SEVEN GOLDEN TIPS.

1. If you begin with a PROVISIONAL PATENT, push on speedily during its nine or ten months' period; produce a first-class embodiment; in suitable cases obtain wide and favourable publicity, and **get right on the market**. Include EXHIBITING at Agricultural Shows, etc. Most steps in Patent matters are important in order to attain success and reduce risk. The whole cost of a PROVISIONAL Patent is £5/5/-, if the invention is simple. See Tip No. 6 as to the field.
2. Secure Patent Rights in full for new and immediately marketable inventions of everyday utility; give simple inventions preference. It is often when on the market profitable to use and Register one or more TRADE MARKS. Some Trade Marks are worth each the best part of a Million Pounds (abroad). As a DESIGN Registration costs little; obtain advice thereon. (Fifteen years for about £10/10/-; or five years for about £5/5/- one class). A DESIGN covers a newly-invented, useful or ornamental shape or pattern of an article or articles. According to the materials used, the Designs are classified. In some classes the cost is less than above. It is wise to Register COPYRIGHT (and costs almost nothing—except sometimes in U.S. America). Copyrights remain in force in some cases nearly 100 years.
3. DON'T agree to part with **any** share in your Invention before settling the terms (which should be written). Have the Agreement prepared by a competent Patent Attorney or Solicitor. Don't sell "for a song." Do not hold out for an immense sum.
4. SCRAP, modify, or remake your models or samples so long as you can improve. Extra expense and extra patience in that direction will yield larger or speedier profit in the end. Defer Patenting, if advisable.
5. Take care to obtain further Patents (in addition to the first) if that will cover improvements produced, which are valuable enough to be monopolised. As two farms are worth more than one, so, frequently, are two Patents.
6. PATENTS abroad should only in some cases be obtained. If wisely marketed, they may pay. They may be applied for in the UNITED STATES, CANADA, BRITAIN, IRELAND, NEW ZEALAND, INDIA, SOUTH AFRICAN UNION, FRANCE, GERMANY, the Argentine, Japan, Belgium, Italy, Mexico, Sweden, Russia, Poland, Czecho-Slovakia, etc. It is easy to waste money in Patenting abroad. A help to obtaining Patents is the INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION. It allows twelve months in which to apply for a Complete Patent for an Invention on which Patent has been applied for in (say) AUSTRALIA. There are forty countries granting that privilege. A free list of these countries is available on application to G. G. TURRI & CO. The twelve months begins when the Patent Application is lodged in the first country (say Australia), even if Provisionally. Only a few countries allow Provisional Patents as such. But in effect, the Convention means they all grant a Provisional, without formality, free for a year, based on the Australian. If the full Patent is not applied for abroad within the year then Convention rights abroad cease to be available.
7. In most cases instruct the Patent Attorneys to search records, and advise as to Prior Patents, etc.; search should at least cover Commonwealth Patents (from 1904). The right time to search is before or after applying Provisionally, before applying for COMPLETE Patent.




THE ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be opened on Thursday, 23rd SEPTEMBER, and will be officially opened by The Hon. Sir Frederick Mann, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.

FRIDAY, 24th SEPTEMBER, 1937

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free. Members also receive two ladies' tickets to admit ladies to the Ground and Grand Stands each day of the Show.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 23rd September (Judging Day), on payment of 2/-, and on the remaining days of the Show, till Saturday, 2nd October (inclusive), from 9 a.m., on payment of 2/-. Admission to Public Grand Stand, 3/- extra; to the "Chirnside" and "Cliff" Stands, 2/- extra, and "Gibsonia" and "Cumming" Stands, 1/- extra. Children under 14 will be admitted to the grounds on a payment of 6d., and to all Grand Stands at half price.

Entrance Tickets may be obtained at the gates, and combined Rail and Show Tickets will be sold at Flinders Street, Tourists' Bureau, Collins Street, and First Class combined Rail and Entrance Tickets at all suburban railway stations, including Frankston, Lilydale, Belgrave, Sunbury and Geelong.

The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

All Mares 3 years old or over entered in Sections 1 to 9 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 4), must have obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer.

A Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and Mares, "Pass to the Ring." These stamped tickets must be produced to the Steward before entering the arena.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 22nd September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 5 p.m. on Friday, 1st October.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Wednesday, 22nd September, at 10 a.m., on Thursday, 23rd September, at 8 a.m., and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates before going into the ring.

The upper portion of the door of Horse Boxes outside the Pavilions must remain open during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of one pound.

CATTLE

Stewards in Chief—Beef Cattle: J. E. ROBERTSON, Esq.
Dairy Cattle: G. L. WILSON, Esq.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 5 p.m. on Friday, 1st October.

The breeding year for all Cattle (including Fats) dates from 1st July in each year.

Nurse Cows are not to be entered for competition, but pens will be provided, at 2/6 each, if application is made at time of entry.

Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging day, or vice versa.

Cows or Heifers entered in the "in calf" classes must be stripped out prior to entering the judging ring.

Judges have the right to order any cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

In all sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for 2/6 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions.


Cows and Heifers in Milk must be in the yards on Wednesday, 22nd September, and be fully milked out prior to 5 p.m. (except Friesians, Section 21, which will be stripped out at 9 p.m.), at which hour they will be stripped out in the presence of the Stewards, or whom they may appoint. They will be judged first on Thursday morning. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out.

Entries of milking stock (Sections 16 to 23 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk, and returns forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

Entries limited to three in each class (except where otherwise specified) from any one exhibitor.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

Any exhibitor who shall without due cause fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of £1.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

All male exhibits of cattle over the age of 12 months shall be rung through the nose, and when on parade or going to and from the parade shall be led by such ring. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for every infringement of this regulation.

Exhibitors of cattle are not permitted to allow persons to ride on the backs of their exhibits. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for any infringement of this regulation.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, exhibits in this Section be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

All Cattle exhibits must be safely secured in the stalls allotted to them. Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage caused through neglect of this regulation.

Exhibits of Cattle which, in the opinion of the Society, ARE NOT IN REASONABLE SHOW CONDITION shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

OVERALLS FOR STOCK ATTENDANTS.

Attendants leading stock, when being judged and on parade, must wear uniform coats, to be secured from the Society.



THIS stud was founded in 1932, and included as its foundation stock seven A.A. cows bred by the Hon. T. H. Payne, Woodburn, Vic., three bred by Mr. A. G. Hunter, Northwood Park, Vic., and two from Dr. Arnold Caddy's Chandpara Stud, Vic. Several of these cows were prize-winners at the Melbourne Royal Show, and the three studs from which they came were at that time well in the lead of A.A. Red Poll breeders in Victoria.

The first bull used was Woodburn Wiseboy 1515 A.A., by Whiteway Wiseman (imp.) 610 A.A. out of Knepp Prudence 3rd (imp.) 1104 A.A. Both Woodburn Wiseboy's grand-sires and grand-dams had an important prize-winning record in England.

Woodburn Wiseboy's first heifer, Ivanhoe Lotus, has been a prize-winner at the last three R.A.S. of Tasmania shows, taking first as a yearling 1934, first as a two-year-old 1935, and first as a three-year-old 1936. Another stud bull now in use at Ivanhoe is Woodburn Merlin 1501 A.A., by Gresham Mohawk (imp.) 1389 A.A.

Show exhibiting commenced at R.A.S. of Tasmania in October, 1932, with increasing success each year until 1936, when awards included first prize in all of the four bull classes and the four cow and heifer classes, the group prize and championships for both bull and cow. JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS.

The steers are to be weighed alive on the day previous to judging and the live weights handed to the judge. In the first place, the steers are to be judged alive (by the Red Poll judge, in the Red Poll ring), on the lines of breed characteristics and suitability for the beef trade. A maximum number of 40 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers are to be sold by auction at the Show Grounds on behalf of exhibitor, and on Tuesday, 28th September, they will be slaughtered in the presence of the judge (a butcher), weighed for dead weight, and judged on appearance, when dressed, for color, quality and value of meat, hide and offal. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcass, hide and offal is 60. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcass judge, who has power to have the carcass cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

After the final awards are made, the meat must be placed on exhibition for two days at butchers' shops within a radius of six miles from Melbourne G.P.O., due notice of days and place to be given to the public. The judges are to be asked to furnish reports on this competition to the Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australasia, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Note.—Exhibits in the above Class are eligible to compete in Classes 350, 351 and 357.





JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS.

The steers are to be weighed alive on the day previous to judging and the live weights handed to the judge. In the first place, the steers are to be judged alive (by the Dairy Shorthorn judge, in the Dairy Shorthorn ring), on the lines of breed characteristics and suitability for the beef trade. A maximum number of 40 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers are to be sold by auction at the Show Grounds on behalf of exhibitor, and on Tuesday, 28th September, they will be slaughtered in the presence of the judge (a butcher), weighed for dead weight, and judged on appearance, when dressed, for color, quality and value of meat, hide and offal. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcass, hide and offal is 60. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcass judge, who has power to have the carcass cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

After the final awards are made, the meat must be placed on exhibition for two days at butchers' shops within a radius of six miles from Melbourne G.P.O., due notice of days and place to be given to the public. The judges are to be asked to furnish reports on this competition to the Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Note.—Exhibits in the above Class are eligible to compete in Classes 350, 351 and 357.

FEEDING SHEEP — CAUTION !

Sheep must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.
