



Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 5 p.m. on Friday, 1st October, except animals entered in Class 582, which may be removed from the grounds after 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 29th September.

Age of all pigs to be calculated to day of judging (23rd September, 1937). The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In Classes 525 to 581 (inclusive), all exhibits over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book, and pigs in classes under the age of four months, must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' In the classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

All sows 2 years old or over must be in pig or have produced a recorded litter during the 12 months prior to the closing date of entries.

All boars 15 months old or over must have had their tusks cut within one month prior to the Show.

The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires and dams of exhibits MUST be stated on entry form.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Stud Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Swine not registered prior to 31st July will only be permitted to be entered for the Show on payment of double entry fees.

Exhibitors must be financial members of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society, and entries are limited to two in each class from any one exhibitor, in whose name the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding.

Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration on the back of their entry forms that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified, and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

Judges shall give consideration to sows entered in the "Sow and Litter" Classes when making Champion and Reserve Champion awards.

No pig shall be transferred from its numbered pen without the sanction of the officer in charge.

Special attention is directed to the Classes for Eggs. See Classes 900 to 905.

Poultry MUST be penned before 9 p.m., Tuesday, 28th September, but, in order to avoid disappointments, exhibitors are advised to despatch their birds so that they will arrive as early as possible on that day.

Poultry arriving at Spencer-street Railway Station at or before 5.55 p.m. on Tuesday, 28th September, will be conveyed by special train to the Show Grounds Siding at Flemington.

NOTE.—When forwarding poultry by rail, exhibitors are particularly requested to mark clearly in each compartment of the coop the exhibit number of the bird that was sent therein, so that the same arrangement of birds may be made for the return journey.

POULTRY.

Tags bearing the pen numbers will be forwarded to exhibitors. together with entry tickets. These tags must be securely fastened to the legs of the birds in accordance with the exhibit numbers on the entry tickets.

Selling prices of all Poultry exhibits may be displayed on coops. Cards will be supplied free on application to the Poultry Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

Exhibits must not be handled unless the authority of the Superintendent be first obtained.

RULES.

1. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.

- 2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.
- 3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss, or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.
- 4. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

Grand Championship Government Certificates will be awarded for Poultry as under:-

1. Light breeds (bautams excepted), best bird, any age or sex.

Heavy breeds, best bird, any age or sex.
 Best Duck or Drake.

4. Best Pair of Birds (pure bred or cross), adapted for export.


SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above classes unless there are at least (6) competitors.

2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate is not eligible to compete again.

3. Competition will be confined to birds which are the property of and have been bred by the competitor.

4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture, when applying for the certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.

NOTE.—Pigeons will be received and penned, fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

Birds belonging to Interstate exhibitors will be returned on Monday, 4th October, 1937.

Only a limited number of exhibitors will be allowed into the Pigeon House at a time to remove their birds. No birds to be removed till the termination of the Show on Saturday, 2nd October, 1937.

Prizes in all Classes will be based upon the following scale: -

From one to three entries—8/-; 3/-.

From four to six entries-12/-; 5/-; Card.

From seven to nine entries—15/-; 10/-; 5/-.

Ten entries or over—£1; 10/-; 5/-.

Labels will be sent for each pen when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the Exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and Interstate Exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to each division. When the Exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the coops or cages by the Society.

Selling Prices of all Pigeons may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Pigeon Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

In Utility and Fancy Varieties, all young birds must be rung with 1936-37 A.C.S., A.P.S. or C.P.E. ring, or any other recognised club ring of correct size. In Homer Classes, all young birds must be rung with a recognised Club ring. Birds wearing special leg bands or rings, or bearing marks of any kind that may indicate ownership. will not be allowed to compete.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The Exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

For the convenience of intending exhibitors, the office will be open for the reception of entries till 9.30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday evenings, 19th and 20th August.

Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society, and will only be received subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry.

No bird may be entered in more than one Class, and birds entered In wrong classes will not be judged and the entry fees will be forfeited.

ENTRY FEE 1/-. PRIZES IN EACH CLASS will be:-First, 5/- and 40 per cent. of entry fees. Second, 2/6 and 20 per cent. of entry fees. Third, Card and 10 per cent. of entry fees.

(See particulars of Special Prizes and Trophies at end of Section.) Birds must be delivered to the Superintendent at the Pigeon Pavilion on the Show Grounds not later than 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 22nd September. Country and interstate exhibitors may make arrangements with the Society to receive their birds and return them after the Show.

Exhibitors must provide suitable cages for their birds, standard if possible. Gummed labels to be affixed thereto will be supplied by the Society.

No bird suffering from any disease will be allowed to be exhibited.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Thursday, 23rd September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion on that day. The Pavilion will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Friday, 24th September, and from 9 a.m. until 9.45 p.m. on Saturday, 25th September.

During the Show the birds will be in the custody of the Society, and must not be touched or handled by the owner or any person on any pretence whatever without the permission of the Superintendent.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their birds before 10 p.m. on Saturday, 25th September.

The Society will arrange for a competent person to feed and otherwise attend to the birds, and caretakers will be on duty in the Pavilion night and day during the currency of the Show.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

The State Electoral Districts obtaining the largest aggregate number of points throughout the various sections as specified hereunder will be awarded the following prizes:—First prize, £80; second prize, £40; third prize, £25; fourth prize, £15; fifth prize, £10.

Exhibitors must indicate on their entry forms the name of the State Electoral District in which they reside, and only the prizesgained by such exhibitors will be permitted to count in the aggregate. (No points will be given for any award unless the Electoral District is specified on the entry form.)

In the Clydesdale section and in the Cattle Breeding sections, points will be awarded for a first prize, 6 for a second, and 3 for a third. In all other Horse Breeding sections, in the sections for Breeding Sheep and Swine, and in the Cereal Classes, 6 points will be awarded for each first prize, 4 for each second prize, and 2 for each third prize.

In the sections for Farm and Lorry Horses, Saddle and Harness Horses and Ponies, Fat Cattle, Fat Sheep, Bacon and Pork Pigs, and all Farm Produce (except cereals), Dairy Produce, Fruits and Wine, 3 points will be awarded for each first prize, 2 for a second, and 1 for a third.

In the Poultry section, except the classes for Bantams, and in the Cooking division in the Women's Industry section, 1 point will be awarded for each first prize and half a point for each second prize.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

- 1. Collections may consist of the following:—Farm, Dairy, Horticultural and Pastoral Produce, including Wool, Wine, Vegetables. Roots, etc., and Wood.
- 2. Societies may compete in all the subdivisions mentioned in the scale of points at the foot hereof, or may, at their discretion, delete any part or parts carrying points not exceeding 100. All Societies must, however, compete in Section 13—Effective Arrangement. No Society will partake in the distribution of the prize money unless its exhibits are awarded 450 points or over. A list of the deleted sections or subsections (if any) to be delivered to the Society's office on the Show Grounds at least 48 hours before the judging is timed to commence. Prize money will be divided on the basis that the percentage of points actually scored bears to the number of points competed for.
- 3. Exhibits entered for the Agricultural Societies' Competitions are not eligible to compete in the general classes. Exhibitors wishing to compete in open classes must forward a separate exhibit.
- 4. Each exhibit will be allowed from 850 to 1000 square feet of floor space.
- 5. All collections of exhibits must be in charge of a responsible officer of the Society sending the same, who will have to arrange and display the exhibit to the best advantage. Exhibits must be completed before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 23rd September.
- 6. On application to the Secretary, one approved attendant from each Society competing will be allowed to assist in locating the exhibits while the judging is taking place, but he will be removed from the building if he interferes with the Judge in any way.
- 7. Exhibits must be produced, prepared or manufactured within a radius of 30 miles of the Show Grounds of the Society entering same, and, with the exception of wines and woods, must have been produced within 12 months previous to date of entry. Woods and wines may be of any age, but the latter must be from a vineyard that is producing at time of exhibition. Exhibits may be manufactured from produce secured beyond the 30-mile radius and wool grown in the district may be scoured beyond the 30-mile radius. No exhibits produced or manufactured in the capital cities of Australia or within a five-mile radius of the General Post Office of same will be allowed to compete.

NOTE.—Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration when lodging their entries that their exhibits comply with Condition 7.

8. Exhibitors are required, in arranging their exhibits, to place them in such a manner as to facilitate judging. The Judges shall have the right to sample all foods and preserves.

9. SCALE OF POINTS FOR JUDGING.

NOTE.—Provided the quality of exhibits in any section is equal, a greater number of points will be awarded to the collection in which the greater number of varieties is shown. Wheat and potatoes are limited to twenty varieties in each case.

- 2. Wine-grower shall mean any wine-grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and manufacturing wine from grapes grown in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for the purpose of wine-making, and although the wine-grower be also a wine merchant, he may exhibit in the wine-growers' section, provided his entry be accompanied by a statutory declaration to the effect that his exhibit was manufactured at his own vineyard.
- 3. Exhibitors must mark on bottles, in plain figures, the year of the Exhibition (1937) and the number of the Class in which each sample is entered. The bottles for wines must be wine bottles (reputed quarts), and aerated waters and cider may be either pints or quarts. All bottles must be labelled with business labels or the name of the Exhibitor. Exhibitors must also mark their names and addresses on their cases or hampers.
- 4. The name, character and vintage of the wines must be stated on the entry forms, which must be duly lodged with the Secretary. (See General Regulations.)

With the exception of Class 1647, no prizes are offered for competition in this Section, the display being made by members of the Nurserymen and Seedsmen's Association of Victoria under an arrangement between this Society and that Association, which has appointed a committee to organise the Section and allocate the space available for displays in the Horticultural Hall.

1647. SPECIAL PRIZES of £20, £10 and £5 will be awarded for displays made by District Horticultural Societies or Clubs, and £5 will be allowed as organising expenses for each approved

Three competent judges will be appointed to adjudicate in the Competition, which will be conducted under the following conditions:

- 1. The Competition shall be for a Floral Display, which may be supported with pot plants and/or foliage. Self or any other cut foliage permissible. Exhibits will be judged mainly on their decorative value to the Exhibition.
- 2. The size or ground plan of each exhibit shall be within a circumscribing rectangle having an area of 12 feet by 8 feet.

4. All exhibits must be completed for judging by 1 p.m. on Saturday, 25th September.

5. Staging may be commenced any time on Thursday, 23rd September, and/or on any succeeding days until the Saturday morning.

- 6. Any pot plants exhibited must have been in possession of the Horticultural Society's contributing member at least two months before the opening of the Horticultural Division of the Royal Agricultural Show on 25th September, 1937.
- 7. Flowers and plants may be drawn from any sources other than the nurseries and gardes of nurserymen and municipal councils.
- 8. Any floral designs or parts thereof to be introduced as a feature must be made up at the place of staging the Inter-Society Exhibits.
- 9. In the arrangement of the stands, principals or employees of nurserymen, municipal gardens and florists are debarred from taking any part, either in handling the blooms or supervising the staging of the exhibit.
- 10. Staging money amounting to £3 towards expenditure incurred in staging, carriage, etc., will be paid to each Society that stages an exhibit obtaining not less than 50 per cent. of the maximum points at time of judging, or reaching a standard to the satisfaction of the Judges, and is maintained until the close of the Inter-Society Competition.
- 11. A further £2 will be awarded for each exhibit that is maintained to the satisfaction of the Royal Agricultural Society Stewards until the termination of the Inter-Society Competition at the night session on Thursday, 30th September.

- 12. Winners of the first, second and third prizes must keep up their maintenance for the full period in order to claim prize money.
- 13. Bottles should be excluded from the stands, and earthenware or other suitable containers with wide bases used, in order to withstand any possible brushing over by the public or through other causes.
- 14. All tables, tiering and other material to be used in building up the stands, containers, etc., and the carriage of exhibits, must be provided by the competing Society.
- 15. The erection of neatly-executed cardboard signs denoting the name of the Society, size not to be unnecessarily large, will be permitted on each exhibit.
- 16. No trading card or cards will be permitted to be displayed on any exhibit staged in this Competition, nor any trading done therefrom.
- 17. The display of trophies or prize cards not relating to the particular event is prohibited.
- 18. At the discretion of the "Garden Week" Committee, and on the submission of show prize schedules and Society literature for perusal, distribution from the stands will be authorised.
- 19. Arrangements will be made with the Show Grounds staff to clear the thoroughfares of all discarded flowers and other litter, which, after the opening day, must be ready for clearance by the groundsmen by 10 a.m. daily.
- 20. Each Society shall appoint its own attendants to be responsible for the respective Societies' stands throughout the event.
