271. **\*BULL**, any age (Special).—Competition restricted to animals entered in the ordinary classes. A bull will be eligible for entry in this Class if it has not previously been awarded first prize in the class, and if from a registered female which has averaged not less than 10 lbs. of butter fat per week in an official or semi-official test computed on a basis of not less than 273 days after assessing her production by adding allowances in accordance with the Victorian Government Herd Testing Scheme. Judging will be on points: 50 being allowed for type, and 50 for test pedigree. In this latter section, 25 points will be allowed for the butter fat record yield of the bull's dam, and 25 points for the record yield of the bull's sire's dam, in the proportion of two points for each 1 lb. of butter fat over 10 lbs. per week averaged by a cow after assessing her production by adding allowances in accordance with the Victorian Government Official Herd Testing Scheme. Records of the dam and sire's dam must be lodged with the entry, and only tests completed on or before 31st July, 1955, will be taken into consideration. A card showing the record of the bull's dam and his sire's dam will be displayed on the stall during the Show.—Prizes: £3, £2, £1.



- (1) **GRAND CHAMPION COW**, under Government standard herd test regulations. A Grand Champion prize of £100 to be awarded to the cow securing the position of Annual Champion for three years, not necessarily in succession.
- (2) **ANNUAL CHAMPION COW**, under Government standard herd test regulations. A prize of £10 to be awarded to the cow which gives the greatest amount of butter fat under the herd test regulations of the Department of Agriculture during a lactation terminating within a year ended 30th June, subject to such cow re-calving within fifteen months from the previous calving dates. If two lactation periods are completed within the year, the best will be the period considered.
- (3) **ANNUAL RESERVE CHAMPION COW**, under Government standard herd test regulations. A prize of £5 to be awarded to the cow attaining second place under the conditions set out in (2).
- (4) **CHAMPION HERD**, Prize £20, and

- (5) **RESERVE CHAMPION HERD**, Prize £10—To be awarded to the herds giving the greatest and second greatest average returns under the Government standard herd test regulations of the Department of Agriculture during a year ending 30th June, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1) Minimum number of cows (completing the test during the year) in a herd, 15.
- (2) Such herd to average 300 lbs. or more of butter fat.

**TYPE AND UTILITY CLASSES**

Prizes are presented by the Government of Victoria.

**SPECIAL TYPE AND UTILITY CLASSES** are provided in each Dual Purpose and Dairy Breed Section. They will be judged according to the following conditions:—

As a basis of qualification cows competing in these classes must have produced the following amounts of butter fat:—

In the 3,000 lbs. butter fat production class, it is not necessary for cows to have gained a certificate during the aforementioned period.

In all cases where the tests are other than those of the Victorian Standard Herd Test Scheme, certificates issued by the Department or organisation which conducted the tests, must accompany the entry forms.

Judging will be on a type basis only.

No points will be allotted either for production or type.

Competition is restricted to animals entered in the ordinary classes.



# SHEEP

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 12 noon on Friday, 30th September.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (\*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society and must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, on or before 12 noon, Saturday, 23rd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

All male animals must be completely entire. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its pen, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 14th September, 1955.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry may be fined the sum of £1 for each entry of sheep not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by—(1) the death of the animal or animals; (2) contagious or infectious diseases

(confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. In addition to the fine aforesaid the Council may debar the entrant from taking part in any future exhibition by the Society.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

All British Breeds Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep in accordance with the Rules of that Society.

All Corriedale Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Corriedale Association in accordance with the Rules of that Association.

Any found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed will be disqualified.

Disqualified sheep may not be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Exhibitors of disqualified sheep may remove them from the Show Grounds or leave them in their pens. If sheep are left in the pens a notice carrying the words, "Rejected

by Inspectors and not permitted to be offered for sale," must be erected over them.

Sheep in Sections 26 to 38 inclusive, must be penned before 2 p.m. on Sunday, 25th September.

A ewe entered as "with a lamb of her own breed at foot" may be transferred to the Class provided for ewe of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, or vice versa.

All sheep entered in Sections 26 to 38 (inclusive) must be registered in the exhibitor's name and be the property of exhibitors registered in an approved public Flock Book. Only one exhibitor will be recognised as the owner from any one holding.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the yards.

All sheep in the British Breeds Classes (except shorn sheep); over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn between 1st August and 31st December, 1954. Date of shearing to be given on entry form. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1st July, 1954.

Inspectors will examine all registered British Breeds, Corriedale, and Fat Sheep exhibited prior to judging and discard all not up to standard and evenly shorn.

Exhibits of shorn sheep must be closely and evenly shorn on or before 1st September, 1955. No Longwool sheep entered in a shorn class may have more than one and a half inches of wool on any part of its body on judging day, and no shortwool sheep may have more than three-quarters of an inch of wool on any part of its body on judging day.

Sheep not shorn in accordance with the above regulations, will be disqualified.

In shorn sheep classes the carcass will be taken into consideration as well as the type.

Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number, and no particulars other than the breeder's name and date of shearing will be published in the Show Catalogue.

Exhibitors must sign a statutory declaration to the effect that no sheep exhibited by them will be affected by foot-rot, or show any signs or symptoms of the disease at time of exhibition.

For particulars of registration in the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia, apply to the Secretary, Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Corriedale Flock Book, apply to the Secretary of the Australian Corriedale Association, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, C.I.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge: Five shillings during currency of Show. Several large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of 10/- each.

Judging of all Registered Sheep (except Dorset Horns) will commence at 9.30 a.m. on Monday, 26th September. Judging of Dorset Horn will commence at 9 a.m. on Monday, 26th September.

## STRAWING OF PENS.

The Society will arrange for the strawing of all Pens prior to the Show. Charges covering this service must be forwarded with entry fees. The charge for each pen will be 4/-.

## TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 30th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

### **VETERINARY SERVICES:**

All messages for veterinary services should be directed to the Cattle Superintendent's office. During the hours the Show is open to the public, the Society retains one or two members of its own veterinary panel at the grounds who may be consulted by livestock owners in need of such services. Sick or injured stock may be attended by any veterinary surgeon the exhibitor cares to employ.

# PIGS

STEWARD-IN-CHIEF: J. M. GARDINER, Esq.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 30th September. Pigs entered in Sections 42 to 47 must be penned not later than 12 noon, on Wednesday, 21st September.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (\*).

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for the Pig Sections must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, on or before 12 noon on Saturday, 23rd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its pen, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the pen be not occupied by such exhibit by 12 noon on Wednesday, 21st September, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 14th September.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry may be fined the sum of £1 for each entry of pigs not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by—(1) the death of the animal or animals; (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. In addition to the fine aforesaid the Council may debar the entrant from taking part in any future exhibition by the Society.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that

effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

No bedding other than straw or hay, may be used in any box or stall.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

Age of all pigs to be calculated to 15th September in each year. The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision shall be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

In Sections 42 to 47 (inclusive) all exhibits over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book. Pigs in classes under the age of four months must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Pig Society. In the Classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Australian Pig Society, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Pigs not registered prior to 15th July will only be permitted to be entered for the Show on payment of double entry fees.

Exhibitors must be financial members of the Australian Pig Society, whose herds must be accredited as Brucellosis-free by the Department of Agriculture.

All sows 9 months old or over must be in pig or have produced a recorded litter within 9 months prior to 15th September, 1955. The date of birth of such recorded litter must be stated on the entry form.

All boars over 12 months old must have had their tusks cut back to gum level one week prior to the Show, and the Superintendent is empowered to remove from the Show Grounds any boar whose tusks have not been cut.



The Registered Herd Book numbers of all exhibits and of the sires and dams of exhibits must be stated on entry form.

Entries are limited to two in each class from any one exhibitor, in whose name the exhibits must be registered in the Herd Book.

Judges shall give consideration to sows entered in the "Sow and Litter" Classes when making Champion and Reserve Champion awards.

No sow (other than those entered in the sow and litter classes) will be permitted to be exhibited with a litter.

Any boar, entered in the breeding classes, not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeons may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Pig Section. On application to the Secretary, sheds will be reserved. Charge, 12/6 each, during the currency of the Show. Ten extra large sheds beyond the end of the Pig Pavilion, each fitted with four sleeping bunks, may be reserved on payment of £1/10/- each.

No pig shall be transferred from its numbered pen without the sanction of the Superintendent.

All pigs entered in the stud classes will be paint branded with exhibit numbers.

#### TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE that it is a condition of entry that motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 30th September.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.
