The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions 3 years old and over must have obtained a Government veterinary certificate of soundness.

All Mares 3 years old or over entered in Sections 1 to 11 inclusive must have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Surgeon at one of the Stallion Parades, or from the Society's Veterinary Surgeon. Such certificate must be produced to the steward of the Class when horses are paraded for judging. Stewards will collect and retain such certificates.

[NOTE.—At Stallion Parades only Mares entered in a recognised Stud Book will be examined.]

Stallions will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons, on the Show Grounds, on Monday, 24th September, commencing at 10 a.m.; Mares on the same day by the Society's Veterinary Surgeons. No veterinary examinations will be made on judging day.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured. The official measurer will be in attendance on the grounds on Monday, 24th September, at 9 a.m., and on Tuesday, 25th September, at 8 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates before going into the ring.

NOTE.—Horse-boxes must not be locked during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

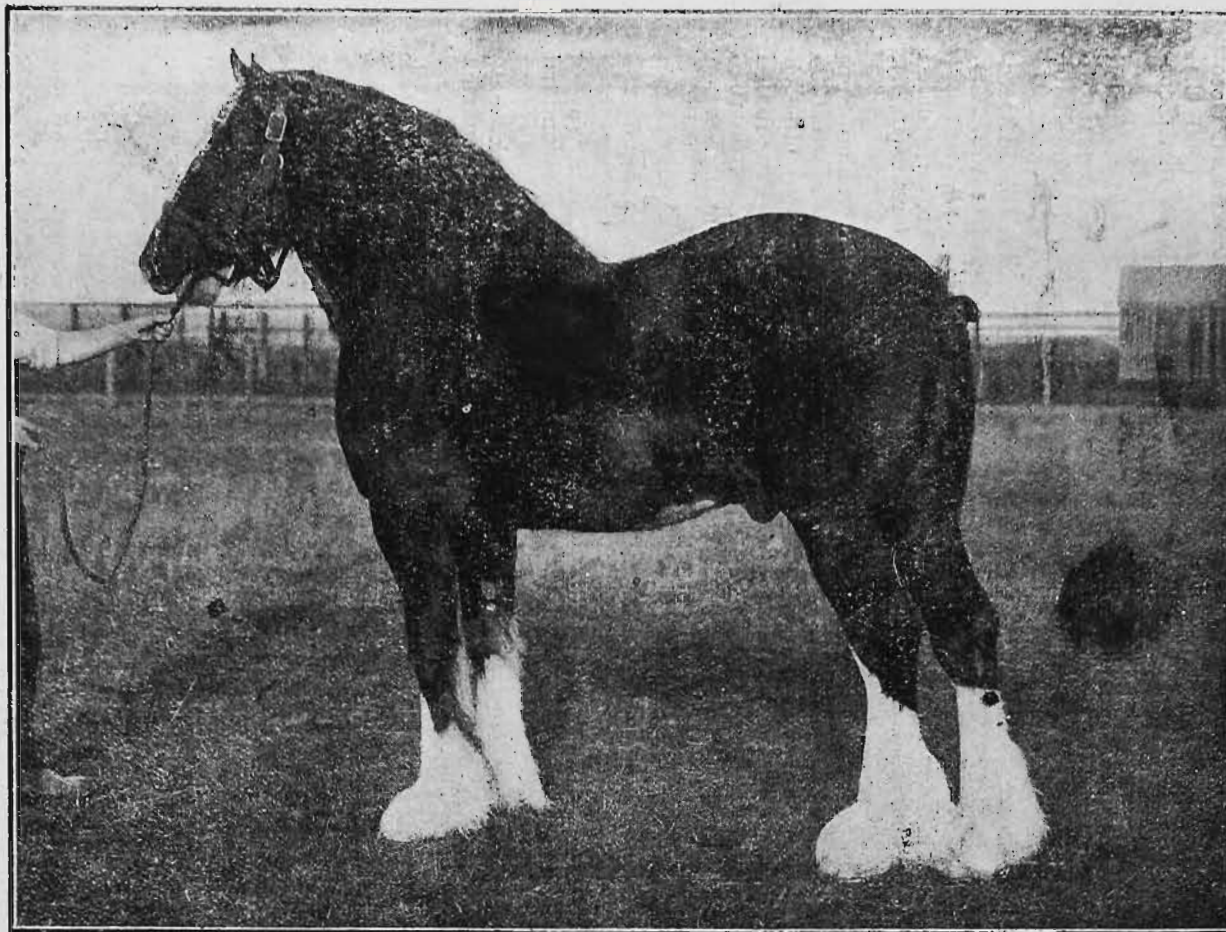

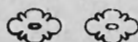

Presented by the Government of Victoria.

- (1) **Grand Champion Cow**, under herd testing regulations. A grand champion prize of £100 to be awarded to the cow securing position of annual champion for three years, not necessarily in succession.
- (2) **Annual Champion Cow**, under herd testing regulations. A prize of £25 to be awarded to the cow which, on completion of lactation period, gives the greatest amount of butter fat under the herd testing regulations of the Department of Agriculture during a lactation period terminating within a year ending 30th June. If two lactation periods are completed within the year, the last will be the period considered.
- (3) **Annual Reserve Champion Cow**, under herd testing regulations. A prize of £15 per annum to be awarded to the cow attaining second place under the herd testing regulations of the Department of Agriculture during a year ending 30th June.

These prizes to be awarded conditionally upon the winning cow being exhibited at the next Royal Show. In the event of the death of the winning cow prior to such show, the owner may be called upon to exhibit his next best cow.

- (4) **Best Herd**, under herd testing regulations. A first prize of £40 and second prize of £10 to be awarded to the herd giving the greatest average return under the herd testing regulations of the Department of Agriculture, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) Minimum number of cows (completing the test during the year) in a herd, 10.
- (2) Such herd to average 300 lbs. of butter fat.
 - (a) Handicaps will be allowed under the following scale:—
 - (1) In a herd of more than 10 cows, each cow will receive an allowance equivalent to $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of butter fat for each cow in the herd.
 - (2) Cows commencing their first lactation period, and being then under three years of age, will receive an allowance of 75 lbs. of butter fat.
 - (3) Cows commencing their first lactation period, and being then over three years of age, and cows commencing their second lactation period, and being then under four years of age, to receive an allowance of 50 lbs. of butter fat.

The prize to be allotted for the year ending 30th June, and three of the best cows in the winning herd to be exhibited at the next Royal Show. No cow competing for any prize shall be milked more than twice a day, and must calve again within 15 months.

Note.—The Government of Victoria intends to continue the Herd Testing Competitions as outlined above, but in 1918 and onwards the Annual Champion Prize will be reduced to £10, the Reserve Annual Champion to £5, and the first and second prizes for the best herd to £20 and £10 respectively.

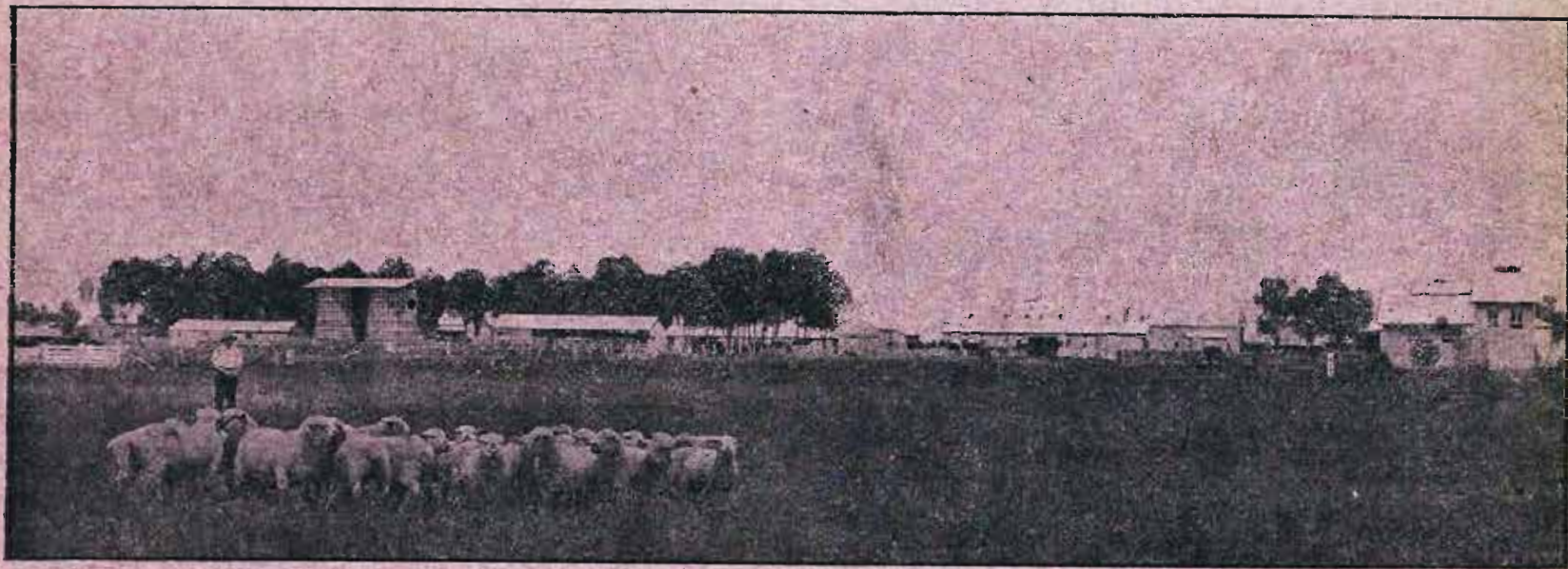

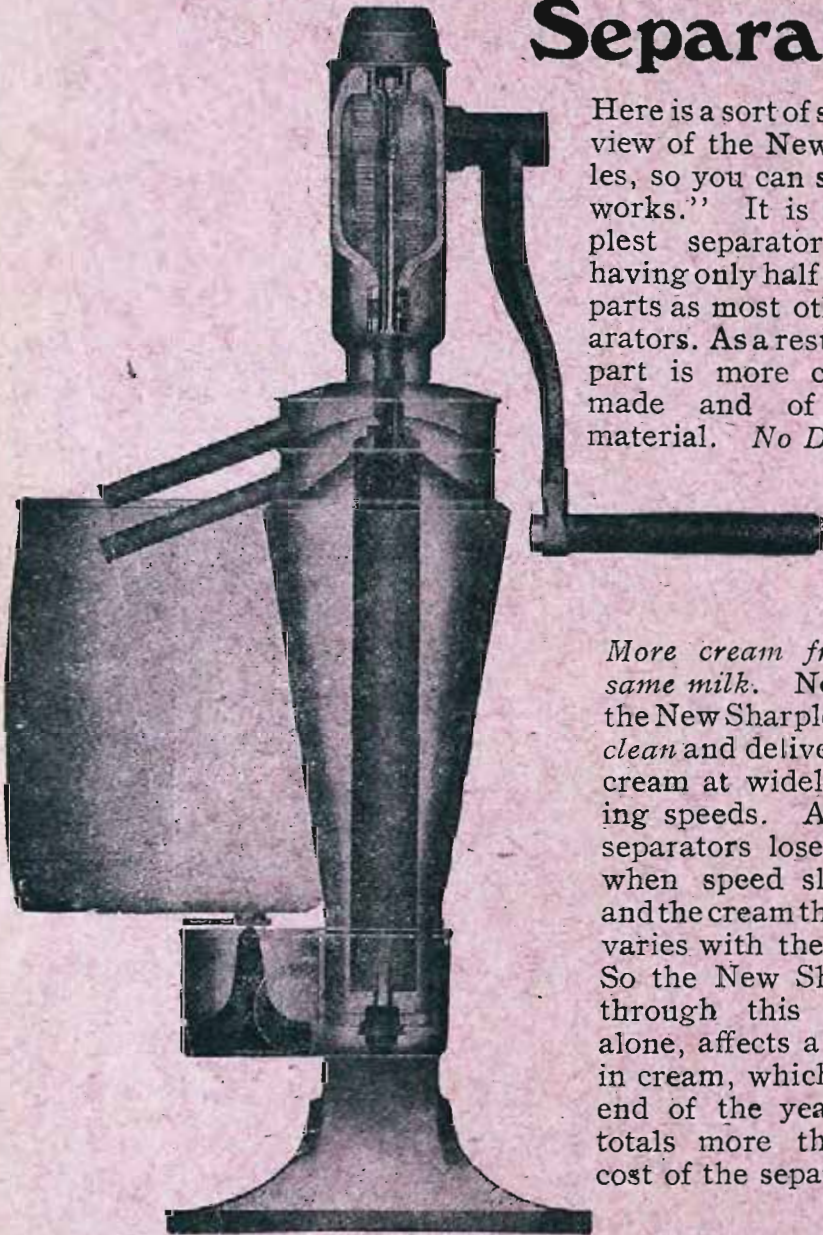
