for the "Kennel Club Calendar" and

"Stud Book"; and no dog shall compete in an open class that is qualified to compete in a winners' class at any Show where winners' classes are provided for that breed. The prizes must be won in open classes provided for dogs of any breed, or in varieties of the same breed, divided by weight, colour, sex, or age, in adult classes; and one of the prizes must be won at a Show held by the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club, or the Kennel Club of New South Wales, or at a Championship Show held under the rules of the English Kennel Club. The Shows of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club, the Kennel Club of New South Wales, the Victorian St. Bernard, Mastiff, and Newfoundland Club, the Southern Fox Terrier Club, and of the Bendigo Agricultural Society, shall rank as two-point Shows. All other Shows held under the Rules of the Victorian Poultry and Kennel Club shall rank as one-point Shows.

15. If any dog be disqualified by the Judge or formally objected to during the Show, for being improperly tampered with, the Veterinary Inspector shall examine the dog, and give his opinion to the Secretary in writing before the close of the Show.

16. Any objection to a dog may be made by any person; it must be made to the Council or Secretary of the Society not later than the Friday preceding the close of the Show. The objection must be in writing, and the objector must (unless in cases where the objection is laid by the Council or by the regularly constituted Committee of a Show, in which case a deposit shall not be necessary) at the same time lodge a sum of £1 in the hands of the Council or Secretary, which deposit shall, if the objection be proved frivolous, be forfeited.

17. In the foregoing Rules, the word "dog" shall be interpreted to include both sexes.

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. All dogs must have chains and collars, without names, attached, to enable them to be taken out if required.

2. Any dog wearing a collar with its owner's name thereon, will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

3. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove the same from the yards without a written order from the Secretary, and a deposit of £2. (See General Regulations, Clause 31.)

4. Dogs considered by the Stewards and the Hon. Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

5. Dogs to be in their places in the yards on Wednesday at 10 o'clock.

Note.—The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to take charge of the dogs during the day, and also a night watchman.

Entries, accompanied by entry fees, will be received by the Secretary of the Society up to July 21st, 1900; an entry fee of 5s. will be charged for each exhibit. Competitors may make as many entries as they please. Each exhibit shall consist of five (5) boxes of butter of 56 lbs. each.

The boxes and butter shall be without brands or private marks; a corrugated or honeycomb finish, with a plain or fancy border, may be placed on the butter.

Exhibits must be consigned to the Government Freezing Works, Flinders-street, for cool storage, on or before July 24th, 1900—six weeks before the Show. A paper label must be attached to each box bearing the number of the entry as advised by the Secretary of the Society.

When forwarding exhibits, competitors must send the following information to the Secretary, viz.:—

1. Whether the supply is mixed, or from one farm.
2. The breed or breeds of cows from which milk came.
3. The kind of grasses or pastures.
4. The time which elapsed between milking and separating.
5. The temperature of separating.
6. The length of time cream was kept before churning.
7. The kind of starter used, if any.
8. State if the milk or cream was pasteurised.
9. The degree or extent of sourness, acidity, or ripeness of cream before churning.
10. The temperature of cream before churning.
11. The source of the water supply used for washing the butter, and if filtered.
12. State if the butter was worked once or twice; if twice, what time elapsed between each working.

Samples shall be taken from each exhibit for analysis to determine the per cent. of butter fat, water, curd, salt, preservative, etc., and for bacteriological analysis. Photographs of all cultures shall be taken to illustrate the nature of bacterial contents of each exhibit.

Judging shall be by points, on the following basis:—

- 50 for flavour, which should embrace aroma.
- 30 for texture, which includes moisture.
- 20 for condition, which takes in packing, general appearance, and get up.

In addition, notes shall be made regarding particulars of flavour, aroma, texture, packing, colour, salting, etc. The points awarded shall indicate the relative money value of each exhibit. For instance, when a perfect butter, scoring 100 points, is worth 100s. per cwt., or £100 per ton; a butter scoring 95 points is worth 95s. per cwt., or £95 per ton; and one scoring, say, 80 points, should be worth 80s. per cwt., or £80 per ton.

The exhibits shall be judged before storing in cold room. They shall be taken out of cool store and placed in a normal temperature, not exceeding 65 degrees, for one week before the final judging. The prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the results of the last judging.

During the time of the Show a card shall be displayed with each exhibit showing particulars of production, manufacture, chemical and bacterial analysis, with photograph of cultures, and the notes and points awarded by the Judges on the first and second scoring.

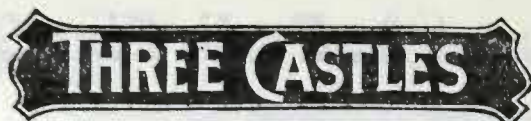

## Special Regulations re Champion Prizes of Australia.

(The Gift of the Government of Victoria.)

1. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being exhibitors.

2. Unless three entries at least have been made, and unless there are not less than two exhibits, prizes shall not be awarded if the Judges do not report the exhibits to be of exceptional merit, and worthy of the prizes.

3. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

4. In any case where, in the opinion of the Secretary for Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be paid.

5. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

Note.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes of Australia.

---

## General Regulations.

1. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry, and produce, which must be the growth of the present year, must be grown or made by the exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being exhibitors.

2. No exhibit will be allowed to enter in more than one class, except for a sweepstake, or for a special or champion prize.

3. Applications for space for stands of manures, machinery, and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only (Sections 41 and 42), must be made on or before Saturday, June 30th, 1900. After the applications close positions will be allotted, and a charge of 1s. per foot frontage will be made for the space granted, exclusive of space under cover, for which the charge is 5s. per foot for first five feet, with a reduction after that amount. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made on the Society's forms, before the close of general entry, for insertion in the Catalogue.

4. General entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and must be in the hands of the Secretary, at the office, Equitable Building, Collins-street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, the 4th day of August, 1900, at 12 o'clock noon. On payment of an extra fee, double-fee entries will be received at the office after that hour till 5 p.m. on Tuesday, August 7th, when all entries close. Entry fees, in accordance with next regulation, to accompany each entry.

Note.—Entries for competition are limited to three exhibits in all live stock classes, which exhibits must be brought before the Judges. Entries for sale only—50 per cent. extra entry fee. Competitive and sale exhibits to be separated in the show grounds.

5. Members of the Society (subscription, £1) will be charged a fee of 5s. on each entry in a numbered class except for Swine, Poultry, and Wines, in which Sections the entry fee in each class is 2s. 6d., and in Classes 37, 38, 39 and 121, in which the entry fee is £1. Non-members will be charged ten per cent. on the money value of the first prize in each class in which they enter, provided always that no entry fee in any class shall be less than five shillings (which amount covers entries in classes in which medals are offered for first prizes), except in Swine, Poultry, and Wines, for which the entry fee is 2s. 6d. Entry fees must accompany entries.

6. Separate entries (with entry fees) must be made for Special Prizes in cases in which the prizes have class numbers. When the Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required.

7. The correct age of exhibits of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit.

8. No sheep to be entered or shown that have been shorn before July 12th in the preceding year. The date on which sheep were shorn to be stated on entry form. No sheep will be allowed to compete that have their wool oiled or dressed with any foreign matter whatever. No sheep to be gone over with the shears except for plucks or dags.

9. The breeding year dates from August 1st in each year for horses, and July 1st in each year for cattle. Colonial-bred shall mean bred in any of the Australasian colonies.

10. All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be visibly entire, and any marks of spaying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

11. Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit will state the number of its box, stall, pen, or stand, as the case may be, which will correspond with its number in the official catalogue. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the Grounds. It must be retained and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary, to whom exhibitors, when sending in their entries, must make application for the number required.

12. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expenses, and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and of 10s. for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owing them from exhibiting at the future meetings of the Society.



13. All exhibits of Carriages, Buggies, etc. (Section 35), Manures (Section 41), and Machinery, Implements, and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 42) must be in their places in the yards on Monday night, September 3rd. All other exhibits, except Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, High Jumpers, Cavalry Horses, Carriage Pairs, Poultry and Dogs, and Wines, etc. (see foot of this regulation), must be in their places in the yards by 10 a.m. on Tuesday, September 4th, when the Judges will begin adjudication. Hunters, Ladies' Hunters, High Jumpers, Cavalry Horses, and Carriage Pairs will only be required to be in the yards on the day or days on which they perform. Except for Cavalry Horses, boxes will not be allotted to horses in these classes. Poultry and Dogs must be in their places in the yards before 10 a.m. on Wednesday, September 5th, except working Sheep Dogs, which are not required till Thursday at 10 a.m. Wines, etc. (Section 39), must be lodged in the cellars of the Exhibition Building, Carlton Gardens, on or before Monday, August 6th, 1900, at five p.m.

14. Exhibits will not be received in the yards after the date and hour specified. No animal or article, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds, unless duly entered.

16. The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society must immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

17. As many men will be allowed into the yards free as the Council may deem necessary to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.

18. Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public, and horse-boxes must not be locked during those hours, or the exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

19. Any exhibitor or his employe putting manure out of his box, stall, or pen, after 8.30 a.m. on a Show day, shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

20. When ordered by the Stewards, all prize-taking horses and cattle must be taken out on parade in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors will be subject to a fine of 10s. in each case in which the order of the Stewards to parade is not obeyed, and shall be liable to forfeit any prize awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

21. No exhibitor or manager of an exhibiting company (except in the case of an owner riding or driving his exhibit) will be allowed in that section of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication of the Judges, and it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judges, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective lots, or address the Judges, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing.

22. The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Any exhibit (for which no class is provided) likely to



benefit the colony, if entered as an extra in a competitive section, may be recommended a prize or certificate if considered meritorious, but no prize can be recommended by the Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a class in which the same can compete.

23. The Judges are requested to make a reserve number of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceed the number of prizes offered, if, in their opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; they are also requested to give commendations when deserved.

24. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements may be debarred from again exhibiting, and, if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors may be required to make a statutory declaration regarding their entries, if the Council so desires.

25. Any person insulting or interfering with the Judges during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

General Regulations—Two.

26. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and to keep the same on during the hours of exhibition, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Prize Card in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

27. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judges, shall decide the question.

28. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society, as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulations, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

29. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before twelve noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

30. No exhibit (except Live Stock) can be removed from the Exhibition until five p.m. on Saturday, when all exhibits may leave the yards.

31. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the yards each day of the Exhibition after five p.m. on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for any exhibit of dogs, £2; see Special Regulation, under Section 34, Clause 3), as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before ten a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned, before the time specified, the cheque, together with all the prize money (if any) it



has won, will be forfeited; but on the animal's return each day the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

32. Water will be provided in the yards for Live Stock and the working of machinery.

33. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the yards at Melbourne prices); and exhibitors of machinery, fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the regulations.

34. The successful tenderer for the privilege of photographing exhibits has the exclusive right thereto, with the reservation that the Council may allow the Press to take photographs of exhibits for purposes of illustration.

35. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements, or other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards.

36. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.

37. All exhibits of Live Stock, for which boxes or stalls are provided free for one week (and in the case of over-sea exhibits, for a fortnight) before the Show opens, must be removed from the Grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made for boxes.

38. The Exhibition will be open to the public on Tuesday from ten a.m. (during adjudication by the Judges), admission 1s.; on Wednesday, Thursday (vice-regal day), Friday and Saturday, from nine a.m., admission 1s. Admission to grand stand on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, 2s. 6d.

39. Members, on presentation of their badges, and members' ladies, on presentation of their tickets, will be admitted free to the Grounds and grand stand.

40. Cheques for prizes at the Show will be passed for payment at the Council meeting on Tuesday, September 18th, 1900, one week after which date they will be payable on application to the Secretary.

41. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

Note.—The Society does not undertake to receive exhibits, but a carter is in attendance at the Show Grounds platform to take charge of them if required to do so, and place them in their respective sections for a small charge, the Society not being in any way responsible in the matter.

## Sales.

Sales of Exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds on Friday and Saturday. Beef breeds of cattle, horses and swine sold on Friday,

dairy breeds of cattle and sheep on Saturday. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show, and exhibitors are required to state on their entry forms if their exhibits are for sale or for exhibition only. Extra entry fee for sale stock.

Prize lists, entry forms, and every information on application to the Secretary, Equitable Building, Collins-street, Melbourne; or Secretary of any Agricultural Society in Victoria.

Members' Tickets, £1 each (giving the subscriber the privileges of admission with a lady to the grounds and grand stand at all times, a vote for the election of office-bearers, etc.), may be had on application to the Secretary, or to Mr. N. E. Ruck, Collector.

Holiday tickets at excursion fares on all railway lines.

Exhibitors at Melbourne from Sydney are issued return tickets at single fare. Minimum number, 9.

Intending competitors are particularly requested to observe the date fixed for the reception of entries at the office, as the rule will be **STRICTLY ENFORCED**.

The Society is prepared to give liberal encouragement to all kinds of novelties calculated to improve existing or to promote new industries, by offering every facility for their exhibition; and provided such novelties are entered as extras in any competitive section, by awarding prizes or certificates if considered meritorious.

## Railway Regulations.

Agricultural Machines and Implements, Live Stock and Produce, Dogs, Poultry, and Other Birds, also Conditions applying to Judges and to Attendants on Stock.

[Exhibits are consigned direct to Show-siding at Society's Grounds.]

1. On consigning to the Show the consignor must declare on consignment note that they are for exhibition, naming the Show, and they must be way-billed accordingly. They will then be charged full rates to the place of exhibition, but will be conveyed back to the station whence they were sent free, at any time within one month, if a certificate from the Secretary of the Society to the effect that they have been exhibited and not sold is handed in on consigning. Certificate to be attached to the "free" way-bill. If part of a consignment is sold the balance will be returned free.



2. The foregoing applies to exhibits conveyed in goods waggons and by goods trains; valuable animals may, however, be conveyed in horse-boxes by passenger trains under these conditions, at goods rates, provided there is rolling stock available.

3. For all exhibits which have been sold, full rates will be charged for the return journey.

4. Exhibits may be sent from one Show to another on the same line or branch of same line, provided a "Not Sold" certificate is presented and freight prepaid at each station. When final destination is reached, they will be returned to starting station as per Clause 1.

5. All exhibits to be loaded and unloaded by consignors and consignees, and to be carried and signed for at the owner's risk.

6. Exhibits unaccompanied by a certificate from the Secretary of the Show will be charged full rates both ways.

7. To ensure despatch, forty-eight hours' notice should be given to the stationmaster of the number and description of vehicles required.

8. All freight to be "Prepaid" in first instance, and made "To Pay" (if charged) on return journey.

9. Judges to be carried at holiday excursion fare for the return journey, when on official duty; certificate to be produced at Booking Office.

10. Attendants on stock, before starting to a Show, must furnish themselves with a certificate, duly filled up and signed, as per Clause 11, and pay full fare to and from the place of exhibition; but after returning with the exhibits, if a full truck load of sheep, or a full cattle-truck load of horses, cattle or pigs, has been paid for, and if provided with a certificate that the stock exhibited has not been sold, and also with the second part of certificate, as per Clause 11, duly filled up and signed, a refund of both fares will be made. This applies only to attendants who travel in the trucks or in vans of goods trains with the stock. Only one attendant is to be allowed to each truck. The certificate must be receipted by the attendant, and sent by the stationmaster to the Traffic Audit Office as a voucher.
