NOTE.—Pigeons will be received and penned, fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

Unless special arrangements are made with the Superintendent, all eggs will be destroyed.

Birds belonging to interstate exhibitors will be returned on Monday, 30th September, 1946.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, 24th September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion until after the completion of judging. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the completion of judging until 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 24th September; from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 25th; Thursday, 26th, and Friday, 27th September, and from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September.

Only a limited number of exhibitors will be allowed into the Pigeon House at a time to remove their birds. No birds to be removed till the termination of the Show on Saturday, 28th September, 1946.

For the convenience of exhibitors, the office will be open for the reception of entries till 9.30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday evenings, 15th and 16th August, 1946.

Prizes in all Classes will be based upon the following scale:—
From one to three entries, 8/-, 3/-; from four to six entries, 12/-, 5/-, Card; from seven to nine entries, 15/-, 10/-, 5/-; ten entries or over, £1, 10/-, 5/-.

Labels will be sent for each pen when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the coops or cages by the Society.

Selling prices of all pigeons may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Pigeon Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

In Utility and Fancy Varieties, all young birds must be rung with 1945-46 A.C.S. or A.P.S. ring, or any other recognised club ring. In Homer Classes, all young birds must be rung with a recognised club ring, and the ring numbers of all birds must be given on the entry form. Birds wearing special leg bands or rings, or bearing marks of any kind that may indicate ownership, will not be allowed to compete.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

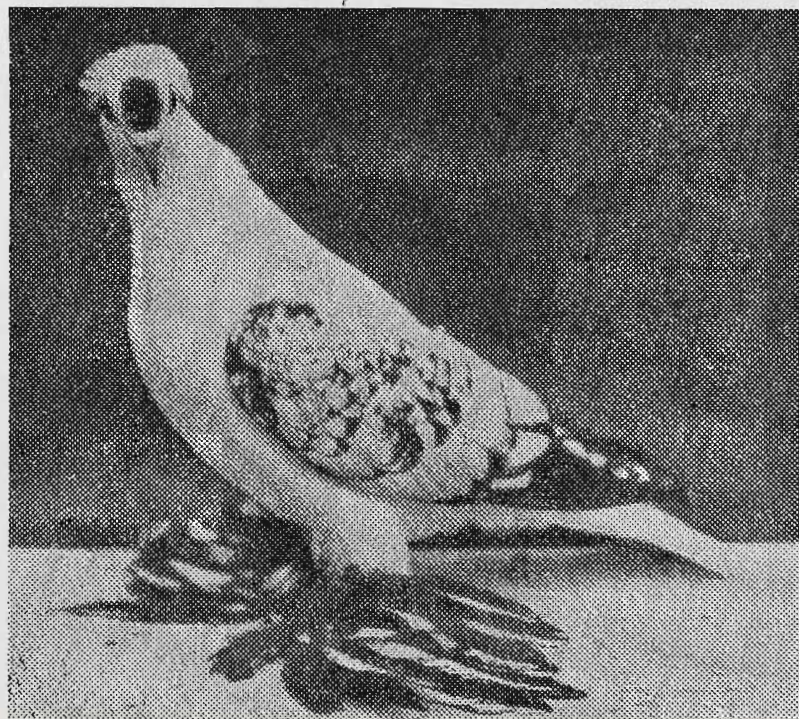

For the convenience of intending exhibitors, the office will be open for the reception of entries till 9.30 p.m. on Thursday and Friday evenings, 15th and 16th August.

Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society, and will only be received subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Society.

Exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry.

No bird may be entered in more than one class, and birds entered in wrong classes will not be judged and the entry fees will be forfeited.

Entry fee, 1/-. Prizes in each class will be:—First, 5/- and 40 per cent. of entry fees; Second, 2/6 and 20 per cent of entry fees; Third, Card and 10 per cent. of entry fees. (See particulars of Special Prizes and Trophies at end of Section.)

Budgerigars must be delivered to the Superintendent at the Pigeon Pavilion on the Show Grounds not later than 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September. Canaries, Finches and Cage Birds must be delivered not later than 9 p.m. on Thursday, 19th September. Country and interstate exhibitors may make arrangements with the Society to receive their birds and return them after the Show.

Exhibitors must provide suitable cages for their birds—standard, if possible. Gummed labels to be affixed thereto will be supplied by the Society, and no addition must be made to these labels by exhibitors. In the event of an exhibitor adding to the information included on the label by the Society, the bird to whose cage this label is attached will be disqualified.

No bird suffering from any disease will be allowed to be exhibited.

Judging of Budgerigars will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Thursday, 19th September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion on that day. Judging of Canaries, Finches and Cage Birds will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Friday, 20th September. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the conclusion of judging until 9 p.m. on Friday, 20th September, and from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Saturday, 21st September.

During the Show the birds will be in the custody of the Society, and must not be touched or handled by the owner or any person, on any pretence whatever, without the permission of the Superintendent.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their birds before 9 p.m. on Saturday, 21st September.

The Society will arrange for a competent person to feed and otherwise attend to the birds, and caretakers will be on duty in the Pavilion night and day during the currency of the Show.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Exhibitors of birds which are protected or kept under permit must produce their permit when called upon to do so. The Society does not accept any responsibility in this matter. Entries can only be accepted on this condition.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

DISTRICT DISPLAYS.

NOTE.—Owing to the fact that time did not permit of the preparation of exhibits, no competition will be held this year, but Societies intending to exhibit in 1947, are invited to commence the preparation of their displays.

Societies intending to exhibit must notify the Secretary of their intention to do so on or before 31st December, 1946.

CLASS.

1599. COLLECTION OF EXHIBITS FROM AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.—A sum of £100 per exhibit securing 450 points or over will be divided as prize money. Entry fee 10/-.

Each Exhibit in the above Class securing three hundred points or over will receive £95 towards expenses, in addition to the prize money.

NOTE.—To avoid the possibility of any exhibits being overlooked by the Judges, exhibitors in the above Class are requested to supply complete lists of all produce shown, setting out in detail the exhibits displayed under each heading.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION.

1. Collections may consist of the following:—Farm, Dairy, Horticultural and Pastoral Produce, including Wool, Wine, Vegetables, Roots, etc., and Wood.

2. Societies may compete in all the subdivisions mentioned in the scale of points at the foot hereof, or may, at their discretion, delete any part or parts carrying points not exceeding 100. All Societies must, however, compete in Section 13—Effective Arrangement. No Society will partake in the distribution of the prize money unless its exhibits are awarded 450 points or over. A list of the deleted sections or sub-sections (if any) to be delivered to the Society's office on the Show Grounds at least 48 hours before the judging is timed to commence. Prize money will be divided on the basis that the percentage of points actually scored bears to the number of points competed for.

3. Exhibits entered for the Agricultural Societies' Competitions are not eligible to compete in the general classes. Exhibitors wishing to compete in open classes must forward a separate exhibit.

4. Each exhibit will be allowed from 850 to 1,000 square feet of floor space.

5. All collections of exhibits must be in charge of a responsible officer of the Society sending the same, who will have to arrange and display the exhibit to the best advantage. Exhibits must be completed before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 19th September.

6. On application to the Secretary, one approved attendant from each Society competing will be allowed to assist in locating the exhibits while the judging is taking place, but he will be removed from the building if he interferes with the Judge in any way.

7. Exhibits must be produced, prepared or manufactured within a radius of 30 miles of the Show Grounds of the Society entering same, and, with the exception of wines and woods, must have been produced within 12 months previous to date of entry. Woods and wines may be of any age, but the latter must be from a vineyard that is producing at time of exhibition. Exhibits may be manufactured from produce secured beyond the 30-mile radius and wool grown in the district may be scoured beyond the 30-mile radius. No exhibits produced or manufactured in the capital cities of Australia or within a five-mile radius of the General Post Office of same will be allowed to compete.

NOTE.—Exhibitors must make a statutory declaration when lodging their entries that their exhibits comply with Condition 7.

8. Exhibitors are required, in arranging their exhibits, to place them in such a manner as to facilitate judging. The Judges shall have the right to sample all foods and preserves.

9. SCALE OF POINTS FOR JUDGING.

NOTE.—Provided the quality of exhibits in any section is equal, a greater number of points will be awarded to the collection in which the greater number of varieties is shown. Wheat and potatoes are limited to twenty varieties in each case.

1. Wine merchant shall mean any person, association or company buying Wine.

2. Wine-grower shall mean any wine-grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and producing wine from grapes grow in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for that purpose, and, although the wine-grower be also a wine merchant, he may exhibit in the Wine-growers' Section, provided his entry be accompanied by a statutory declaration to the effect that his exhibit was processed at his own vineyard.

3. Exhibitors must mark on bottles, in plain figures, the year of the Exhibition (1946) and the number of the Class in which each sample is entered. The bottles for Wines must be wine bottles (reputed quarts), and Aerated Waters and Cider may be either pints or quarts. All bottles must be labelled with business labels or the name of the exhibitor. Exhibitors must also mark their names and addresses on their cases or hampers.

4. The name, character and vintage of the Wines must be stated on the entry forms, which must be duly lodged with the Secretary. (See General Regulations.)

In the event of more entries being received than can be accommodated in the space available, preference will be given to those Societies which competed in the 1939 Show, and a ballot conducted regarding the remainder.

Three competent judges nominated by the Royal Horticultural Society will be appointed to adjudicate in the Competition, which will be conducted under the following conditions:—

1. The competition shall be for a Display of Cut Flowers, which may be supported with pot plants in flower and/or foliage. Self or any other cut foliage permissible.

2. The size of each competitive stand must cover and not exceed a ground area with a 12ft. frontage and an 8ft. depth. A divisional space shall be arranged between each Society exhibit.

3. A Display is distinct from a collection of flowers. Points for Display Exhibit are:—

Variety; Elegance and Beauty of Arrangement; Color Harmony; 10 points. Quality, 5 points. General Finish, 5 points.

4. Flowers and plants may be drawn from any sources other than those of nurseries and municipal gardens.

5. In the arrangement of the stands, principals or employees of nurserymen, shall be debarred from taking any part, either in handling the blooms or supervising the arrangement of the exhibit.

7. Any pot plants exhibited must have been in the possession of the Society's contributor at least two months before the opening of the Show.

8. Preparations for staging may be commenced any time after the closing of the Horticultural Hall on Saturday evening, 21st September (approximately 10.30 p.m.), or during the following day and evening up until midnight.

9. All exhibits must be completed for judging by 1 p.m. on Monday, 23rd September.

10. Award sashes or such other form of award to distinguish the placings shall be provided.

11. The whole of the prize money awarded shall be pooled and divided among all Societies competing, in proportion to the points allocated at the time of the primary judging, provided that 40 points or more shall have been secured by any one Society.

12. All displays must be maintained to the satisfaction of the "Garden Week" Committee and the Royal Horticultural Society until the close of the Show on Saturday, 28th September, in order that prize money may be claimed.

13. Appearance money amounting to £5 shall be paid to each competing Society to cover incidental expenditure, irrespective of points gained, provided there is maintenance to the end of the Competition.

14. Country competitors shall be paid a special fee to cover any extra distance travelling of plants, flowers, etc.

15. Where possible, all bottles shall be excluded from the stands, and earthenware or other suitable containers used with wide bases, in order to withstand any brushing over by the public or through other causes.

16. All tables, tiering and other material to be used in building up the stands, containers, etc., and the carriage of exhibits, must be provided by the competing Society.

17. The erection of neatly-executed cardboard signs, denoting the name of the Society, size approximating 18ins. x 12ins., will be permitted on each exhibit.

18. No trading card or cards will be permitted to be displayed on any exhibit staged in this Competition, nor trading of any description done therefrom.

19. The display of trophies or prize cards not relating to the particular event is prohibited.

20. At the discretion of the "Garden Week" Committee and the Royal Horticultural Society and on the submission of show prize schedules and Society literature for perusal, distribution from the stands may be authorised.

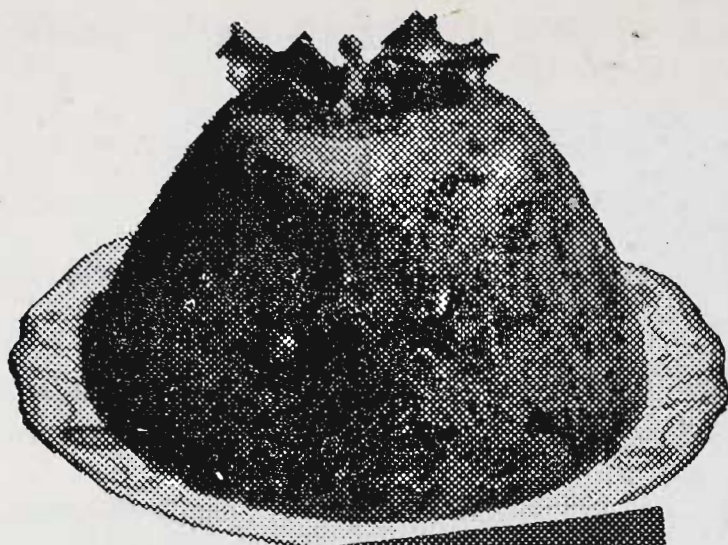

CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW.

To be held under the Rules and Regulations of the Kennel Control Council, which is conducted under the auspices of this Society, and with which the Society is affiliated. A copy of the Rules and Regulations may be inspected at the office of the Society.

JUDGES.—D. T. Sinclair, Esq., of New Zealand—all except Australian Breeds; R. R. Mitchell, Esq.—all Australian Breeds.

In all cases where an adjudication involves breeds scheduled to be judged by more than one judge, those judges will confer.

STEWARDS.—William Cockbill, Esq., Steward in Chief; Messrs. E. J. Bennett, N. F. Coles, G. G. McEwin Duncan, C. Kelly, F. A. Longmore, R. Myers, J. S. Rowles and H. T. C. Woodfull.

This Show incorporates the Championship Show of the Chow Chow Club of Australia.

ENTRY FEE.—Members of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, 3/-; Non-Members of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, 4/- each entry.

PRIZES.—Unless otherwise stated the prizes in each class are: First, 10/- and Card; Second, 5/- and Card; Third, Card. Plain ribbons will be issued in the judging rings merely as an indication to the spectators of the judge's awards—blue for first, red for second and white for third.

Kennel Control Council Challenge Certificates with inscribed blue ribbons also Reserve Challenge Certificates are offered at this Show, one of each certificate for each sex of every breed, at the discretion of the Judges. On application to and confirmation by the Kennel Control Council, any dog which wins not fewer than four Challenge Certificates as distinct from Reserve Challenge Certificates under not fewer than four different Judges at different Shows, and gains a total of 100 points shall be known as a K.C.C. Champion. Points shall be allotted as follow:—(a) Each Challenge Certificate winner—10 points plus 1 point for every dog and bitch six months of age or over entered in an ordinary class for the breed; (b) 25 points for each winner in the following groups, provided that no exhibit shall receive more than a total, in all, of 25 points at any one Show: Group 1, Toys; Group 2, Sporting Terriers; Group 3, Gundogs; Group 4, Sporting, other than Terriers or Gundogs; Group 5, All others. Dogs holding Kennel Control Council or other approved Challenge Certificates of any degree of the type awarded previous to 1st January, 1941, shall be permitted to qualify for the title merely by winning a total, in all, of four Certificates under four different Judges at different Shows, regardless of the point value.

Challenge and Reserve Challenge Certificates may be awarded to both sexes in classes which are for dogs and bitches together, also to every breed entered in the "Any other Recognised Breeds classes."

The judges are empowered and are instructed not to award any prize to any animal which they consider is not of sufficient merit.

PAYMENT OF PRIZES.—All Special Prizes, and prize money will be posted to the winners after the Show.

EXHIBITS DUE AT SHOW.—All exhibits must be benched by 9.30 a.m. on the days they are due to be exhibited. Each breed will be required to be on exhibition for two days and two nights unless otherwise stated. See headings to Groups. Intending exhibitors are warned not to make an entry unless they are prepared strictly to observe this condition.

Every dog must be provided with a suitable collar and chain or a lead but they must be benched with chains of metal. No cages may be used for dogs other than those provided or approved by the Society, and nothing which will affect the view of the public may be added to the cages. Not more than one exhibit may occupy any one bench or cage. A dog may not be so placed on the bench or in a cage as to be away from the view of the public. The position of exhibit numbers on benches or cages may not be altered.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.—Exhibits may be removed from the Show after it closes at night provided a deposit of 10/- per dog is paid (maximum £1 for all exhibits owned by the one person), but a night watchman will be employed by the Society for the convenience of those who prefer to leave their dogs on the benches over night.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS.—These will be posted to exhibitors before the Show. When dogs are being judged the handler must wear the exhibit number of only the dog being handled.

VETERINARY INSPECTION.—No dog will be admitted to the Show until submitted to veterinary examination and its exhibit number is stamped "Pass to Ring." Examinations will take place between 8.30 and 9.30 a.m. of the first day on which each Group is exhibited and between 2 p.m. and 2.45 p.m. for special classes on Saturday, 21st September.

JUDGING.—Judging will commence punctually at 10 a.m. on the first day on which each Group is exhibited (See headings to Groups). In the case of Special Prizes in which dogs from different Groups are required to meet, the elimination awards will be made immediately judging is completed and the final award will be made at 10 a.m. on the second day of the latest Group concerned.

In view of the need to expedite judging, exhibitors will be held wholly responsible for having their dogs in the judging rings immediately they are required for judging. After the Judge's Steward has given word to the Judge to proceed with the judging of a competition, no other exhibit may enter the judging ring until after that competition has been completed. Exhibits which are not brought promptly to the rings when called, and exhibits the owners or handlers of which omit to obey the orders of the Stewards, or are wearing more than one exhibit number, may be refused admission to the rings.

LIABILITY TO PARADE.—Exhibitors will be held wholly responsible for parading their dogs in the main arena as required. See headings to Groups. Entry tickets which will be posted by the Society to all entrants will admit the holders to the show, up to one hour before the parade is to commence.

EXERCISING EXHIBITS.—By arrangement with the Superintendent exhibitors will be permitted to exercise their dogs for a short time each day—in the morning before 9.30 a.m. and in the evening.

For this purpose the entry tickets which will be posted by the Society to all entrants, will admit the holders to the Show before 9.30 a.m.

Except as stated herein no exhibit may be absent from its bench unless for the purpose of being judged.

FREE CARE AND RETURN.—Dogs will be received and benched, fed and attended to without charge. Certificates for the free return by train of unsold dogs brought to the Show by train will be issued on application to the Superintendent.

REGISTRATION NECESSARY.—Prior, to entry, all dogs, must be registered or transferred or leased to present ownership direct with the Kennel Control Council, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne. The fees per dog are as follow:—

Dogs registered with a body recognised by the K.C.C. must, nevertheless, be registered on the usual form with the K.C.C., but on production of a registration certificate no fees shall be charged.

WITHDRAWAL OF ENTRY.—In order to prevent unnecessary preparation of benches, etc., the Society reserves the right to impose a fine of 10/- for each and every entered dog not exhibited unless notification of withdrawal from competition is sent the Society before the Show.

DISPLAY OF ADVERTISING.—Exhibitors will be permitted to display approved advertising material on the benches and cages allotted their exhibits. The display must be executed attractively, not in handwriting, and shall be removed promptly if deemed undesirable. It shall not go beyond the following:—(1) A space not exceeding 2 ft. wide by 8 in. deep at the back of the bench; (2) The name, address and telephone number of the Kennel or exhibitor, or both; (3) The name of the exhibit; (4) A properly approved stud card of the exhibit, whether dog or bitch. Stud cards may mention wins at other fixtures; (5) Suitable words offering dogs and/or puppies for sale, but not actually naming any dog or puppy which is not exhibited, and not quoting any prices; (6) Photographs and illustrations of the dog exhibited; (7) General decorative material other than announcements.

LOCKERS.—A limited number of lockers, with keys, will be available for the use of exhibitors at a charge of 2/6 for two days use. Reservations and payments may be made at time of entry.

OWNERS' RISK.—The Society will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs sent for exhibition, or any other property entrusted to it, but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors, and all other persons, that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of or damage to any dog or other property, whether arising from accident, or other cause whatever, or from any act or omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants, or others.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES.—PUPPY.—For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve months of age.

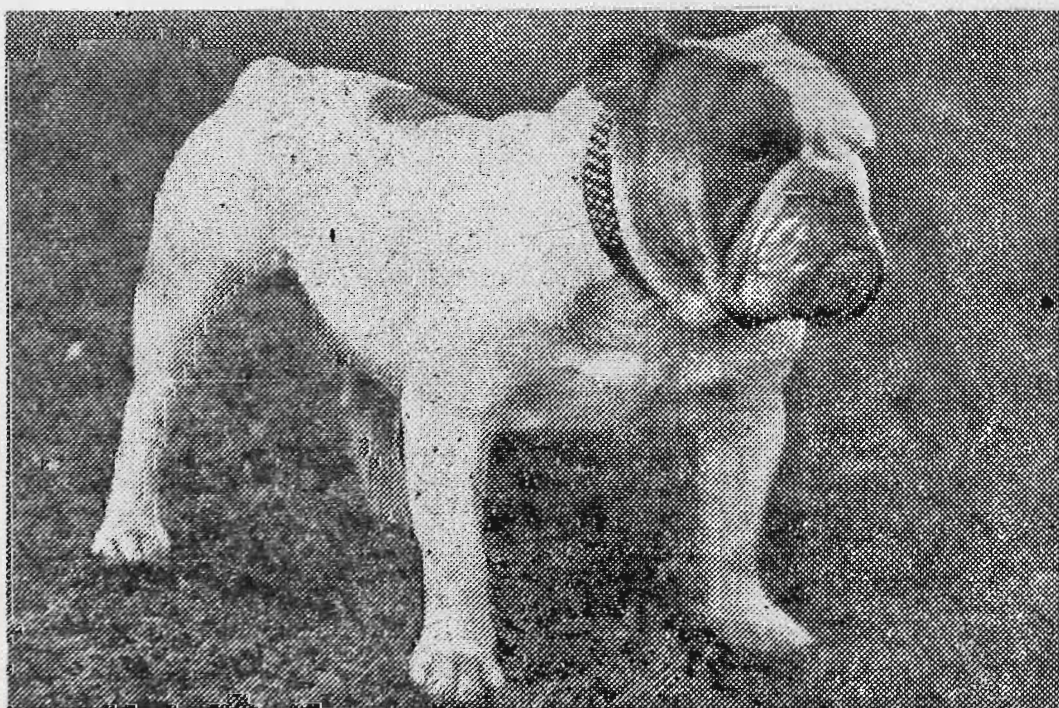

Sheep Dog Association.)

TRIAL RULES

1. Owners of dogs competing in Open Trials must be financial members of the Victorian Working Sheep Dog Association or of a recognised Working Sheep Dog Association in another State, and their dogs must be registered in a recognised Stud Book, except in case of competitors living within 25 miles of the locality in which the Trial is to be held, the competitions held by the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria and the annual competition for the Captain Payne Trophy excepted.

2. An owner may appoint a nominee to work his dog, or dogs, in the trials, and such nominee will conjointly assume responsibility with the owner during the trials.

3. Any Agricultural Society or Trial Club deciding to conduct trials under these rules shall on payment of a fee of 5/-, be included in the list of bodies affiliated with this Association. Members of the Association competing in Victoria are bound to confine their support to affiliated bodies.

4. Any dog having won a first prize at any sheep dog trial shall not be eligible to compete in a Novice Trial. A dog that has only divided a first prize competing singly or as one of a pair is not debarred from competing as a novice.

5. No bitch in season shall be allowed to compete.

6. Any protest against a dog competing must be lodged in writing with the Secretary of the Show or Trial Committee within the time specified by that body, and be accompanied by a fee of £1, which will be returned if the protest is upheld. Such protest will be dealt with by the Show or Trial Committee, which will, within fourteen days, submit a report to this Association.

7. Competitors in Sheep Dog Trials shall take their place according to the draw, and any dog absent may not be allowed to compete except at the discretion of the Trial Committee under special circumstances.

8. No competitor should be allowed on the course with his dogs for exercise after the commencement of the trials. Any person or persons bringing dogs on the ground and allowing them to run loose, either by mistake or otherwise, except when directed by the Trial Steward, may be fined £1.

9. If, in the opinion of the Judge or Committee of any body conducting a trial under these rules, any man ill-use his dog, he will be subject to a fine of £1, and may be debarred from competing again at any trial conducted under these rules.

10. In the event of any question or situation arising not provided for in the foregoing rules, the matter in question will be dealt with by the Show or Trial Committee, and its decision shall be final. Any action taken shall be reported to this Association within fourteen days, and the Executive Committee, if it deems fit, may make any alteration or addition to cover such contingency in the future.

11. The Judge's decision shall be final.

12. The maximum time allowed to competitors will be fixed before the trials commence. Any competitor withdrawing his dog before the expiry of the full time allowed, unless at the discretion of the Judge, shall not be entitled to a prize.

13. If the working of any dog is of inferior merit, the Judge has power to terminate the trial before the expiration of time allowed.

14. A sub-committee of not less than 3 or more than 5 competitors shall be appointed to inspect sheep for defects and cull before the trial commences, and no fresh sheep shall be allowed, except in extraordinary circumstances, at the Judge's discretion.

15. If a dog shall bite or in any way injure a sheep, such dog will at once be disqualified and the competitor held responsible for any damage done to the sheep. Should a dog bark or snap at the sheep when they are stuck up, points may be deducted.

16. The competitor will not be allowed to assist his dog in any way, except by signal, whistle or word of mouth. Any competitor who by action, sound or unfair manoeuvre stops or turns sheep at any obstacle shall have points deducted, and if the obstacle is negotiated by such action full obstacle points shall be deducted.

17. The competitor, with his dog, shall stand at a flag indicating the starting point, and shall not cast his dog until directed by the Trial Steward. No dog shall be held at the starting point.

18. Any dog coming between the worker and sheep in the cast will be disqualified. The Judge, at his discretion, need not disqualify a dog getting between worker and sheep when negotiating an obstacle.

19. When the competitor has to move from one given point to another, he must do so in a direct line, and not stop to work his dog. Infringement of this rule will entail a deduction of points for each offence.

20. At the conclusion of each trial, the competitor must take his sheep to the enclosed yard as expeditiously as possible.

21. Should there be a "final" trial by selected dogs, the Judge will give his awards to those gaining highest aggregate number of points. At least one dog more than there are prizes offered shall be selected to compete in a "final" trial.

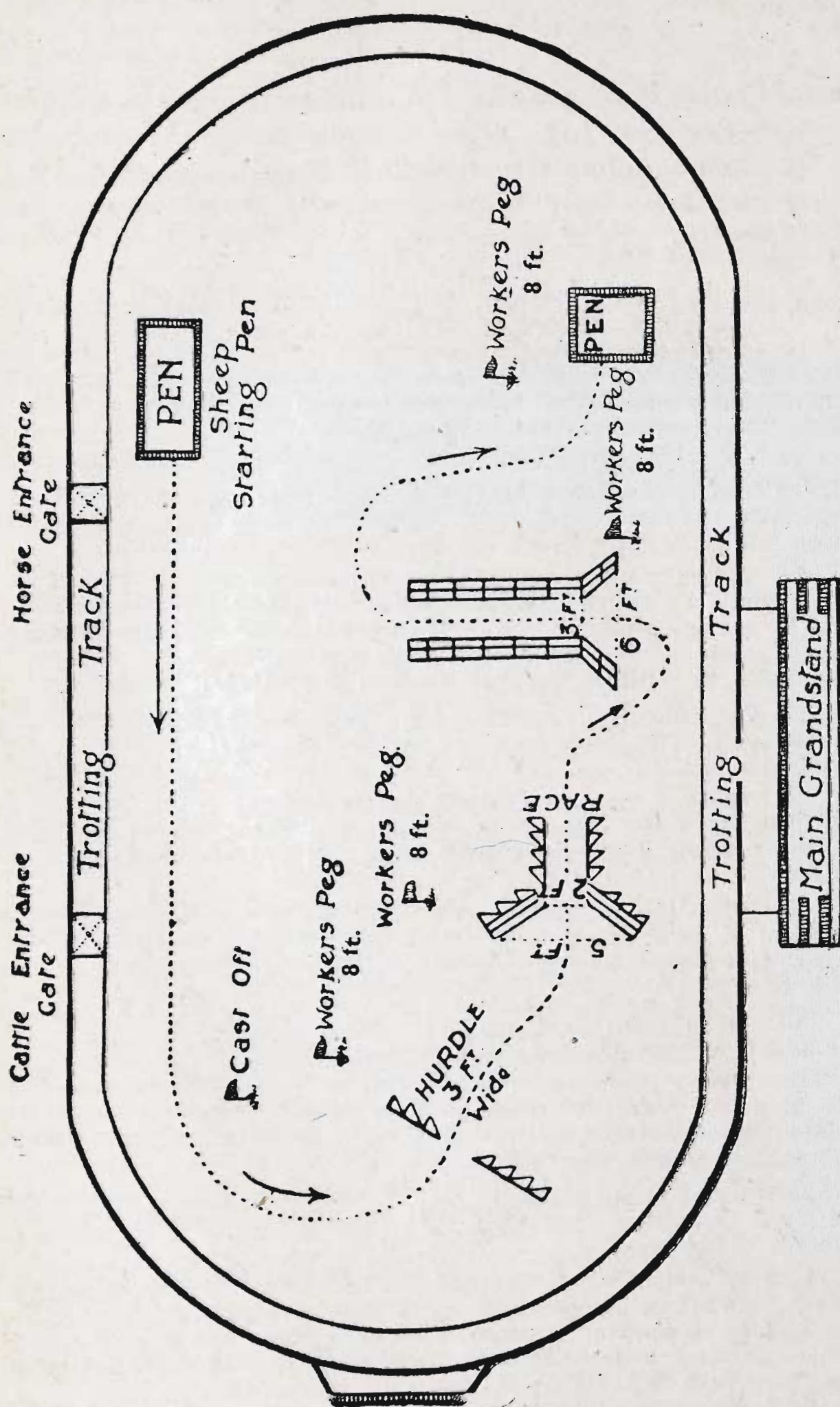
22. In any final trial the Judge, or Judges, with the assistance of the Trial Committee, may alter the course or vary the test for dogs selected to compete.

23. In field trials, if any dog fails at first attempt to sight his sheep, he may be recalled and re-directed.

24. When working a pair of dogs, both dogs must be cast, one off either hand and in the opinion of the Judge both dogs working together must do a fair share of the work.

25. Any person or persons refusing to conform with these rules will be expelled from the ground, and may be disqualified from competing at any future trials conducted under these rules.

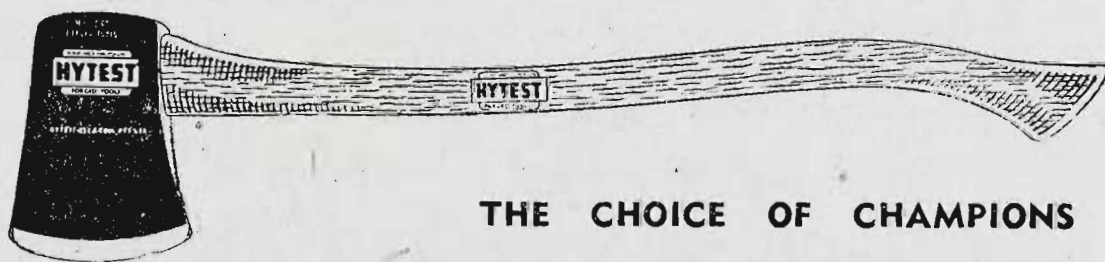

**Class 2265.—THE VICTORIAN AMATEUR WALKERS'
CLUB 50 KILOMETERS ROAD WALKING
CHAMPIONSHIP, 1946.**

Fifty kilometers is the standard walking event of the Olympic Games, and in English measurements is equal to 31 miles and 121 yards.

Sanction has been granted by the Victorian Amateur Athletic Association to conduct the event this year as a Victorian Championship, and it will be the first occasion since 1927 that the marathon walk has carried the Championship Title. In that year, the distance was 25 miles, and the course from beyond Frankston to St. Kilda. E. Sunderland was first home in the record time of 3 hours and 53 minutes.

In 1930, the distance was increased to the Olympic standard, and has since that year been under the patronage of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.

The last event was held in 1939, being won by J. Gaylor, who will be defending his title.

THE COURSE.—Starting with four laps on the Royal Show Grounds arena, competitors will leave these grounds from the rear gate and, proceeding via Lang's Road and Fisher Parade, turn to the right into Ballarat Road to a point about 1½ miles on the Melbourne side of Rockbank, and returning by the same roads to the Show Grounds, where competitors will finish by completing two laps of the arena.

TIME.—The race will start at 11 a.m. on Saturday, 28th September, 1946, and, with equable weather conditions, the winner should enter the arena on the final mile at about 3.50 p.m.

CONDITIONS OF CONTEST.

1. Every competitor must be over the age of 21 years, and must satisfy the Committee, by his previous racing, that he is competent to complete the distance of this event. The Committee reserves the right to demand from any entrant a doctor's certificate of fitness, such certificate to be handed to the Secretary at least 24 hours prior to the start of the event.

2. Competitors must make their own arrangements for their requirements on the road. The Committee of the V.A.W.C. will, as far as possible, arrange for the care of competitors and the provision of cycling attendants en route, but will accept no responsibility. Not more than one attendant will be permitted to any one competitor at any one time.

3. The Referee and Judges have power to order any competitor to retire from the competition, not necessarily from reasons of unfair walking.

4. Walking on footpaths is not permitted. Any infringement of this rule, accepting pace or being shielded from the wind will entail immediate disqualification.

5. The Judges have power to disqualify any competitor for any infringement of the Rules of Walking.

6. The Committee of the V.A.W.C. shall be the absolute authority on the matter of settling any disputes which may arise prior to or after the contest. Their decision shall be final and without appeal. The Referee of the day shall have sole jurisdiction during the period of the race. His decisions on all matters relative to that period shall be final and without appeal.

7. The entrance fee shall be Two Shillings (2/-). Entries will be accepted only from bona fide members of the various walking clubs of Australia, who are affiliated with their State associations, and which are, in turn, affiliated with the Amateur Athletic Union of Australia.

Special Regulations re Champion Prizes

(The Gift of the Government of Victoria, through the Department of Agriculture.)

1. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor.

2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the Judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the Judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether.

3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

4. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be awarded.

6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes.

General Regulations

ENTRIES.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.)

1. Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society, and all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at time of entry, and produce, which must be the growth of the preceding 12 months, must be produced, grown or made by the exhibitor, except in the case of Agricultural Societies being exhibitors.

2. No exhibit may be entered in more than one class, except for a sweepstake, a special or champion prize, or unless specifically stated in the regulations governing the Section. Where any exhibit has, through oversight, been allowed to compete in more than one class (not being one of the exceptions abovementioned), such exhibit shall, whether awarded a prize or not, be deemed to be ineligible to compete, or to have competed, in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

3. The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry submitted for this exhibition. No disqualified or deformed animal shall be allowed to compete for a prize.

4. When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

CLOSING DATES OF ENTRIES.

5. Applications for stands for harness and saddlery, vehicles, machinery and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only (Section 60), must be made by ordinary letter. After the applications close, positions will be allotted and a charge will be made for the space granted. Entries of this description of exhibits must afterwards be duly made by letter before Saturday, 17th August, 1946, at 12 o'clock noon.

6. All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society, and (including those by post) must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, on or before Saturday, 17th August, 1946, at 12 o'clock noon. Entry fee must accompany each entry. Entries for competitions are limited to three exhibits in Cattle and two exhibits in Sheep and Swine (except where specified otherwise), which exhibits must be brought before the Judge.

AGE OF EXHIBITS.

7. The date of birth of live stock must be set forth in each entry. Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibit. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision to be final on all matters regarding age.

8. The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year for all horses, and 1st July in each year for all cattle. Australasian bred shall mean bred in any of the Australian States or New Zealand.

QUALIFICATION FOR ENTRY.

9. All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be visibly entire, and any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

10. All sheep over 18 months old, except where otherwise specified, must have been shorn since 1st August in the preceding year. The date on which sheep were shorn to be stated on entry form. Any sheep infested with ticks or lice are liable to disqualification. The month and year of lambing of all sheep under 2½ years old must be stated.

VETERINARY CERTIFICATES.

11. All Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered under the Horse Breeding Act, 1928. All Mares, 3 years old or over, entered in Sections 1 to 9 inclusive, must have first obtained a certificate of soundness from a Government Veterinary Officer. Government Veterinary Officer will stamp all Entry Tickets for Stallions and Mares "Pass to Ring." These stamped tickets must be produced to the Steward before entering the Arena. Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Officers on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 18th September, commencing at 10 a.m. Judges are particularly requested to satisfy themselves, as far as possible, regarding the soundness of all other horses before awarding the prize, and to avoid giving prizes to animals showing symptoms of hereditary

diseases. A Judge may consult the Society's Veterinary Surgeon if he deem it expedient. No protests on veterinary grounds will be received.

THE EXHIBITION.

12. The Exhibition will be open to the public daily from 9 a.m.; admission, 2/-. Admission to main grandstand, 3/- extra; "Chirnside" and "Cliff" grand stands, 2/- extra; and to the seated reserves, 1/- extra.

The charge for admission to the grounds for children is 6d.

13. Members, on presentation of their badges, and members' ladies' on presentation of their tickets, will be admitted free to the grounds and grandstands subject to such regulations as the Council may make.

Children of Members, up to 14 years of age, will be permitted to enter the Jubilee grandstand on payment of 1/- each.

ENTRY TICKETS.

14. Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes, admitting up till 10 a.m., will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 18th September, 1946.

PENALTY FOR NON-EXHIBITION.

15. In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry will be subject to a fine of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and 10/- for each entry of sheep or pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by—(1) The death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. The non-payment of such fines to debar entrants from taking part in any future Exhibitions of the Society.

EXHIBITS DUE AT SHOW GROUNDS.

16. Wheat exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 3rd August, at 5 p.m. Wine exhibits must be lodged at the Show Grounds on or before Saturday, 17th August, 1946, at 5 p.m. Fleeces and Skins on or before Saturday, 7th September, 1946, at 12 noon. Exhibits of Fat Cattle must be penned before 3 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September. Cows in milk must be penned before 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September. Exhibits of Needlework, Arts and Crafts and Home Crafts must be lodged at the ground before 5 p.m. on Saturday, 14th September. Exhibits of Foods must be lodged at the Grounds before 2 p.m. on Tuesday, 17th September. Machinery, Implements and Miscellaneous Exhibits (Section 60) must be in their places before 6 p.m. on Thursday, 19th September. Table Vegetables must be benched before 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 24th September. Business Turnouts to be in the Grounds before 10 a.m. on Friday, 20th September. Horses entered for the Arena Events will only be re-

quired to be in the yards on the day or days on which they perform. (If a request be made on the entry form, the Society will endeavour to provide boxes for horses entered for contests.) Poultry and Pigeons must be penned before 9 p.m. on Monday, 23rd September, 1946. Budgerigars must be penned before 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September. Canaries and Cage Birds must be penned before 9 p.m. on Thursday, 19th September. Dogs entered in Group 1 must be penned before 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 20th September; those entered in Group 2 before 9.30 a.m. on Monday, 23rd September; those entered in Group 3 before 9.30 a.m. on Wednesday, 25th September; those entered in Group 4 before 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 27th September, and those entered in Group 5 before 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 27th Sept. Sheep (except Fats) must be penned before 10 a.m. on Monday, 23rd September. Fat Sheep and Lambs must be penned before 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 24th September. All other exhibits must be in their places in the yards by 9 a.m. on Thursday, 19th September, 1946.

17. Exhibits will not be received in the yards after the date and hour specified. No exhibit, whether for competition or not, will be admitted to the Show Grounds unless duly entered as an exhibit.

18. All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Secretary being first obtained.

REMOVAL OF DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS.

19. The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

19a. In case any live stock, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall be injured or maimed or suffering from any ailment requiring, in the opinion of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or that of some qualified substitute, immediate veterinary aid, and the owner of such stock is absent or fails to forthwith render such aid, the Secretary or Assistant Secretary may provide such aid, and the cost and expense thereby incurred shall in every case be borne by the owner of such stock. If such aid be not immediately available, the Secretary or Assistant Secretary may, on the advice of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or of such substitute, have such live stock destroyed. The owner of such stock and any persons having the control thereof shall indemnify the Council Secretary or Assistant Secretary and the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or such substitute, against all damages, costs, expenses or liability incurred in connection with the same.

19b. All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend their exhibits at their own risk, and in case any exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers and members, property and effects from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.

PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.

20. All machinery in motion shall either be securely fenced or be in such position or of such construction as to be equally safe to every person as it would be if it were securely fenced.

PASSES FOR ATTENDANTS.

21. As many men as the Council may deem necessary will be allowed into the yards free to take charge of exhibits, and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary.

RUGGING OF EXHIBITS.

22. Exhibits must not be rugged and horses must not wear spats during the hours the Show is open to the public, and the upper portion of horse boxes outside the pavilions must remain open during those hours. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

CLEANING OF STALLS.

23. Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

PARADES.

24. All prize-winning horses and cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of Ten Shillings in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

The parading of non-prize-winning animals is optional with exhibitors.

All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers.

No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

AWARDING OF PRIZES.

25. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

26. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

27. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

28. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Sashes in all Horse and Cattle Sections, and Rosettes in all Sheep and Swine Sections in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

29. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit, stall

or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

30. Stock exhibits wearing bridles or head stalls, with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon, are liable to disqualification.

31. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

32. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the yards; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

33. Cheques for prizes at the Show will be passed for payment at the Council meeting on Tuesday, 15th October, one week after which date they will be payable.

34. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for six months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

PROTESTS.

35. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of £1 sterling, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

36. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

37. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulations, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

38. No exhibit (except Live Stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) shall be removed from the Exhibition until 5 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September, when all exhibits may be removed. Horses, Cattle and Pigs may be removed from the Grounds on Friday, 27th September, after 1 p.m. Sheep may be removed after 12 noon on Friday, 27th September.

39. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the yards at the close of the Exhibition each day on depositing with the Secretary an approved cheque for £10 (or for any exhibit of Dogs, 10/-, with a maximum of £1 for any one exhibitor), as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 9.30 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day, the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

WATER AND FORAGE.

40. Water will be provided in the yards for Live Stock and for the

working of machinery, but exhibitors using gas engines, suction gas plants and refrigerators, must provide water storage tanks on their stands, and not permit water to run to waste. Exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage (which can be purchased in the yards at Melbourne prices), but no feed must be stacked in any of the Stock Pavilions. Exhibitors of machinery will be required to provide their own fuel (which must be coke or wood, no coal being allowed), and materials necessary to enable them to comply with the regulations.

PRIVILEGES.

41. The successful tenderers for the privilege of photographing exhibits have the exclusive right thereto, with the reservation that the Council may allow the Press to take photographs of exhibits for the purposes of illustration.

DISTRIBUTION OF ADVERTISING MATERIAL.

42. The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements or other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibitors at their respective stands. Any person infringing this regulation will incur expulsion from the yards. Any exhibitor desiring to distribute trade lists, etc., must lodge a deposit of £1 with the Secretary before the Show opens, to be returned after the Show is closed if this regulation has been complied with, and to be forfeited if it has not.

CARE OF EXHIBITS.

43. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.

USE OF PENS AND STALLS.

44. All exhibits of Live Stock, for which boxes, stalls or pens are provided, have the use of such accommodation free for one week (and in the case of oversea exhibits, for a fortnight), before the Show opens, but they must be removed from the grounds within one week after the last day of sales, or a charge will be made.

EXHIBITS AT SHOW GROUNDS.

45. The Society's carter will receive competitive exhibits of produce, poultry, dogs, etc., that are addressed to the Show Grounds Siding, and place the entries in their respective sections. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits; but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. For the carting of stock feed and non-competitive exhibits, etc., to any part of the ground, the following charges will be made, for which receipts will be given:—Up to 1 cwt., 6d.; up to 3 cwt., 1/-; up to 6 cwt., 1/6; up to 10 cwt., 2/-; up to 15 cwt., 2/6; and each additional 5 cwt., 6d.

46. In order to facilitate the unloading and loading of stock at the Show Grounds Siding, the grounds will be lighted at night, and the Society will engage a corps of stock assistants, who will meet every stock train.

All stock assistants will be numbered, and will not approach the trucks unless requested by exhibitors.

They will be permitted to charge Exhibitors not more than 9d. for each "lead" (one or more animals) of stock between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m., nor more than 1/- for each "lead" between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

VEHICLES OTHER THAN EXHIBITS.

47. Vehicles and motors other than listed exhibits will not be permitted to enter the grounds.

A paddock for parking motor-cars and other vehicles is provided. Charges—Motors or Vehicles, 1/-.

Vehicles and motors are not permitted to be driven indiscriminately about the grounds, but must proceed directly to their destinations.

Notices

Railway Regulations

Supplementary to the General Conditions for the Carriage of Goods and Live Stock.

IMPORTANT NOTICE.—Exhibitors desiring to have their stock conveyed by rail from the Show Grounds on Friday evening must order their trucks through the Show Grounds Station-Master before 12 noon on Wednesday, 25th September.

Exhibits are consigned direct to Show Siding at Society's Grounds, and exhibitors are particularly requested to send in their applications for trucks at once to the local Station-Master, or to the Live Stock Agent, Railway Department, Melbourne, or through their own selling agents.

1. The undermentioned conditions shall be applicable in respect of agricultural machines and implements, machinery, produce, live stock (including dogs, poultry and other birds), buggies, trotting sulkies* accompanying trotting horses, motor-cars, drays, waggon and other goods of a like nature sent for exhibition at Shows.

They may also, by special arrangement with the General Passenger and Freight Agent, be made operative in respect of:—

Agricultural machinery sent for field trial in which a number of machines participate.

Ploughs sent for ploughing matches.

Horses sent for horse parades.

*Wherever practicable, trotting sulkies shall be afforded similar transport on the return journey as was given on the forward journey, so that, as far as possible, the sulkies may accompany the horses.

2. The exhibits will be carried at the convenience of the Commissioner by Passenger, Mixed or Goods trains as may be desired by the consignors. Valuable animals may be sent by passenger trains in horse boxes if this class of vehicle be available, and charged the same rate as if loaded in cattle trucks, and forwarded by Goods trains. Each three stalls in "F." or "F.F." horse box to be regarded as equivalent to one full cattle truck.

3. When the exhibits are consigned on the forward journey, the consignors will require to declare, on the consignment note therefor, that they are for exhibition, specifying the Show for which they are intended, and the way-bill must be endorsed accordingly.

The ordinary freight charges shall be imposed and prepaid in respect of the forward journey in all cases.

4. On the backward journey, any exhibits, or portion thereof, which have been sent by rail as paying freight on the forward journey, exhibited, and not sold, will, subject to the conditions in Clause 7 and on production of the approved certificates, signed by the Secretary of the Show, be carried "free" to the station whence they were forwarded, provided the journey is completed at any time within one month from the date of despatch on the forward journey. The certificates must be handed in when the exhibits are consigned, and attached to the waybill.

If, on the backward journey, a greater number of vehicles be used for the carriage of exhibits than was used on the forward journey, ordinary freight charges will be imposed in respect of exhibits carried in the additional vehicles.

Tarpaulins, if used at request of owner to cover live stock trucks, shall be charged for at the rate of 3/5 per tarpaulin.

All exhibits, or part thereof, which have been sold, or are not accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, will be subject to the ordinary freight charges and conditions on the backward journey.

Stud sheep purchased at Agricultural and Pastoral Shows by exhibitors thereat, and forwarded from the Show uncrated in the same truck at the exhibitor's returned unsold exhibits of sheep to the original forwarding station of the latter, shall be charged at Class "2" mileage rate on the basis of 3 cwt. per animal, and subject to the Tariff for Smalls, where cheaper than the ordinary rate.

5. Exhibits, accompanied by the aforesaid certificate, may be forwarded on from one Show to another, subject to the freight charges and conditions, as prescribed in Clause 3 of this division, which freight charges must be prepaid, and when the final destination is reached, they may be returned "free" to the original despatching station, subject to the conditions in Clause 7. If, however, in proceeding to another Show, such exhibits be returned over any portion of the line in respect of which the full freight charges have been paid on the forward journey, the exhibits may be sent free, subject to the conditions in Clauses 4 and 7, over such portion of the line.

6. Exhibits must be loaded and unloaded by or at the expense of the consignors or consignees. In all cases where Show exhibits are

loaded or unloaded by the department, the charges prescribed for the service shall be imposed.

7. Exhibits, other than live stock, may, where alternative rates apply, be consigned on the forward or the backward journey at the sender's option either at the rates and conditions prescribed in the Goods Rates Book for carriage at Commissioners' Risk or at Owner's Risk. On the backward journey, when consigned at Commissioners' Risk, the full Commissioners' Risk Rate shall be imposed, but if such exhibits be consigned at Owner's Risk, they will be carried free.

Live stock exhibits shall be carried at the prescribed rates for livestock on the forward journey, and shall be carried on the backward journey free, but whether on the forward or backward journey, such carriage shall be subject to the conditions prescribed in the Goods Rates Book in respect to the carriage of live stock.

Special attention is directed to the following conditions which is supplementary to the general conditions respecting the carriage of live stock:—

The Commissioners will not be liable for the loss of or injury to any horses, cattle, or other animals, or birds in excess of the amounts specified hereunder, unless at the time of delivery thereof at the station or siding for the purpose of being carried, the value of such horses, cattle or other animals, or birds, shall have been declared by the consignor thereof, and the increased charges hereunder set forth (which are in addition to the freight charges), shall have been paid to and accepted by the employee duly authorised to receive same.

On horss, cattle, or other animals insured at the risk of the Commissioners, power is reserved to them to regulate the number of animals which shall be carried in each truck, and the Commissioners will not be responsible for any loss or injury which may occur to any live stock during the loading or unloading, or during transit, when such loss or injury arises from fear or restiveness, or through such live stock being suffocated or trampled upon, and without negligence on the Commissioners' part.

The Commissioners' liability is limited as follows, viz.:—For any horse, £50. For any neat cattle, per head, £20. For any sheep, pig, dog, or other small animal, or bird, per head, £1.

The increased charges are as under, and must be prepaid upon consignment of the stock:—

Provided that in all cases any animal or bird exceeding in value £100 shall be insured only under special agreement.

Owners of stock going to and returning from Shows may be allowed free carriage each way of fodder, as specified hereunder, if it be loaded in the trucks with the animals:—

1 cwt. for each horse or head of cattle.

20 lbs. for each pig or sheep.

Exhibits from the Department of Agriculture, viz., wheat, straw in bulk, olive oil, wine, honey, etc., fruit (preserved), charts, etc., fibres, including flax, hemp (dressed and undressed), willows, manures, vegetable oil, eggs, also the necessary marquees, poles and pegs, tables, trestles, and fittings, forwarded to the various Agricultural Shows in the State, shall be carried free both on the forward and backward journeys at owner's risk; when consigned at Commissioners' risk on the forward or backward journey the full Commissioners' Risk Rate shall be imposed.

Distict exhibits forwarded by local Agricultural Societies to the Royal Agricultural Show shall be carried on the forward journey at the Grain Rate subject to the tariff for Smalls and returned free under the usual show conditions.

Consignors should give not less than four (4) days' notice to the stationmaster of the number and description of live stock trucks, and 48 hours for other trucks, etc., required to load exhibits.

8. Owners of stock going to and returning from Shows may be allowed free carriage each way of fodder, as specified hereunder, if it be loaded in the trucks with the animals:—

1 cwt. for each horse or head of cattle.

20 lbs. for each pig or sheep.

9. Exhibits from the Department of Agriculture, viz., wheat, straw in bulk, olive oil, wine, honey, etc., fruit (preserved), charts, etc., fibres, including flax, hemp (dressed and undressed), willows, manures, vegetable oil, eggs, also the necessary marquees, poles and pegs, tables, trestles, and fittings, forwarded to the various Agricultural Shows in the State, shall be carried free both on the forward and backward journeys at Owner's Risk; when consigned at Commissioners' Risk on the forward or backward journey the full Commissioners' Risk Rate shall be imposed.

10. District Exhibits forwarded by local Agricultural Societies to the Royal Agricultural Show shall be carried on the forward journey at the Grain Rate, subject to the "Tariff for Smalls," and returned "free," under the usual Show conditions.

11. Consignors should give not less than (4) days' notice to the stationmaster of the number and description of live stock trucks, and 48 hours for other trucks, etc., required to load exhibits.

12 If a full sheep-truck load of sheep, or a full cattle-truck load of horses, cattle or pigs has been paid for on the forward journey, and the whole of the stock has been returned "free," in accordance with the provisions of Clause 4 of this division, one stock attendant, in respect of each truck, will be granted a refund of the return fare paid by him. He must travel in the truck or in the van of a goods train with the stock, and must provide himself with a copy of Form P69, duly completed by the station-masters at the forwarding and returning stations respectively. A receipt for the refund must be given on the certificate by the attendant. This refund shall, however, only be allowed provided a straight up and down journey is made between two stations. When the stock is returned from any station other than that to which it was waybilled by the original despatching station, the stock attendant certificates for the journeys made must be retained by the stock attendant until he returns to the original despatching station, and forwarded by the Stationmaster at that station to the General Passenger and Freight Agent, where any refund due will be adjusted.
