

In 1945 and 1947, further importations were made from the well-known CLENSTONE Stud, Dorset, England.



Prizes in all classes other than those in which the amounts are specifically stated will be based on the following scale:—From one to three entries, 7/6, 4/-; from four to six entries, 12/6, 4/-, Card; from seven to nine entries, 15/-, 7/6, Card; ten entries or over, £1/2/6, 12/6, 4/-.

Entry fee 4/-, Members 3/-.

NOTE.—Poultry will be received and penned, fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

SPECIAL NOTE.—Owing to the fact that Mr. Anthony will judge all standard breeds and ducks, geese and turkeys, judging will continue over several days and birds will be required to be on exhibition for a longer period than usual.

Exhibitors will please note that birds MUST be penned before 9 p.m. Thursday, 21st September.

In order to avoid disappointments, exhibitors are advised to despatch their birds so that they will arrive as early as possible on that day.

Poultry arriving at Spencer Street Railway Station on Thursday, 21st September, will be picked up and conveyed to the Show Grounds by the Society's carrier.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Friday, 22nd September. The pavilion will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. from Friday, 22nd September, to Friday, 29th September, and from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Saturday, 30th September.

When forwarding poultry by rail, exhibitors are particularly requested to mark clearly in each compartment of the coop the exhibit number of the bird that was sent therein, so that the same arrangement of birds may be made for the return journey.

Tags bearing the pen numbers will be forwarded to exhibitors, together with entry tickets. These tags must be securely fastened to the legs of the birds in accordance with the exhibit numbers on the entry tickets.

Selling prices of all Poultry exhibits may be displayed on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Poultry Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person. A commission of 5 per cent. will be charged on all sales effected by the Superintendent on behalf of exhibitors.

Exhibits must not be handled unless the authority of the Superintendent be first obtained.

RULES.

1. "Cock"—A cock shall mean a male over 12 months of age. "Hen"—A hen shall mean a female over 12 months of age. "Cockerel"—A cockerel shall mean all males hatched on or after 1st July, 1949. "Pullet"—A pullet shall mean all females hatched on or after 1st July, 1949. "Duckling"—A duckling shall be 12 months of age or under on the first day of the Show.

2. Labels and despatch slips will be sent for each pen, when the exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs. On the reverse side of the labels exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary, by post or telegram, of the despatch of their exhibits, giving full particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box if it be properly divided, and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the exhibition pens by the Society.

- 3. The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for for any accident, mistake, loss or damage from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.
- 4. The Veterinary Surgeon, or his deputy, is authorised to order the removal of all birds owned by an exhibitor, any one of whose exhibits shows signs of being infected with a contagious disease.
- 5. Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

GRAND CHAMPIONSHIP GOVERNMENT CERTIFICATES will be awarded for Poultry as under:—

- 1. Light breeds (bantams excepted), best bird, any age or sex.
 - 2. Heavy breeds, best bird, any age or sex.
 - 3. Best Duck or Drake.
- 4. Best Pair of Birds (pure bred or cross), adapted for export.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS.

- 1. No certificate will be granted in any one of the above Classes unless there are at least six (6) competitors.
- 2. Any bird having previously been awarded a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate is not eligible to compete again.
- 3. The competition will be confined to birds which are the property of and have been bred by the competitor.
- 4. Societies under whose auspices the certificates are awarded shall obtain and forward to the Director of Agriculture, when applying for the Certificates to be prepared, statutory declarations from the exhibitors that the winning bird has not previously won a Government Gold Medal or Champion Certificate, and that the exhibitor is the breeder, as required in condition (3) above.
- 5. The bird winning the certificate in any class shall, immediately upon such award being made, have two holes punched in the inside web of the left foot. The markings shall be done by or under the supervision of the judge (in the presence of a member of the Committee of the Society) of the Section in which the award is made, who shall not certify to such award unless and until such marking has been carried out.
- 6. The Department will supply to the Secretary of the Society a punch for use by the judge. This punch must be returned by registered post to the Director of Agriculture immediately after the Show.



NOTE.—Pigeons will be received and penned, fed and attended to, re-cooped and despatched, free of charge to exhibitors, subject to the provisions of Regulations 43 and 45.

Unless special arrangements are made with the Superintendent, all eggs will be destroyed.

Birds belonging to interstate exhibitors will be returned on Monday, 2nd October, 1950.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, 26th September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion until after the completion of judging. The Pavilion will be open to the public from the completion of judging until 9 p.m. on Tuesday, 26th September; from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 27th; Thursday, 28th,

and Friday, 29th September, and from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Saturday, 30th September.

Only a limited number of exhibitors will be allowed into the Pigeon House at a time to remove their birds. No birds to be removed till the termination of the Show on Saturday, 30th September, 1950.

Prizes in all Classes will be based upon the following scale:—From one to three entries, 8/-, 3/-; from four to six entries, 12/-, 5/-, Card; from seven to nine entries 15/-, 10/-, 5/-; ten entries or over, £1, 10/-, 5/-.

Labels will be sent for each pen when the Exhibitor is not a resident of Melbourne or suburbs, on the reverse side of which the exhibitors will be required to write their names, addresses, and instructions for the return journey. Country and interstate exhibitors must inform the Secretary by post or telegram of the despatch of their exhibits, giving all particulars, in order that arrangements may be made for receiving them. Several birds may be sent in one hamper or box, if it be properly divided and pen numbers attached to each division. When the exhibitor resides in or near Melbourne, "Entry Tickets" only will be sent, the corresponding numbers being affixed to the coops or cages by the Society.

Selling prices of all pigeons may be displayed

on coops.

Cards will be supplied free on application to the Pigeon Superintendent, who will place them on the coops if requested by exhibitors who are unable to attend in person.

In Utility and Fancy Varieties, all young birds must be rung with 1949-50 recognised club ring. In Homer Classes, all young birds must be rung with a recognised club ring, and the ring numbers of all birds must be given on the entry form. Birds wearing special leg bands or rings, or bearing marks of any kind that may indicate ownership, will not be allowed to compete.

Where classes are provided for any particular colour or variety, birds of that colour or variety must be shown in those classes. Where young bird classes are provided, young birds must not be shown in old bird classes.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.



Budgerigars, Canaries and Cage Birds must be delivered to the Superintendent at the Pigeon Pavilion on the Show Grounds not later than 9 p.m. on Wednesday, 20th September. Country and interstate exhibitors may make arrangements with the Society to receive their birds and return them after the Show.

Exhibitors must provide suitable cages for their birds—standard, if possible. Gummed labels to be affixed thereto will be supplied by Gummed the Society, and no addition must be made to these labels by exhibitors. In the event of an exhibitor adding to the information included on the label by the Society, the bird to whose cage this label is attached will be disqualified.

No bird suffering from any disease will be allowed to be exhibited.

Judging will be commenced at 9 a.m. on Thursday, 21st September, and, with the exception of those engaged by the Society, no person will be admitted to the Pavilion on that day. The Pavilion will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 9 p.m. on Friday, 22nd September, and Saturday, 23rd September.

During the Show the birds will be in the custody of the Society, and must not be touched or handled by the owner or any person, on any pretence whatever, without the permission of the Superintendent.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their birds before 9 p.m. on Saturday, 23rd September.

The Society will arrange for a competent person to feed and otherwise attend to the birds, and caretakers will be on duty in the Pavilion night and day during the currency of the Show.

The greatest care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Society will not be responsible for any accident, mistake, loss or damage, from whatever cause arising, the exhibits being at the sole risk of the exhibitor. In case of the death of any exhibit, the same shall be certified by the Veterinary Surgeon or his deputy.

Exhibitors of birds which are protected or kept under permit, must produce their permit when called upon to do so. The Society does not accept any responsibility in this matter. Entries can only be accepted as the control of the co tries can only be accepted on this condition.

Birds that have been tampered with or improperly dealt with in any way shall be disqualified, and entry fees paid therefor shall be forfeited. The exhibitor shall also be liable to disqualification, and, if a member, to expulsion from the Society.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS-AUSTRALIAN WINES CLASSES.

- 1. All classes are open for competition to wine growers and wine merchants.
- 2. A wine merchant shall mean any person, association, or company buying wine.
- 3. A wine grower shall mean any wine grower owning or occupying a vineyard, and manufacturing wine from grapes grown in such vineyard, or from grapes purchased for the purpose of wine-making.
- 4. Exhibitors may either be members or nonmembers of the Society.
- 5. Exhibitors will be allowed up to three entries in any one class. Each wine sample to consist of three quart (reputed) bottles in the young wine classes and four bottles in the open classes. Two quart (reputed) bottles are to be supplied for Brandy and Vermouth. Exhibitors entering the same wine in more than one class must supply the full number of sample bottles for each entry.

Note.—In 1950 the number of bottles has been increased, see note at head of section.

- 6. All wines will be judged on points.
- 7. The judge may award prizes on the basis of First, Second, Third, Very Highly Commended, Highly Commended and Commended, but prize money will only be allocated for first and second awards.
- 7 (a). The judge shall have power, at his discretion, to transfer exhibits from one class to another when it is obvious that the exhibitor has made an error in making his entry.
- 8. Entries must be made on forms supplied by the Society for that purpose. Exhibitors must state on the forms the class to be competed for, the distinguishing mark on the exhibits, character and vintage of the wine, and, when stipulated, the quantity in stock.
- 9. No person will be allowed to inspect an entry form after reception by the Secretary, until the Judges' awards have been made public.

4. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void, and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.

5. No person will be allowed to inspect an entry form after reception by the Secretary, until the Judges' awards have been made pub-

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES.

1. The Judges shall have power to call in one or more persons, not being exhibitors, for consultative or advisory purposes.







11. Appearance money amounting to £5 shall be paid to each competing society to cover incidental expenditure, irrespective of points gained, provided there is maintenance to the end of the competition.


