

TUESDAY, 24th SEPTEMBER, 1918.

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free. Members also receive two ladies' tickets to admit ladies to the Grounds and Grand Stands each day of the Show.

The public will be admitted on Monday, 23rd September (Judging Day), at 10 a.m., on payment of 1s.; and on the remaining days of the Show till Saturday, 28th September (inclusive), from 9 a.m. 1s. 

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions 3 years old and over must have obtained a Government veterinary certificate of soundness.

All Mares 3 years old or over entered in Sections 1 to 11 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 3) must have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Surgeon at one of the Stallion Parades, or from the Society's Veterinary Surgeon. Such certificate must be produced to the steward of the Class when horses are paraded for judging. Stewards will collect and retain such certificates.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons, on the Show Grounds, on Saturday, 21st September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured. The official measurer will be in attendance on the grounds on Saturday, 21st September, at 10 a.m., and on Monday, 23rd September, at 8 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates before going into the ring.

NOTE.—Horse-boxes must not be locked during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.
