

#### JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS.

The steers are to be weighed alive on the day previous to judging and the live weights handed to the Judge. In the first place the steers are to be judged alive (by the Dairy Shorthorn Judge, in the Dairy Shorthorn ring), on the lines of breed characteristics and suitability for the beef trade. A maximum number of 40 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers are to be sold by auction at Newmarket on behalf of exhibitor, and on Thursday, 26th September, they will be slaughtered in the presence of the Judge (a butcher), weighed for dead weight, and judged on appearance, when dressed, for colour, quality and value of meat, hide and offal. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcase, hide and offal is 60. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcase Judge, who has power to have the carcase cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

After the final awards are made, the meat must be placed on exhibition for two days at butchers' shops within a radius of six miles from Melbourne G.P.O., due notice of days and place to be given to the public. The judges are to be asked to furnish reports on this competition to the Dairy Shorthorn Association of Australia, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Inspectors will examine all registered British Breeds, Corriedale and Polwarth Sheep exhibited prior to judging and discard all not up to standard and not fairly and evenly shorn. Any found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed will be disqualified.

Sheep in Sections 29 to 41 inclusive are only required in the yards from 10 a.m. on Monday, 23rd September (when judging commences),

until 12 noon on Friday, 27th September.

Sheep must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. The exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

A ewe entered as "with her own lamb at foot" may be transferred to the Class provided for ewe of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, or vice versa.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge: Five shillings during currency of Show. Several large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of 10/each.

All sheep entered in Sections 29 to 41 (inclusive) must be registered in the exhibitor's name and be the property of exhibitors registered in an approved public Flock Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as the owner from any one holding.

All Sheep (except Corriedales) over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn since 1st August, 1945, except where otherwise specified, and judges are empowered to disqualify exhibits that, in their opinion, do not conform to this regulation. Date of shearing to be given on entry form. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1st July, 1945.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be

removed from the yards.

Exhibits of shorn sheep must be closely and evenly shorn on or before 1st September, 1946. No sheep entered in a shorn class may have more than three-quarters of an inch of wool on any part of its body on judging day.

Sheep that have been unfairly shorn or unfairly trimmed will be disqualified.

Sheep entered by name or tag number and/or with individual pedigree may not be substituted.

Entries limited to two in each class from any one exhibitor.

#### THE EGG & EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD OF VICTORIA

#### SUBMITS SOME INTERESTING FACTS FOR YOUR

#### CONSIDERATION.

At the time of the last Royal Agricultural Show the Board quoted, in this space, statistics showing the increase in egg production from the time of its inception to the close of the financial year 1939/40, and gave a brief summary of its activities in Producers' interests to that date. Further statistical information is now printed, giving an indication of the industry's development over the war years.

On 1st July, 1943, the Commonwealth Government, by virtue of powers acquired under National Security Regulations, set up an organisation under the Controller of Egg Supplies to control the industry and market the ever-increasing supplies. The Controller of Egg Supplies, therefore, has functioned in relation to marketing the surplus production on a nation-wide basis exactly as the Board did on a State-wide basis. The Prices Commissioner made a uniform price for the whole of Australia.

The advantages of this wider control are obvious, but the future of the Victorian Board, which has acted as Agent for the Controller in Victoria to this date, depends on the organisation which will take the place of the Controller of Egg Supplies.

It is considered desirable that the beneficial features of the present control should be retained, for a study of the figures quoted above, plus the knowledge that only 60 per cent. of Victoria's production is consumed locally, makes it obvious to the reasoning man that organised marketing is even more vital than in the pre-war years.

The Victorian Board looks forward to the continued cooperation of the industry, and is confident that as an efficientlyorganised producers' co-operative, all problems which confront the future of this industry will be dealt with successfully.

# PIGS

## Section 44 Pigs

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 5 p.m. on FRIDAY, 27th September.

Age of all pigs to be calculated to 15th September in each year. The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In Classes 695 to 744 (inclusive) all exhibits over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book. Pigs in classes under the age of four months must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society. In the Classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

All sows 2 years old or over must be in pig or have produced a recorded litter during the 12 months prior to the closing date of entries.

All boars 15 months old or over must have had their tusks cut within one month prior to the Show, and the Superintendent is empowered to remove from the Show Grounds any boar whose tusks have not been cut.

The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires and dams of exhibits MUST be stated on entry form.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Stud Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Exhibitors must be financial members of the Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society, whose herds must be accredited as Brucellosis-free by the Department of Agriculture.

Entries are limited to two in each class from any one exhibitor, in whose name the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding.

Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration that their entries are true and correct in every particular, that their exhibits are eligible for entry according to the conditions specified, and subject to the Rules, Regulations and By-laws of the Society, and that their exhibits, and the holding or holdings on which such exhibits were kept, have been free from swine fever for 12 months prior to the date of entry.

- 1. Competition is limited to financial members of the Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society, whose herds have been accredited as Brucellosis-free by the Department of Agriculture.
- 2. Pigs must be bred by exhibitor and be pure bred or first cross of two pure breeds.
- 3. All nominated litters must be by sires and from dams that are either fully registered as purebreds or from litters notified in accordance with the rules of the Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society.

- 4. Not more than three litter nominations in each class will be accepted from any one breeder.
- 5. Each litter to be nominated to the Secretary of the Royal Agricultural Society one month before the expected farrowing date so that Stock Inspectors may be prepared to inspect and mark the litter at birth. (No fee for nominations).
- 6. The birth of the litter to be reported immediately to the District Stock Inspector by the nominator, who must also record it with the Australian Stud and Commercial Pig Breeders' Society.
- 7. The Stock Inspector will ear mark or tattoo the pigs of the litter as soon after birth as possible, and then, when they are eight weeks old, he will check the identification of the litter and weigh the pigs.

#### ENTRIES:

- 8. An entry shall comprise two pigs (2 sows, 2 barrows, or 1 sow and 1 barrow) from one and the same nominated litter.
- 9. No exhibitor may make more than two entries in each class. The two entries may come from one or two nominated litters.
- 10. Pigs entered for this competition must be penned not later than 5 p.m. on Tuesday, 17th September, and must not be fed or watered thereafter. Weighing will commence at 8 a.m., on Wednesday, 18th September, when identification marks of entered pigs will be checked.

Special attention is directed to the Classes for Eggs. Classes 1062 to 1067.)

Poultry MUST be penned before 9 p.m., Monday, 23rd September, but, in order to avoid disappointments, exhibitors are advised to despatch their birds so that they will arrive as early as possible on that day.

Poultry arriving at Spencer Street Railway Station at or before 5.55 p.m. on Monday, 23rd September, will be conveyed by special train to the Show Grounds Siding at Flemington.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, 24th September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion until after the completion of judging. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the completion of judging until 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 24th September; from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 25th; Thursday, 26th, and Friday, 27th September, and from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September.

NOTE.—When forwarding poultry by rail, exhibitors are particularly requested to mark clearly in each compartment of the coop the exhibit number of the bird that was sent therein, so that the same arrangement of birds may be made for the return journey.

Tags bearing the pen numbers will be forwarded to exhibitors, together with entry tickets. These tags must be securely fastened to the legs of the birds in accordance with the exhibit numbers on the entry tickets.

Selling prices of all Poultry exhibits may be displayed on coops. Cards will be supplied free on application to the Poultry Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

Exhibits must not be handled unless the authority of the Superintendent be first obtained.

#### RULES.

- 1. Cockerel and Pullet shall mean a bird hatched on or after 1st July in previous year. Young Ducks or Young Drakes must be twelve months old or under on the first day of the Show.
- 2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs. On the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.
- 3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the Exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.
- 4. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATES will be awarded for Poultry as under:—
