

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Special Regulations re **Champion Prizes**

1. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor.

2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the Judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the Judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether. Only first prize winners of ordinary classes are eligible to compete for a Championship but the animal placed second to the Champion in the ordinary class, shall be eligible to compete for the Reserve Championship.

3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

4. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Council, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize shall not be awarded.

6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE .- Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes.

General Regulations

ENTRIES.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.) The Society accepts no responsibility for 1. the loss of, or damage to, any exhibit.

2. The Council of the Society or its appropriate Committee reserves the right-

- (a) To reject any entry without assigning any reason.
- (b) To cancel any event or Class.
 (c) To alter the time at which any Class or event is to take place or the conditions of entry of any Class or event.
- (d) To remove any exhibit from the Show Grounds.

3. In case any live stock, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall be injured or maimed or suffering from any ailment requiring, in the opinion of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or that of some qualified substitute, immediate veterinary aid, and the owner of such stock is not in attendance or fails to forthwith render such aid, the Director or his deputy may provide such aid, and the cost and expense thereby incurred shall in every case be borne by the owner of such stock. If such Veterinary Surgeon or such substitute is of the opinion that such live stock should be destroyed then the Veterinary Surgeon or his substitute may thereupon destroy such livestock either with or with-out the owner's consent. The owner of such

stock and any persons having the control thereof shall indemnify the Council Director or his deputy and the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or such substitute, against all damages, costs, expenses or liability incurred in connection with the same.

The acceptance of entry of stock is on the condition that the exhibitor agrees to submit such stock to inspection by the Council or its representative or Veterinary Surgeon.

4. All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend their exhibits at their own risk, and in case any exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers and members, property and effects from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.

5. Exhibitors hereby accept all responsibility for any damage or injury to any person or property which may be occasioned by or arise out of the use of any machinery, implement or apparatus of any nature used in connection with the stand.

AWARDING OF PRIZES.

6. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

7. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

8. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number, by marking it as such, of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

9. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Sashes in all Horse and Cattle Sections, and Rosettes in all Sheep and Pig Section in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class (special classes excepted) to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

10. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same card on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any

GENERAL REGULATIONS

exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit, stall or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

11. Stock exhibits wearing bridles, head stalls or other equipment with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon or under the control of a person displaying such name about his person are liable to disqualification.

12. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

13. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the grounds; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

14. Cheques for prizes will be forwarded to exhibitors as soon as practicable after the Show.

15. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for twelve months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

PROTESTS.

16. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Director, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of \$2, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

17. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

18. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulation, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.

19. Details relating to the removal of exhibits are printed in the various sections of this publication. In the case of Live Stock, injured or ill, special permission to leave the Show Grounds may be given providing that the injury or illness is certified by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon. Exhibitors wishing to obtain a Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate to permit removal of exhibits from the Grounds must lodge a fee of \$2 with each application. Notwithstanding the foregoing, horses and cattle may be removed in accordance with Regulation 20.

20. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the grounds at the close of the Exhibition each day on depositing with the Director an approved cheque for \$20 as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 9.30 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day, the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

This regulation does not include dogs. Particulars regarding the removal of dogs will be found at the head of the Dog Section in the Schedule.

CARE OF EXHIBITS.

21. The Society accepts no responsibility for the care of exhibits and exhibitors and competitors enter at their own risk.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING SALES BY AUCTION

Sales of exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds, and the Society reserves to itself the right to decide time and order of sales in all sections. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

A commission of 1 per cent. shall be paid to the Society in respect of all stock sold on the Show Grounds.

Whilst on the Show Ground the animal shall at all times be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society and shall not be removed without the Society's consent.

The animal shall be at the exclusive risk of the Purchaser from the fall of the hammer and pro forma delivery only shall be deemed to have been given to the Purchaser.

Whilst required by the Society to remain on the Show Ground the animal shall be in the custody and care of the Vendor who however shall be deemed to hold as bailee only.

The Vendor may parade the animal as required by the Rules and Regulations or for public or private exhibition or to be photographed but he shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the animal by reason of any act (negligent or otherwise) on the part of any attendant whether in the employ of the Vendor or of the Society or otherwise.

The Vendor shall bear the cost of the feeding and normal tending of the animal whilst in his custody and shall in all respects comply with the Society's requirements.



HORSES

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society at the time of entry.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 24th September.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Sweepstakes, special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for Horse and Contest Sections, except Trotting, must be in the hands of the Director, at his office, Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, W.2, on or before Tuesday, 14th June, at 4.30 p.m. Entry fee must accompany each entry. Performance forms for all horses, galloways or ponies (except Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses) must also accompany the entry form.

EVERY ANIMAL ENTERED MUST BE EX-HIBITED UNLESS A CERTIFICATE SIGNED BY THE OWNER IS LODGED WITH THE SOCIETY PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE SHOW, STATING THAT THE ANIMAL IS UNABLE TO COMPETE ON ONE OF THE FOLLOWING GROUNDS:

- (i) THE ANIMAL HAS DIED.
 (ii) THE ANIMAL IS UNFIT FOR EX-HIBITION DUE TO INJURY OR DISEASE
- THE ANIMAL HAS BECOME IN-ELIGIBLE FOR THE CLASS ENTERED. (iii) THE
- (iv) SOME OTHER CAUSE WHICH THE COUNCIL OR DIRECTOR OF THE SOCIETY CONSIDERS REASONABLE.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS RULE RENDERS THE OWNER OR ENTRANT LIABLE TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$10 FOR EVERY ANIMAL NOT EXHIBITED, AND IN ADDITION THE COUNCIL MAY DEBAR THE OWNER OR EXHIBITOR FROM TAKING PART IN ANY FURTHER EX-HIBITION CONDUCTED BY THE SOCIETY.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Director or his deputy, and (except live stock, in accordance with Regulation 18) must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Director being first obtained.

INSPECTION OF STOCK

Exhibitors in the Stock Sections shall, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits, in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be completely entire. Any male animal in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

Exhibits of horses which, in the opinion of the Society, are not in reasonable Show condition, shall be removed from the grounds.

Failure to comply with this rule shall render the exhibitor liable to a fine not exceeding \$10 for each separate offence.

No advertisement of notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on or in any stall or building.

SURCHARGE

A surcharge of 10 cents per horse shall be imposed on all horses, galloways and ponies entered in Sections 9 and/or 11.

This surcharge, which must be remitted with the entry fees, shall be paid into the Overseas Team Fund of the Equestrian Federation of Australia.

AGE OF EXHIBITS

The breeding year dates from 1st August in each year.

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

MARES (in Foal)

Any prize awarded to a mare exhibited as being in foal may be withheld until the production of a certificate that she has produced a foal after the exhibition and previous to the 1st January next ensuing.

STALLIONS-Government Certification and Registration

Stallions over two years of age exhibited from States other than Victoria need not be registered under the Act, but must be examined and passed by a Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type, except registered Clydes-dales carrying a current certificate of soundness issued in South Australia which will be accepted for exhibition purposes on production of this certificate.

All Stallions over 2 years of age, owned in Victoria, must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding (Victoria) Act 1928.

VETERINARY EXAMINATION

1 -

All Stallions and Mares over two years of age entered in Sections 1 to 7 (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must be examined by a Government Veterinary Officer and if passed, have their Entry Tickets stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring. No appeal against a Government Veterinary Officer's decision will be entertained.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Government Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 14th September, commencing at 10 a.m.

HEIGHT

Where height is stipulated, horses and ponies must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct class. The official measurer will be in attendance on the Grounds on Tuesday, 13th, and Wednesday, 14th September, at 10 a.m., on Thursday, 15th September, at 8 a.m., and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m., and the neck numbers of horses and ponies must be endorsed by the measurer.

When measuring a horse, galloway or pony an allowance of half $(\frac{1}{2})$ of an inch for shoes may be made at the discretion of the Measurer. Should an exhibit be measured with shoes on and the exhibitor disagree with the Official Measurer's decision as to the height of the animal, he may, should he desire, have it re-measured without shoes. The Official Measurer may, in his discretion, request the removal of shoes from any horse, galloway, or pony, prior to measurement.

If the judge entertains a doubt as to the correctness of a height certificate, he has the power to order the exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the Steward shall accompany the exhibit to the Measurer's Stand and supervise the re-measuring.

Any exhibitor who supplies wrong information on entry or performance form will render himself liable to disqualification.

ENTRY TICKETS

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Superintendent at the Show Grounds.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

All horses and ponies entered in Sections 1 to 10 inclusive are required to be at the grounds from 9 a.m. on Thursday, 15th September, until 11 p.m. on Saturday, 24th September, unless otherwise specified.

The upper portion of horse boxes outside the pavilion must remain open during those hours. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of one dollar for every infringement of this regulation.

NECK NUMBERS AND COMPETITORS' NUMBERS

Numbers corresponding to the number in the catalogue must be worn by each exhibit or competitor when appearing before the Judge.

Neck numbers for the horses must be collected at the offices of the Horse Superintendents.

Competitors' numbers for Riding Competitions, Jumping Contests and Novelty Events must be collected from the office of the Horse Superintendent, Eastern Area.

PAVILIONS AND STALLS -

Hours Open and Cleanliness

With the exception of Saturdays and Thursday (Show Day) the Horse Pavilion will remain open to the public until 7 p.m.

On Saturdays and Show Day they will remain open until 9. p.m. but will close between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m..

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Horse Superintendent:

- (i) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- (ii) Clean out their stalls or boxes before 8 a.m. each day.

ACCEPTANCE AND ACCOMMODATION

The Society may limit acceptances to that number of horses which can be accommodated on the Show Grounds.

Restrictions are therefore imposed on entries in Sections 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, and the nature of the restriction is referred to at the head of each Section concerned.

PERFORMANCE FORM

Nomination will NOT be accepted for horses, ponies or galloways (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted) unless accompanied by a performance form.

A performance form for the purpose of conveying the information specified hereunder is to be completed for each horse, galloway or pony (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted).

This form is to be forwarded with the entry form and fees and must reach the Director not later than 4.30 p.m. on Tuesday, 14th June, 1966.

The closing date of nomination shall not be extended.

Information to be furnished on the performance form is:

- (a) Name of horse or pony (a separate form is to be completed for each exhibit);
- (b) Age of horse or pony (state day, month and year of foaling, if known);
- (c) Prizes gained by the horse or pony nominated, viz.: Name of Show; Date of Show; Prizes—first, second or third, etc. (if a horse or pony was exhibited without gaining a prize, such is to be stated);
- (d) Name of exhibitor;



(e) Remarks. (Briefly to be stated the nature of the class in which the exhibit was entered and/or gained prizes. The approximate number of exhibits in such class to be given.)

From the nominations the Society will determine which entries are to be accepted. Not later than 15th August, 1966, the Society will advise all nominators whether their nomination has been accepted as an exhibit for competition at the 1966 Royal Melbourne Show in the class or classes stated. The exhibitor will also be advised, as early as practicable after entries have been accepted, whether a box, on the Show Grounds, or otherwise, has been allocated the exhibit for which the entry has been accepted.

Entry fees paid in respect of nominations not accepted shall be refunded.

JUDGING AND PARADES

Exhibitors are advised to study the time table, showing times at which judging in the various Classes is to be commenced. Judging in any Class will not commence before the time specified. No warning will be given, and any competitor not present when the Judge is ready to commence will miss the opportunity to compete.

Horses are not permitted to enter the Judging Ring if fitted with bearing reins.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be reported to and dealt with by Council.

All horses will be required to take part in Parades in accordance with the printed programme and exhibitors who do not comply with this regulation shall be dealt with by Council.

All horses parading must wear exhibit numbers.

Riders of horses in Grand Parades must wear formal or hacking attire.

No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

FEED SHEDS AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge, \$5 during the currency of the Show. Where feed sheds are shared, the exhibitors concerned shall be required to pay the appropriate share of the charge. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the passageways of the Horse Pavilions.

No bedding other than straw or hay, may be used in any boxes or stalls.

For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will be situated on the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

CLYDESDALES

DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11.15 p.m. on Saturday, 24th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

EXERCISING HORSES

The exercising of all horses, galloways and ponies, will be allowed on the trotting track only, before 8.15 a.m. on any day of the Show, and one week prior thereto, by permission of the Superintendent.

The exercising of all horses, galloways and ponies will be allowed on the trotting track only, before 8.15 a.m. on any day of the Show.

On the Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednes-day immediately preceding the commencement of the Show, ridden and driven exhibits will be allowed to exercise on the trotting track from 8 a.m. until 12 noon in accordance with the following schedule:

An exhibit may only be entered in one ordinary class in this Section and as many Special classes as it is eligible to compete.

An exhibit cannot be entered in a Special Class unless it has been entered in an ordinary class.

An exhibit must compete and qualify in an ordinary class before becoming eligible for Champion Prizes.

Horses entered in this Section must be fully registered as Clydesdales in the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book, or other approved stud book published outside the Commonwealth, except yearlings, which may be entered if recorded as progeny in the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book, and eligible for full regis-tration therein. Females recorded in the Ap-pendices to the C.C.S.B. will not be eligible to compete in this Section.

For particulars of registration in the Commonwealth Clydesdale Stud Book, apply to the Secretary, Commonwealth Clydesdale Horse Society, Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, W.2.

VETERINARY EXAMINATION

All Stallions and Mares over two years of age entered in Sections 1 to 7 (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must be examined by a Government Veterinary Officer and, if passed, have their Entry Tickets stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring. No appeal against a Government Veterinary Officer's decision will be entertained.

Stallions and Mares will be examined by Gov-ernment Veterinary Surgeons on the Show Grounds on Wednesday, 14th September, com-mencing at 10 a.m.

All horses must be paraded. (See Regulation at head of Horse Section.)





An exhibit may only be entered in one ordinary class in each of Sections 5, 6, 7, 9 and 10 and in as many Special Classes as it is eligible to compete in Sections 5, 6, 7, 9, 10 and 11.

An exhibit cannot be entered in a Special class unless it has been entered in an ordinary class in the same section. (This regulation does not apply to the Miscellaneous and Dressage Classes, which include Classes 156 to 168.

An exhibit must compete and qualify in an ordinary class before becoming eligible for Champion Prizes.

(Stallions are not eligible to compete in this Section. Dressage Classes excepted).

All animals entered in this Section must be registered in the Equestrian Federation of Australia's Register. For particulars regarding registration apply to the Secretary Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch), Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, W.2.

Where height is stipulated, horses must be measured, and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement may be transferred to its correct Class. Where a definite weight is specified, the horse must, in the opinion of the judge, be suitable for carrying such weight.

All horses in the 14-st., 12-st. and 10-st. Hack Classes must be paraded before judging, when the Judge will classify them into their various classes in the following way:-The horses entered for 14-st. Hack shall be paraded, when any horse too light in the opinion of the Judge, shall be transferred to the 12-st. Class. Those entered in the 12-st. Class shall be next paraded, when the Judge shall class out any he considers too heavy or too light, and shall transfer the heavy to 14-st. and the light to 10-st. Class. Those entered for the 10-st. Class shall be paraded, and the Judge shall class out all considered too heavy, and transfer to 14st. or 12-st. Class, as the case may be. Judging will then commence with the 14-st. Class.

No hacks shall be classified after the appointed time unless permission is obtained from the Chief Light Horse Steward.

N.B.:-Hacks, which are not paraded for classification will not be eligible to compete.

Please state on entry form the name, colour and correct age of exhibit, also pedigree (if known).

Notwithstanding any regulation to the contrary, an exhibit may be entered in one ordinary class in the Saddle Section and one ordinary class in the Harness Section.

DRESS

Ladies and Girls:

In hack classes and riding competitions ladies should wear either:-

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots. Or-
- (b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodhpurs and jodhpur boots. In classes for best equestrienne turnout, and Jumping Contests, ladies must wear (a) above. In novelty events, ladies may wear either breeches and boots or jodhpurs with a WHITE shirt and no coat if the weather is hot; ties or stocks should be. securely pinned.

Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In hack or pony classes and riding competitions-bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.
- (b) In jumping competitions gentlemen riders must wear either (a) Hunting Livery of a recognised Hunt Club. (b) Black coat and stock, white breeches, black boots, or (c) Tweed coat and tie, fawn breeches and black or tan boots. Boys under 16 shall wear hunting cap, tweed coat, and WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.



In the event of the animal originally nominated becoming unfit for use because of accident or illness, a substitute will be permitted provided that the Society's Veterinary Surgeon certifies to the fact that the animal originally nominated is not fit to 606 2-607 compete.

Trophies will be competed for annually, and each year's winner will be presented with a suitably inscribed Sash. Special Sashes will also be awarded to the competitors placed second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth.



DRESSAGE TESTS

OBJECT AND GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The object of Dressage is the harmonious development of the physique and ability of the horse. As a result, it makes the horse calm, supple and keen, thus achieving perfect understanding with its rider.

These qualities are revealed by:

the freedom and regularity of the paces;

- the harmony, lightness and ease of the movements;
- the lightening of the forehand and the engagement of the hind quarters;
- the horse remaining absolutely straight in any movement along a straight line and bending accordingly when moving on curved lines.

The horse thus gives the impression of doing of his own accord what is required of him. Confident and attentive, he submits generously to the control of his rider.

His walk is regular, free and unconstrained. His trot is free, supple, regular, sustained and active. His canter is united, light and cadenced. His quarters are never inactive or sluggish. They respond to the slightest indication of the rider and thereby give life and spirit to all the rest of his body.

By virtue of a lively impulsion and the suppleness of his joints, free from the paralysing effects of resistance, the horse obeys willingly and without hesitation and responds to the various aids calmly and with precision.

In all his work, even at the halt, the horse must be on the bit. A horse is said to be "on the bit" when the hocks are correctly placed, the neck is more or less raised according to the extension or collection of the pace, the head remains steadily in position, the contact with the mouth is light and no resistance is offered to the rider.

The position of the horse when "on the bit" depends on the conformation as well as on the degree of training of the horse.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS

HALT. At the halt, the horse, standing square on his four legs and immobile, must be ready to move forward at the least pressure of the rider's legs.

EXTENDED WALK. At the extended walk, the horse should cover as much ground as quickly as possible WITHOUT haste and without breaking. The hindlegs passing clearly beyond the tracks of the forelegs. The rider gives freedom to the head and neck of the horse without, however, losing contact, so as to be able at any moment to make the horse change his pace, his speed, or his direction.

EXTENDED TROT. At the extended trot, the horse extends his action, his neck is stretched, his shoulders vigorously driven on by the haunches, gains ground forward without noticeably increasing height.

ORDINARY WALK. The ordinary walk is a free, regular and unrestrained walk. The horse walks briskly, but with a calm, deliberate and

even step, each clearly marked, distinct and equally spaced. The rider keeps a light and steady contact on the reins.

ORDINARY TROT. The ordinary trot is a pace between an extended and a collected trot. The horse goes forward freely and quite straight. engages his haunches which remain very active pulls gently at the reins with a balanced and even bearing. His strides should be as far as possible equal; the hind legs follow exactly in the tracks of the fore legs.

ORDINARY CANTER. The ordinary canter is a race between an extended and collected canter. The horse perfectly straight from the poll to the tail, goes freely with a natural balance.

REIN-BACK. The rein-back is the walk backwards of the horse. It is correct when the horse lifts his feet and brings them down in pairs diagonally almost simultaneously, the haunches remaining well in line. The horse walks back step by step, constantly ready, at the wish of the rider, either to halt or to advance without halting.

Comments:

1. All movements in Dressage tests may be progressive unless otherwise stated. It is, therefore, better to put in one or two strides at the walk and get the "move-off" smooth and straight, than to try to break straight into the trot and cause the movement to be rough and crooked.

2. In the extended trot make the horse lengthen his stride and let there be a definite difference between the extended and the ordinary trot. Be careful to maintain the cadence throughout the transition and the correct bend round the corners. Keep the ordinary trot lively though with shortened strides and the same cadence.

3. Make good wide loops, making sure you go right up to the side line. It is better even to come back a little at the end of each loop as you pass the centre and then change the bend smoothly. Keep the slow trot active.

4. In the halt, the horse must stand absolutely still on all four legs on the track parallel to the long side and remain on the bit. Count six slowly. The horse must move off smoothly, remaining on the bit without throwing up his head.

5. Turn about on the haunches, the inside hind leg being the pivot, the fore legs performing a semi-circle with even strides round this pivot, the outside fore leg moving over and in front of the left. The pivoting leg when raised should be replaced on the same spot; it is a bad fault if it is drawn back. The horse should be flexed in the direction of the turn, but the neck should not be bent. The rider's outside hand should not be carried across the withers. As soon as the turn is completed and the horse parallel to the long side he should proceed at once at the walk. After three or four strides at the walk break into the canter. Here the transition should not be progressive as it definitely lays down that the canter be done from the walk. Be careful to avoid the quarters coming in and the head being bent out or thrown up. 6. Be sure that the circle is round and goes well up to the prescribed dimensions. There should be no variation in the pace. The horse should be flexed in the direction to which he is going and the hind legs follow in the tracks of the fore legs.

A very common fault is that the second half of the circle is flatter than the first; it is better to err in the other direction as if the second half of the circle is flat it makes a more abrupt return to the long side and prevents it from being smooth.

7. Come smoothly away from the short side, make the loops well up to but not beyond the quarter lines and maintain the same bend throughout. The horse should always be bent to the leading leg whether cantering false or true. Be careful not to get on two tracks and be sure to make all three loops the same size.

8. The old canter should be continued to within six feet of the prescribed point and the change produced progressively, i.e., through the trot. There should be at least one stride at the walk and the new canter obtained from the walk not more than six feet beyond the prescribed point. The horse's body must remain straight on the diagonal line throughout.

9. After the salute, the horse must move off with a loose rein straight towards the judges. The aid to turn may be given by a slight contact of the outside rein, the horse then being allowed to walk up the long side with a loose rein.

10. The horse should go freely and actively forward maintaining activity and cadence in all paces, with smooth transitions. Good and steady head and tail carriage, no raising or beating of the head, no tail swishing. Clear four-time walk evenly spaced. Springing activity from one diagonal to the other in the trot. Canter definitely three-time and straight.

11. Rider's body should be upright with seat well down in the saddle and should be still, the hands and the legs steady. The hands must always remain on their own side of the horse's neck with the elbows close to the sides and legs should never be in front of the perpendicular. The heels well down even when giving aids and knees turned well into the saddle. All aids should be correct and as invisible as the training of the horse permits.

GENERAL REMARKS

The test is to be performed from memory. The number of marks obtainable is 200.

Time allowed: 8 minutes.

The time will be counted from the exact moment, after the salute to the judges, when the horse moves forward until the horse is brought to a standstill at the end of the test and the rider salutes the judges. For every second exceeding the time imposed a penalty of a half-mark will be deducted from the score sheet. Ordinary and extended trot to be performed Rising. Collected trot, Sitting.

RIDING COMPETITIONS

A horse may be ridden by only one competitor in each Class.

In riding competitions for adults, from 10 to 12 competitors will be tested at a time. Eliminations will follow a preliminary walk, trot and canter. The remaining competitors will be tested at the discretion of the Judges.

In riding competitions for children, the tests will be at the discretion of the Judge.

Dress, Ladies and Girls:

In Hack Classes and Riding Competitions ladies should wear either:-

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots. Or-
- (b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodhpurs and jodhpur boots.

In the classes for best equestrienne turnout and jumping contests, ladies must wear (a) above. In novelty events, ladies may wear either breeches and boots or jodhpurs with a WHITE shirt and no coat if the weather is hot; ties or stocks should be securely pinned.

Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In Hack or Pony Classes and Riding Competitions—bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.
- (b) In Jumping Competitions gentlemen riders must wear either (a) hunting livery of a recognised hunt club, (b) black coat with stock, white breeches and black boots, or (c) tweed coat with tie, fawn breeches and black or tan boots. Boys under 16 shall wear hunting cap, tweed coat, WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

In competitions, competitors under the age of 18 years must supply proof of age with entry unless-

- (a) A birth certificate has been previously furnished to the Society.
- The age of the competitor was accepted for (b) the 1954 or subsequent Shows.

Proof of age will be accepted in the form of birth certificate, extract of birth entry, statutory declaration, baptismal certificate or school certificate.

Stallions are not eligible for use in Riding Com petitions.



QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS.

1. Each Country Agricultural Society in Vic-toria, or a gymkhana registered with the Eques-trian Federation of Australia, is invited to cooperate in qualifying competitors for these trophies, by providing annually riding competitions for competitors under 15 years of age on the day of its show.

2. Each Society conducting qualifying com-petitions is requested to notify the Royal Agri-cultural Society of Victoria of the names and addresses of the winners and "runners-up", so that if it is found that, for any reason, the winners were ineligible, an opportunity may be given the "runners-up" to compete in the Cham-pionship Competitions.

3. Such competitions to be named "The Good Hands Qualifying Riding Competitions," and the Roya¹ Agricultural Society of Victoria to provide suitable certificates for presentation to the winners.

4. The holder of a R.A.S. Qualifying Certificate, won in the same year, shall not be eligible to compete.

5. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability-mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account, but special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general management and control of the horse or pony.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITION

6. Only holders of qualifying certificates won during the preceding twelve months will be eligible to compete for the Challenge Trophies at the Royal Melbourne Show. No entry fee will be charged.

7. The Championship Competitions shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge, before finally making his award, shall require his six finalists to execute a figure 8 at a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back, all six using the same mount (with snaffle bridle) which will be selected by the Society's referee, from horses ridden in this competition.

NOVELTY EVENTS

8. Eligible competitors are accepted on the condition that they will be prepared to provide the selected mount.

9. The names of the winners will be engraved on the Challenge Trophies, and they will be entitled to hold them until 31st August in the year following their success.

10. Suitably inscribed Championship Sashes will be presented to each successive winner of the Challenge Trophies.

The winners of the Challenge Trophies will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to age.

12. The Council of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria may, at its discretion, vary the conditions governing the qualifying and Championship Competitions.

13. All entries must be lodged with the Society by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, 14th September. Note: Winners of Good Hands Championship Competitions are ineligible to compete in Consolation Riding Competitions.

Ladies and gentlemen may compete.

This is a bareback event. Four starters in each heat.

Competitor and mount will be at starting line.

Upon the signal to GO from the starter, competitors will go beyond a given line with their mount, dismount and retrieve ball, and then remount and ride to finish line, placing ball in drum, repeating once if two balls have been placed at end of course.

Length of course will be left to discretion of judge, but barrels should be at Flag Racing distance, 10 yards apart.

If ball is dropped by competitor he must retrieve ball, and be mounted when placing ball in drum.

In this event, competitors will start on the left side of the barrel and turn their horses on the right (off side rein) at the barrel.

APPLE RACE CONDITIONS

Ladies and gentlemen may compete.

Judge will use his discretion as to the number starting in heats.

Competitors and mounts (saddled) will be at the starting line. Upon the starter's signal to GO, they will go beyond a given line to the trough or their respective bucket, which may be held by the competitor as he grabs for an apple with his mouth. He must not touch apples with his hands. If the bucket is knocked over by the competitor he will be disqualified.

After competitor has grasped apple in his mouth from his bucket he must mount and ride to finish line. If apple is dropped on the way to finish line, competitor may dismount and retrieve apple with his mouth, then remount and continue.

JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO NOTE THAT RIDERS MAY NOT RIDE MORE THAN TWO HORSES IN ANY EVENT UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

A surcharge of 10 cents per horse shall be imposed on all horses, galloways and ponies entered in Sections 9 and/or 11. This surcharge, which must be remitted with the entry fees, shall be paid into the Overseas Team Fund of The Equestrian Federation of Australia.

The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the time directed by the stewards.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must do so with the Horse Superintendent at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of \$1 for the first offence and \$2 for second or later offences.

All entrants in jumping competitions must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. After the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In Jumping Contests competitors may be limited as under:

Group A, Maximum of 40.

Group B, Maximum of 25.

Group C, Maximum of 20.

All animals entered for Jumping Competitions Groups A, B, C, D and E, must be registered in the Equestrian Federation of Australia's Register. For particulars regarding registration, apply to the Secretary, Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch), Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, W.2.

Competitors in jumping competitions must compete in the order directed by the steward in charge.

Exhibitors will please note that entries should not be made for individual classes except for Section Fours.

The jumping section is divided into groups.

Group A, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in that Group.

Competitions in Group A will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group B, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches whose past performances indicate that they are up to the required standard for competitions conducted under Tables B and C and Special Rules.

Competitions in Group B will be judged under Tables b or C (as specified) and Special Rules.

JUMPING

Group C is for ponies and galloways and horses judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in the group to be ridden by riders under 17 years of age on the first day of the Show and who are members of a Pony Club affiliated with the Australian Pony Club Council.

Competitions in Group C will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group D is for qualified hunters.

Group E is for Section fours, trios, and special competitions.

Intending competitors in Groups A, B or C will not enter for classes by number but simply indicate the number of classes in which they desire to compete.

The Committee after studying the performances will grade the horses and allocate them to the various classes.

In Group D, entries will be accepted only from Masters of Associated Hunt Clubs.

Exhibitors wishing to enter in the teams and section four events will enter in the class or classes in which they wish to compete.

(In these classes horses may be made up into teams, irrespective of the group in which they may be graded.)

Horses and galloways competing in Group A are not eligible for Section Fours.

In Group E there will be no grading and intending exhibitors will enter their ponies, galloways and horses for the classes in which they are eligible to compete.

Please note that ponies and galloways 14 hands 2 inches and under may compete only in Group C, E and F.

Entry fees must be forwarded with entry forms for jumping competitions. After entries have been graded they will be allotted to classes and refunds made in respect of those not accepted.

WEIGHT

No minimum weights in Classes where age of rider is restricted.

In Classes open to all riders over the age of 15 years gentlemen riders must carry 11 st. 11 lbs.; ladies, 11 st.

The loss of weight during a Competition entails elimination.

Weighing is obligatory after each Competition and must be carried out in the presence of an official especially appointed for this purpose.

It is absolutely forbidden for a rider to dismount until he has received permission from the Steward in charge of the Weighing Enclosure. Any infringement of this Rule entails elimination.

Riders may weigh in with their saddles, weight cloths and numbers, but NOT whips.

In the event of a competitor being unable to make the weight, up to 2 lbs. will be allowed for the bridle, martingale and any other form of equipment carried by the horse.

Riders are responsible for the provision of any necessary weights and weight cloth.

There is no minimum weight provision for competitors in Groups C and D and Section Fours.

All jumping competitions are for amateur or professional riders unless otherwise stated.

Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its Council officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever, other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.

Male or Female riders may take part in all events unless otherwise stated.

All events to be run over course and obstacles as the Council may decide.

IN ALL EVENTS OVER OBSTACLES AND HURDLES OF ANY DESCRIPTION, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED, RIDERS MUST BE 15 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

DRESS

Ladies and Girls:

In hack classes and riding competitions ladies should wear either:—

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots. OR—
- (b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodphurs and jodphur boots.
 In Equestrienne Turnout classes and Jumping Contests, ladies must wear (a) above.

Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In hack or pony classes and riding competitions — bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.
- (b) In jumping competitions gentlemen riders must wear, (a) hunting livery of a recognised hunt club, (b) black coat, with stock, white breeches, black boots, or (c) tweed coat with tie, fawn breeches, black or tan boots. Boys under 16 shall wear hunting cap, tweed coat and WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

RULES FOR JUDGING COMPETITIONS UNDER F.E.I. RULES.

ELIMINATIONS

In all jumping competitions the rider is eliminated for the following occurrences:

- (a) Failure to be ready to enter the arena when called.
- (b) Jumping any obstacle in the arena before the starting signal, even if it is not included in the course.
- (c) Crossing the starting line before the starting signal is given.
- (d) Failing to cross the starting line within 60 seconds of the starting signal. (e) Third disobedience in the whole round.
- (f) Showing any obstacle to the horse before starting, or after a refusal.
- (g) Entering or leaving the arena dismounted without the special permission of the President of the Ground Jury.

- (h) Resistance of the horse during the round at any one time exceeding 60 seconds.
- (i) Taking more than 60 seconds to jump an obstacle (except in the case of a fall).
- (j) Jumping an obstacle without having rectified a deviation from the course.
- (k) Jumping an obstacle not forming part of the course.
- (1) Jumping an obstacle in the wrong order.
- (m) Passing the wrong side of a flag, if not rectified.
- (n) Exceeding the Time Limit.
- (o) Jumping an obstacle which has been knocked down, before it has been re-set.
- (p) Starting again after an interruption, before the signal to continue has been given.
- (q) After a disobedience or fall at a double, treble or multiple obstacle, failing to re-start jumping over the whole obstacle except for a completely closed obstacle).
- (r) Failing to jump each fence of a double, treble, or multiple obstacle, separately.
- (s) Failing to cross the finishing line mounted, before leaving the arena.
- (t) The rider and/or horse leaving the arena, before the completion of the round.
- (u) Receiving unauthorised assistance, whether solicited or not, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (v) Failing to have the required minimum weight when weighing in after completion of the round.
- (w) Entering the arena on foot after the start of the competition, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- Failing to comply with the conditions of a com- (\mathbf{x}) petition stipulating that part of the course is to be ridden at a trot or walk.
- Jumping an optional obstacle more than once in (\mathbf{v}) a jump-off.
- All other reasons for elimination set out in the (z) rules.

DEFINITIONS, GENERAL RULES AND PENALTIES

OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN:

1. An obstacle is considered as having been knocked down when through the fault of the horse, or rider:

(a) Any part, or the whole, of it is knocked down, even when the falling part is arrested in its fall by any other portion of the obstacle.

(b) When at least one of its ends is dislodged from its support.

(c) Any framework intended to maintain the solidity of the obstacle, and forming an integral part of its support falls. Touches and displacements, in whatever direction, do not count.

2. (a) When an obstacle, or part of an ob-stacle, is composed of several elements placed one on top of the other and in the same vertical plane, the dislodging of the top element alone is penalised.

- 82

(b) When an obstacle to be taken in one jump is composed of several elements not fixed in the same vertical plane (oxer, brook, triple bar, water jump or ditch, preceded or followed by another obstacle, etc.), the fall of one or more elements or foot in the water is counted only as one fault, irrespective of the number and position of the elements knocked down.

(c) If an obstacle that has been knocked down does not actually fall until after the horse has left the arena, it will not be penalised.

(d) If any element of an obstacle that has been knocked down prevents the horse from jumping the next obstacle it must be removed. The time required for doing this is deducted from the total time of the round.

(e) All obstacles with water (with the exception of the water jump which is subject to special rules) must be marked by a lath both on the take-off side and on the landing side.

DISOBEDIENCE:

3. The following are considered as disobediences and are penalised as such:

Rectified deviation from the course. Refusal. Run-out. Resistance.

Any form of circle or series of circles, in any part of the course for any reason, except that a horse may circle once or more without penalty to re-take the track after a run-out or a refusal. In a course that is not marked by a continuous line, unless there is any indication to the contrary on the plan or notified by the Jury, any circle (whereby the horse crosses its original track), wherever it may be on the course, is penalised as a disobedience. Approaching an obstacle sideways, or zig-zagging, or turning sharply towards it, do not constitute a disobedience, provided the horse has not passed the obstacle.

DEVIATION FROM THE COURSE:

4. There is a deviation from the course when the horse does not follow the plan for the course as shown on the diagram posted up, as when the rider:

(a) Disregards a flag to indicate the course to be followed.

(b) Does not clear the obstacles in the prescribed order.

(c) Jumps an obstacle outside the course, or misses one on the course.

5. (a) To rectify a deviation from the course the rider must resume the course from the spot where the error was committed.

(b) A deviation from the course rectified before clearing an obstacle is penalised as a disobedience.

(c) A deviation from the course not rectified, or rectified only after taking an obstacle, whether this forms part of the course or not, incurs the penalty of elimination. Officials or others in the arena are never allowed to warn the competitor of his error.

REFUSAL:

(a) A refusal consists of stopping in front of an obstacle to be jumped, whether or not the horse knocks it down or displaces it.

(b) Stopping at an obstacle without knocking it down and without reining back, followed immediately by a standing jump, is not penalised.

(c) If the halt is perceptible, or if the horse steps back even a single pace, voluntarily or not, or retakes the track, a refusal is incurred.

(d) If a horse, having knocked down an obstacle in stopping, jumps this obstacle before it has been re-erected, he is eliminated.

(e) If a horse slides through an obstacle, the officiating judge must decide immediately whether it is to count as a refusal or as an obstacle knocked down. If he decides it is a refusal, the bell is sounded at once and the competitor must retrace his steps and re-jump the obstacle. Should he fail to do so and jumps an obstacle, other than another of the same combination, he is eliminated. Should the Judge decide it was not a refusal, he will not ring the bell and the competitor must continue his round. He is then penalised as for an obstacle knocked down.

(f) The action of showing an obstacle to the horse after a refusal and before resuming the course is penalised by elimination.

RUNNING OUT:

7. It is considered as running-out and the horse must be brought back to jump the obstacle again, failing which he is eliminated, when:

(a) The horse, not being properly under control of his rider, avoids the obstacle he should have jumped.

(b) He jumps the obstacle outside the boundary flags which mark it.

RESISTANCE:

8. It is considered to be a resistance when the horse, wherever he may be, refuses to go forward (stops, runs back, turns round more or less completely, rears, etc.).

All horses are eliminated that:

(a) Resist their riders for a period of sixty consecutive seconds during the round.

(b) Take more than sixty seconds to jump an obstacle, except in the case of a fall.

(c) Have not passed the starting line sixty seconds after being given the signal to start.

FALLS:

9. (a) A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his horse which has not fallen, in such a way as to necessitate remounting, or vaulting, into the saddle.

(b) A horse is considered to have fallen when the shoulder and quarters have touched either the ground, or the obstacle and the ground.

10. (a) A fall is penalised wherever it takes place within the course and whatever the cause. After a fall the rider must continue the course from the point where he fell, or from any other point, provided he does not reduce the length of the course.

(b) The penalty to be imposed for a fall is set out in Table "A", "B", or "C".

(c) When the horse or rider falls in knocking down an obstacle the penalties for both occurrences are added together. The same applies to a fall following a disobedience.

UNAUTHORISED ASSISTANCE:

11. Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not, with the object of facilitating the task of the rider or helping his horse, is unauthorised assistance and is forbidden under penalty of elimination.

The judges have full powers to decide whether the rider will be eliminated or not.

Bringing back a runaway horse after a fall or helping the rider to re-adjust the saddlery, or to remount, is not considered as unauthorised assistance. The course must be re-taken at the exact spot where it was interrupted.

Handing his whip to a rider who has dropped it during the round is unauthorised assistance.

DOUBLE, TREBLE AND MULTIPLE OBSTACLES:

12. A double, treble, or multiple obstacle is one composed of two, three or more fences or parts, and with a maximum inner distance between them of 39 ft. 5 ins. (12 metres), which must be taken in two, three or more successive jumps. The distance is measured from the base of the one fence on the landing side to the base of the next fence on the take-off side.

In double, treble and multiple obstacles, each fence or part of the whole must be jumped separately, on penalty of elimination. When there is a refusal, run-out, or fall, the rider must take the whole obstacle again, or he will be eliminated. Exception is made for completely closed obstacles.

All the faults for mistakes and resistances made at each fence and during the various attempts are counted separately and added together, but should a refusal be due to a fall between two fences it will not be penalised.

BANKS, SLOPES AND RAMPS:

13. Banks, slopes, ramps and sunken roads, irrespective of whether they include any sort of fence and whatever the direction in which they should be taken, will be regarded as double, treble, multiple or closed obstacles. Each part must be jumped separately and faults will be penalised as for these obstacles.

The Jury must decide before the competition whether the obstacle is to be considered as closed or as a double, treble, or multiple obstacle. This decision must be included on the plan of the course.

14. A bank or platform (.butte.) without the addition of a fence, or with only one pole, can be taken in a flying jump. This way of jumping does not incur any penalties.

OBSTACLES COMPLETELY CLOSED:

(15). (a) If an obstacle is completely closed (such as in-and-out, square or hexagonal) the rule for rejumping the whole obstacle does not apply.

(b) In such cases, if the horse leaves the enclosure on the wrong side, he is considered as having jumped an obstacle that is not part of the course and he is eliminated.

(c) If, on the other hand, once in the enclosure, there is a refusal or fall, the rider is obliged to leave the enclosure by jumping out of it in the correct direction. If he is unable to do so within 60 seconds or after several attempts, making in all three refusals during the round, he is eliminated. He has not the right to displace, or cause to be displaced, or to modify any of the elements of the obstacle.

TIME:

(a) Unless otherwise stated in the conditions of the Class the "Time Allowed" for the course will be announced before each event.

(b) THE "TIME LIMIT" IS TWICE THE "TIME ALLOWED".

(c) FAULTS FOR TIME:—FOR EVERY SECOND OR PART OF A SECOND EXCEEDING THE "TIME ALLOWED" ‡ FAULT. EXCEEDING THE "TIME LIMIT". ELIMINATED.

JUMPING-OFF:

See conditions of class concerned.

DEFINITION OF JUMPING ARENA:

The Jumping Arena will, when practicable, be entirely enclosed, but if not, will be clearly marked with flags or some other easily recognised indicator. At all times the Trotting Track will be taken as off the Jumping Arena. It will be the responsibility of all competitors to acquaint themselves with the extent of the arena and its markings before competing.

THE COUNCIL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INTRODUCE A STANDARD AT ANY TIME.

CRUELTY TO HORSES is forbidden either in the arena, exercise area or elsewhere. A competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disallowed from taking part in any further competitions at the Show where the offence was committed. The decision rests with the Judge and no appeal will be considered.

GROUP A

Competition in classes in this group is open only to horses over 14.2 hands whose past performances, in the opinion of the committee, warrant their inclusion in the group.

From the entries received, the Council will select the horses with the best performances (up to a maximum of 20

horses) to compete in PART I, and the next best (up to a maximum of 20) to compete in PART II.

PART I-Classes 252 to 258.

PART II—Classes 259 to 264.

Horses in Group "A" may not compete in groups "B" and "C", but they may compete in groups "D" and "E" excluding Section Fours.

All competitions in this Group will be judged under "Table A".

Riders must be 15 years of age or over.

Competitors will jump as many obstacles (in the correct order) as possible within 90 seconds, the competitors changing over as many times as there is reason to do so

until they are stopped by the clock. The horse jumping the course when the whistle for time is sounded must then jump the following obstacle. The time will be taken when the horse's forelegs touch the ground; this obstacle does NOT count in classification. If for any reason the rider does not jump the obstacle at which the clock is stopped he is gonged and the clock stopped. The team will then be placed last of those gaining an equal number of points.

In the course of the competition the rider will be always gonged at the first fault committed no matter what this may be. The partner takes over immediately and continues the course. If it was a jumping fault, the partner takes over the round and jumps the obstacle following that where the fault was incurred.

If the fault was a disobedience, the partner takes over the round and must jump the obstacle where the disobedience occurred.

Notwithstanding the conditions above, if a rider completes one circuit of the course without fault, the other member of the team MUST take over the jumping. The competition then proceeds in accordance with the conditions as previously detailed.

CLASSIFICATION:

In this competition, two points will be awarded for each obstacle jumped clear 3-50 and one point for each obstacle knocked down.

1- 52 53 55 55 55 55 57 From the total number of points scored by a team the following are deducted: 1 point for the first disobedience (or fall); 2 points for the second disobedience (or fall); 2 points for the third dis-obedience (or fall). The fourth disobedience entails elimination of the team.

In the case of equality of time and points there is a compulsory jump-off for first place only, over the same or a reduced course.

Owners will be allowed to pair and in the event of a pair separately owned winning, the prize will be divided.

For horses and galloways over 14.2 hands.

No rider may ride more than two horses.
