All horses and ponies entered in Sections 1 to 8 inclusive are required to be at the grounds from 9 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September, until 1 p.m. on Friday, 28th September, unless otherwise specified.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 28th September.

The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

All Stallions over 2 years of age, owned in Victoria, must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding (Victoria) Act 1928.

Stallions over two years of age exhibited from States other than Victoria, need not be registered under the Act, but must be examined and passed by a Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type.

All Stallions and Mares over two years of age entered in Sections 1 to 6 (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must, after examination by a Government Veterinary Officer, have their Entry Tickets stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 19th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Tuesday, 18th, and Wednesday, 19th September, at 10 a.m.; on Thursday, 20th September, at 8 a.m., and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates, which must be produced to the Steward when entering the judging ring.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony an allowance of three-eighths (§) of an incl. for shoes will be made. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

If the judge entertains a doubt as to the correctness of a height certificate, he has the power to order the exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the Steward shall accompany the exhibit to the Measurer's Stand and supervise the re-measuring.

Exhibits in classes in which an age certificate from the Society's Veterinary Surgeon is required must be paraded for examination at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, 19th September.

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on entry form. Immediately after the close of entries the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In all Hunting and Jumping Contests, competitors may be limited to 30.

The upper portion of the door of the Horse Boxes outside the Pavilion must remain open during the hours the Show is open to the public. The Exhibitor will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any Exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of one pound.

Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Horse Pavilions. The attention of Exhibitors is drawn to General Regulations 14 and 15. These will be strictly enforced.

Exhibits of horses which, in the opinion of the Society, are not in reasonable Show condition, shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

Exhibitors are advised to study the timetable, showing times at which judging in the various Classes is to be commenced. Judging in any Class will not commence before the time specified. No warning will be given, and any competitor not present when the Judge is ready to commence will miss the opportunity to compete.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must

be removed immediately, and will not be readmitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 28th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

PARADES.

Prize-winning horses and cattle ONLY will be permitted to take part in Parades.

All prize-winning horses and cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits.

All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers.

No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

EXERCISING HORSES.

The exercising of all horses, galloways and ponies, will be allowed on the trotting track only before 8.15 a.m. on any day of the Show, and one week prior thereto, by permission of the Superintendent.

Where height is stipulated, horses must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct Class. Where a definite weight is specified, the horse must, in the opinion of the judge, be suitable for carrying such weight.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony, an allowance of three-eighths (3) of an inch for shoes will be made. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

All horses in the 14-st., 12-st. and 10-st. Hack Classes must be paraded before judging, when the Judge will classify them into their various classes in the following way:— The horses entered for 14-st. Hack shall be paraded, when any horse too light in the opinion of the Judge, shall be transferred to the 12-st. Class. Those entered in the 12-st. Class shall be next paraded, when the Judge shall class out any he considers too heavy or too light, and shall transfer the heavy to 14-st. and the light to 10-st. Class. Those entered for the 10-st. Class shall be paraded, and the Judge shall class out all considered too heavy, and transfer to 14-st. or 12-st. Class, as the case may be. Judging will then commence with the 14st. Class.

Please state on entry form the name, colour and correct age of exhibit, also pedigree (if known).

All prize-winning horses must be paraded. (See Regulation at head of Horse Section.)

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. Notwithstanding any regulation to the contrary, an exhibit may be entered in one ordinary class in the Saddle Section and one ordinary class in the Harness Section.



GENERAL REMARKS.

The Test is to be performed from memory. This is a very simple test and can be carried out by any well-balanced hunter.

All entries must be lodged with the Secretary by 12 noon on Saturday, 30th June.

The number of marks obtainable is 200. Competitors will be penalised for the number of marks by which they fall short of this maximum.

Time allowed for each competitor: 7 minutes. The time will be counted from the exact moment, after the salute to the judges, when the horse moves forward until the horse is brought to a standstill at the end of the test, and the rider salutes the judges. For every second exceeding the time allowed a penalty of a half-mark will be deducted from the score sheet.

Errors over the course will be penalised:— First time 2 marks. 5 marks. Second time Third and subsequent times 10 marks. NOTE.—The Competitors' total marks are

added together, divided by the number of Judges and then deducted from the total of 200.

SADDLERY. Bridle: Snaffle, with or without drop noseband or Double Bridle. Saddle optional. Martingales, bearing reins and blinkers of ANY KIND are

forbidden.

DEFINITION OF PACES.

(In accordance with the Statutes and General Regulations of the Federation Equestre Internationale).

HALT: At the Halt, the horse, standing square on his four legs and immobile, must be ready to move forward at the least pressure of the riders legs.

EXTENDED WALK: At the extended walk, the horse should cover as much ground as quickly as possible WITHOUT haste and without breaking. The hind-legs passing clearly beyond the tracks of the fore legs. The rider gives freedom to the head and neck of the horse without, however, losing contact, so as to be able at any moment to make the horse change his pace, his speed, or his direction.

EXTENDED TROT: At the extended trot, the horse extends his action, his neck is stretched, his shoulders vigorously driven on by the haunches, gains ground forward without noticeably increasing height.

ORDINARY WALK: The ordinary walk is a free, regular and unrestrained walk. The horse walks briskly, but with a calm, deliberate and even step, each clearly marked, distinct and equally spaced. The rider keeps a light and steady contact on the reins.

ORDINARY TROT: The ordinary trot is a pace between an extended and a collected trot.
The horse goes forward freely and quite The horse goes forward freely and quite straight, engages his haunches which remain very active, pulls gently at the reins with a balanced and even bearing. His strides should be as far as possible equal; the hind legs follow exactly in the tracks of the fore-legs.

ORDINARY CANTER: The Ordinary Canter is a pace between an extended and collected Canter. The horse, perfectly straight from the poll to the tail, goes freely with a natural

REIN-BACK: The rein-back is the walk backwards of the horse. It is correct when the horse lifts his feet and brings them down in pairs diagonally almost simultaneously, the haunches remaining well in line. The horse walks back step by step, constantly ready, at the wish of the rider, either to halt or to advance without halting.



The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the proper time.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must notify the Hunter's Shed Steward at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of 10/for each offence.

Stallions are not eligible to compete in any arena event except hunting, jumping and trotting contests.

All entrants in light horse, pony and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection, first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In all Hunting and Jumping Contests, competitors may be limited to 30.

JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

Special Rules:

- (a) Jumping competitions will be judged under the following rules:-
 - 1. Knocking down fence with either fore or hind legs. 4 Faults.
 - 2. Refusals—

1st 3 faults 2nd 6 faults 3rd Elimination

Refusals are cumulative, and the third refusal in the whole round eliminates the Competitor.

- 3. Fall of Horse or Rider. 8 Faults.
- 4. A certain speed for some competitions is required, and a "Time Allowed" for the course is announced. Exceeding the "Time Allowed" is penalised at the rate of 4 Fault for every second or part of a second. The "Time Limit" is double the "Time Allowed."

Exceeding the "Time Limit" is always penalised by Elimination.

Competitors do not get either penalties or bonus marks for completing the course in less than the time allowed.

- (b) Competitors in all jumping competitions will ride at catch weights unless otherwise In classes where a minimum weight is specified, loss of weight entails elimination. Weighing-in is obligatory before and after such competition, and must be carried out in the presence of the official appointed Clerk of Scales for the Show.
- (c) All jumping competitions are for amateur or professional riders unless otherwise
- (d) Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its Council officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever, other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.
- (e) Animals under 14 hands 2 inches may only compete in Classes 182, 186, 188 and 192 to 201.
- (f) Male or Female riders may take part in all events unless otherwise stated.
- (g) All events to be run over course and obstacles as the Council may decide.
- (h) In all events over fences, unless otherwise specified, riders must be 15 years of age or over.

CHAMPION PRIZES.—Champion Sashes will be presented as under: Best mare or gelding, competing singly, in Classes 168 to 173, 176, 177, 184, 185 and 189. Best mare or gelding, competing singly, in Classes 192 to 200. In making the awards, the judge will take into consideration the performances during the Show, and it shall be at his discretion whether he again puts the horses over the fences before making his final decision.







In riding competitions for adults, from 10 to 12 competitors will be tested at a time. Eliminations will follow a preliminary walk, trot and canter. The remaining competitors will be tested at the discretion of the judges.

In riding competitions for children, the tests will be at the discretion of the judge.

Dress, Ladies and Girls:

In hack classes and riding competitions ladies should wear either:-

(a) Black bowler hat, black or dark blue coat. stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots.

Or-

(b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock) jodhpurs and jodhpur boots. In the classes for best equestrienne turnout, ladies should wear (a) above. In

jumping or novelty events, ladies may wear either breeches and boots or jodh-purs with a WHITE shirt and no coat if the weather is hot; ties or stocks should be securely pinned.

Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In hack or pony classes and riding competitions-bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.
- (b) In jumping competitions gentlemen should wear hunting or steeplechase costume. Boys under 18 may wear hunting or Boys under 18 may wear hunting or steeplechase costume or hunting cap, WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

Stallions are not eligible to compete in any Arena event except Hunting, Jumping and Trotting Contests.



QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS.

- 1. Each Country Agricultural Society in Victoria, or a gymkhana registered with the R.A.S. Light Horse Control Council, is invited to cooperate in qualifying competitors for these trophies, by providing annually riding competitions for competitors under 15 years of age on the day of its Show.
- 2. Each Society conducting qualifying competitions is requested to notify the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria of the names and addresses of the winners and "runners-up," so that if it is found that, for any reason, the winners were ineligible, an opportunity may be given the "runners-up" to compete in the Championship Competitions.
- 3. Such competitions to be named "The Good Hands Qualifying Riding Competitions," and the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria to provide suitable certificates for presentation to the winners.
- 4. The holder of a R.A.S. Qualifying Certificate, won in the same year, shall not be eligible to compete.
- 5. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability—mount, saddlery or costume vill not be taken into account, but special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION.

- 6. Only holders of qualifying certificates won during the preceding twelve months will be eligible to compete for the Challenge Trophies at the Royal Melbourne Show. No entry fee will be charged.
- 7. The Championship Competitions shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge, before finally making his award, shall require his six finalists to execute a figure 8 at a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back, all six using the same mount which will be provided by the Society.
- 8. The names of the winners will be engraved on the Challenge Trophies, and they will be entitled to hold them until 31st August in the year following their success.
- 9. Suitably inscribed Championship Sashes will be presented to each successive winner of the Challenge Trophies.
- 10. The winners of the Challenge Trophies will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to age.
- 11. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria may, at its discretion, vary the conditions governing the qualifying and Championship Competitions.
- 12. All entries must be lodged with the Secretary by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 19th September.







The breeding year for Beef Cattle and Fat Cattle dates from 1st September and for Dual Purpose and Dairy Cattle from 1st July in each year.

Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging day, or vice versa.

Cows or Heifers entered in the "in calf" classes must be stripped out prior to entering the judging ring.

Judges have the right to order any Cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

In all Sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for 2/6 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions.

Cows and Heifers in milk, except Friesians, must be at the grounds on Wednesday, 19th September, and be fully milked out between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m., at which hour they will be stripped out in the presence of the Stewards, or whom they may appoint. Friesians will be stripped out between 4 a.m. and 5 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September. They will be judged first on Thursday morning. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out. All other cattle must be at the grounds before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 20th September.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 28th September.

Entries of milking stock (Sections 16 to 23 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter-fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk, and returns forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

In Dual Purpose Sections no animal born after 30th November, 1950, and in Dairy Sections no animal born after 31st October, 1950, may be exhibited.

In classes where entries are limited to one from each exhibitor two animals may be nominated, but only one may be exhibited. In such case no refund will be made of the entry fee paid on the cancelled entry.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of £1.

Parades.— Prize-winning horses and cattle only will be permitted to take part in parades. All prize-winning horses and cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All horses and cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

All male exhibits of Cattle over the age of 12 months shall be rung through the nose, and when on parade or going to and from the parade shall be led by such ring. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for every infringement of this regulation.

Each exhibitor is required to see that each of his exhibits is securely tethered in its stall, and in the case of polled breeds it is compulsory that they be tethered by the nose ring in addition to the head stall or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, exhibits in this Section be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

Exhibits of Cattle which, in the opinion of the Society, are not in reasonable Show condition, shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

Any animal offered for sale may wear, in the sale ring, only those ribbons won in single competition.

In Classes where, to be eligible, animals are to be born between certain dates, which are shown, neither date is inclusive.

Except where otherwise determined by Council all cattle must be certified T.B. free. An animal need not be individually tested for T.B. if from a Government-certified T.B.-free herd. Individual tests must be completed not earlier than 90 days prior to the opening date of the Show. Certificates for individual tests must accompany entry

No animal may be offered for sale by auction unless it has been the property of the exhibitor for at least two years prior to the first day of the Show.

Attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on parade must wear uniform grey coats, which can be secured from the Society.



JUDGING ARRANGEMENTS.

The steers are to be at the Show Grounds by 9 a.m. on Wednesday, 19th September.


They will be weighed alive on that day, commencing at 9 a.m., and the live weights will be handed to the Judge. In the first place the steers are to be judged alive, by the Dairy Shorthorn Judge) on the lines of breed characteristics and suitability for the beef trade. A maximum number of 100 points can be awarded to exhibits when alive.

The steers will be slaughtered in the presence of the Judge on Thursday, 20th September, weighed for dead weight, and judged by the appraisal system. The maximum number of points which can be awarded for the dead carcase is 100. The live weight is also to be furnished to the carcase Judge, who has power to have the carcase cut as he wishes, in order to arrive at a correct judgment. The prizes are to be awarded to the exhibits that gain most points in the two judgings, and are the property of the exhibitors who enter the steers, and not of the purchasers.

A SPECIAL RIBBON AND TROPHY, valued at £5/5/- will be awarded to the most successful exhibitor in this Section. Three points will be awarded for a first prize in each numbered class, two points for a second prize, and one point for a third prize. In the event of a tie, two points will be allotted for a Championship and one point for Reserve Champion awards.




