

JUMPING

ELIMINATIONS

In all jumping competitions the rider is eliminated for the following occurrences:

- (a) Failure to be ready to enter the arena when called.
- (b) Jumping any obstacle in the arena before the starting signal, even if it is not included in the course.
- (c) Crossing the starting line before the starting signal is given.
- (d) Failing to cross the starting line within 60 seconds of the starting signal.
- (e) Third disobedience in the whole round.
- (f) Showing any obstacle to the horse before starting, or after a refusal.
- (g) Entering or leaving the arena dismounted without the special permission of the President of the Ground Jury.
- (h) Resistance of the horse during the round at any one time exceeding 60 seconds.
- (i) Taking more than 60 seconds to jump an obstacle (except in the case of a fall).
- (j) Jumping an obstacle without having rectified a deviation from the course.
- (k) Jumping an obstacle not forming part of the course.
- (l) Jumping an obstacle in the wrong order.
- (m) Passing the wrong side of a flag, if not rectified.
- (n) Exceeding the Time Limit.
- (o) Jumping an obstacle which has been knocked down, before it has been re-set.
- (p) Starting again after an interruption, before the signal to continue has been given.
- (q) After a disobedience or fall at a double, treble or multiple obstacle, failing to re-start jumping over the whole obstacle except for a completely closed obstacle.
- (r) Failing to jump each fence of a double, treble, or multiple obstacle, separately.
- (s) Failing to cross the finishing line mounted, before leaving the arena.
- (t) The rider and/or horse leaving the arena, before the completion of the round.
- (u) Receiving unauthorised assistance, whether solicited or not, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (v) Failing to have the required minimum weight when weighing in after completion of the round.
- (w) Entering the arena on foot after the start of the competition, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (x) Failing to comply with the conditions of a competition stipulating that part of the course is to be ridden at a trot or walk.
- (y) Jumping an optional obstacle more than once in a jump-off.
- (z) All other reasons for elimination set out in the rules.

DEFINITIONS, GENERAL RULES AND PENALTIES

OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN:

1. An obstacle is considered as having been knocked down when through the fault of the horse, or rider:

(a) Any part, or the whole, of it is knocked down, even when the falling part is arrested in its fall by any other portion of the obstacle.

(b) When at least one of its ends is dislodged from its support.

(c) Any framework intended to maintain the solidity of the obstacle, and forming an integral part of its support falls. Touches and displacements, in whatever direction, do not count.

2. (a) When an obstacle, or part of an obstacle, is composed of several elements placed one on top of the other and in the same vertical plane, the dislodging of the top element alone is penalised.

(b) When an obstacle to be taken in one jump is composed of several elements not fixed in the same vertical plane (oxer, brook, triple bar, water jump or ditch, preceded or followed by another obstacle, etc.), the fall of one or more elements or foot in the water is counted only as one fault, irrespective of the number and position of the elements knocked down.

(c) If an obstacle that has been knocked down does not actually fall until after the horse has left the arena, it will not be penalised.

(d) If any element of an obstacle that has been knocked down prevents the horse from jumping the next obstacle it must be removed. The time required for doing this is deducted from the total time of the round.

(e) All obstacles with water (with the exception of the water jump which is subject to special rules) must be marked by a lath both on the take-off side and on the landing side.

DISOBEDIENCE:

3. The following are considered as disobediences and are penalised as such:

Rectified deviation from the course.

Refusal.

Run-out.

Resistance.

Any form of circle or series of circles, in any part of the course for any reason, except that a horse may circle once or more without penalty to re-take the track after a run-out or a refusal. In a course that is not marked by a continuous line, unless there is any indication to the contrary on the plan or notified by the Jury, any circle (whereby the horse crosses its original track), wherever it may be on the course, is penalised as a disobedience. Approaching an obstacle sideways, or zig-zagging, or turning sharply towards it, do not constitute a disobedience, provided the horse has not passed the obstacle.

DEVIATION FROM THE COURSE:

4. There is a deviation from the course when the horse does not follow the plan for the course as shown on the diagram posted up, as when the rider:

(a) Disregards a flag to indicate the course to be followed.

(b) Does not clear the obstacles in the prescribed order.

(c) Jumps an obstacle outside the course, or misses one on the course.

5. (a) To rectify a deviation from the course the rider must resume the course from the spot where the error was committed.

JUMPING

(b) A deviation from the course rectified before clearing an obstacle is penalised as a disobedience.

(c) A deviation from the course not rectified, or rectified only after taking an obstacle, whether this forms part of the course or not, incurs the penalty of elimination. Officials or others in the arena are never allowed to warn the competitor of his error.

REFUSAL:

(a) A refusal consists of stopping in front of an obstacle to be jumped, whether or not the horse knocks it down or displaces it.

(b) Stopping at an obstacle without knocking it down and without reining back, followed immediately by a standing jump, is not penalised.

(c) If the halt is perceptible, or if the horse steps back even a single pace, voluntarily or not, or retakes the track, a refusal is incurred.

(d) If a horse, having knocked down an obstacle in stopping, jumps this obstacle before it has been re-erected, he is eliminated.

(e) If a horse slides through an obstacle, the officiating judge must decide immediately whether it is to count as a refusal or as an obstacle knocked down. If he decides it is a refusal, the bell is sounded at once and the competitor must retrace his steps and re-jump the obstacle. Should he fail to do so and jumps an obstacle, other than another of the same combination, he is eliminated. Should the Judge decide it was not a refusal, he will not ring the bell and the competitor must continue his round. He is then penalised as for an obstacle knocked down.

(f) The action of showing an obstacle to the horse after a refusal and before resuming the course is penalised by elimination.

RUNNING OUT:

7. It is considered as running-out and the horse must be brought back to jump the obstacle again, failing which he is eliminated, when:

(a) The horse, not being properly under control of his rider, avoids the obstacle he should have jumped.

(b) He jumps the obstacle outside the boundary flags which mark it.

RESISTANCE:

8. It is considered to be a resistance when the horse, wherever he may be, refuses to go forward (stops, runs back, turns round more or less completely, rears, etc.).

All horses are eliminated that:

(a) Resist their riders for a period of sixty consecutive seconds during the round.

(b) Take more than sixty seconds to jump an obstacle, except in the case of a fall.

(c) Have not passed the starting line sixty seconds after being given the signal to start.

FALLS:

9. (a) A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his horse, which has not fallen, in such a way as to necessitate remounting, or vaulting, into the saddle.

(b) A horse is considered to have fallen when the shoulder and quarters have touched either the ground, or the obstacle and the ground.

10. (a) A fall is penalised wherever it takes place within the course and whatever the cause. After a fall the rider must continue the course from the point where he fell, or from any other point, provided he does not reduce the length of the course.

(b) The penalty to be imposed for a fall is set out in Table "A", "B", or "C".

(c) When the horse or rider falls in knocking down an obstacle the penalties for both occurrences are added together. The same applies to a fall following a disobedience.

UNAUTHORISED ASSISTANCE:

11. Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not, with the object of facilitating the task of the rider or helping his horse, is unauthorised assistance and is forbidden under penalty of elimination.

The judges have full powers to decide whether the rider will be eliminated or not.

Bringing back a runaway horse after a fall or helping the rider to re-adjust the saddlery, or to remount, is not considered as unauthorised assistance. The course must be re-taken at the exact spot where it was interrupted.

Handing his whip to a rider who has dropped it during the round is unauthorised assistance.

DOUBLE, TREBLE AND MULTIPLE OBSTACLES:

12. A double, treble, or multiple obstacle is one composed of two, three or more fences or parts, with a minimum inner distance between each of them of 23 ft. (7 metres) up to a maximum inner distance between them of 39 ft. 5 ins. (12 metres), (with the exception for the Hunting Competitions where the distance may be less than 23 ft.), which must be taken in two, three or more successive jumps. The distance is measured from the base of the one fence on the landing side to the base of the next fence on the take-off side.

In double, treble and multiple obstacles, each fence or part of the whole must be jumped separately, on penalty of elimination. When there is a refusal, run-out, or fall, the rider must take the whole obstacle again, or he will be eliminated. Exception is made for completely closed obstacles.

All the faults for mistakes and resistances made at each fence and during the various attempts are counted separately and added together, but should a refusal be due to a fall between two fences it will not be penalised.

BANKS, SLOPES AND RAMPS:

13. Banks, slopes, ramps and sunken roads, irrespective of whether they include any sort of fence and whatever the direction in which they should be taken, will be regarded as double, treble, multiple or closed obstacles. Each part must be jumped separately and faults will be penalised as for these obstacles.

The Jury must decide before the competition whether the obstacle is to be considered as closed or as a double, treble, or multiple obstacle. This decision must be included on the plan of the course.

If this mention is not indicated on the plan, the obstacle must be regarded as a double, treble or multiple obstacle.

JUMPING

14. A bank or platform (-butte-) without the addition of a fence, or with only one pole, can be taken in a flying jump. This way of jumping does not incur any penalties.

OBSTACLES COMPLETELY CLOSED:

(15). (a) If an obstacle is completely closed (such as in-and-out, square or hexagonal) the rule for rejumping the whole obstacle does not apply.

(b) In such cases, if the horse leaves the enclosure on the wrong side, he is considered as having jumped an obstacle that is not part of the course and he is eliminated.

(c) If, on the other hand, once in the enclosure, there is a refusal or fall, the rider is obliged to leave the enclosure by jumping out of it in the correct direction. If he is unable to do so within 50 seconds or after several attempts, making in all three refusals during the round, he is eliminated. He has not the right to displace, or cause to be displaced, or to modify any of the elements of the obstacle.

TIME:

(a) Unless otherwise stated in the conditions of the Class the "Time Allowed" for the course will be announced before each event.

(b) THE "TIME LIMIT" IS TWICE THE "TIME ALLOWED".

(c) FAULTS FOR TIME:—FOR EVERY SECOND OR PART OF A SECOND EXCEEDING THE "TIME ALLOWED" $\frac{1}{4}$ FAULT. EXCEEDING THE "TIME LIMIT". ELIMINATED.

JUMPING-OFF:

In jumping competitions judged under Table A, the winner will be decided by one of the following methods (to be indicated in the competition concerned).

Table "A1". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off the prize will be divided.

Table "A2". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A3". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the first Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A4". In the event of equality of faults for any award in the first round of the Competition time will decide. In the event of equality of faults and time for first place there may be one Jump-off at the discretion of the Judge.

DEFINITION OF JUMPING ARENA:

The Jumping Arena will, when practicable, be entirely enclosed, but if not, will be clearly marked with flags or some other easily recognised indicator. At all times the Trotting Track will be taken as off the Jumping Arena. It will be the responsibility of all competitors to acquaint themselves with the extent of the arena and its markings before competing.

THE COUNCIL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INTRODUCE A STANDARD AT ANY TIME.

CRUELTY TO HORSES is forbidden either in the arena, exercise area or elsewhere. A competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disallowed from taking part in any further competitions at the Show where the offence was committed. The decision rests with the Judge and no appeal will be considered.

GROUP A

Competition in classes in this group is open only to horses over 14.2 hands whose past performances, in the opinion of the committee, warrant their inclusion in the group.

From the entries received, the Council will select the horses with the best performances (up to a maximum of 20 horses) to compete in PART I, and the next best (up to a maximum of 20) to compete in PART II.

PART I—Classes 264 to 270.

PART II—Classes 271 to 276.


Horses in Group "A" may not compete in groups "B" and "C", but they may compete in groups "D" and "E" excluding Section Fours.

All competitions in this Group will be judged under "Table A".

Riders must be 15 years of age or over.

CONDITIONS

Six identical obstacles are placed in a straight line with a distance of about 12 yards between each of them.

The obstacles are of identical construction and consist of bars of the same type.

The bars may be at the same height of 4 ft. or at progressive heights, e.g., 3 ft. 8 in., 4 ft., 4 ft. 4 in., 4 ft. 8 in., 5 ft., 5 ft. 4 in.

If the competitor knocks down any of the bars, he should not stop, but should continue the course.

Only those without faults in the first round are entitled to take part in subsequent rounds, or if there are no clear rounds, those with an equal number of faults.

The height of the six bars must be increased for the second and subsequent rounds.

If there is no decisive result after the fourth or fifth round, the Judges can end the competition. The horses which were eligible to jump again are placed equal.

No time limit.



Competitors will jump as many obstacles (in the correct order) as possible within 90 seconds, the competitors changing over as many times as there is reason to do so until they are stopped by the clock.

The horse jumping the course when the time is sounded must then jump the following obstacle. The time will be taken when the horse's forelegs touch the ground; this obstacle does NOT count in classification. If for any reason the rider does not jump the obstacle at which the clock is stopped he is gonged and the clock stopped. The team will then be placed last of those gaining an equal number of points.

In the course of the competition the rider will be always gonged at the first fault committed no matter what this may be. The partner takes over immediately and continues the course. If it was a jumping fault, the partner takes over the round and jumps the obstacle following that where the fault was incurred.

If the fault was a disobedience, the partner takes over the round and must jump the obstacle where the disobedience occurred.

Notwithstanding the conditions above, if a rider completes one circuit of the course without fault, the other member of the team MUST take over the jumping. The competition then proceeds in accordance with the conditions as previously detailed.

CLASSIFICATION:

In this competition, two points will be awarded for each obstacle jumped clear and one point for each obstacle knocked down.

From the total number of points scored by a team the following are deducted: 1 point for the first disobedience (or fall); 2 points for the second disobedience (or fall); 2 points for the third disobedience (or fall). The fourth disobedience entails elimination of the team.





LTD., MANUFACTURERS AND IMPORTERS OF PHOTOGRAPHIC MATERIALS, 252 COLLINS STREET, MELBOURNE AND ALL STATES.)—First prize, Trophy Order for \$40; Second prize, Trophy Order for \$25; Third prize, Trophy Order for \$15; Fourth prize, Trophy Order for \$10; Fifth prize, Trophy Order for \$5; Sixth prize, Trophy Order for \$5.

For teams of four riders who must be of twelve years of age and under twenty-one years of age, on the first day of the Royal Melbourne Show. Competitors must be members of the Pony Club or Zone they represent, and have regularly participated in rallies as members of his or her Club since 1st October, 1968, or since becoming a member of his or her Club. All ponies, galloways or horses entered must have been ridden regularly at rallies of the Club they represent.

The winning team will be that which has the least number of faults adding together the faults of the best three scores in the team. All four horses to jump. Should a Club be unable to field a team of four, it shall be permissible for a team of three to compete. In this case, the three sources are added to give the team score. Unless the three members complete the Course, the team concerned is eliminated.

Competitors must wear Pony Club uniform; Pony Club jumper in the colours of the Club, uniform shirt and tie, jodhpurs and short boots. Hard hats must be worn. Only blunt spurs without rowels may be worn. If the spur is curved, the curve must be downwards. Whips carried must not exceed 30 inches in length overall.

In the first round the obstacles will be set to a minimum height of 3'6" and a maximum height of 4'. In the event of equality for first place there will be a jump-off over a course of which certain obstacles may be enlarged. If after this jump-off there is still equality for first place, there will be a second jump-off in which time will decide. The speed for the event will be 382 yards per minute and the competition will be judged on Table "A".

The Pony Club Association of Victoria may enter not more than nine teams with the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria. Teams will be selected by the Association on performance in the pre-selection event at the Zone Competitions, conducted prior to the Show. The Association must furnish to the Society the names of the horses and riders in the teams, not later than 5.00 p.m., on 10th September, 1969.

Entry fee, \$4 per team.

290. THE "NATIONAL BANK" INTER-NATIONAL AND INTERSTATE TEAMS' JUMPING CONTEST.

SPECIAL PRIZES, \$250 (presented by THE NATIONAL BANK OF AUSTRALASIA LTD., 271 COLLINS STREET, MELBOURNE.)—First, \$120; Second, \$80; Third, \$50.

This contest will be restricted to teams of four horses over 14.2 hands and riders from each State of the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New

Zealand or any country within the British Commonwealth of Nations. Should a team be able to produce only three riders the team captain must enter only three horses and riders. Each State, Dominion or Country will be limited to a maximum of two teams each. In the event of teams from four or more States, Dominions or Countries being nominated, one team only from each State, Dominion or Country will be eligible to compete. Teams will be selected by their respective State Branches of the E.F.A. or their National Federation from horses already nominated and which have competed in jumping events in Group "A". One reserve horse and rider for each team may also be nominated. The reserve horse can only take part if one of the four horses is ill or the victim of an accident and this is confirmed by the official Veterinary Surgeon at least thirty minutes before the start of the competition. The reserve horse must be ridden by the rider of the horse which is ill or injured. Once a final selection of riders and horses has been submitted to the Director no substitution will be allowed even from reserve horses and riders except on production of an approved medical or veterinary certificate as the case may be.

Riders may ride in one team only and may ride only one horse in that team. In the case of a State, Dominion or Country nominating more than one team they are required to be nominated as the State, Dominion or Country's "A" and "B" team. No rider may be nominated for any State, Dominion or Country other than that in which he or she is resident and no horse may be nominated for any State, Dominion or Country except that in which its nominator is resident. The committee may in its absolute discretion accept the nomination of a composite team from States, Dominions or Countries provided that such team does not consist of more than 50% of horses and/or riders from any one State, Dominion or Country.

Nominations must be submitted to the Director in writing not later than 6 p.m. on the day preceding the day on which the event is scheduled to be contested.

Each team is required to jump two distinct rounds over the same course at a rate of 436 yards per minute. To be tried over a course as stipulated by the Committee.

The classification of the teams is established by totalling the faults over the jumps and those for time incurred by the three best horses of each team in each round.

If for any reason, a competitor does not finish the course at any stage of the competition the team is not thereby eliminated, but can continue. But each horse eliminated or withdrawn during a round is penalised by 20 faults added to the faults incurred by the competitor belonging to any team who has the most faults over the same course during the same round. The actual faults made by the horse that was stopped do not count; they are replaced by those of the horse which had the worst round, unless he himself had the most faults, in spite of having been eliminated or withdrawn.

The prize money will be divided among the owners of the horses in the winning teams. Riders must be 15 years of age or over on the first day of the Show. Should a team win this contest after its third horse has completed its second round then the fourth horse may be withdrawn. The order in which the horses compete will be decided by lot. The captain of each team then decides the order in which he wants his riders to start. All those numbered one go first, then all those numbered two, and so on.

All the horses in the team may take part in the jump-off, if there is one. In case of equality for first place, the time of the three best horses of each team in this jump-off decides.

9. The decision of the Judge, in all cases, will be final as to places.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND EXHIBITION, ETC.

(See also the conditions at the head of each Breed Section)

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. At time of entry and until after exhibition, all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society.

The foregoing clause regarding leases does not apply in the Ayrshire Section. All exhibits in that Section must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

The breeding year for Dairy Cattle dates from 1st July in each year.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Showgrounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 27th September.

The conditions governing the number of entries permitted will be found at the head of each breed section.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class, such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the owner is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:—

- (i) The animal has died.
- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.

Failure to comply with this rule renders the owner or entrant liable to a fine of not more than \$10 for every animal not exhibited, and in addition the Council may debar the owner or exhibitor from taking part in any further exhibition conducted by the Society.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for all cattle sections must be in the hands of the Director, at his office, Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, on or before the time stated at head of each cattle section.

Except where otherwise determined by Council, all cattle must be certified Tuberculosis free. Animals from herds listed as accredited or in process of accreditation under the Accredited Tubercle-free Herd Scheme conducted by the Department of Agriculture, Victoria, need not be individually tested, but all other cattle exhibited must be Tuberculin tested within ninety days prior to opening date of the Show. Certificates for these individual tests must accompany entry forms, or, if not available at that time, must be in the hands of the Director no later than 14 days prior to the opening day of the Show.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Director or his deputy, and (except in accordance with Regulation 19) must not be removed from their allotted places during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Director being first obtained.

Unless authorised by the Society no livestock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

The General Regulations and Regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

ENTRY TICKETS

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the grounds. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Superintendent at his office on the Show Grounds.

CATTLE

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors are required to deliver their Cattle (except Fat Cattle) to the Show Grounds in time to ascertain from the Cattle Superintendent where their exhibits are to be placed and to have them in their allotted positions by 9 a.m. on Wednesday, 17th September.

The entry of cattle, fodder, bedding or equipment to the Show Grounds prior to the Friday preceding the first day of the Show, is not allowed without special permission being granted by the Society.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their stock until 11 p.m. on Saturday, 27th September.

NECK NUMBERS

Numbers corresponding to the exhibit numbers in the catalogue must be worn by the exhibits when appearing before the Judge.

Neck numbers must be obtained by the exhibitor from the office of the Superintendent.

"IN MILK" CLASSES AND DISPOSAL OF MILK

A Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging, or vice versa.

Cows and heifers, in milk, except Dairy Shorthorns, must be fully milked out in readiness for "stripping out" by the Stewards at 5.00 p.m. on Wednesday, 17th September.

Dairy Shorthorn cows and heifers, in milk, must be in readiness for "stripping out" at 8.00 p.m. on Wednesday, 17th September.

The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out, and the exhibits which are to receive such attention must be in readiness in the stalls allotted to them.

Before entering the Judging Ring exhibits in the "In Milk" Classes will be checked with the Milk Stewards' reports to ascertain that they have been fully milked out in compliance with the conditions.

Entries of milking stock (Sections 24 to 30 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter-fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk, and returns, less dairy costs, will be forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

Exhibitors must provide their own receptacles for the delivery of milk to the Society's dairy on the Show Grounds.

JUDGING

Judging will be in catalogue order and will take place at the time stated at the head of each breed section.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of \$10.

Judges have the right to order any Cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

Attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on parade must wear uniform grey coats, which can be procured from the Society, and the showing of a name or names on the wearing apparel or about the person of the attendant is prohibited. This regulation will be strictly enforced.

AGE, DEFORMITY AND USE OF HORMONES

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

If, in the opinion of the Director, exhibits in these Sections be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be completely entire. Any male animal in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

In all Cattle Sections any animal entered which can be shown to the satisfaction of the Society to have received Hormones will be ineligible for a prize.

INSPECTION OF STOCK

Exhibitors in the stock sections shall, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or Stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show. See also regulations at head of Beef and Dairy Cattle Sections.

SECURITY OF ANIMALS

All male exhibits of Beef and Dual Purpose Cattle born on or before 31st August, 1968, and all male exhibits of Dairy Cattle, irrespective of age, shall be rung through the nose and at all times shall be led by such ring. If, in the opinion of the Stewards or Society's officials, any bull is considered unsafe, such bull shall be placed under such control as directed by the Stewards or Society's officials.

All bulls exhibited in the Dairy Sections shall be tethered by the nose ring in addition to the headstall or neck rope.

All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of \$4 for every infringement of this regulation.

Each exhibitor is required to see that each of his exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. All exhibitors of Beef Cattle must provide neck straps or neck ropes, as well as halters for tethering their cattle.

CATTLE

Every poll bull and every wholly or partially dehorned bull entered in Beef and Dual Purpose Sections, must be securely tethered by an effective head-stall in addition to a nose ring or neck strap or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Director, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

PARADES

Prize winning cattle **only** will be permitted to take part in parades. All prize-winning cattle must be taken on parade in accordance with the printed programme. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of one dollar in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

Attendants leading stock on parade must wear uniform grey coats which can be procured from the Society.

This regulation will be strictly enforced.

SALES AND NOTICES

Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls stating that an animal is for sale; such cards not to exceed 12 in. x 10 in. and must not be put up until after 12 noon on Wednesday, 17th September. No other advertisements or notices (except by permission of the Council) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

Any animal offered for sale may wear, in the sale ring, only those ribbons won in single competition.

In the Beef Cattle Sections no bull shall be sold whilst at the Show Grounds, either by public auction or private treaty, for less than 400 dollars and no female for less than 300 dollars.

A commission of 1 per cent. shall be paid to the Society in respect of all stock sold on the Show Grounds.

In all Cattle Sections (except Fat Cattle) Exhibitors are required to indicate, where provided on the entry form, the animals to be offered for sale by auction at the Show.

WEIGHING OF BEEF CATTLE

All Beef Cattle (both males and females) entered in Sections 14 to 23 will be weighed prior to judging. Weighing will take place on the Tuesday and Wednesday preceding opening day. Exhibitors are asked to ensure that at time of weighing the correct neck number is attached to each animal for quick identification and the recording of weight thereon.

PAVILIONS—Cleanliness and Hours of Exhibition

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Cattle Superintendent:

- (i) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- (ii) Clean out their stalls or boxes before 8 a.m. each day.
- (iii) Refrain from leading exhibits from their stalls to water troughs between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. each day of the Show.

Failure to comply with this rule shall render the exhibitor liable to a fine not exceeding \$10 for each separate offence.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of one dollar.

The placing of bales of straw along the passage-ways is not permitted.

All cattle pavilions will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. daily, and on all succeeding days except the Sunday, they will be open between 6.30 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On the Sunday, the pavilion will be open from 11.30 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Exhibits must not be rugged between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of one dollar for every infringement of this regulation.

FEED SHEDS, MIXING BINS, FODDER ARRANGEMENTS AND BEDDING

In all Sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, \$7.50 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for use in Dairy Cattle Sections for \$1.00 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions except on the fodder lofts or in their own feed sheds.

No bedding other than straw or hay (except grass hay), may be used in any boxes or stalls.

For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will be situated on the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

CHAMPIONSHIP PLAQUES

Plaques denoting Champion and Reserve Champion are provided by the R.A.S. for display over the winning animals.

VETERINARY ARRANGEMENTS

A veterinary service commencing on the Sunday preceding the Show will be available until the Sunday immediately after the Show.

For further information see the General Regulations of the Society.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 27th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

INTER-BREEDS COMPETITIONS

Two cash prizes of \$20.00 each, presented by the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, will be awarded for—

- (a) the Best Prepared and Maintained Breed of Beef Cattle during the Show; *BREED SHOW - see 7AUS*
- (b) the Best Prepared and Maintained Breed of Dual Purpose or Dairy Cattle during the Show.

The prize money will be paid to the Victorian Branches of the Societies of the successful breeds.

1. Exhibits in this Section can only be entered in one ordinary class, except in the case of exhibits entered in Classes 9 and 10. These may, if eligible, also be entered in Classes 11 or 12, and vice versa.
2. An exhibit cannot be entered in a special Class unless it has been entered in Class 1, 2 or 3.

*Denotes Special Class.

3. All exhibitors in this Section shall state on their entry forms:—
 - (a) The breed, cross of breeds or mixture of breeds of each animal entered so far as this is known.
 e.g., "Poll Shorthorn — Hereford cross. Sire, Burton Lea Poll Shorthorn; dam, grade Hereford cow."
 - (b) The name, breed and registered number of the sire and/or dam of each animal entered when either or both of these are known to be registered.
 - (c) Whether an exhibit has been artificially bred.
4. Any exhibitor who is awarded a cash prize in this Section may elect to receive a trophy to the value of that prize money or any part thereof.
5. The Society reserves the right to reject or limit entries at its discretion. Accommodation is limited.

6. Except in those classes where suitability for export trade is required, suitability for local trade is implied.
7. Where an exhibitor's entry is based on age as shown by its teeth, it must not show evidence of having had more teeth than specified for the class.
8. Unless otherwise stated all entries in this Section are required to be grass-fed. "Grass-fed" means that the exhibit has been grazed on pasture or crop and may have received hay or ensilage but not grain or concentrates and must not have been stall-fed.
9. In Classes where particulars of feeding are required to be shown on the entry form exhibitors are asked to indicate whether or not their exhibits have been foster-mothered.
10. The Council reserves the right to display all or any part of any carcass in the refrigerated show-case at the Meat Hall.

GENERAL JUDGING RULES AND ARRANGEMENTS

1. A complete Timetable of the arrangements for this Section will be forwarded to each exhibitor after entries have been received.
2. Live judging in all ordinary classes will be carried out by the official Fat Cattle Judge.
3. Special classes will also be judged alive by the official Fat Cattle Judge, who will award a maximum of 100 points for conformation.
4. In all special classes the prize is awarded for the animal obtaining the highest aggregate of points from both live and carcass judging. These points are not aggregated in the ordinary classes.
5. In classes where three animals are penned the prize is awarded on the basis of total points scored by all three exhibits in either the live judging or carcass judging and not on the basis of the best individual of the three penned.
6. The Chief Steward may, at his discretion, transfer any animal or pen of animals from the class in which they were entered to any other class.
7. In single animal Classes 1 to 8 exhibits will not be awarded a points score when judged alive, but will be placed first, second and third at the Judge's discretion.

The order of Breeds in the Grand Parade shall be:—Devon, Galloway, Murray Grey, Hereford, Brahman, Beef Shorthorn, Santa Gertrudis, Poll Shorthorn, Angus, Poll Hereford. The order will rotate annually, the first breed this year becoming the last next year.

INSPECTION REGULATIONS IN BEEF AND DUAL PURPOSE SECTIONS

1. Each Breed Society in the Beef and Dual Purpose Sections shall nominate to the R.A.S. an inspector or inspectors of cattle entered in the breed of the particular Breed Society.
2. The Council of the R.A.S. shall appoint such person or persons as an inspector or inspectors who shall inspect each animal entered in the relevant breed. Such inspections shall be carried out on the day preceding the opening day of the Show commencing at 10 a.m. Exhibitors are required to have their stock attended and in readiness for inspection. The inspector(s) shall on that day submit their report before 1 p.m. to the Director.
3. If in the unanimous opinion of the inspector(s) any animal
 - (a) is not true to type or
 - (b) is not of sufficient merit as to be worthy of exhibit in the class or classes for which it is entered or
 - (c) has not been adequately prepared for the show or
 - (d) bears any marking brand or tattoo contrary to the markings brand or tattoo disclosed in the relevant entry form or any marking brand or tattoo not in accordance with the records of the relevant Breed Society or
 - (e) being a bull born on or before the 31st August 1968 is not rung through the nose
 then such animal shall be ineligible for exhibition and the Society may require the animal to be forthwith removed from the Show Grounds and the exhibitor, upon receipt of such notice shall forthwith remove such animal and failing such removal by him within the time prescribed by the Director the Director may remove the animal or cause the animal to be removed and all costs and expenses of removal shall be borne by the exhibitor and shall be refunded to the Society. Each such animal shall at all times be at the sole risk and responsibility of the exhibitor and the person or persons removing the animal shall at all times be deemed to be the agents of the exhibitor and all acts and omissions on the part of such person or persons shall be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the exhibitor who shall indemnify and hold indemnified the Society its servants and agents from all claims whatsoever in respect of the animal whether by reason of any loss or injury to or caused by the animal or because of transportation, feeding or housing or otherwise howsoever.

4. The decision of the inspector(s) shall be final subject only to appeal to the Chief Steward or Assistant Chief Steward in the Beef Cattle Section and his opinion shall be final.
5. The inspector(s) or Chief Steward or his assistant shall not be required to furnish to the exhibitor any reasons for their decision.
6. Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations the Society shall have the right to declare any animal ineligible to compete because of the health of any such animal or for any other reason which the Society or its Director deems fit. The Society or its Director shall thereupon have the right to order the removal of such animal from the Show Grounds or in default thereof remove such animal at the expense and risk of the exhibitor.
