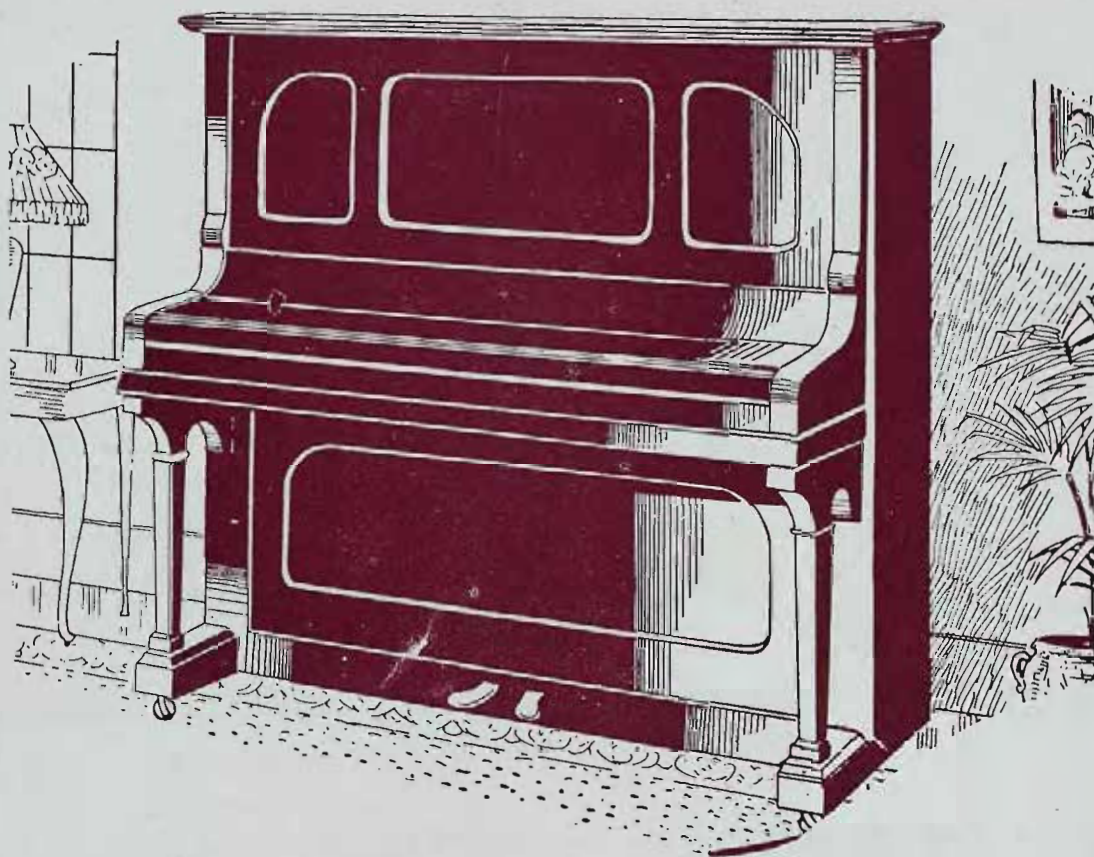

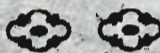

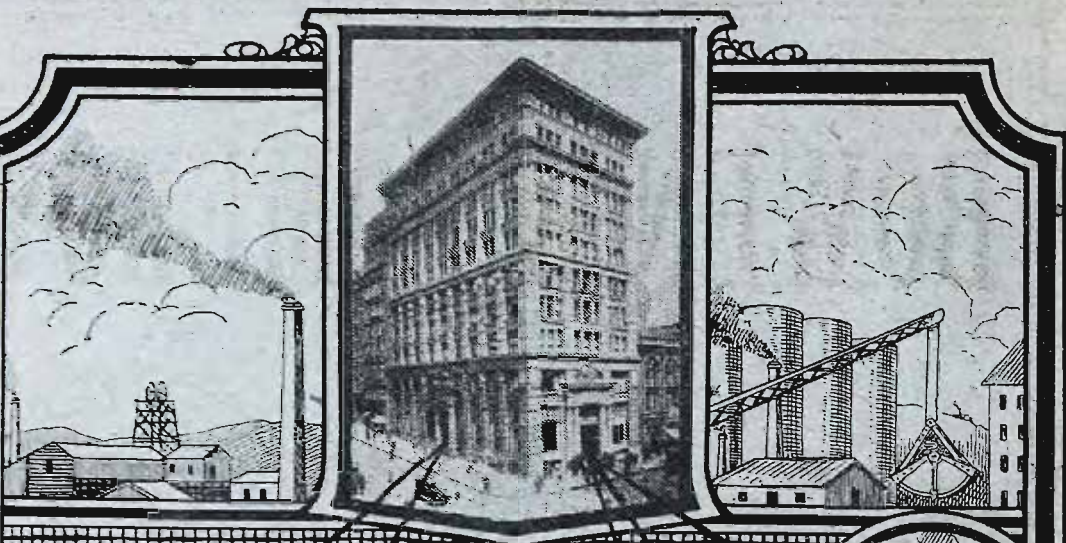

FRIDAY, 21st SEPTEMBER, 1923.

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free. Members also receive two ladies' tickets to admit ladies to the Ground and Grand Stands each day of the Show.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 20th September (Judging Day), on payment of 2/-, and on the remaining days of the Show, till Saturday, 30th September (inclusive), from 9 a.m., on payment of 2/-. All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1919.

All Mares 3 years old or over entered in Sections 1 to 10 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 3) must have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer.

Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and Mares, "Pass to the Ring." These stamped tickets must be produced to the Steward before entering the arena.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons, on the Show Grounds, on Wednesday, 19th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured.
