PERFORMANCES OF NAROOMA STOCK:

Narooma is the first ACCREDITED ABORTION-FREE Herd in N.S.W., and possibly the Commonwealth.

Narooma stock are all Certified Tubercle Free.

During 1932-33 Narooma stock established the following Records:—

Twenty-one Cows completed a 273 days' record in 1932, for an average of 414.97 lbs. butter-fat or 500 lbs. commercial butter. Excepting herds with less than five cows, this is the highest average in the State. Ten of these cows were 2-year-old heifers.

Up to date in 1933, 18 cows have averaged 477lbs. butter-fat without allowances.

Kelvinside Brown Lustre (22703) produced, in 273 days, 15,643½ lbs. milk and 849.87 lbs. fat, creating a New South Wales Jersey Record for all ages.

In 365 days she produced 20,102½ lbs. milk, 1116 lbs. fat, or 1344 lbs. butter.

Kelvinside Noble Fuschia, a half-sister to Lustre, created a junior 3-year-old record by producing 10,416½ lbs. milk and 623.6 lbs. butter fat in 273 days.

Highest Butter-fat, 365 days: Junior 2-year-old—Narooma Pleasant, 545.15 lbs. fat.

Highest Milk Production, 273 days' test: Junior 2-year-old—Narooma Charming, 8647½ lbs.; Senior 2-year-old—Narooma Minerva, 9249 lbs.; Mature—Kelvinside Brown Lustre, 15,643½ lbs.

Highest Milk Production, 365 days' test: Junior 2-year-old—Narooma Pleasant, 9972½ lbs.; Senior 2-year-old—Narooma Minerva, 11,495 lbs. (a State record).

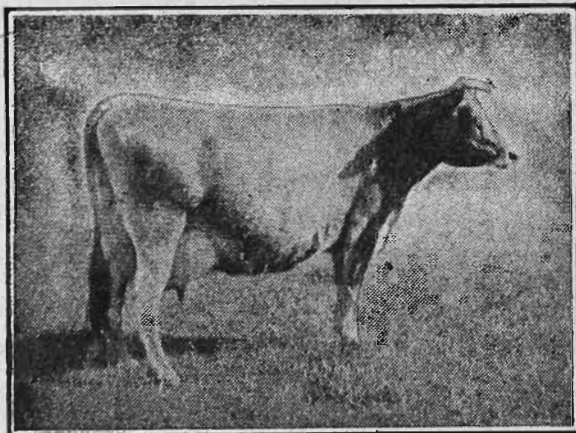

SHEEP

Sheep in Sections 25 to 35 inclusive are only required in the yards from 10 a.m. on Monday, 25th September (when judging commences), until 5 p.m. on Friday, 29th September.

Sheep must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge: Five shillings during currency of Show. Seven large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of 10/- each.

Except in the case of Fat Sheep, and breeds for which there is at time of entry no recognised Flock Book in Australia, all Sheep entered in the following Sections must be the property of exhibitors registered in an approved public Flock Book, except sheep under 12 months old, which must be bred in a registered flock. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as the owner from any one holding.

Sheep over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn since 1st August, 1932, except where otherwise specified, and judges are empowered to disqualify exhibits that, in their opinion, do not conform to this regulation. Date of shearing to be given on entry form.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the yards.

Exhibitors of shorn sheep must lodge a statutory declaration when making their entries that their exhibits have been closely and evenly shorn on or after 15th August, 1933.

Sheep that have been unfairly shorn or unfairly trimmed will be disqualified.

NOTE.—When forwarding poultry by rail, exhibitors are particularly requested to mark clearly in each compartment of the coop the exhibit number of the bird that was sent therein, so that the same arrangement of birds may be made for the return journey.

Tags bearing the pen numbers will be forwarded to exhibitors, together with entry tickets. These tags must be securely fastened to the legs of the birds in accordance with the exhibit numbers on the entry tickets.

Selling prices of all Poultry exhibits may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Poultry Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

Exhibits must not be handled unless the authority of the Superintendent be first obtained.

RULES.

1. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.

2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.

3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss, or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

4. Birds wearing leg bands or rings, other than those attached outside the Commonwealth, will be disqualified from receiving a prize.

5. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

Grand Championship Government Certificates will be awarded for Poultry as under:—

1. This Society is affiliated with the Kennel Control Council of Victoria, and the Dog Section is conducted under the rules of that body. (A copy of the rules may be inspected at the office of this Society). All dogs must be registered with the Kennel Control Council of Victoria, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne. The registration fee for each dog is as follows:—

2. Each dog must be provided with a suitable collar and chain or lead.

3. No dog shall enter the judging ring wearing a collar on which the name of the dog or its owner appears.

4. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which will be supplied by the Society.

5. Exhibitors will, on personal application to one of the Stewards, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent and without leaving a deposit of £2. (See General Regulation 39.) Entry tickets for dogs will admit exhibitors on the days the dogs are on exhibition before 9.30 a.m. and after 5 p.m., to enable exhibitors to exercise their dogs if they so desire.

6. Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Stewards or the Veterinary Surgeon unfit for exhibition, either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other causes, will not be received, and will be removed if found necessary.

7. Labels will be sent for each dog when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors

must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Two or more dogs may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided and labelled.

Note.—The Society's postal and telegraphic address at Show time is Show Grounds, Ascot Vale.

8. The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the Dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by Exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to, any Dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others.

9. The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to feed and take charge of the dogs during the day, and a night watchman will also be on duty.

10. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of Dogs which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show benches, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of 10/- for each and every entry of Dogs not exhibited, unless a certificate, under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent, be lodged with the Secretary of the Society at least three days before the opening of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the Dog or Dogs; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by the Dog or Dogs becoming ineligible for the Class in which they have been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owning them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.

11. Should any dispute arise in this Section, for which no specific rule has been laid down, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

"Puppy Class" for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months of age.

"Novice Class" for dogs six months of age or over, which have not won a first prize in any Class or a Challenge Certificate or Country Challenge Certificate at any exhibition; Encouragement, Maiden, Brace, Team, Litter and all Puppy Classes excepted. (See note below).

"Limit Class" for dogs six months of age or over which have not won a total of four first prizes in any Limit, Australasian-bred and/or Open Class at any exhibition. (See note below.)

"Australasian-bred Class" for dogs six months of age or over, born in Australia or New Zealand, and subject to any height and weight limitations.

"Open Class" for all dogs six months of age or over, if confined to a breed or variety, for all dogs of that breed or variety. The word "variety" shall be taken as referring to the pure-bred varieties, for which a separate register is kept by the Kennel Club of England at the date of the exhibition at which the classes are offered.

N.B.—Only wins prior to midnight of the day preceding that on which the breed is exhibited shall count. Wins at Parades do not count at Shows.

SPECIAL NOTIFICATION.—No Dog will be allowed to be benched or be admitted to the Judging Ring unless he be examined by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, and the Ring Number Card stamped, "Pass to Ring."

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon will be in attendance from 8 a.m. till 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 22nd September; on Wednesday, 27th September, and again on Friday, 29th September, at the same time, for the purpose of examining the dogs.

In each Class the prizes are:—First prize, £1; second prize, 7/6; third prize, Card.

A Kennel Control Council of Victoria Challenge Certificate, with Blue Ribbon, is offered in each breed, one for each sex. The awarding of Challenge Certificates to every breed entered in the "any other recognised breed" class is left to the discretion of the Judge. The Judges may withhold awards if animals are not of sufficient merit.
