

AUSTRALIAN WINES

- (d) In the case of Brandy, its apparent strength.
 (e) Where more than one entry, the distinguishing mark of the entry to conform to the certificate of entry.
 (f) Baume of all entries in sweet wine classes should be shown on entry form and label.
- (N.B.)—Bottles must not bear any labels or capsules other than those supplied by the Society. Branded bottles and corks are permissible.
13. Sparkling wines must represent wines with natural effervescence, the result of fermentation in the bottle.
 14. Exhibits to be delivered to the Ground Manager's office at the Royal Showgrounds, Ascot Vale, in containers holding not more than one dozen quart bottles properly marked to show exhibitor's name (see front page for details).
 15. In all classes, the wine in stock as stated on the certificate of entry may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.
 16. Entries of Blended Wines must represent the prescribed quantity already blended.
 17. Immediately after the closing date of entries, a draw may be made for selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable at least one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. An official appointed by the Society shall make an inspection of the quantity of such wine in accordance with the certificate of entry, and his report will be later considered by the Committee of the Society.
 18. Unless otherwise stated, all exhibits become the property of the Society.
 19. Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on the certificate of entry and be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
 20. All exhibits must be solely the produce of Australian grapes and conform to the respective Acts of the States and the Commonwealth which governs the manufacture of Australian Wine and Australian Brandy; these to include the Customs and Excise Act and Regulations, the Distillation Act and Regulations, Health Act and Regulations and many others. The Society reserves the right to have any exhibit inspected and/or analysed by one or more persons appointed for that purpose.
 21. No protest will be entertained unless made within seven days of the announcement of the awards.
 22. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any other similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited.
 23. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of the exhibits.
 24. Unless with the special permission of the Society no exhibitor or representative or employee of an exhibitor may occupy the position of Judge or become in any way identified with the judging or handling of exhibits, in any class in which he or his employers are interested. This rule shall not apply to Stewards or Trainee Judges.
 25. No exhibitor shall advertise or allow to be advertised by any means whatsoever, whether by broadcasting, pictorially, or in writing, the fact that any exhibit has won any prize in this section unless such advertisement shows clearly:
 - (a) Year of award;
 - (b) Description of class, with vintage year where applicable;
 - (c) Type of wine.
 Any competitor making improper use of awards won in the Wine or Brandy Section for advertising purposes may be disqualified from any future Show or Shows.
 26. Points for Diploma Awards will, in connection with aggregate prizes be allocated to the following scale of points:

 In the event of a tie, the exhibitor gaining the highest number of Diplomas for Gold Awards will be judged the winner.

INSTRUCTIONS TO JUDGES

1. Judges will judge each class without collaboration, and on receipt of all result sheets applicable to any one class, the Chairman Judge shall have the points totalled, checked and he shall have the final power to determine the Awards.
2. Judges will not have access to exhibits apart from the glass of each placed in front of them by the Stewards.
3. All exhibits will be judged on points as follows:

4. Diploma Awards will be made as follows:

Bronze Award	15.5 to 16.9 points
Silver Award	17.0 to 18.4 points
Gold Award	18.5 points and over
5. The Judges shall have power to disqualify or dismiss, as being not eligible for judging, any exhibit which, in their opinion, does not comply with the regulations in every respect, and such disqualification shall be accepted as final.
6. Awards may be withheld in any class where exhibits are considered unworthy.

SPECIFICATIONS

The following specifications are intended as a guide only to the exhibitors and judges in Wine Shows conducted by the Society. Except where analytical standards are mentioned, it is in general left to the exhibitor to see that his entries conform, but in case of doubt the Judges may submit samples for analysis.

AUSTRALIAN WINES

HOCK

Should be in brilliant condition, pale to light straw in colour, preferably with a slight greenish tinge, light to medium bodied, medium to high acidity and yet soft, with a fresh and flowery bouquet and a clean after-taste free of bitterness or lingering sweetness.

MOSELLE

Specification similar to Hock, but with some sweetness not exceeding half-degree baume.

WHITE BURGUNDY OR CHABLIS

Should be in brilliant condition, light to medium straw in colour. Medium to full-bodied and yet delicate, with a medium acidity and a fresh bouquet. Its aftertaste may be a little more pronounced than in Hock even with a very slight bitterness but no lingering sweetness.

SAUTERNES

A white table wine of straw to light golden colour. It should be in brilliant condition, medium to full-bodied, with a bouquet which is aromatic rather than flowery and distinctly sweet in flavour. It should not show excessive SO₂. Baume should not be less than 1.5 degrees.

ROSE

A still, light and tart table wine, with a slight tannin finish and a fresh fruity flavour, but without muscat character. Colour pink. It should not contain more than 0.50% reducing sugar and alcoholic strength should be between 17% and 24% proof spirit.

CLARET

A dry red table wine which may vary from fairly dark to light red in colour according to the age of the wine, and from light to medium body. The acidity and body should be well balanced and the wine, whilst soft and rounded on the middle palate, should finish firm and astringent and showing, as well as grape tannin flavour, some but not excessive flavour of oak tannin from the maturation wood. The bouquet should be fruity and in harmony with the body and flavour of the wine. An amber colour is objectionable.

BURGUNDY

A dry red table wine of colour and body similar to Claret but a softer wine which may be of somewhat lower acidity and which must be soft and round on the middle palate and lack the characteristic astringency of Claret on the finish.

SWEET WHITE NOT EXCEEDING 27°

Should be straw to light golden colour. Usually with some Muscat character. Bouquet must be fruity and attractive without objectionably excessive SO₂. Flavour should be soft, round and well balanced. Strength not to exceed 27% proof spirit and baume not to exceed 7 degrees.

SWEET WHITE DESSERT

Golden to amber in colour, depending on age. Must not show Muscat character but have fruity and aromatic bouquet. It must be full-bodied, soft and round and yet with an acidity sufficient to prevent mawkishness. Baume not to exceed 6 degrees in the commercial class or 10 degrees in the open class.

SWEET RED NOT EXCEEDING 27°

Colour medium to dark red. May show some amber tinge. Bouquet to be characteristic of red dessert wine without excessive SO₂. Palate to be full flavoured with some astringency on the finish but without excess acidity. Strength not to exceed 27% proof spirit and baume not to exceed 7 degrees.

SWEET WHITE MUSCAT

Colour light golden to deep amber. Distinct Muscat bouquet and palate. Full-bodied, soft and round and yet firm enough not to be mawkish. Baume not to exceed 6 degrees in the commercial class or 10 degrees in the open class.

SWEET RED, RUBY PORT STYLE

Colour medium to dark red. May only show slight amber tinge, excessive amber colour is objectionable. Bouquet and palate full and fruity. Finish firm and astringent leaving no lingering sweetness. Baume not to exceed 6 degrees.

SWEET RED, TAWNY PORT STYLE

Colour pale red with distinct amber tinge to deep amber with reddish tinge. Bouquet fruity and aromatic, palate full and soft with distinct dryness on the finish. Some flavour of oak tannin from the maturing wood is desirable. A lingering sweetness on the after palate is undesirable. Baume not to exceed 6 degrees.

VINTAGE PORT

Colour deep ruby to light ruby possibly with a slight amber tint, depending on age. Bouquet fruity and characteristic of bottle aged Vintage Port. Should not show wood character. Flavour full and soft with firm, astringent finish and no lingering sweetness. Baume not to exceed 6 degrees.

SHERRY, PALE DRY FINO STYLE

Colour straw to pale golden. Bouquet characteristic of flor sherry. Flavour light and dry without excessive acidity or astringency but some oak character. Finish dry, aromatic with distinct "nutty" aftertaste of flor sherry.

SHERRY, AMONTILLADO STYLE

Colour golden to light amber. Bouquet similar to pale dry Sherry, but more aromatic. Palate fuller and softer than pale dry with some oak astringency showing through. Finish dry and aromatic with characteristic "nutty" aftertaste of sherry.

SHERRY, OLOROSO STYLE

Colour amber to deep amber. Bouquet fruity and aromatic and showing both oak wood and Sherry character. Palate soft and round but with firm oak tannin finish. Baume not to exceed 3 degrees.

CHAMPAGNE

Colour should be pale to light straw. Should have good acidity and not be too light in body. Bouquet should be fresh, fruity but without particular varietal character, and should indicate some years in bottle. The wine should be fairly dry but show no astringent finish. Bubbles should be fine and persistent (make sure tasting glasses are not washed in detergent).

SPARKLING BURGUNDY

Colour should be light to medium ruby. In older wines may show a trace of amber but not more than a trace. Bouquet fruity but should show bottle age. Fairly pronounced acidity. Full flavour and body, some sweetness but with dry finish. May show slight oak character. Bubbles should be fine and persistent (make sure tasting glasses are not washed in detergent).

AUSTRALIAN WINES

VERMOUTHS

These should approximate European counterparts. Colour of Dry Vermouth should be very light straw, and Sweet Vermouth from golden to deep amber.

TWO YEARS OLD BRANDY

Entries in this class should be representative of popular commercial brandies, but should avoid fruitiness. The Brandy should be a well balanced distillate of wine made from neutral grape varieties. It should avoid excessive heads or tails, and should not show varietal character (e.g. Muscat). It should be smooth but not too sweet (1.5 degrees obscuration is suggested as maximum). A clean balanced bouquet is essential. Colour not too dark.

OLD BRANDY

Colour may be somewhat darker than in young Brandy class. Well-matured oak should be distinguishable on both bouquet and flavour. Bouquet should be clean and somewhat ethereal but well balanced showing no particular constituent to excess. Flavour should be full, smooth and aromatic. Finish aromatic without trace of fusel oil. No varietal character or fruitiness should be evident. Some slight sweetness is acceptable.

THE W. E. LILLIE TROPHY. — A trophy presented by **THE WHOLESALE SPIRIT MERCHANTS ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA**, in recognition of the services of Mr. W. E. Lillie, will be awarded to the most successful exhibitor of Liqueurs each year. (Points will be allotted as follows: Gold Award 5 points, Silver Award 3 points, Bronze Award 1 point. In the event of a tie the winner will be declared on a count back of the most Gold Awards. If required, exhibitors must complete a statutory declaration that they or the firm concerned are the manufacturers of the liqueur or liqueurs exhibited.

1. Each exhibitor will be allowed one entry only in each Class with the exception of Classes 1021 and 1022. Any number of entries may be made in these two classes by any exhibitor providing each liqueur entered represents a separate and different registered recipe. No liqueurs with a coffee flavour shall be entered in Class 1022. Each sample to consist of two 26 oz. bottles or four 13 oz. bottles as stated in each class.

Bottles must not be labelled with business labels. Branded bottles and corks are not permissible. Entries in all classes must be made in oval amber bottles.

2. No person shall enter any spirits or liqueur as an exhibit unless he has in stock, available for sale, a supply of such spirit as stipulated in respect of each class of exhibit. A margin of variation of 2 degrees in strength to be allowed for any exhibit, unless otherwise stated. Liqueurs must be made from natural extracts or flavourings, and must not contain synthetic flavourings. Exhibitors must state on the label the spirit content of the liqueur exhibited.

3. Exhibits must represent stocks as set out on certificate of entry, and be the bona fide property of exhibitor at the time of entry.

4. No entry will be received from any person or persons disqualified by this or any similar Society during the period of such disqualification. Should any such entry be accepted, it shall, when discovered, be deemed void, and the entry fee and exhibit shall be forfeited to the Society.

5. No person will be allowed to inspect an entry form after reception by the Director, until the Judges' awards have been made public.

6. Immediately after the closing date of entries, a draw may be made for the selection of three exhibitors from whose entries a further draw will be made to enable one sample to be selected from each exhibitor. The Society reserves the right to make an inspection of the quantity in accordance with the certificate of entry.

7. After the close of entries no person will be permitted access to the exhibits, except the Judges, Director and Staff, until the award has been made.

8. If required, exhibitors must make a statutory declaration to the effect (a) that it conforms with these regulations; and (b) that it has not been blended with any imported spirit or liqueur.

9. Exhibits are to bear labels which will be supplied by the Society and must show:—

(a) Class Number.

(b) Distinguishing Number (as shown on entry form) if two or three entries in the one class.

(c) Name of Spirit or Liqueur. In the Liqueur Classes, the name of the Liqueur **MUST** be shown on the label.

(d) Spirit Content.

10. The Judge shall have power, at his discretion, to transfer exhibits from one class to another when it is obvious that the exhibitor has made an error in making his entry.

11. In all classes the stock, as stated on the entry form, may be inspected and checked by a representative of the Society or its nominee. Each exhibitor must supply the Society with a sealed envelope containing the record of any sale made subsequent to their entries being lodged, provided such sale has reduced the stipulated quantity below the minimum.

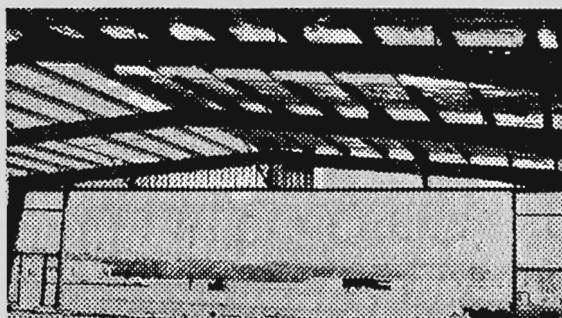

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society and must be in the hands of the Director, at his office, Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, on or before 4.30 p.m., Wednesday, 22nd July, 1970. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their exhibits until after 9.00 p.m. on Saturday, 26th September, 1970.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Director or his deputy, and must not be removed from their Classes during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Director being first obtained.

Exhibits of Wheat, Oats and Barley must represent a quantity of not less than 150 bushels, and exhibits of Chaff and Hay represent a quantity of not less than 10 tons, and must be produced by the exhibitor during the preceding twelve months.

RICH FRUIT OR CHRISTMAS CAKE

Oven Temperature: 325°, decrease as cake cooks.

Cooking time: 3-3½ hours.

Cooking utensil: Cake tin 8" round or 7" square, lined with 3 layers of paper.

Ingredients: 8 oz. Butter, 8 oz. Castor or Brown Sugar (1 1/3 cups) or 8 oz. 1A Sugar (1 cup), 8 oz. Flour (2 cups), 2 oz. S.R. Flour (½ cup), ½ teaspoon Salt, 4 Eggs, ¼ teaspoon Nutmeg, 2 tablespoons Fruit Juice or other liquid, 8 oz. Sultanas (1 1/3 cups), 8 oz. Currants (1 1/3 cups), 8 oz. Seeded Raisins (1 1/3 cups), 2 oz. Mixed Peel (1/3 cup), 2 oz. Chopped Glace Cherries (1/3 cup), 2 oz. Dates (if liked) (1/3 cup), 2 oz. Almonds (1/3 cup), 1 teaspoon Mixed Spice, 1 teaspoon Cinnamon.

Method:

1. Weigh and measure ingredients.
2. Sift flour, salt and spices. Beat eggs.
3. Cream butter and sugar.
4. Gradually add eggs to creamed mixture. Mix well.
5. Add fruit and nuts, then flour and liquid. Stir gently and thoroughly.
6. Place in prepared tin, hollow out centre to allow for rising. Bake.
7. When baked, leave in tin for at least 10 minutes before turning out on to cake cooler.

(Cake may be left in tin until quite cold.)

207. THE "VEB" FOUNDATION EGG SPONGE. Prizes: First, \$6; Second, \$2.50; Third, \$1.50.

Ingredients: 4 ozs. S.R. Flour (1 cup), 4 ozs. Castor Sugar (¾ cup), 3 Eggs weighing 6 ozs., 2 tablespoons hot water, 3 drops Essence, ¼ teaspoon Salt.

Method:

1. Weigh and measure ingredients. Sift flour.
2. Separate whites and yolks of eggs. Place whites in a warm dry basin with salt.
3. Beat until very stiff but still shiny. Add sugar very slowly and beat until mixture is stiff.
4. Add yolks and beat until mixture forms a figure "8" and resembles thick cream. Add water and essence down the side of the basin.
5. Using a tablespoon, fold in sifted flour very lightly. Add about half of the flour at a time. Do not over-mix.
6. Pour into prepared tins and bake.
7. When cooked turn onto a cake cooler. Reverse cake to cool with right side up.

8. Ice with suitable icing and fill as desired.

Oven temperature: 375 deg. **Cooking time:** 15-20 minutes.

Cooking utensils: 2-7" greased sandwich tins.

All puddings, rich fruit cakes, decorated cakes, sweets and preserves must be called for between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Sunday, 27th September, or Monday, 28th September, 1970, unless specific instructions as to the return of same are given to the Society prior to the commencement of the Show.

O-SO-LITE PRODUCTS PTY. LTD. have donated \$21 towards the prize money in the Cooking Section.

A TROPHY ORDER, valued at \$21, donated by the MANUFACTURERS OF WESTERN STAR BUTTER, will be awarded to the most successful exhibitor in Classes 208 to 236.

Three points will be awarded for a first prize in each Class, two points for a second prize, and one point for a third prize. In the event of a Judge awarding an equal first, second or third, full points will be awarded to each exhibitor.

A SPECIAL PRIZE OF \$10 (donated by "COLES STORES", MELBOURNE), will be awarded to the competitor gaining the greatest number of points in the Section for Cooking (Classes 208 to 277). The method of calculating points for both of the above trophies to be—three points for first prize, two points for second prize, and one point for a third prize. 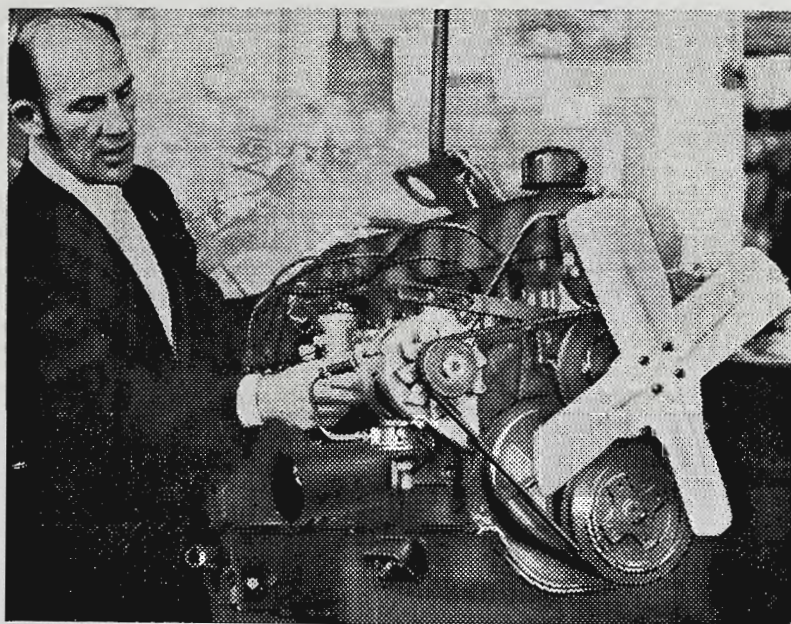

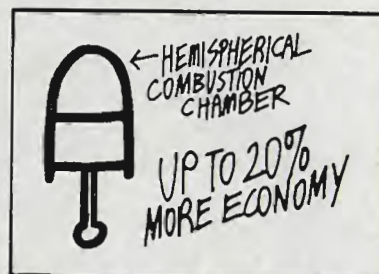
