A maximum number of 40 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers are to be sold by auction at the Show Grounds on behalf of exhibitor, and on Tuesday, 27th September, they will be slaughtered in the presence of the Judge (a butcher), weighed for dead weight, and judged on appearance, when dressed, for colour, quality and value of meat, hide and offal. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcase, hide and offal is 60. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcase Judge, who has power to have the carcase cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

After the final awards are made, the meat must be placed on exhibition for two days at butchers' shops within a radius of six miles from Melbourne G.P.O., due notice of days and place to be given to the public. The Judges are to be asked to furnish reports on this competition to the Red Poll Cattle Breeders' Association of Australia, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Note.—Exhibits in the above Class are eligible to compete in Classes 478, 479 and 485.

Prizes in this Division are presented by the Government of Victoria.

Cows competing in these Classes must have gained a Government Herd Testing Certificate during the year ending 31st July, 1938.

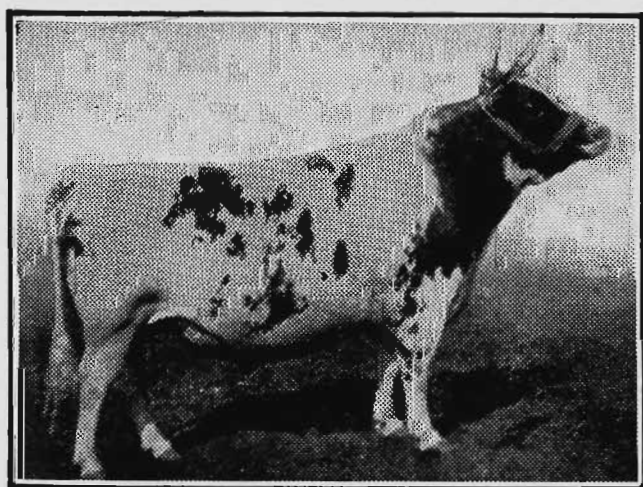

Inspectors will examine all registered British Breeds and Corriedale Sheep exhibited, and any found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed will be disqualified, and all prizes won by such sheep will be cancelled.

Sheep in Sections 27 to 37 inclusive are only required in the yards from 10 a.m. on Monday, 26th September (when judging commences), until 5 p.m. on Friday, 30th September.

Sheep must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. The exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge: Five shillings during currency of Show. Seven large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of 10/- each.

Toonallook, which lies in the Upper Murray country 28 miles from Albury, comprises 8200 acres freehold of picturesque well cleared hills and fertile valleys with beautiful warm rich flats, and has a rainfall of 27 in. per annum.

When Messrs. F. C. and N. L. Griffith acquired the property in 1935 (their father, Mr. Lionel C. Griffith, having purchased it in 1914 from the Mitchells), they lost no time in commencing a stud flock of Romney Marsh sheep and in laying down high class improvements. For many years Romney cross sheep have been a feature of the station's production, and the present owners aim in due course to run about 4000 bought Merino wethers, about 3000 Romney cross breeding ewes, and about 1000 high class Romney Marsh stud ewes, together with the resulting lambs and young sheep, besides a herd of about 300 Red Poll cattle.

The foundation of the stud comprised 542 ewes selected from over 1000 stud ewes purchased from Currandooley, where the late Mr. Harry Osborne had a well-known stud (Flock No. 34), which he founded in 1913 chiefly on Parorangi (N.Z.) blood, and maintained with English Romney Marsh rams. Messrs. Griffiths Bros. also purchased four hogget rams from Chatsbury and three rams from New Zealand, one of the latter being 98/35 from Parorangi, which won champion honours at Cootamundra show last year. At the Parorangi and Mahoe dispersal sales in 1937 they personally secured a number of the best stud ewes (in lamb to top sires), paying up to 32 guineas for same, and three rams, one of the latter being Parorangi 133/33, bought at 190 guineas.

There are 570 stud Romney breeding ewes to-day at Toonallook, 350 of which are due to lamb this year to the New Zealand rams. Although they exhibited at the Sydney Sheep Show for the first time last year, with imported sheep, seasonal conditions this year have kept the owners fully occupied and they have decided not to show. However, the stud will be represented next year with several promising young sheep of its own breeding.

Both Mr. Fred Griffith and his brother, Mr. Norman Griffith, are applying a methodical, intelligent, and practical interest to the development of the stud along sound lines, and buyers can be sure of satisfaction. Orders are now being booked for rams for forward delivery.

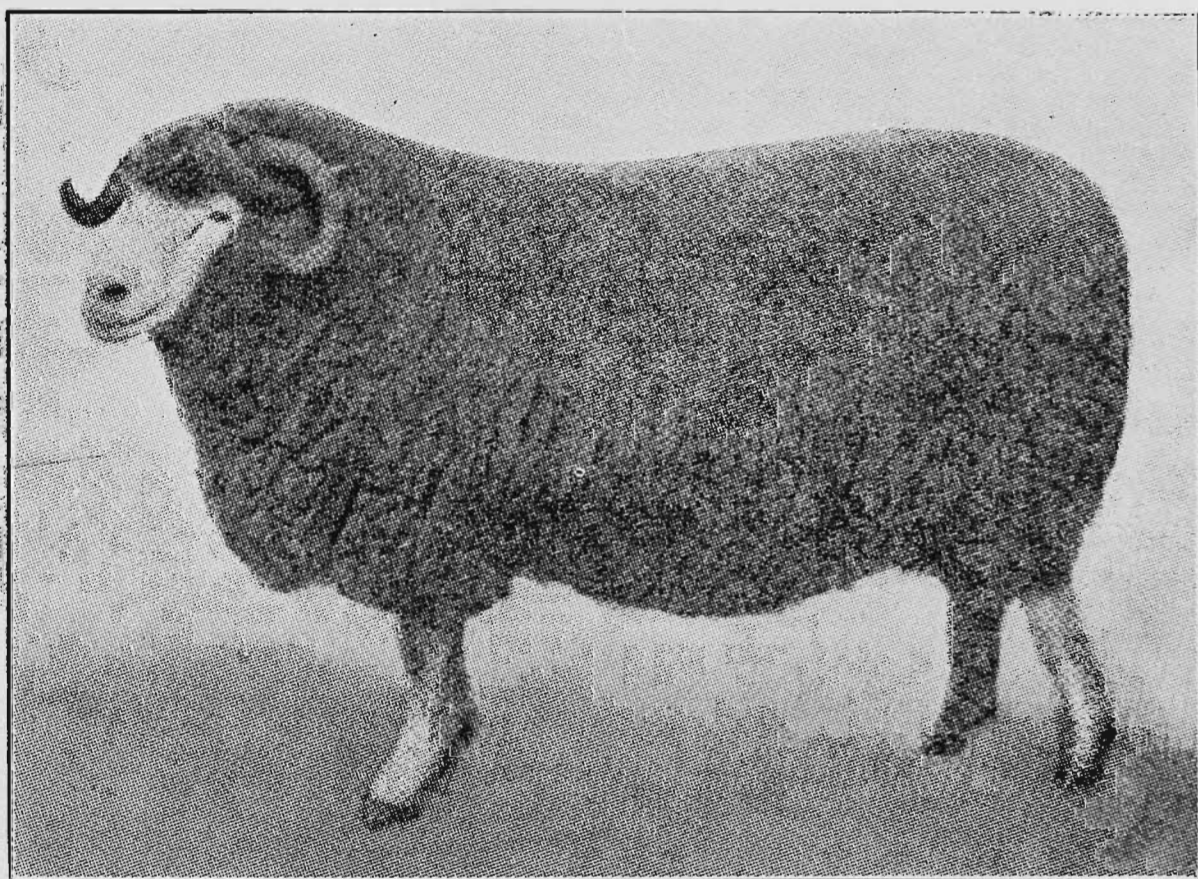

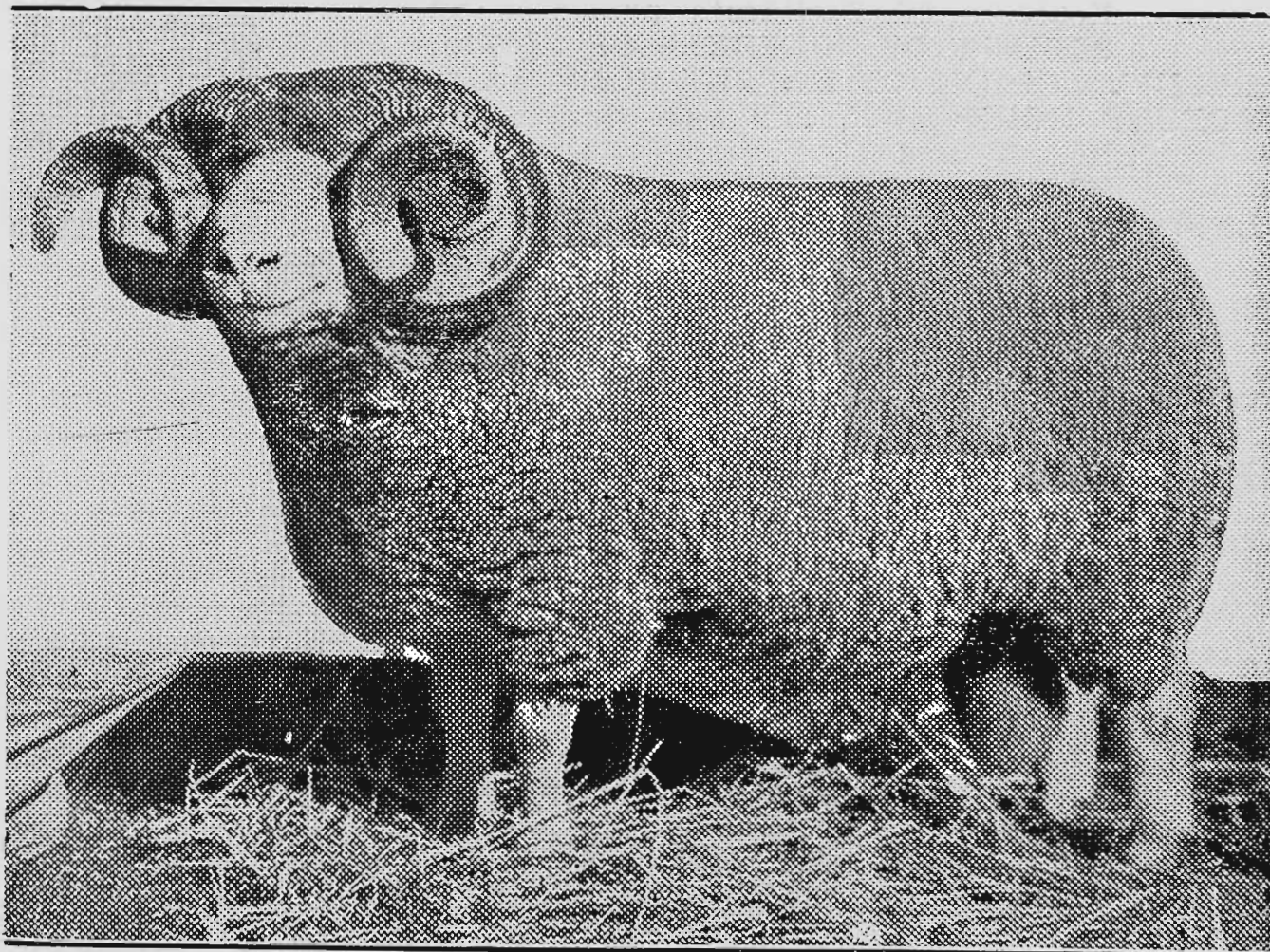

Section 40—Pigs.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 5 p.m. on Friday, 30th September, except animals entered in Class 707, which may be removed from the grounds after 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 28th September.

Age of all pigs to be calculated to 15th September in each year. The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In Classes 650 to 706 (inclusive), all exhibits over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book. Pigs in classes under the age of four months must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society, and must not exceed 150 lbs. live weight. In the classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

Inspectors will examine all pigs exhibited and report to the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society (Victorian Branch). All pigs not visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society will be disqualified, and all prizes won by such pigs will be cancelled.

All sows 2 years old or over must be in pig or have produced a recorded litter during the 12 months prior to the closing date of entries.

All boars 15 months old or over must have had their tusks cut within one month prior to the Show.

The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires and dams of exhibits MUST be stated on entry form.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Stud Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Exhibitors must be financial members of the Australian Stud Pig Breeders' Society, and entries are limited to two in each class from any one exhibitor, in whose name the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding.

Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration on the back of their entry forms that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified, and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

Judges shall give consideration to sows entered in the "Sow and Litter" Classes when making Champion and Reserve Champion awards.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Pig Section. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge, 12/6 each during the currency of the Show. Seven extra large sheds beyond the end of the Pig Pavilion, each fitted with four sleeping bunks, may be reserved on payment of £1/10/- each.

No pig shall be transferred from its numbered pen without the sanction of the officer in charge.

2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs. On the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.

3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

4. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATES will be awarded for Poultry as under:—

1. Light breeds (bantams excepted), best bird, any age or sex.
2. Heavy breeds, best bird, any age or sex.
3. Best Duck or Drake.
4. Best Pair of Birds (pure bred or cross), adapted for export.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above classes unless there are at least six (6) competitors.

2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate is not eligible to compete again.

3. Competition will be confined to birds which are the property of and have been bred by the competitor.

4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture, when applying for the certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.

5. The bird winning the certificate in any class shall, immediately upon such award being made, have two holes punched in the inside web of the left foot. The markings shall be done by or under the supervision of the judge (in the presence of a member of the Committee of the Society) of the Section in which the award is made who shall not certify to such award unless and until such marking has been carried out.

6. The Department will supply to the Secretary of the Society a punch for use by the judge. This punch must be returned by registered post to the Director of Agriculture immediately after the Show.

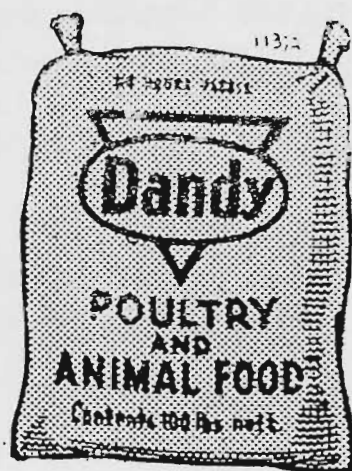

26th SEPTEMBER.**

NOTE.—Pigeons will be received and penned, fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

Unless special arrangements are made with the Superintendent, all eggs will be destroyed.

Birds belonging to interstate exhibitors will be returned on Monday, 3rd October, 1938.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, 27th September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion until after the completion of judging. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the completion of judging until 10 p.m. on Tuesday, 27th September; from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Wednesday, 28th; Thursday, 29th, and Friday, 30th September, and from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Saturday, 1st October.

Only a limited number of exhibitors will be allowed into the Pigeon House at a time to remove their birds. No birds to be removed till the termination of the Show on Saturday, 1st October, 1938.

For the convenience of exhibitors, the office will be open for the reception of entries till 9.30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday evenings, 18th and 19th August, 1938.

Prizes in all Classes will be based upon the following scale:—
From one to three entries, 8/-, 3/-; from four to six entries, 12/-, 5/-, Card; from seven to nine entries, 15/-, 10/-, 5/-; ten entries or over, £1, 10/-, 5/-.

Labels will be sent for each pen when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may

be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the coops or cages by the Society.

Selling prices of all pigeons may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Pigeon Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

In Utility and Fancy Varieties, all young birds must be rung with 1937-38 A.C.S., A.P.S. or C.P.E. ring, or any other recognised club ring of correct size. In Homer Classes, all young birds must be rung with a recognised club ring. Birds wearing special leg bands or rings, or bearing marks of any kind that may indicate ownership, will not be allowed to compete.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

For the convenience of intending exhibitors, the office will be open for the reception of entries till 9.30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday evenings, 18th and 19th August.

Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society, and will only be received subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

Exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry.

No bird may be entered in more than one class, and birds entered in wrong classes will not be judged and the entry fees will be forfeited.

Entry fee, 1/-. Prizes in each class will be:—First, 5/- and 40 per cent. of entry fees; Second, 2/6 and 20 per cent. of entry fees; Third, Card and 10 per cent. of entry fees. (See particulars of Special Prizes and Trophies at end of Section.)

Budgerigars must be delivered to the Superintendent at the Pigeon Pavilion on the Show Grounds not later than 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 21st September. Canaries, Finches and Cage Birds must be delivered not later than 9 p.m. on Thursday, 22nd September. Country and interstate exhibitors may make arrangements with the Society to receive their birds and return them after the Show.

Exhibitors must provide suitable cages for their birds—standard, if possible. Gummed labels to be affixed thereto will be supplied by the Society.

No bird suffering from any disease will be allowed to be exhibited.

Judging of Budgerigars will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Thursday, 22nd September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion on that day. Judging of Canaries, Finches and Cage Birds will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Friday, 23rd September. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the conclusion of judging until 10 p.m. on Friday, 23rd September, and from 9 a.m. until 9.45 p.m. on Saturday, 24th September.

During the Show the birds will be in the custody of the Society, and must not be touched or handled by the owner or any person, on any pretence whatever, without the permission of the Superintendent.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their birds before 10 p.m. on Saturday, 24th September.

The Society will arrange for a competent person to feed and otherwise attend to the birds, and caretakers will be on duty in the Pavilion night and day during the currency of the Show.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Exhibitors of birds which are protected or kept under permit must produce their permit when called upon to do so. The Society does not accept any responsibility in this matter. Entries can only be accepted on this condition.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

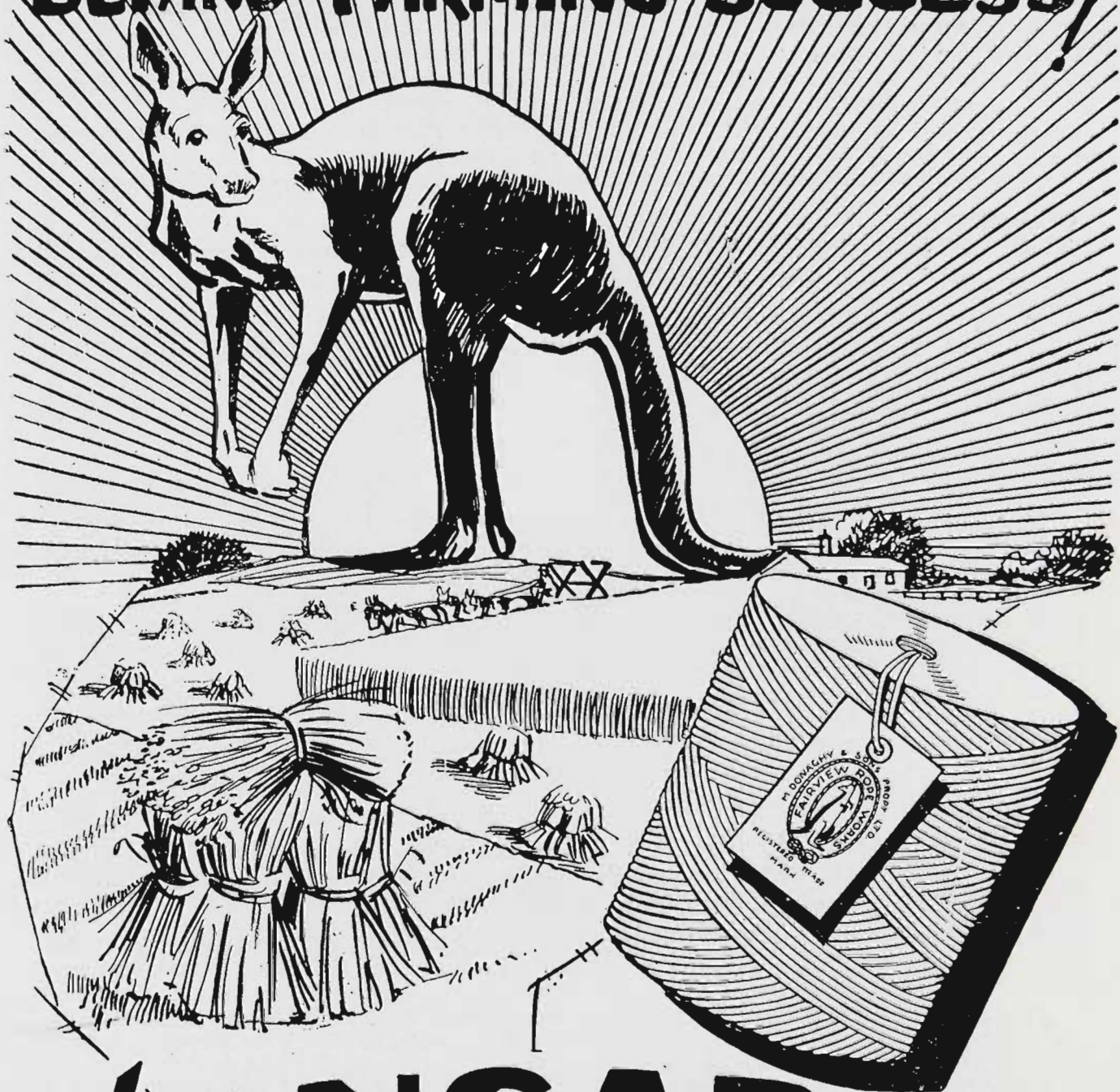
