The flock of Messrs. James Sloane and Son, Mulwala, N.S.W., was founded in 1863 by the late Alex. Sloane, who purchased at Tubbo 1200 Merino ewes from Groongal (Learmonth Bros.) The late Alex. Sloane managed the flock until 1878, since when his son, Mr. James Sloane, has had control of the breeding of the flock. Alexander Sloane from time to time introduced stud sheep, mostly from Havilah (N. P. Bayly), Ercildoune (Sir Samuel Wilson), Rawdon (E. K. Cox), and Scone (W. Gibson and Son, Tasmania). When Mr. James Sloane took charge, Scone rams were being used, and were kept to for many years, especially sons and grandsons of "Royal Hero." In 1910 Mr. James Sloane took over his share of the flock. Since then it has been bred mostly within itself. Prior to this, one ram from Wanganella Estate (Exors. T. Millear) was introduced. Since 1910 there has been a further infusion of Wanganella blood—two rams of that strain having been used.





Poultry MUST be penned before 9 p.m., Tuesday, 22nd September, but, in order to avoid disappointments, exhibitors are advised to despatch their birds so that they will arrive as early as possible on that day.

Poultry arriving at Spencer-street Railway Station at or before 5.55 p.m. on Tuesday, 22nd September, will be conveyed by special train to the Show Grounds Siding at Flemington.

NOTE.—When forwarding poultry by rail, exhibitors are particularly requested to mark clearly in each compartment of the coop the exhibit number of the bird that was sent therein, so that the same arrangement of birds may be made for the return journey.

Tags bearing the pen numbers will be forwarded to exhibitors, together with entry tickets. These tags must be securely fastened to the legs of the birds in accordance with the exhibit numbers on the entry tickets.

Selling prices of all Poultry exhibits may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Poultry Superintendent.

Exhibits must not be handled unless the authority of the Superintendent be first obtained.

RULES.

1. All exhibitors must be registered with the Victorian Poultry Control Council for the current year. (The registration fee is 1/-, and may be paid when entries are being made.) Exhibitors already registered must quote their registered number on the entry form.

2. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.

3. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.

4. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss, or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

5. Birds wearing leg bands or rings, other than those attached outside the Commonwealth, will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

6. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

Grand Championship Government Certificates will be awarded for Poultry as under:---

1. Light breeds (bantams excepted), best bird, any age or sex.

2. Heavy breeds, best bird, any age or sex.

3. Best Duck or Drake.

4. Best Pair of Birds (pure bred or cross), adapted for export.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above classes unless there are at least (6) competitors.

2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate is not eligible to compete again.

3. Competition will be confined to birds which are the property of and have been bred by the competitor.

4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture, when applying for the certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.

5. The bird winning the certificate in any class shall, immediately upon such award being made, have two holes punched in the inside web of the left foot. The markings shall be done by or under the supervision of the judge (in the presence of a member of the Committee of the Society) of the Section in which the award is made, who shall not certify to such award unless and until such marking has been carried out.

6. The Department will supply to the Secretary of the Society a punch for use by the judge. This punch must be returned by registered post to the Director of Agriculture immediately after the Show.







2. Each dog must be provided with a suitable collar and chain or lead.

3. No dog shall enter the judging ring wearing a collar on which the name of the dog or its owner appears.

4. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which will be supplied by the Society.

5. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent, and without leaving a deposit of £2. (See General Regulation 39.)

6. Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Stewards or the Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received; or removed if found necessary.

7. Labels will be sent for each dog when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Two or more dogs may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided and labelled.

Note.—The Society's postal and telegraphic address at Show time is Show Grounds, Ascot Vale.

DOGS.

8. The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the Dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by Exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to, any Dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others.

9. The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to feed and take charge of the dogs during the day, and a night watchman will also be on duty.

10. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of Dogs which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show benches, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of 10/- for each and every entry of Dogs not exhibited, unless a certificate, under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent, be lodged with the Secretary of the Society at least three days before the opening of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the Dog or Dogs; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by the Dog or Dogs becoming ineligible for the Class in which they have been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owning them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

11. Should any dispute arise in this Section, for which no specific rule has been laid down, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

Extract from the rules of the Kennel Control Council of Victoria, included for the guidance of intending exhibitors:— 114.—A dog shall be disqualified from competition—(1) By the

114.—A dog shall be disqualified from competition—(1) By the Committee of the K.C.C. of V. direct, or (2) by the Committee of the exhibition on objection, subject to appeal to the Committee of the K.C.C. of V., if it is proved to be:—

(a) Exhibited at an exhibition previously declared "unrecognised" by the Committee of the K.C.C. of V.

115.—Any person promoting, exhibiting, judging, or in any way officiating at an exhibition previously declared by the Committee of the K.C.C. of V. to be "unrecognised," shall, at the discretion of such Committee, be disqualified or suspended from judging, competing, winning a prize, making an objection, or taking any part at a recognised exhibition.

116—Such disqualification or suspension shall also apply to all dogs registered in the name of, or owned by, any person disqualified or suspended under these Rules.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

"Puppy Class" for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months of age.

"Novice Class" for dogs six months of age or over, which have not won a first prize in any Class or a Challenge Certificate or Country Challenge Certificate at any exhibition; Encouragement, Maiden, Brace, Team, Litter and all Puppy Classes excepted. (See note below).

"Limit Class" for dogs six months of age or over which have not won more than a total of four first prizes in any Limit, Australasian-bred or Open Class at any exhibition. (See note below).

"Australasian-bred Class" for dogs six months of age or over, born in Australia or New Zealand, and subject to any height and weight limitations.

"Open Class" for all dogs six months of age or over.

N.B.—Only wins prior to midnight of the day preceding that on which the breed is exhibited shall count. Wins at Parades do not count at Shows.

SPECIAL NOTIFICATION.—No Dog will be allowed to be benched or be admitted to the Judging Ring unless he be examined by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, and the Ring Number Card stamped, "Pass to Ring."

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon will be in attendance from 8 a.m. till 9.30 a.m. on Thursday, 17th September, and again on Thursday, 24th September, at the same time, for the purpose of examining the dogs.

A Kennel Control Council of Victoria Challenge Certificate, with Blue Ribbon, is offered in each breed, one for each sex. The Judges may withhold awards if animals are not of sufficient merit.
