THE ANNUAL EXHIBITION will be open on **THURSDAY, 17th SEPTEMBER**, to **SATURDAY, 26th SEPTEMBER** (including Sunday 20th at 11.00 a.m.).

Members of the Society, on presentation of their badges, will be admitted to the Grounds and Grand Stands free.

The public will be admitted on Thursday, 17th September, and on the remaining days of the Show, from 9 a.m., on payment of \$1 for adults and 20c for children under 14 except on Sunday, 20th September, when the public will be admitted from 11.00 a.m. on payment of \$1 for adults and 10c for children.

No charge is made for admission to public Grand Stands.

Admission may be obtained at the gates by cash payment or on production of Member's badges or official passes, etc., also combined Rail and Show Tickets which are sold at Flinders Street, Railway Station, Tourist Bureau, Collins Street, and at all suburban railway stations, including Frankston, Lilydale, Belgrave, Sunbury and Geelong.

PRIVILEGES of MEMBERSHIP

EXTRACT FROM REVISED CONSTITUTION AND RULES.

The privileges of a FULL MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's grounds and grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society.
- (ii) The right to purchase up to two additional ladies' badges at the price fixed from time to time by the Council.
- (iii) The benefits of any reciprocal arrangement which the Society has with any kindred Society.
- (iv) Such reduced entry fees at shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine upon.
- (v) The right to vote at general meetings of the Society subject to any rules herein contained which deal with the right to vote at meetings of the Society.

The privileges of an ASSOCIATE MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's grounds and grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or other exhibitions conducted by the Society.
- (ii) Such reduced entry fees at shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society as the Council may from time to time determine.
- (iii) If a firm, corporation, society, company or other body, then it shall have the right to pay more than one associate member's subscription in which event it shall be entitled to as many associate members' badges as subscriptions paid.

The privileges of a JUNIOR MEMBER shall be:—

- (i) Free admission to the Society's grounds and grandstands surrounding the main arena during shows or exhibitions conducted by the Society.

NOTE.—ASSOCIATE AND JUNIOR MEMBERSHIPS DO NOT CARRY ANY RECIPROCAL RIGHT WITH ANY SOCIETY.

MEMBERS' BADGES MAY BE PURCHASED AT THE VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT TOURIST BUREAU, 272 COLLINS STREET, MELBOURNE, AND ALSO AT SHOW-TIME AT THE SHOW GROUNDS ENTRANCES NEAR THE HALL OF MANUFACTURES, LANG'S ROAD No. 1 GATE, LEONARD'S CRESCENT AND ON THE RAILWAY PLATFORM.

General Regulations

Unless otherwise provided in the Regulations concerning each Section or Class, the following Regulations shall apply:

CHAMPION PRIZES

1. All exhibits to be the bona fide property of exhibitors, and produce to be grown or made by the exhibitor.

2. For Champion Awards to be made, three exhibits must be entered (at least two of which must be duly shown), unless the Judge reports that an exhibit (even though alone) is of exceptional merit and worthy of such award. If, however, in the opinion of the Judge, none of the exhibits are of sufficient merit, he may withhold the prize altogether. Only first prize winners of ordinary classes are eligible to compete for a Championship but the animal placed second to the Champion in the ordinary class, shall be eligible to compete for the Reserve Championship.

3. Stallions over 2 years of age must be registered as required by the provisions of the Horse Breeding Act, 1928.

4. The prizes to be awarded by Judges appointed by the Society.

5. In any case where, in the opinion of the Council, any misstatement has been made regarding any exhibit, the prize may not be awarded.

6. All exhibits to be subject to General Regulations.

NOTE.—Separate entries are not required for Champion Prizes.

ENTRIES.

(Also see Special Notes in Each Section.)

1. The Society accepts no responsibility for the loss of, or damage to, any exhibit.

2. The Council of the Society or the Director or his authorized deputy shall have the power and right to:—

- (a) Reject or cancel any entry at any time without assigning any reason.
- (b) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event for which it is entered without assigning any reason.
- (c) Cancel any event or class without assigning any reason.
- (d) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place or to alter the conditions of entry of any event.

- (e) To remove any exhibit from the Show Grounds without assigning any reason.

The Society reserves the right to adjudicate upon any entry or upon any question of dispute or doubt, and to make any determination upon any matter, whether covered by the conditions of entry or not, to the intent that the Society shall have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the exhibits entered or offered for exhibition therein.

The determination of the Council of the Society or the Director upon all points shall be final and conclusive without the right of appeal.

Any animal or exhibit will not be eligible to compete in any class by reason only of the Society's acceptance of the entry and/or its inclusion in the Society's printed catalogue.

3. In case any live stock, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall be injured or maimed or suffering from any ailment requiring, in the opinion of the Society's Veterinary Surgeon or that of some qualified substitute, immediate veterinary aid, and the owner of such stock is not in attendance or fails to forthwith render such aid, the Director or his deputy may provide such aid, and the cost and expense thereby incurred shall in every case be borne by the owner of such stock. If such Veterinary Surgeon or such substitute is of the opinion that such live stock should be destroyed then the Veterinary Surgeon or his substitute may thereupon destroy such livestock either with or without the owner's consent. The owner of such stock and any persons having the control thereof shall indemnify the Council Director or his deputy and the Society's Veterinary Surgeon, or such substitute, against all damages, costs, expenses or liability incurred in connection with the same.

The acceptance of entry of stock is on the condition that the exhibitor agrees to submit such stock to inspection by the Council or its representative or Veterinary Surgeon.

The Society accepts no responsibility for the accuracy or otherwise of any matters in the catalogue concerning the names, age or breeding of any animal or any particulars whatsoever appertaining to any exhibit.

4. All competitors and exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend their exhibits at their own risk, and in case any exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers and members, property and effects from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

PRECAUTIONS RE MACHINERY.

5. Exhibitors hereby accept all responsibility for any damage or injury to any person or property which may be occasioned by or arise out of the use of any machinery, implement or apparatus of any nature used in connection with the stand.

AWARDING OF PRIZES.

6. It shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any person interfering with the Judge, and, if necessary, to order the removal of such offender from the yards. Persons in charge must on no account leave their respective exhibits, or address the Judge, unless authorised by the Stewards of the section in which they are competing. Competitors not ready at the appointed time of adjudication will be liable to disqualification.

7. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether, where the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

8. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number, by marking it as such, of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

9. The Judge shall award Reserve Champion Sashes in all Horse and Cattle Sections, and Rosettes in all Sheep and Pig Section in which Champion awards are made, and the animal second in the class (special classes excepted) to the Champion shall be allowed to compete for the Reserve Championship.

10. Any exhibitor or attendant refusing to attach the Prize Card to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded, and keep the same card on the exhibit during the hours of exhibition, or any exhibitor or attendant altering a Prize Card in any way, will, on proof thereof to the Council, forfeit all prizes awarded to such exhibit during the Show, and may be disqualified from again competing, and no exhibitor will be allowed to display any Ribbon or Prize Card on his exhibit, stall or stand, in addition to those issued by the Society for the year. One Prize Card only is issued for each prize won.

11. Stock exhibits wearing bridles, head stalls or other equipment with their names or the names of their owners displayed thereon or under the control of a person displaying such name about his person are liable to disqualification.

12. The Council may withhold any prize when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society. Exhibitors must, if required by the Council, make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

13. Any person insulting or interfering with a Judge during the Show will be subject to removal from the grounds; and the prizes, if any, awarded to such person may be forfeited.

14. Cheques for prizes will be forwarded to exhibitors as soon as practicable after the Show.

15. Any prize or prizes awarded at this Show, and left unclaimed for twelve months, may be forfeited and cancelled by the Finance Committee of the Society.

PROTESTS.

16. Protests against awards must be lodged with the Director, in writing, before 12 noon on the day after such awards are made, with a deposit of \$2, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found, on due consideration, to be unfounded or frivolous.

17. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Council, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.

18. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judge appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests, alleging infringement of the regulation, the decision of the Council shall be accepted as final and without appeal.

VETERINARY SERVICES

19. The Society has appointed a Veterinary Panel to provide a service to exhibitors.

20. Exhibitors may employ a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's Panel but in such instances must inform the Society's superintendent of the stock concerned.

21. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may refuse to attend an animal previously examined and treated by a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's Panel.

22. Unless otherwise specifically stated, only members of the Society's Veterinary Panel may give official Veterinary Certificates required by the Society.

23. A member of the Society's Veterinary Panel may at any time swab an exhibit upon the request of the Council or the Director of the Society.

REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS.

24. Details relating to the removal of exhibits are printed in the various sections of this publication. In the case of Live Stock, injured or ill, special permission to leave the Show Grounds may be given providing that the injury or illness is certified by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon. Exhibitors wishing to obtain a Veterinary Surgeon's Certificate to permit removal of exhibits from the Grounds must lodge a fee of \$2 with each application. Notwithstanding the foregoing, horses and cattle may be removed in accordance with Regulation 20.

25. Any exhibit of Horses or Cattle may be removed from the grounds at the close of the Exhibition each day on depositing with the Director an approved cheque for \$20 as a guarantee that the animal will be returned to the yards next morning before 9.30 a.m. In the event of the animal not being returned before the time specified, the deposit, together with all the prize money (if any) it has won, will be liable to forfeiture; but on the animal's return each day, the cheque will be refunded to the exhibitor.

This regulation does not include dogs. Particulars regarding the removal of dogs will be found at the head of the Dog Section in the Schedule.

CARE OF EXHIBITS.

26. The Society accepts no responsibility for the care of exhibits and exhibitors and competitors enter at their own risk.

REGULATIONS
GOVERNING SALES BY
AUCTION

Sales of exhibits (for the carrying out of which the Society will offer every facility) will be held on the Show Grounds, and the Society reserves to itself the right to decide time and order of sales in all sections. All animals intended for sale must be duly entered and exhibited at the Show.

A commission of 1 per cent. shall be paid to the Society in respect of all stock sold on the Show Grounds.

Whilst on the Show Ground the animal shall at all times be subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society and shall not be removed without the Society's consent.

The animal shall be at the exclusive risk of the Purchaser from the fall of the hammer and pro forma delivery only shall be deemed to have been given to the Purchaser.

Whilst required by the Society to remain on the Show Ground the animal shall be in the custody and care of the Vendor who however shall be deemed to hold as bailee only.

The Vendor may parade the animal as required by the Rules and Regulations or for public or private exhibition or to be photographed but he shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the animal by reason of any act (negligent or otherwise) on the part of any attendant whether in the employ of the Vendor or of the Society or otherwise.

The Vendor shall bear the cost of the feeding and normal tending of the animal whilst in his custody and shall in all respects comply with the Society's requirements.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entries will be received in the Horse Section of the Royal Agricultural Society's Show subject to the rules and conditions hereinafter set out and also those appearing at the head of each section and class.

2. The Council of the Society or the Director shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- (i) Reject or cancel any entry at any time.
- (ii) Prohibit the participation by any person or exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered.
- (iii) Cancel any event or class.
- (iv) Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place.
- (v) Alter the conditions of any event.
- (vi) Remove any exhibit from the Show Grounds.

3. The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

4. The exhibitor enters and competes entirely at his or her own risk. The Society shall not be responsible for any damage or injury suffered by any exhibit or by the exhibitor or any person acting on his behalf.

5. The exhibitor shall at all times comply with the directions or requests of the Council of the Society or The Director. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry of the horse the exhibitor the conditions of event the conduct of the exhibitor the conducting of the event the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

6. The Council of the Society and the Director reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not and the decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the exhibits and exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Council of the Society or the Director.

7. An exhibit or exhibitor shall not be eligible to compete in any class by reason of the Society's acceptance of the entry and/or the inclusion of the exhibit or exhibitor in the Society's catalogue or by reason of an Exhibit Entry Ticket or number or other document having been printed allotted or issued by the Society.

8. Unless otherwise stated all exhibits in Sections must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry or be held by him under written lease in existence at the time of entry and the Council of the Society or the Director shall have the power

to recognise or reject such lease as it deems fit. The owner or lessee hereby indemnifies the Society against all claims from any cause made against the Society in respect of such animal at the instance of any other person.

9. An exhibit sold after the date of entry and before the time of judging shall not be entitled to compete unless with the approval of the Council of the Society or the Director.

10. No entry can be changed by the exhibitor after entries close.

11. All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society unless otherwise permitted by the Director.

12. Entries in the Horse Section of the Show with the exception of Trotting events must be made at the Society's office at the Administration Building at the Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale 3032, on or before 4.30 p.m. on 17th June, or be delivered by post to the said office on or before the same time viz.: the 17th June, at 4.30 p.m.

13. The appropriate entry fee as set out in the Schedule of Prizes shall be forwarded with each entry.

14. Entries in Sections 11 and 13 shall be accompanied with a fee of 10 cents per exhibit as a contribution towards the Overseas Fund of The Equestrian Federation of Australia.

15. All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor or his authorised agent or in the appropriate case by the competitor.

16. No exhibit in Sections 1 to 12 inclusive may be entered in more than one Ordinary Class unless otherwise stated at the head of the Section. Sweepstakes special classes or championships do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the Schedule Special Classes are designated with a star (*). Should any exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall compete in the first class in which its name appears in the Society's Catalogue unless the Director otherwise directs.

ARRIVAL OF EXHIBITS

17. Exhibits shall be placed where directed by the Director and where a stall or box is allotted the exhibit shall be in occupation of such stall on or before 9 a.m. on Thursday, 17th September, unless otherwise specified. The upper door of the horse boxes outside pavilions shall remain open during the days and hours of the Show.

18. Exhibits shall not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, the 26th September.

STANDARD OF EXHIBITS

19. All male animals competing in Sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 shall be entire. Female animals competing in Sections 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 shall not be speyed. In this regard the decision of a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Society shall be final.

20. Exhibits which in the opinion of the Director are not in reasonable Show condition or standard shall not compete in the classes entered for and may at the direction of the Director be removed from the Show Grounds without refund of entry fee.

21. (a) Stallions three years of age and over owned in Victoria must be registered as required by the Horse Breeding Act 1928.
- (b) Stallions three years of age and over exhibited from States other than Victoria need not be registered under the said Act but must be examined and passed by a Victorian Government Veterinary Officer in respect of both soundness and type. Clydesdales carrying a current certificate of soundness issued by the appropriate authority in South Australia will be accepted for competition on production of such certificate.
- (c) All stallions and mares 3 years of age and over entered in Sections 1 to 9 inclusive (except Farm and Lorry Horses in Section 2) must be examined by a Government Veterinary Officer and if passed have their neck numbers stamped "Pass to Ring" before entering the judging ring. There shall be no appeal against the Veterinary Officer's decision. The examination by the Veterinary Surgeons will be made on the Show Grounds commencing at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 16th September.

ACCOMMODATION AND PERFORMANCES

22. Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any Sections may be made by the Society.

23. Entries for horses ponies or galloways (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted) must be accompanied by a performance form. A performance form for the purpose of conveying the information specified hereunder is to be completed for each horse, galloway or pony (Clydesdales and Farm and Lorry Horses excepted). This form is to be forwarded with the entry form and fees and must reach the Director not later than 4.30 p.m. on 17th June, 1970. The closing date of entry shall not be extended. Information to be furnished on the performance form is:

- (a) Name of horse or pony (a separate form is to be completed for each exhibit);
- (b) Age of horse or pony (state day, month and year of foaling, if known);
- (c) Prizes gained by the horse or pony nominated, viz.: Name of Show; Date of Show; Prizes — first, second or third, etc. (if a horse or pony was exhibited without gaining a prize, such is to be stated);
- (d) Name of exhibitor;
- (e) Remarks (Briefly to be stated the nature of the class in which the exhibit was entered and/or gained prizes. The approximate number of exhibits in such class to be given).

AGE OF EXHIBITS

24. The breeding year commences on the 1st August in each year. The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision shall be final in regard to age.

HEIGHT OF EXHIBITS

25. Where height is stipulated the exhibit must be measured and an exhibit over or under the specified measurement shall be transferred to its appropriate class. The Society's duly appointed measurer will be in attendance on the Show Grounds on Tuesday, 15th and Wednesday, 16th, commencing at 10 a.m. on Thursday, 17th September, at 8 a.m. and on each remaining day of the Show from 9.30 a.m. to 10 a.m. The measurer shall write the measurement of each exhibit he measures on the neck number of such exhibit.

26. When measuring an exhibit an allowance of half an inch for shoes may be made by the measurer. Should an exhibit be measured with its shoes on the exhibitor may if he so desires have the horse re-measured without shoes. The measurer may in his discretion request the removal of shoes from any exhibit and re-measure the horse without shoes.

27. Should the Society have appointed more than one measurer then an exhibit having been measured and its height written on the neck number by one of such measurers shall not be submitted for measurement or re-measurement to one of the other measurers.

28. Except as provided in the next rule the decision of the measurer shall be final.

29. The judge of a class may request any exhibit to be re-measured. In such case the exhibit shall be re-measured by the Steward in charge of the class and the height then decided upon by the Steward shall be final.

ENTRY TICKETS TO SHOW

30. An entry ticket will be issued by the Society for each exhibit unless the Director otherwise determines. The entry ticket will state thereon the number of the exhibit and the exhibit number shall correspond with the box allotted to the exhibit where practicable. The exhibit ticket must be produced whenever required by the Society or the Director.

NECK NUMBERS AND COMPETITORS' NUMBERS

31. Numbers corresponding to the number in the Catalogue must be worn by each exhibit or competitor when appearing before the judge. Neck numbers for horses must be collected from the office of one of the horse Superintendents. Competitors' numbers for Riding Competitions Jumping Contests and Novelty Events must be collected from the office of the Horse Superintendent Eastern Area.

HOURS OF OPENING OF PAVILIONS AND CLEANING OUT

32. With the exception of Saturdays, Sunday and Thursday (Show Day) the Horse Pavilion will remain open to the public until 7 p.m. On Saturdays and Show Day they will remain open until 9 p.m., but will close between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. On Sunday, the Horse Pavilion will open at 10.30 a.m. and close at 6.00 p.m. Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Director:

- (i) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- (ii) Clean out their stalls or boxes before 8 a.m. each day.

ABSENCE OF EXHIBIT

33. (a) Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the owner

is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:

- (i) The animal has died.
- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.
- (v) After arrival at the Show Grounds a horse may be scratched from competing in an event if it has become unfit to compete.

TESTS AND SWABBING

34. The Society or the Director may make or cause to be made any test of any exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such exhibit and may take possession of any such exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary.

"DRUG" includes all substances capable of affecting the central or peripheral nervous systems, the cardio-vascular or respiratory system, all hormones, vitamins administered other than orally, analgesics, anti-inflammatory drugs and coagulants.

Any exhibit which has been brought to the Show Grounds and is found by the Society or the Director to have had administered to it any drug as defined above may be disqualified for any event or class for which it has competed at the Show.

When any horse which is on the Show Grounds for the purpose of taking part in a class or event at the Show is found to have had administered to it a drug as defined above the owner and any other person who was in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalized by the Society.

Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the conduct speed stamina or courage of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any electric or galvanic apparatus or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalized by the Society.

CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS

35. The Council may withhold any prizes when fraudulent or erroneous statements have been made regarding an exhibit, or when exhibits have been tampered with or improperly dealt with, and may also withhold all prizes awarded to exhibitors who have been guilty of false statements in relation to any of their exhibits; and exhibitors guilty of false entries or statements, or found guilty of tampering with or improperly dealing with their exhibits, may be debarred from again exhibiting, and if Members, shall be liable to expulsion from the Society.

Exhibitors must, if required by the Council or Director make a statutory declaration regarding their entries.

Any person who in the opinion of the Council of the Society or the Director is or has been behaving in an improper manner may be removed from the Show Grounds and any prizes won by such person or an exhibit owned by or under the control of such person may be forfeited at the discretion of the Society or the Director.

MARSHALLING AND JUDGING

36. Exhibits and/or exhibitors entered in events judged on the arena other than the first day of the Show shall be present in the Marshalling Yard adjacent to the western entrance gate to the arena (next to the Result Board) a least 5 minutes prior to the time specified in the Time Table for the event to take place, and be ready to move to judging ring under direction of the Marshal. The exhibits and/or exhibitors not so presented shall not be permitted to enter the arena or take part in the event.

Riders in jumping events shall be present in the Marshalling Yard and ready to walk the course 20 minutes prior to the time stated in the Time Table for the event to commence.

37. Exhibits shall be ineligible for judging if fitted with bearing reins. No spurs other than dummy spurs not exceeding $\frac{3}{4}$ " in length may be used.

38. The Society or the Director may alter the judge for any particular event at any time it or he deems fit.

39. No person shall in any way consult or interfere with or attempt to interfere with the judge or endeavour to interfere with his freedom of choice or judgement.

Persons in charge of exhibits must not leave their exhibits unattended and such persons or exhibitors shall not address the judge unless authorized by the Steward in Charge of the class or the Judge himself.

40. The Judge may award a second or third prize, instead of a first, or may withhold a prize altogether, where he considers the exhibits are not of sufficient merit.

41. The Judge is requested to make a reserve number, by marking it as such, of the exhibit next in merit beyond those to which the prizes are awarded in every class where the number of the entries exceeds the number of prizes offered, if, in his opinion, the exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize; he is also requested to give commendations when deserved.

42. No exhibit or person in charge thereof shall be equipped with, wear or display anything which indicates the ownership of the exhibit.

43. All exhibitors and competitors shall accept the decision of the Judge as final as to the merits of the exhibit or competitor and no appeal shall be allowed therefrom to any court of law or other body on the question of merit of the exhibit.

44. All prize cards awarded at the Show shall be exhibited in the stall or box for the duration of the Show.

DRESSAGE CONTESTS

45. Competitors in Dressage must abide by the order of the draw and present themselves before the Judge or his steward at the time nominated. Failure to abide by this regulation will entail disqualification.

PROTESTS

46. An exhibitor or competitor may protest against an award won by an exhibit or competitor in the same class alleging infringement of the rules or ineligibility.

47. Such protest shall be addressed to the Director and be lodged at his office at the 1st Floor, Administrative Building, cnr. DeGraves Street and Plummer Avenue, Show Grounds, before 12 noon the day after the award in question has been made. Such protest shall be accompanied with a deposit of \$5.00 which may be forfeited to the Society if the protest be found to be unfounded or frivolous.

48. Should any exhibit which has been awarded a prize be disqualified the next in order of award does not necessarily become entitled to the prize.

49. The protest shall be determined by either the Council of the Society or the Director.

VETERINARY SERVICES

(a) The Society will appoint a Panel of Veterinary Surgeons to provide a service to exhibitors.

(b) Should a horse become ill or suffer an injury then one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons may attend to and treat such animal in the absence of any authority from the owner and the Society or its Veterinary Surgeon shall not be liable in any way for any loss arising out of such treatment.

50. Exhibitors may employ a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's panel but in such instances must inform the Society's Horse Superintendent of the stock concerned.

51. The Society's Veterinary Surgeons may refuse to attend an animal previously examined and treated by a Veterinary Surgeon who is not a member of the Society's Panel.

52. Unless otherwise specifically stated, only members of the Society's Veterinary Panel may give Veterinary Certificates required by the Society.

53. If in the opinion of one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons an animal on the Show Grounds should be destroyed or removed from the Show Grounds the Society or the Director shall be entitled to have the animal destroyed and/or removed from the Show Grounds or shall be entitled to require the owner or his deputy at the Show Grounds to forthwith remove the animal from the Show Grounds. All costs incurred by the Society in connection with such animal shall be paid by the owner to the Society.

PARADES

54. Each exhibit is required to take part in Parades on the Arena at the times set out in the printed programme.

55. Each exhibit shall wear its exhibit (neck) number and riders of horses shall wear formal or hacking attire. No ribbons may be worn on exhibits or competitors other than those won during the 1970 Show.

SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

56. Riders of horses in Grand Parades or any classes (other than jumping and novelty events) must wear formal or hacking attire.

FEED LOCKERS

57. Several feed stalls are available for Exhibitors. Charge \$7.50 during the currency of the Show. Where feed sheds are shared, the exhibitors concerned shall be required to pay the appropriate share of the charge. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the passageways of the Horse Pavilions.

No bedding other than straw or hay, may be used in any boxes or stalls. For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will be situated on the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

58. Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be

removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11.15 p.m. on Saturday, 26th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds. The Society or the Director shall have the right to remove any vehicle at any time from the Show Grounds.

EXERCISING HORSES

59. Unless otherwise determined, the exercising of all horses, will be allowed on the trotting track only, between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. on any day of the Show.

On the Sunday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday immediately preceding the commencement of the Show, ridden and driven exhibits will be allowed to exercise on the trotting track from 9 a.m. until 12 noon in accordance with the following schedule.

Sunday —

Ridden exhibits 9.00 a.m.-10.30 a.m.

Driven exhibits 10.30 a.m.-12 noon

Monday —

Driven exhibits 9.00 a.m.-10.30 a.m.

Ridden exhibits 10.30 a.m.-12 noon

Tuesday —

Ridden exhibits 9.00 a.m.-10.30 a.m.

Driven exhibits 10.30 a.m.-12 noon

Wednesday —

Driven exhibits 9.00 a.m.-10.30 a.m.

Ridden exhibits 10.30 a.m.-12 noon

Horses may only be exercised in the arena at the above times and on the exercise areas provided. They shall not exercise on any other part of the Show Grounds.

FIRE REGULATIONS

60. The use of primus or similar stoves or any heating or lighting appliance of a like nature or any naked light is strictly prohibited in or near any horse stall or pavilion.

The alteration of or interference with any electrical wiring switch or plug is strictly forbidden.

CONTROL OF SHOW

61. Should the Council or the Director be of the opinion that any rule or regulation whether set out in these rules or at the heading of a section or class has been broken or not observed or performed then the exhibit or exhibitor may be disqualified or otherwise penalized at the discretion of the Council of the Society or the Director.

The whole of the Show the events thereat the exhibits and exhibitors and their agents shall be under the complete control of and subject to the decisions and directions of the Council of the Society and/or the Director. Any decision or direction made by either shall be final and binding and no exhibitor shall have any right or cause of action against the Society or the Members of the Council or the Director or any right to approach or seek relief from any Court because of any decision made by either the Council or the Director.

DEFINITION

62. "Director" means and includes the person holding the office of Director or the Society and includes a Deputy appointed by him.

"Exhibitor" includes competitor and/or rider wherever the contest permits.

"Society" includes the Council of the Society.

Singular words include plural.
