THE ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be opened on **THURSDAY, 22nd SEPTEMBER.**

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 22nd September (Judging Day), and on the remaining days of the Show, till Friday, 30th September (inclusive), from 9 a.m. on payment of 5/- for adults and 1/- for children under 14.

On the final day (Saturday, 1st October), the admission fee will be 2/- for adults and 6d. for children under 14.

REPORT OF PROCEEDINGS

For the Year 1955

Annual Report of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

To the Members —

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Council of your Society now reports on the Society's activities during the year ended 31st December, 1955.

ROYAL SHOW

The Society's 1955 Show, which was staged from 22nd September to 1st October, was officially opened on Friday, 23rd September by His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria, Sir Dallas Brooks who was accompanied by Lady Brooks.

The Council is most appreciative of the keen interest displayed by Sir Dallas and Lady Brooks in our Royal Show.

An excellent entry of 22,457 was received for the Show and the exhibits displayed were generally of a very high standard.

The early part of the Show was marred by adverse weather which greatly affected the attendances on these days but despite this 648,137 people visited the Show. This total is 29,324 less than the all-time record for 1954.

Over 7,000 children took advantage of the Council's offer of admitting at half the usual price, parties of school children accompanied by their teachers.

The Arena programme, although somewhat up-set on the first Friday by wet weather, was well organised throughout the Show. Special Arena attractions were not all of a standard required by the Society but every effort is being made to improve these attractions for 1956, which should encourage greater patronage from our City people.

Public reaction to the Navy Display featuring the Helicopter and the finish of the Warrnambool to Melbourne Bicycle Race indicates that both of these events are well worthy for consideration for the 1956 Show. The Grand Prix Jumping Contest and the special night for Night-Trotting also brought very favourable comments.

These are the type of events which should greatly help our Arena program.

The Wood-chopping events in a separate Arena again provided good competitive entertainment for a large number of spectators. The new "Baker" judging machine proved most successful and will benefit the Society in future years by allowing more axemen to compete in the various heats thus saving log supplies.

The new Dairying Industry Display was an outstanding attraction and was a step further in the desire of the Council to give practical demonstrations of the workings of major primary industries of Victoria.

The mechanical section of the display showed in full scale the operations connected with the production of pasteurized bottled milk. Approximately 65,000 bottles of milk were bottled in the display and all were disposed of in the Milk Bar. The Dairy Display Sandwich Bar was well patronized and over 150,000 sandwiches were sold. The special Dairy Sample Bag stand completely sold out the 60,000 bags prepared.

One third of the space was made available to the processing section of the industry and through their Dairy Industry Committee they staged a colourful display of all milk products made in Victoria.

Homogenised flavoured milk was introduced in Victoria at two special milk bars. 30,000 bottles were sold and it is anticipated that this new milk drink will develop extensively in this State in the near future.

The International Fleece Competition was again well supported and made an attractive display in the Centenary Hall.

A larger area was made available for an aquarium and the display staged by the Association proved a good public attraction.

The demand for stands at the Show was again far greater than the space available. The 1955 Standholders, by erecting new buildings and extending and generally improving existing stands, helped to add much colour to our Show.

MEMBERSHIP

The Medallions made available for full Membership of the Society this year brought favourable comments from many members.

DIVISION OF CATTLE BREEDS

Owing to the compulsory demolition of part of No. 2 Cattle Pavilion to make way for the New Grandstand it was decided to divide two Dairy Cattle Breeds i.e. Australian Illawarra Short-horns and Guernseys at the 1955 Show. This move appeared to be satisfactory and further consideration will be given to this matter.

DEVELOPMENT OF GROUNDS

The additional land with buildings at the western end of the Show Grounds purchased during the year and the demolition of the old houses in Leonards Crescent will give the Society the opportunity of further developing the Grounds.

OVERSEAS SCHOLARSHIP

It is desired to place on record the Society's keen appreciation for the generous gift made by the Trustees of the H. V. McKay Trust in making available sufficient funds to enable a Victorian farmer to travel overseas.

With the co-operation of the Nuffield Foundation Organisation, the Society has arranged for a Victorian farmer to travel abroad early in 1956.

The successful applicant for this first Scholarship was Mr. R. M. Butler of Newstead.

The Society feels that Mr. Butler will prove a worthy representative and that he will, on his return, be able to impart his knowledge to other farmers in our State.

COUNCIL

At the annual election of office-bearers, Mr. T. N. Mitchell was re-elected President of the Society and His Honour Judge Mitchell, Messrs. J. Bott and L. M. Dugdale were re-elected Vice-Presidents.

It is with deep regret that the deaths of Capt. A. E. T. Payne and Mr. J. A. Beattie are recorded.

Capt. Payne was elected to the Council of the Society in 1908 and was a Trustee of the Society from 1921 to 1949. He also occupied the position of Vice President on several occasions. His great assistance and enthusiasm in connection with the Society's activities will always be remembered and valued.

The late Mr. Beattie was elected to the Council in 1911 and his efforts over these years are greatly appreciated.

Leave of absence, during various stages of the year, was granted Messrs. A. R. Creswick, K. G. Luke and T. Luxton, Jnr. who travelled Overseas during the year.

NEW GRANDSTAND

Satisfactory progress is now being made in connection with the erection of the New Grandstand and it is anticipated that the first section of the Stand will be available for use early in the new year. When completed the stand will provide members of the Society with much greater facilities during the Show period.

FINANCE

The financial statements and Balance Sheet for the year ended the 31st December 1955 are attached to this report. The revenue has been considerably increased due to some extent to the increased use of the grounds between Shows for Night Trotting, storage and soccer. The expenditure of the Society has however, shown an increase due mainly to increased costs of labour and materials and improvements made to the grounds.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

The Council's appreciation is recorded for the presence of the Premier, The Hon. Mr. H. E. Bolte and members of the State Cabinet and many other members of the State Parliament, also the numerous members of the Federal Government, who visited our Show.

Special thanks are due to the Lord Mayor (Sir Fránk Selleck) and the Mayor of Essendon (Cr. E. B. Basford) for their interest in our Royal Show and also to the Minister for Education (The Hon. Col. W. W. Leggatt) and the Director of Education (Major General A. H. Ramsay) who again permitted parties of school children to visit the Show on various days.

The Overseas Judges were Captain and Mrs. Will Judy of U.S.A. who judged a number of the dog classes, Mr. L. Sherriff of New Zealand who judged Aberdeen Angus and Mr. D. Holden also of New Zealand who judged in the Horse Section and together with the many other judges, Stewards and Stewardesses, carried out their duties most efficiently.

It is desired to record thanks to Mr. A. H. Mullett who recently retired as Director of Agriculture for the co-operation which he rendered to the Society during his term in Office.

Congratulations are extended to Mr. P. Ryan who has been appointed as Mr. Mullett's successor.

Thanks are extended to the various Breed Societies, Public bodies, the Press and Broadcasting Stations for their great part in making our Show such a success.

The Council also desires to record its appreciation of the splendid work done by the members of the staff during the year.

REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO ENTRIES

All horses and ponies entered in Sections 1 to 8 inclusive are required to be at the grounds from 9 a.m. on Thursday, 22nd September, until 1 p.m. on Friday, 30th September, unless otherwise specified.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 30th September.

The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

Stallions over two years of age exhibited from States other than Victoria, need not be registered under the Act, but must be examined and passed by a Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type, except registered Clydesdales carrying a current certificate of soundness issued in South Australia which will be accepted for exhibition purposes on production of this certificate.

All Stallions over 2 years of age, owned in Victoria, must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding (Victoria) Act 1928.

All Stallions and Mares over two years of age entered in Sections 1 to 6 (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must be examined by a Government Veterinary Officer and if passed, have their Entry Tickets stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring. No appeal against a Government Veterinary Officer's decision will be entertained.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 21st September, commencing at 10 a.m.

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Tuesday, 20th, and Wednesday, 21st September, at 10 a.m., on Thursday, 22nd September, at 8 a.m., and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and horses and ponies must be there to obtain their certificates, which must be produced to the Steward when entering the judging ring.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony an allowance of half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of an inch for shoes may be made at the discretion of the Measurer. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official

Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

If the judge entertains a doubt as to the correctness of a height certificate, he has the power to order the exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the Steward shall accompany the exhibit to the Measurer's Stand and supervise the re-measuring.

Exhibits in classes in which an age certificate from the Society's Veterinary Surgeon is required must be paraded for examination at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, 21st September.

All entrants in saddle and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on a form. Immediately after the close of entries the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In any Hunting or Jumping Contest, competitors may be limited to 30.

Any exhibitor who supplies wrong information on entry or performance form will render himself liable to disqualification.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any Exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of one pound.

Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Horse Pavilions.

Exhibits of horses which, in the opinion of the Society, are not in reasonable Show condition, shall be removed from the grounds and shall not be eligible to be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

Exhibitors are advised to study the time table, showing times at which judging in the various Classes is to be commenced. Judging in any Class will not commence before the time specified. No warning will be given, and any competitor not present when the Judge is ready to commence will miss the opportunity to compete.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society at the time of entry.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Sweepstakes, special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

Applications for stands for harness and saddlery, vehicles, machinery and implements, single exhibits, or goods for exhibition only, must be made by ordinary letter. After the applications close, positions will be allotted and a charge will be made for the space granted.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for Horse and Contest Sections, except Trotting must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, on or before Thursday, 30th June, 1955, at 5 p.m. Entries for the Trotting Contest Section must be in the hands of the Secretary of the Trotting Control Board, Royal Showgrounds, Ascot Vale, on or before Wednesday, 10th August, 1955, at 3 p.m. Entries for all other sections must be in the hands of the Secretary on or before 12 noon on Saturday, 23rd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be completely entire. Any male animal in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 21st September, 1955.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry may be fined the sum of £2 for each horse entry not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of

the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by— (1) the death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. In addition to the fine aforesaid the Council may debar the entrant from taking part in any future exhibition by the Society.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary or his deputy, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Secretary being first obtained.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Exhibits must not be rugged and horses must not wear spats during the hours the Show is open to the public, and the upper portion of horse boxes outside the pavilion must remain open during those hours. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

No bedding other than straw or hay, may be used in any boxes or stalls.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement of notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

Winners of Consolation Saddle Classes are eligible to compete in Novice Classes.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 30th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

PARADES.

All horses and prize-winning cattle will be required to take part in Parades, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be

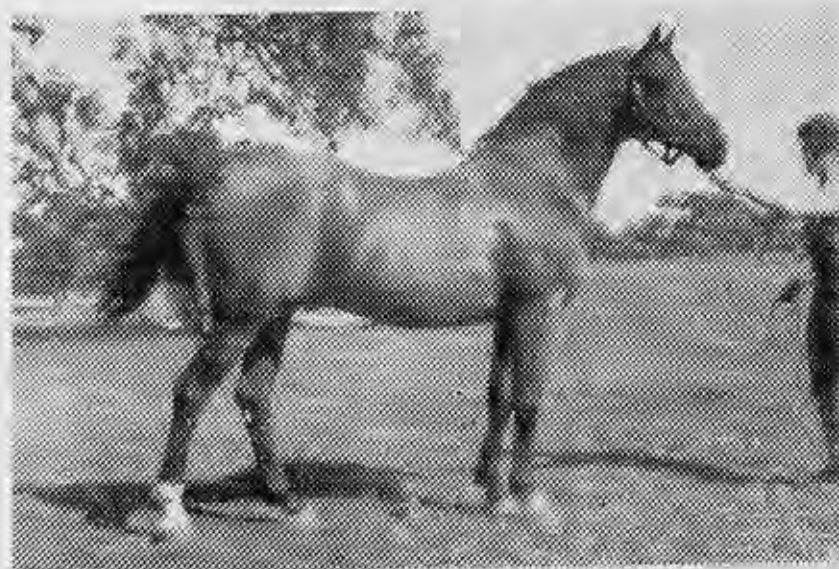

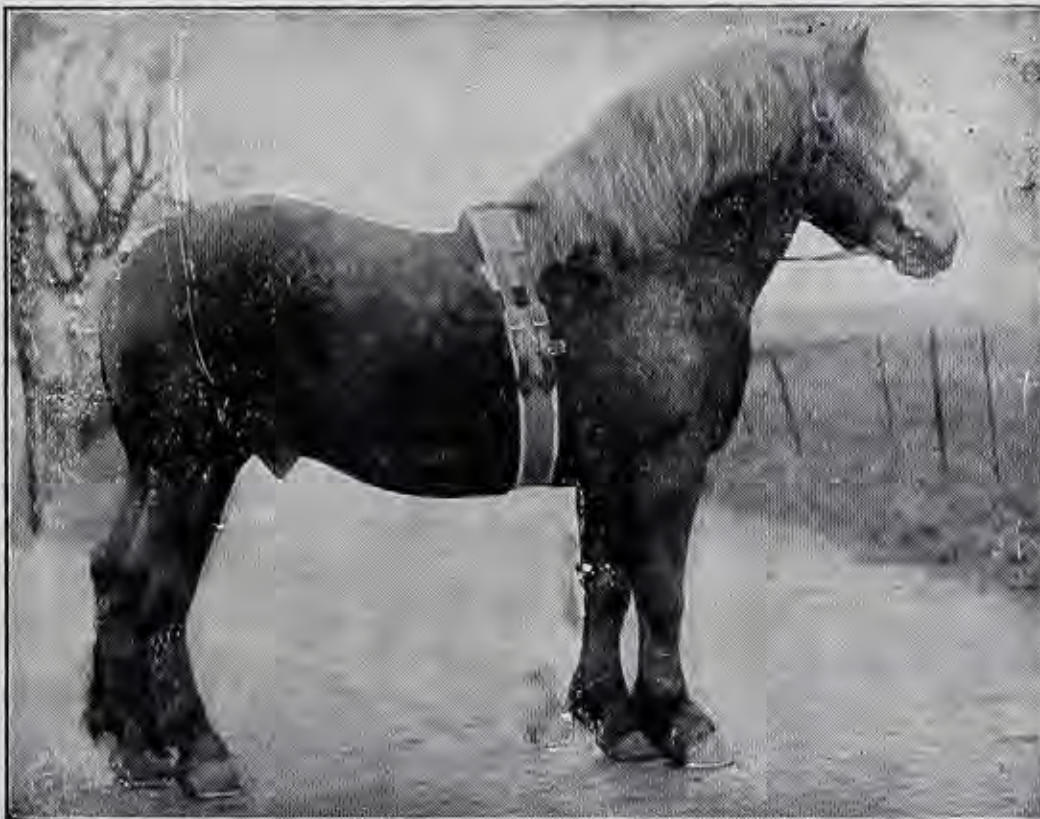

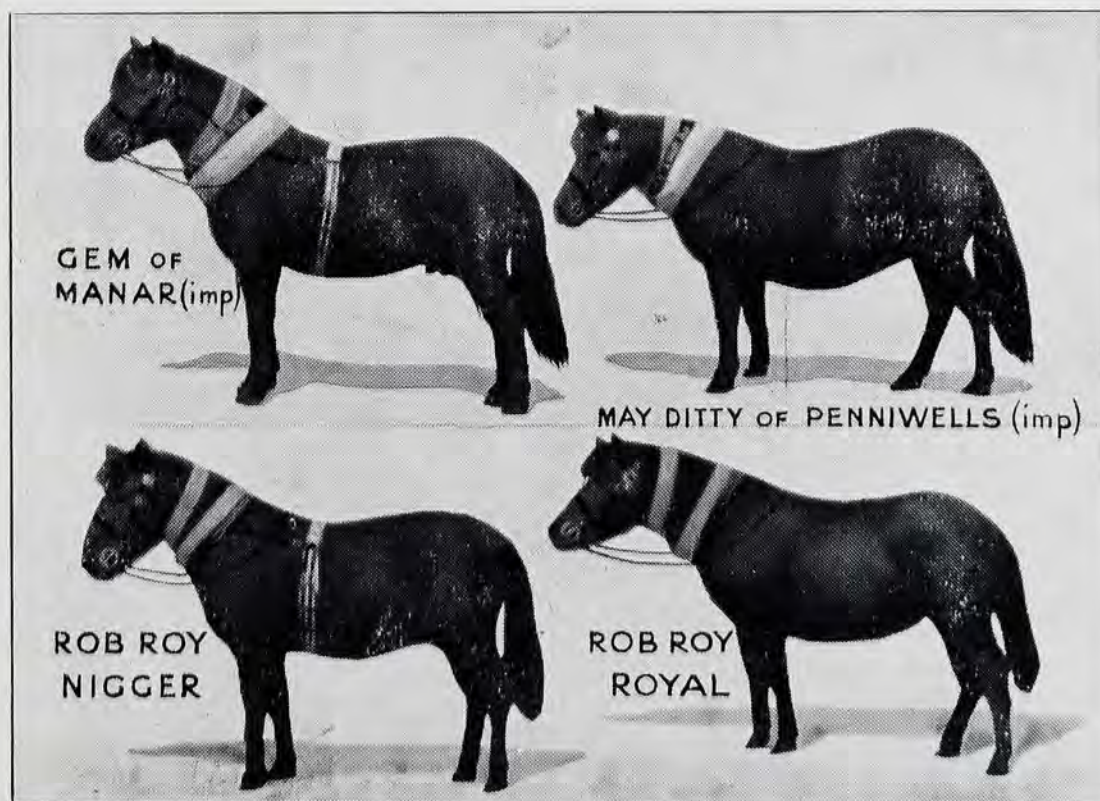

Where height is stipulated, horses must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct Class. Where a definite weight is specified, the horse must, in the opinion of the judge, be suitable for carrying such weight.

All horses in the 14-st., 12-st. and 10-st. Hack Classes must be paraded before judging, when the Judge will classify them into their various classes in the following way:—The horses entered for 14-st. Hack shall be paraded, when any horse too light in the opinion of the Judge, shall be transferred to the 12-st. Class. Those entered in the 12-st. Class shall be next paraded, when the Judge shall class out any he considers too heavy or too light, and shall transfer the heavy to 14-st. and the light to 10-st. Class. Those entered for the 10-st. Class shall be paraded, and the Judge shall class out all considered too heavy, and transfer to 14-st. or 12-st. Class, as the case may be. Judging will then commence with the 14st. Class.

Please state on entry form the name, colour and correct age of exhibit, also pedigree (if known).

All entrants in saddle and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on a form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection, first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded.

Notwithstanding any regulation to the contrary, an exhibit may be entered in one ordinary class in the Saddle Section and one ordinary class in the Harness Section.

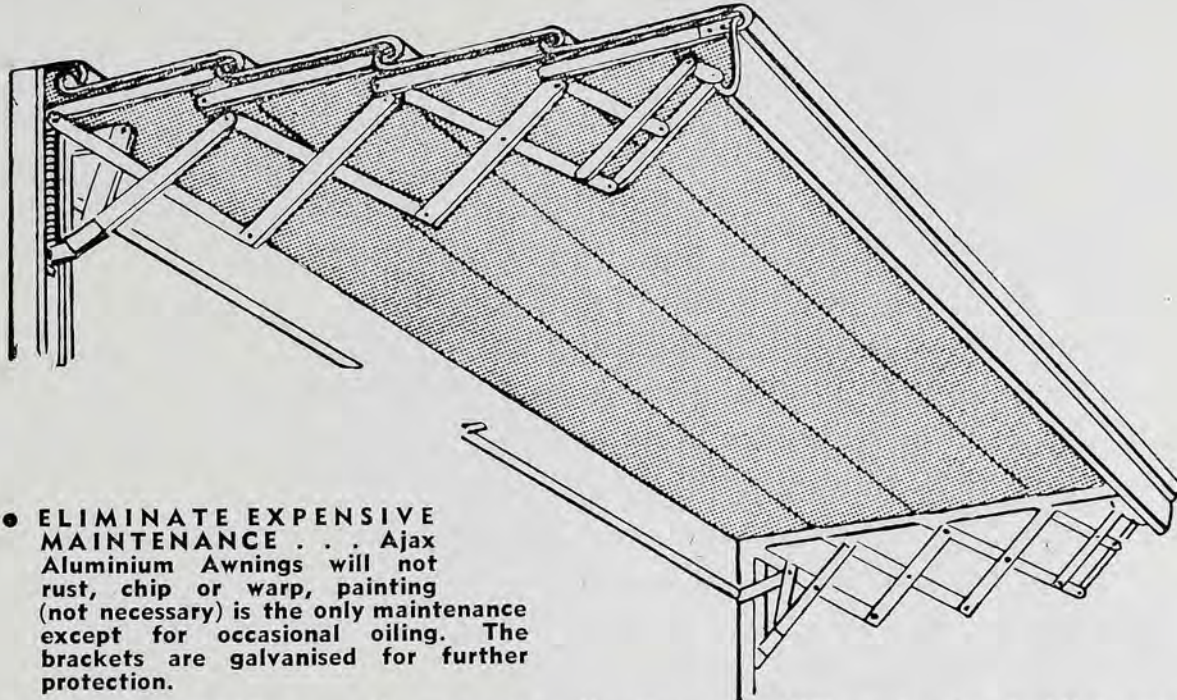

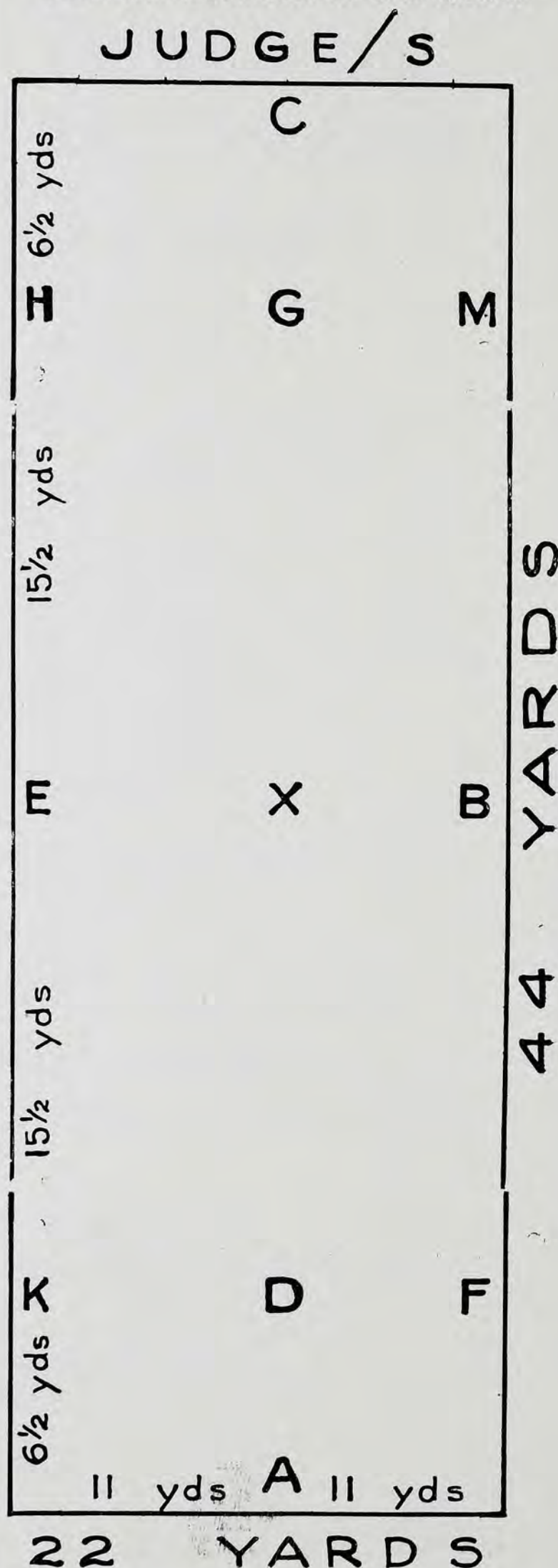

1. ENTRANCE. This should be straight down the centre line. The trot should be active and the horse well on the bit and the head perfectly steady. The transition to the halt should be progressive—one or two paces at the walk—and the horse should stand square, hind-legs well under the body with the weight equally distributed on all four legs. The rider's body should be directly over the point "X" and one fore-leg and one hind-leg of the horse on each side of the white line.

To obtain a good entrance it is essential to start the trot outside the arena and get the horse going well. It is very difficult to obtain a good entry if the rider stands still near the entrance until the signal to enter is given or walks to the entrance, this method will generally result in a "wobbly" start and the horse will give the appearance of being pushed instead of going freely forward.

Great attention must be paid to the halt. The rider must on all occasions during training insist that the horse is halted squarely on all four legs with hind-legs well under the body so that in the end it will become a habit to stand thus.

If the rider feels that the horse is resting one leg, or is not standing square he must rectify it; a well corrected fault is always marked more generously than an uncorrected one.

The halt should be well established and consist of not less than four seconds. It is a bad fault to allow the horse to drop his weight on to his forehead and sink his head and a worse one to hollow his back and throw his head up.

Throughout the test the halt is most important as a correct "move-off" or a correct turn on forehand or haunches is not possible without a correct halt.

Look the Senior Judge straight in the face with a pleasant expression when you salute just as if you were taking off your hat or bowing to someone you were really pleased to meet.

Get hold of your horse before you move-off and make sure that he starts in the correct pace and keeps straight and does not throw up his head.

2. AT "C" TURN RIGHT. Be careful not to make an abrupt turn and use plenty of inside leg to make sure the horse is bent in the direction to which he is going, hold the bend through the corner and move smoothly away from the side at "M". Take up some mark beyond "K" and keep that mark and "K" in a straight line to ensure you are moving straight. Take up the new bend on arrival at "K" and hold it through the corners.

3. ORDINARY TROT RISING. Sit down in the saddle and with your seat and legs push the horse into a trot, do not lean forward, do not start to rise until you have got the trot established which should be in one or two strides. The horse should be taught to go forward at a light pressure of the legs and all flapping of the legs must be avoided. Start preparing the horse by creating increased impulsion a stride or two before reaching "F" to prevent the element of surprise and ensure a smooth transition. Keep your hands still and the horse's head steady; it is a bad fault if the horse pokes his nose or throws his head up.

In the extended trot try to make the horse lengthen his stride without increasing the pace of his steps. Keep the pace up round the corners and on the short side of the arena. Do not try to push the horse too much into the corners, it is better to make a wide turn keeping the right bend and cadence than to make sharp corners by pulling on the outside rein and losing them. The better the horse is trained the sharper the corners can be made holding the cadence and bend, but in a Novice Test the horse is not expected to move through acute corners.

4. SLOW TROT SITTING. Come back to the slow trot as smoothly as possible, let there be a decided change in the pace but maintain the activity. The slow trot is the beginning of collection and the horse must be pushed well up to the bit, the action should be somewhat rounder and higher, it must not be allowed to deteriorate into a "sloppy" trot. Care must be taken that the action of the bit must not be so strong that the horse's head is brought back to the perpendicular.

The Circle must be a true Circle and not approximating to a square by remaining too long on the track on the long sides.

5. CANTER AT "C". Prepare the horse a stride or two before coming to "C" by creating increased impulsion, make sure that you do not lose your bend, do not look down or lean forward and give your aid a stride before reaching "C". The same remarks apply in the canter-circle as in the trot-circle.

6. EXTENDED CANTER. Sit well down and drive the horse into longer strides, do not lean forward nor stand in the stirrups. Be careful the horse does not bring his quarters in, this can be prevented by bringing the forehand a little more to the inside of the track. Maintain the pace and correct bend through the corners. In reducing the pace bring the horse back smoothly being careful to maintain a steady head carriage and hold the quarters straight.

7. TURN ON THE FOREHAND. Make a definite halt as directed in para. 1. with rider's shoulders in line with the "E" marker. Keep the hands steady and firm to prevent the horse from going forward, with the right leg the rider should move the horse's quarters round the forehand, the inner (right) fore-leg being the pivot.* The horse's head may be slightly flexed to the right but the neck must not be bent. The hind-legs should move in regular and even steps, the right hind-leg moving over and in front of the left. The rider's left leg controls the movement, pre-

vents the horse from turning too far and sends him forward as soon as the turn is completed. The horse's inner fore-leg should remain on the same spot, he should not step forward.

8. **THE REIN-BACK.** Make a definite halt with the rider's shoulders in line with the "C" marker, and by pressing the horse into a fixed hand, make him step back the required distance. The diagonal legs should move together in two-time. The horse should not sit on his haunches and drag the hind feet back, he should slightly lower his head and round his back and pick the feet well off the ground. He should not run back out of hand but move backwards in a balanced manner keeping parallel to the side of the arena and as soon as the required distance has been covered move immediately forward without any halt.

9. **SAME AS No. 7 WITH AIDS REVERSED.**

*(Note: The inner leg is the one on the side to which the horse is turning or is bent.)

10. **FREE WALK.** In the free walk with a loose rein the horse should stretch his neck forwards and downwards, lengthen the stride and walk steadily forward, the rider having no contact with the horse's mouth through the reins.

11 to 14. **THE SAME AS Nos. 3 to 6 WITH AIDS REVERSED.**

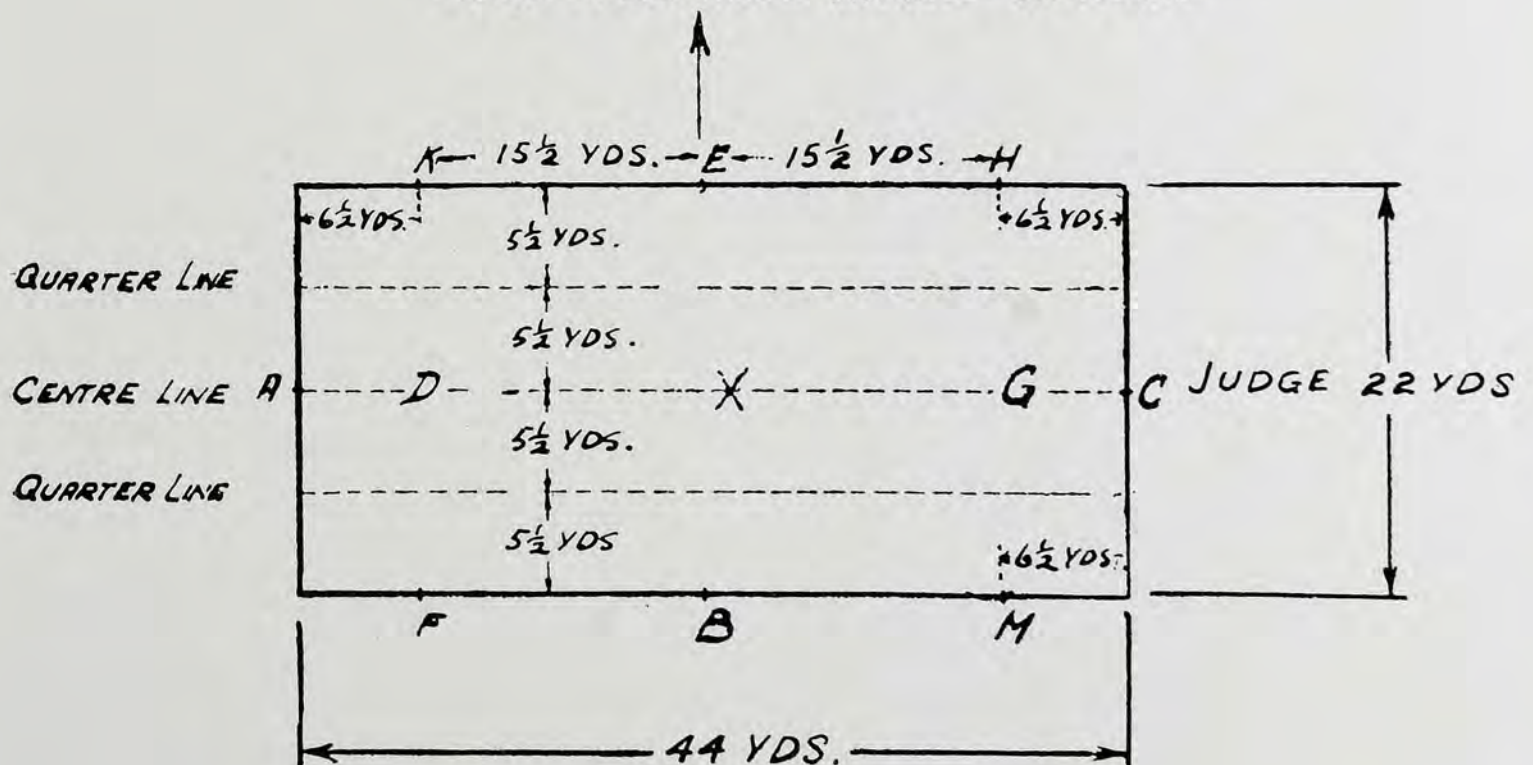
15. Commence the turn before arriving at "A" so as to complete the turn and straighten absolutely on the line "A"- "C", taking care not to overshoot the line. Salute as advised in para. 1. and allow the horse to walk out with a loose rein.

ELEMENTARY TEST.

Comments.

1. Entrance as in Trained Pony Test No. 1.

All movements in Elementary tests may be progressive unless otherwise stated. It is therefore, better to put in one or two strides at the walk and get the "move-off" smooth and straight, than to try to break straight into the trot and cause the movement to be rough and crooked.

2. As in the Trained Pony Test, in the extended trot make the horse lengthen his stride and let there be a definite difference between the extended and the ordinary trot. Be careful to maintain the cadence throughout the transition and the correct bend round the corners. Keep the ordinary trot lively though with shortened strides and the same cadence.

3. Make good wide loops, making sure you go right up to the side line. It is better even to come back a little at the end of each loop as you pass the centre and then change the bend smoothly. Keep the slow trot active (see diagram 1).

4. As for 2.

5. In the halt, the horse must stand absolutely still on all four legs, on the track parallel to the long side and remain on the bit. Count six slowly. The horse must move off smoothly, remaining on the bit without throwing up his head.

6. See Trained Pony Test No. 10.

7. See Trained Pony Test No. 8.

8. Make a definite halt with rider's shoulders opposite "E". Turn about on the haunches, the inside (left hind-leg) being the pivot. The fore-legs performing a semi-circle with even strides round this pivot. The right fore-leg moving over and in front of the left. The pivoting leg when raised should be replaced on the same spot, it is a bad fault if it is drawn back. The horse

should be flexed in the direction of the turn, but the neck should not be bent. The rider's right hand should not be carried across the withers. As soon as the turn is completed and the horse parallel to the long side he should proceed at once at the walk. After three or four strides at the walk break into the canter. Here the transition should not be progressive as it definitely lays down that the canter be done from the walk. Be careful to avoid the quarters coming in and the head being bent out or thrown up.

9. Be sure that the circle is round and goes well up to, but not beyond the quarter line between "X" and "E". There should be no variation in the pace. The horse should be flexed in the direction to which he is going and the hind-legs follow in the tracks of the fore-legs.

A very common fault is that the second half of the circle is flatter than the first; it is better to err in the other direction as if the second half of the circle is flat it makes a more abrupt return to the long side and prevents it from being smooth.

10. See Trained Pony Test No. 6.

11. Come smoothly away from the short side at "A", make the loops well up to but not beyond the quarter lines and maintain the same bend throughout. The horse should always be bent to the leading leg whether cantering false or true. Be careful not to get on two tracks and be sure to make all three loops the same size.

12. As in No. 8 but with the aids reversed.

13. As in No. 9 but with the aids reversed.

14. As in No. 10 but with the aids reversed.

15. As in No. 11 but with the aids reversed.

16. The old canter should be continued to within six feet of "X" and the change produced progressively, i.e., through the trot. There should be at least one stride at the walk and the new canter obtained from the walk not more than six feet beyond "X". The horse's body must remain straight on the diagonal line throughout.

17. As in No. 16.

18. As in Trained Pony Test No. 15, with the exception that here, after the salute, the horse must move off with a loose rein straight towards the judges at "C". The aid to turn to the right may be given by a slight contact of the right rein, the horse then being allowed to walk up the long side with a loose rein.

19. The horse should go freely and actively forward, maintaining activity and cadence in all paces, with smooth transitions. Good and steady head and tail carriage, no raising or beating of the head, no tail swishing. Clear four-time walk evenly spaced. Springing activity from one diagonal to the other in the trot. Canter definitely three-time and straight.

20. Rider's body should be upright with seat well down in the saddle and should be still, the hands and the legs steady. The hands must always remain on their own side of the horse's neck with the elbows close to the sides and the legs should never be in front of the perpendicular. The heels well down even when giving aids and knees turned well in to the saddle. All aids should be correct and as invisible as the training of the horse permits.

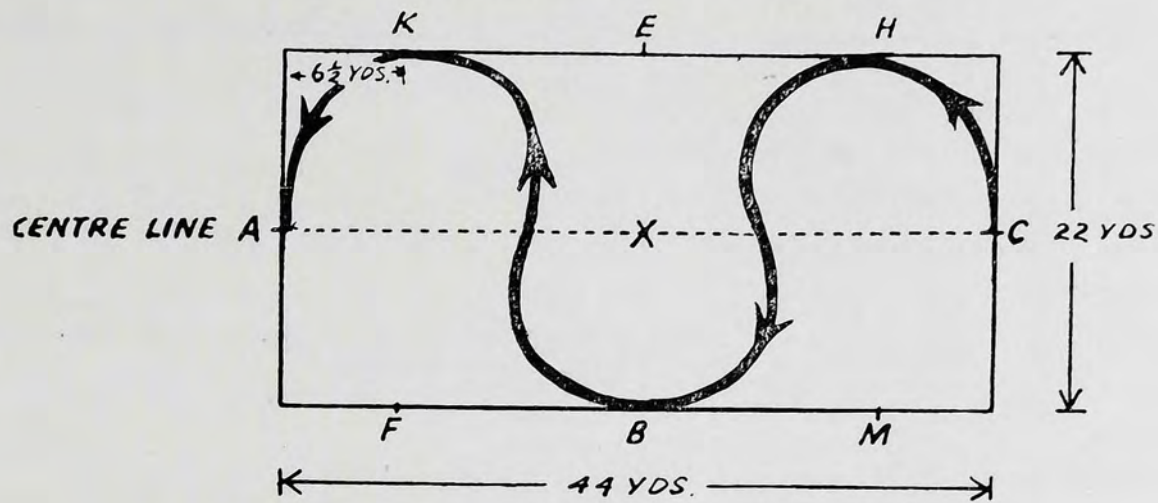

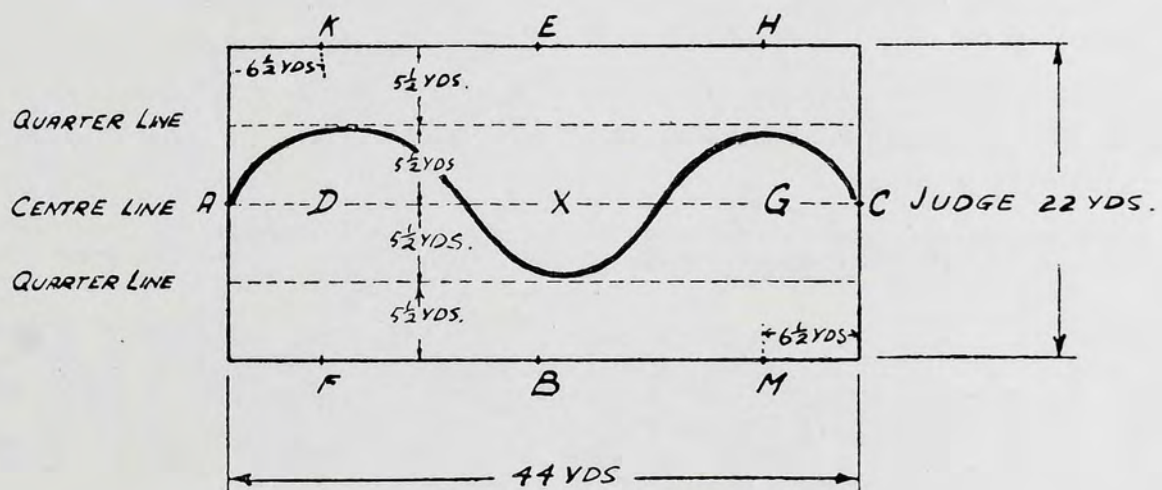

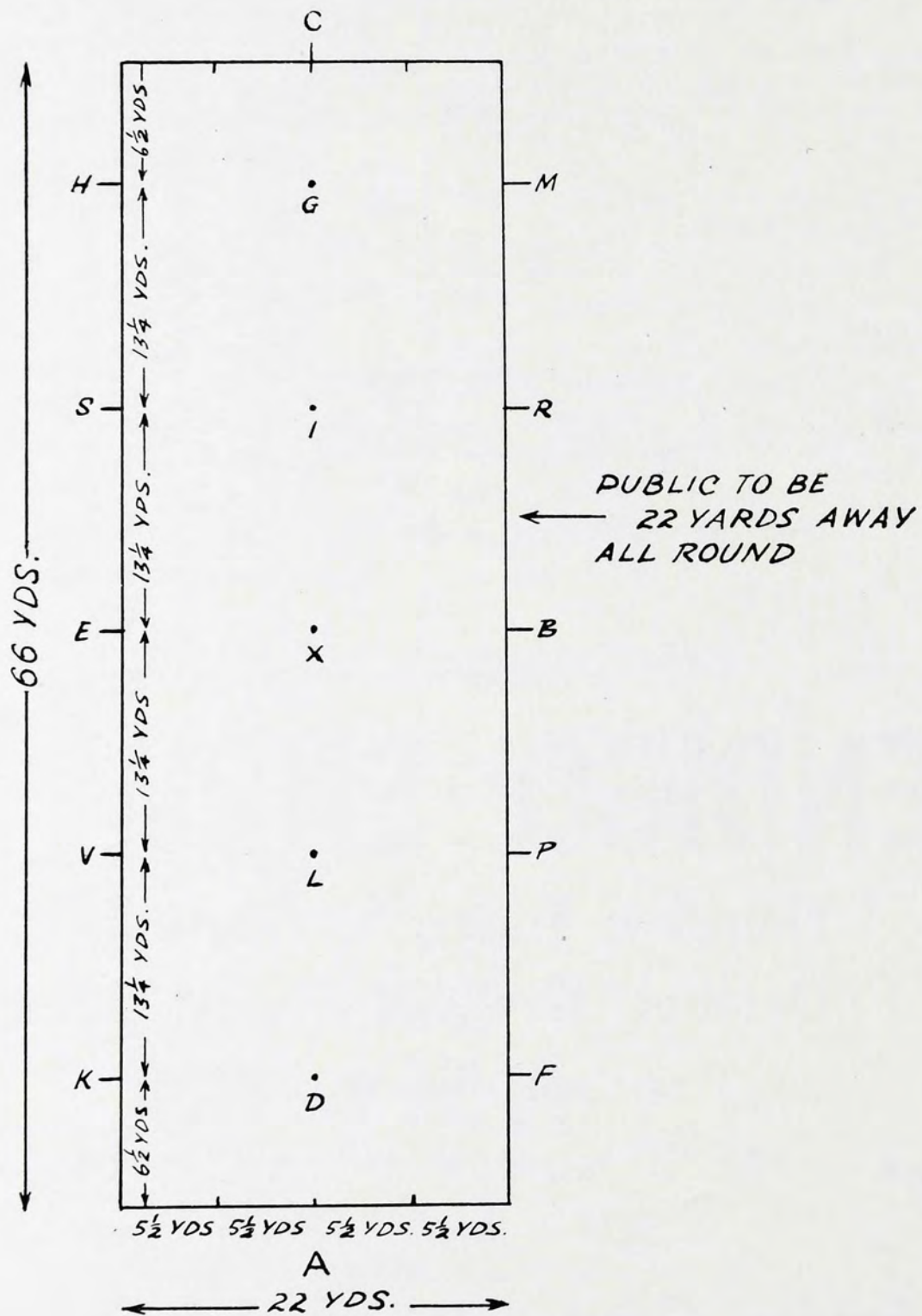

wear hunting cap, tweed coat, WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

*An exhibit may be entered in one ordinary class in each of sections 6, 7 and 8 and in as many special classes as it is eligible to compete in sections 6, 7, 8 and 9.

The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the time directed by the stewards.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must do so with the Hunter's Shed Steward at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of 10/- for the first offence and £1 for second or later offences.

All entrants in saddle and contest sections must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. Immediately after the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. In this connection, first preference will be given to approved animals from other States. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In all Jumping Contests competitors may be limited to 30.

All animals entered for Jumping Competitions Groups A, B, C, D, E and F, must be registered in the Equestrian Federation of Australia's

Register. For particulars regarding registration, apply to the Secretary, Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch), 422 Collins Street, Melbourne.

Competitors in jumping competitions must compete in the order directed by the steward in charge.

Exhibitors will please note that entries should not be made for individual classes except for those in Groups E and F.

The jumping section is divided into groups.

Group A, is for horses judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in that Group.

Group B, is for horses whose past performances indicate that they are not up to the standard of Group A.

Group C, is for ponies and galloways judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in the group.

Group D is for ponies and galloways whose past performances indicate that they are not up to the standard of Group C.

Group E is for qualified hunters.

Group F is for Section fours, trios, and special competitions.

In Group A there will be 7 single events.

In Group B there will be 6 single events.

In Group C there will be 5 single events.

In Group D there will be 4 single events.

Intending competitors in Groups A, B, C and D will not enter for classes by number but simply indicate the number of classes in which they desire to compete.

The Committee after studying the performances will grade the horses and allocate them to the various classes.

In Group E (Qualified Hunters) exhibitors will enter their horses for the class or classes in which they wish to compete.

Exhibitors wishing to enter in the teams and section four events will enter in the class or classes in which they wish to compete. (In these classes horses may be made up into teams, irrespective of the group in which they may be graded.

In Group F there will be no grading and intending exhibitors will enter their ponies and galloways for the classes in which they wish them to compete.

Please note that ponies and galloways 14 hands 2 inches and under may compete only in Group C, D and F.

Entry fees must be forwarded with entry forms for jumping competitions. After entries have been graded they will be allotted to classes and refunds made in respect of those not accepted.

Competitors in all jumping competitions will ride at catch weights unless otherwise stated. In classes where a minimum weight is specified, loss of weight entails elimination. Weighing-in is obligatory before and after such competition, and must be carried out in the presence of the official appointed Clerk of Scales for the Show.

All jumping competitions are for amateur or professional riders unless otherwise stated.

Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its Council officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever, other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.

Male or Female riders may take part in all events unless otherwise stated.

All events to be run over course and obstacles as the Council may decide.

In all events over obstacles and hurdles of any description, unless otherwise specified, riders must be 15 years of age or over.

DRESS.

Ladies and Girls:

In hack classes and riding competitions ladies should wear either:—

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark blue coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots.

Or—

- (b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodhpurs and jodhpur boots.

In Equestrienne Turnout classes and Jumping Contests, ladies must wear (a) above. In novelty events, ladies may wear either breeches and boots or jodhpurs with a WHITE shirt and no coat if the weather is hot; ties or stocks should be securely pinned.

Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In hack or pony classes and riding competitions—bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.

- (b) In jumping competitions gentlemen riders must wear, (a) hunting livery of a recognised hunt club, (b) black coat, with stock, white breeches, black boots, or (c) tweed coat with tie, fawn breeches, black or tan boots. Boys under 16 shall wear hunting cap, tweed coat and WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

RULES FOR JUDGING COMPETITIONS UNDER F.E.I. RULES.

PENALTIES AND MARKING:

- (a) FIRST TURN ROUND, CIRCLE, RUN OUT, OR REFUSAL. 3 FAULTS.
SECOND TURN ROUND, CIRCLE, RUN OUT, OR REFUSAL. 6 FAULTS.
THIRD TURN ROUND, CIRCLE, RUN OUT, OR REFUSAL. ELIMINATED.

The above are cumulative on the entire round.

- (b) OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN. 4 FAULTS.
- (c) FALL OF HORSE AND RIDER or FALL OF RIDER ONLY. 8 FAULTS.
- (d) Jumping an obstacle out of correct order. ELIMINATED.
- (e) Jumping an obstacle before it is re-set. ELIMINATED.
- (f) Horse leaving the arena whether mounted or riderless, before completing the course. ELIMINATED.
- (g) LANDING IN WATER OR DITCH, WHETHER ONE OR MORE FEET. 4 FAULTS.

(NOTE: Should a Horse land in water or ditch, in addition to knocking down the fence, he cannot be penalised more than 4 faults. It is only one obstacle.

OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN:

FOUR FAULTS.

(a) An obstacle is said to be knocked down when, through the fault of the Horse or rider, any part is knocked down, or one of its ends at least is dislodged.

(b) Touches, raps and tips do not penalise. SLATS WILL ON NO ACCOUNT BE USED.

(c) WHEN AN OBSTACLE IS COMPOSED OF SEVERAL ELEMENTS PLACED ON TOP OF ANOTHER IN THE SAME VERTICAL PLANE, SUCH AS SEVERAL BARS FIXED TO THE SAME UPRIGHT (POST AND RAILS), A KNOCK DOWN OF THE TOP ELEMENT ONLY IS PENALISED.

(d) When an obstacle to be taken in one jump is composed of several elements NOT in the same plane (TRIPLE BARS, DOUBLE OXER), a knock-down of one or more elements will be penalised only as for one knock-down.

REFUSAL: 3 Faults for 1st: 6 for 2nd: Elimination for 3rd.

(a) If, in the opinion of the Judge (s), the Horse/Pony is presented at the fence and refuses to attempt to jump, or runs out at the side, it shall count as a refusal, whether the fence is knocked down or not.

If the fence is knocked down it shall be put up again before the rider makes another attempt. The rider should not continue his/her round until the Judge(s) gives the signal. Should a

competitor, who has knocked down a fence when refusing, deliberately jump that fence before it is re-set, he/she will be eliminated.

If the Horse/Pony, in attempting to refuse, slides into the obstacle, pushing it down, and its hind-legs cross the line, it shall count a jump and 4 faults be scored. If, however, the Horse/Pony stops before the hind-legs cross the line of the jump, and is taken back, it shall count as a refusal, 3 faults.

IF THE HORSE/PONY, AFTER REFUSING, IS PUSHED THROUGH THE FENCE, the FAULTS MADE WILL BE ADDED TO THOSE FOR THE REFUSAL. When the obstacle is composed of more than one element to be taken in a single jump or leap by the Horse/Pony (i.e., Double Oxer, Parallel Bars, Triple Bars, etc.) the line shall be deemed to be that of the element nearest the take-off side of the obstacle.

(b) Showing an obstacle to the Horse after a refusal and before resuming the course incurs elimination.

(c) Should a competitor, on entering the Ring, show his Horse an obstacle before commencing the round, he will be eliminated.

(d) If a Horse, when refusing an obstacle, knocks down the obstacle and jumps it before it is re-set, he will be eliminated.

(e) IF A HORSE REFUSES AND SLIDES THROUGH THE OBSTACLE, THE COMPETITOR MUST RETURN AND AWAIT THE RE-SETTING OF THE OBSTACLE AND THEN RE-JUMP IT. SHOULD HE CONTINUE WITHOUT ATTEMPTING TO RE-JUMP THE OBSTACLE HE WILL BE ELIMINATED.

RUN OUTS:

(a) A Horse is considered to have run out if he JUMPS THE WINGS, FLAGS, SHRUBS OR OTHER MARKS SHOWING THE LIMITS OF THE OBSTACLE.

(b) A run out is penalised as for a refusal, but should the competitor fail to attempt to re-jump the obstacle he will be eliminated.

REFUSALS AT A DOUBLE OR TREBLE:

Clearing an obstacle which is a Double or a Treble constitutes a particular test, and the fences cannot, therefore, be separated.

Consequently, if a Horse refuses, runs out, or falls in between any of these obstacles, the rider is obliged to start over again from the first of these fences.

All faults, including refusals at each fence during the various attempts, will be totalled up.

The complete Double or Treble should be numbered as one obstacle only.

TIME:

(a) Unless otherwise stated in the conditions of the Class the "Time Allowed" for the course will be announced before each event.

(b) THE "TIME LIMIT" IS TWICE THE "TIME ALLOWED".

(c) FAULTS FOR TIME:—FOR EVERY SECOND OR PART OF A SECOND EXCEEDING THE "TIME ALLOWED" ½ FAULT. EXCEEDING THE "TIME LIMIT". ELIMINATED.

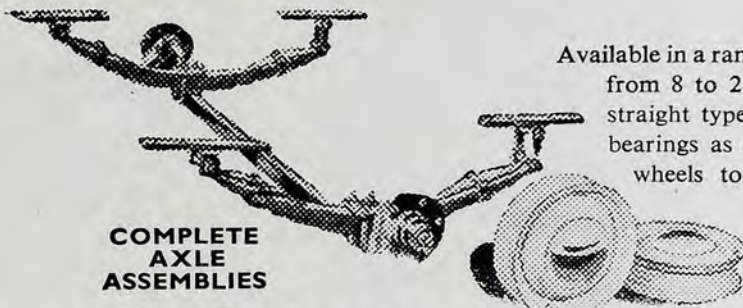
VETERINARY SERVICES:

The breeding year for Dairy Cattle dates from 1st July in each year.

Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging, or vice versa.

Cows or Heifers entered in the "in calf" classes must be stripped out prior to entering the judging ring.

Judges have the right to order any Cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

In all Sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, 12/6 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for 2/6 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions.

Cows and Heifers in milk, except Friesians, must be at the grounds on Wednesday, 21st September, and be fully milked out between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m., at which hour they will be stripped out in the presence of the Stewards, or whom they may appoint. Friesians will be stripped out between 9 p.m. and 10 p.m. on Wednesday, 21st September and they must not be milked prior to 4 a.m. on that day. They will be judged first on Thursday morning. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out. All other cattle must be at the grounds before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 22nd September.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 1 p.m. on Friday, 30th September.

Entries of milking stock (Sections 16 to 23 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter-fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk, and returns forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

The conditions governing the number of entries permitted will be found at the head of each breed section.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of £1.

Parades.—Prize-winning cattle only will be permitted to take part in parades. All prize-winning cattle must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of ten shillings in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

All male exhibits of Cattle over the age of 12 months shall be rung through the nose and when on parade or going to and from the parade shall be led by such ring.

All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of £2 for every infringement of this regulation.

Each exhibitor is required to see that each of his exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. Every poll bull and every wholly or partially dehorned bull entered in the Beef & Dual Purpose Sections, must be securely tethered by an effective headstall in addition to a nose ring or neck rope.

All bulls exhibited in the Dairy Sections shall be tethered by the nose ring in addition to the headstall or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Secretary, exhibits in this Section be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

Any animal offered for sale may wear, in the sale ring, only those ribbons won in single competition.

Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls stating that an animal is for private sale; such cards not to exceed 12 in. x 10 in.

In Classes where, to be eligible, animals are to be born between certain dates, which are shown, neither date is inclusive.

Except where otherwise determined by Council, all cattle must be certified Tuberculosis free. Animals from herds listed as accredited or in process of accreditation under the Accredited Tubercle-free Herd Scheme conducted by the Department of Agriculture, Victoria, need not be individually tested, but all other cattle exhibited must be Tuberculin tested within ninety days prior to opening date of the Show. Certificates for these individual tests must accompany entry forms.

Attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on parade must wear uniform grey coats, which can be secured from the Society.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society at the time of entry.

The foregoing clause regarding leases does not apply in the Ayrshire Section. All exhibits in that section must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Sweepstakes, special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class, such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for all cattle and goat sections must be in the hands of the Secretary, at his office, Temple Court, 422 Collins Street, Melbourne, on or before 12 noon on Saturday, 23rd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be completely entire. Any male animal in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not oc-

cupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Secretary at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 14th September, 1955.

In order to prevent the non-exhibition of animals which have been entered for the Show, thus causing unnecessary preparations, expense and disarrangement of the Show Yard, any person making an entry may be fined the sum of £1 for each entry of cattle not exhibited, and 10/- for each entry of goats not exhibited, unless a certificate under the hand of the Exhibitor or his authorised agent be lodged with the Secretary of the Society before the day of the Exhibition, certifying that such non-exhibition is caused by: (1) the death of the animal or animals; or (2) contagious or infectious diseases (confirmed by the explanatory certificate of a veterinary surgeon); or (3) by its becoming ineligible for the class in which it has been entered, or other reasonable cause. In addition to the fine aforesaid, the Council may debar the entrant from taking part in any future exhibition by the Society.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Secretary or his deputy, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 39) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Secretary being first obtained.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or Stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of ten shillings for every infringement of this regulation.

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

No bedding other than straw or hay may be used in any box or stall.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 12 noon on Friday, 30th September to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.
