



## SHEEP

Sheep in Sections 26 to 37 inclusive are only required in the yards from 10 a.m. on Monday, 22nd October (when judging commences), until 5 p.m. on Friday, 26th October.

Sheep must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings

for every infringement of this regulation.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge: Five shillings during currency of Show. Seven large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of 10/each.

All sheep entered in Sections 26 to 36 (inclusive) must be registered in the Exhibitor's name and be the property of Exhibitors registered in an approved public Flock Book, except sheep under 12 months old, which must be bred in a flock registered in the name of the Exhibitor. Only one Exhibitor will be recognised as the owner from any one holding.

Sheep over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn since 1st August, 1933, except where otherwise specified, and judges are empowered to disqualify exhibits that, in their opinion, do not conform to this regulation. Date of shearing to be given on

entry form.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be re-

moved from the yards.

Exhibitors of shorn sheep must lodge a statutory declaration when making their entries that their exhibits have been closely and evenly shorn on or after 15th August, 1934.

Sheep that have been unfairly shorn or unfairly trimmed

will be disqualified.

Exhibits of Fleeces and Skins must be lodged at the Show Grounds before 12 noon on Saturday, 6th October, or, if sent by rail, must reach Melbourne before that hour, and be addressed: The Secretary, Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, Spencer Street Railway Station, Melbourne.

They will be judged on Monday, 15th October.

The judges are empowered to withdraw from competition any fleece or fleeces which, in their opinion, are not up to Show standard, or that, in their opinion, do not comply with the conditions set out hereunder.

#### FLEECES.

Fleeces to be of not more than 12 months' growth, and to be shorn from sheep the property of the exhibitor for at least six months prior to the Show.



Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration on the back of their entry forms that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified, and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

Judges shall give consideration to sows entered in the "Sow and Litter" Classes when making Champion and Reserve Champion

awards.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Swine Section. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge, 12/6 each during the currency of the Show. Seven extra large sheds beyond the end of the Swine Pavilion, each fitted with four sleeping bunks, may be reserved on payment of £1/10/- each.





# RULES.

- 1. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.
- 2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.
- 3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss, or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.
- 4. Birds wearing leg bands or rings, other than those attached outside the Commonwealth, will be disqualified from receiving a prize.
- 5. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

Grand Championship Government Certificates will be awarded for Poultry as under:-

- 1. Light breeds (bantams excepted), best bird, any age or sex.
- Heavy breeds, best bird, any age or sex.

- 4. Best Pair of Birds (pure bred or cross), adapted for export.

# SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

- 1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above classes unless there are at least (6) competitors.
- 2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate is not eligible to compete again.
- 3. Competition will be confined to birds which are the property of and have been bred by the competitor.
- 4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture, when applying for the certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.
- 5. The bird winning the certificate in any class shall, immediately upon such award being made, have two holes punched in the inside web of the left foot. The markings shall be done by or under the supervision of the judge (in the presence of a member of the Committee of the Society) of the Section in which the award is made, who shall not certify to such award unless and until such marking has been carried out.

Labels will be sent for each pen when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and lastructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to When the Exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, each division. "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the coops or cages by the Society.

Selling Prices of all Pigeons may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Pigeon Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

In Utility and Fancy Varieties, all young birds must be rung with 1933-34 A.C.S., A P.S. or C.P.E. ring, or any other recognised club ring of correct size. In Homer Classes, all young birds must be rung with a recognised Club ring. Birds wearing special leg bands or rings, or bearing marks of any kind that may indicate ownership. will not be allowed to compete.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall

be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

2. Each dog must be provided with a suitable collar and metal chain. No cages may be used for dogs other than those provided or approved by the Society, and nothing which will affect the view of the public may be added to the cages. The position of exhibit numbers on benches or cages shall not be altered.

3. A dog may be entered in more than one class if eligible in

accordance with the classification.

4. No dog shall enter the judging ring wearing a collar on which the name of the dog or its owner appears.

5. When being judged, dogs must wear exhibit numbers, which

will be supplied by the Society.

6. Exhibitors will, on personal application to the Superintendent, be permitted to loose their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning, prior to the opening, and in the evening, after the closing of the Exhibition; but they will on no account be permitted to remove their dogs from the yards without a written order from the Superintendent and without leaving a deposit of £2. Entry tickets for dogs will admit exhibitors on the days the dogs are on exhibition before 9.30 a.m. and after 5 p.m., to enable exhibitors to exercise their dogs if they so desire.

Dogs will be subjected to veterinary inspection, and those considered by the Veterinary Surgeon to be unfit for exhibition, either from disease, the effects of disease, vice, or other cause, will not be received, and will be removed if found necessary.

Labels will be sent for each dog when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibito: must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Two or more dogs may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided and labelled.

Note.—The Society's postal and telegraphic address at Show time is Show Grounds, Ascot Vale.

- The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the Dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by Exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to, any Dogs or other property, whether arising from accident or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their officers, agents, servants, or others.
- The Society will engage a thoroughly practical man to feed and take charge of the dogs during the day, and a night watchman will also be on duty.
- 11. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of Dogs which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparation, expense and disarrangement of the Show benches, any person making any entry will be subject to a fine of 10/- for each and every entry of Dogs not exhibited, unless a certificate, under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent, be lodged with the Secretary of the Society at least three days before the opening of the exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused either by (1) the death of the Dog or Dogs; or (2) contagious or infectious disease (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by the Dog or Dogs becoming ineligible for the Class in which they have been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar all persons owning them from exhibiting at future exhibitions of the Society.
- 12. Should any dispute arise in this Section for which no specific rule has been laid down, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

## DEFINITION OF CLASSES.

"Puppy Class" for dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months

of age. (See note below.)

"Novice Class" for dogs six months of age or over, which have not won a first prize in any Class or a Challenge Certificate or Country Challenge Certificate at any exhibition; Encouragement, Maiden, Brace, Team, Litter and all Puppy Classes excepted. (See note below).

"Limit Class" for dogs six months of age or over which have not won a total of four first prizes in any Limit, Australasian-bred and/or Open Classes at any exhibition. (See note below.)

"Australasian-bred Class" for dogs six months of age or over, subject to any height and weight limitations and not deemed to be

imported. (See note below.)

"Open Class" for all dogs six months of age or over. If confined to a breed or variety, for all dogs of that breed or variety. The word "variety" shall be taken as referring to the pure-hred varieties, for which a separate register is kept by the Kennel Club of England at the date of the exhibition at which the classes are offered. (See note below.)

N.B.—Only wins prior to midnight of the day preceding that on which the breed is exhibited shall count. Wins at Parades do not count at Shows. The age of all dogs is computed from and inclusive of the day of their birth to midnight of the first day on which the breed is exhibited.

SPECIAL NOTIFICATION.—No Dog will be allowed to be benched or be admitted to the Judging Ring unless he be examined by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, and the Ring Number Card

stamped, "Pass to Ring."

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon will be in attendance from 8 a.m. till 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 19th October; on Monday, 22nd October; on Wednesday, 24th October, and again on Friday, 26th October, at the same time, for the purpose of examining the dogs.

In each Class the prizes are: - First prize, £1; second prize,

7/6; third prize, Card.

A Kennel Control Council of Victoria Challenge Certificate, with Blue Ribbon, is offered in each breed, one for each sex. The awarding of Challenge Certificates to every breed entered in the "any other recognised breed" class is left to the discretion of the Judge. The Judges may withhold awards if animals are not of sufficient merit.
