The age standards for production to be recognised as a minimum are those of the Victorian Government Herd Test as follow:—

A SPECIAL PRIZE of \$21, donated by the **VICTORIAN DAIRYFARMERS' ASSOCIATION**, 576 St. Kilda Rd., Melbourne, will be awarded to the cow or heifer of the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners in the specified Type and Utility classes (excluding the 3,000 lb. b./f. production class) gaining the highest combined points for butter fat production and type.

In Type and Utility Classes where 10 or more animals actually compete, the six highest pointed animals shall be eligible to compete for the prize.

1 point will be allotted for every 10 lbs. of butter fat over 350 lbs. (with allowance for age) produced under Government Herd Test, the Victorian Herd Improvement Association or any other recognised Testing organisation during a lactation period of 300 days that followed the calving on, between or including 1st September, 1968, and 31st August, 1969.

The cows eligible to compete for this prize shall be brought together at 9.30 a.m. on Friday, 18th September in the Jersey judging ring for the purpose of being allotted points on type, with a maximum of 100.

Both production and type points shall then be added to determine the winner.

CLASS

339. *BULL, any age.—Competition restricted to animals entered in the ordinary classes. A bull will be eligible for entry in this class if it has not been awarded first prize in the class at a previous Royal Melbourne Show and if from a registered female which has averaged not less than 10 lbs. of butter fat per week in an official or semi-official test computed on a basis of not less than 273 days after assessing her production by adding allowances in accordance with the Victorian Government Herd Testing Scheme. Judging will be on points: 50 being allowed for type, and 50 for test pedigree. In this latter section, 25 points will be allowed for the butter fat record yield of the bull's dam, and 25 points for the record yield of the bull's sire's dam, in the proportion of two points for each 1 lb. of butter fat over 10 lbs. per week averaged by a cow after assessing her production by adding allowances in accordance with the Victorian Government Official Herd Testing Scheme. Records of the dam and sire's dam must be lodged with the entry and only tests completed on or before 30th June, 1969, will be taken into consideration.—Prizes: \$6, \$4, \$2. CHAMPION DAIRY COW

(To be judged on type.)

A trophy order valued at \$50 together with a cash prize of \$50, both presented by the **Dairying and Wholemilk Sections of the Victorian Farmer's Union** for the **Champion Dairy Cow of the Australian Illawarra Shorthorn, Ayrshire, Dairy Shorthorn, Friesian, Guernsey, Jersey, and Red Poll breeds**.

The successful exhibitor will also receive the Society's Championship Sash.

CONDITIONS FOR JUDGING

Each Judge of the abovementioned breeds will be required to nominate two cows, not necessarily the Champion or Reserve Champion, to compete for the trophy and prize.

In addition, each Judge will be required to nominate a third cow purely as a reserve.

Competition is restricted to cows exhibited in the "In Milk" Classes.

Should any breed fail to provide the requisite two cows, it cannot take part in the competition. This, then precludes the Judge of that breed from adjudicating to determine the award.

With the exception of Dairy Shorthorns, all cows nominated by the judges must be stripped out in the presence of the Stewards at 5 p.m. on the evening before judging.

The stripping out of the Dairy Shorthorn nominations shall take place not later than 5.30 p.m.

Judges shall be required to refrain from conferring on the exhibits before or during judging.

All judges of the breeds named will take part in the judging and will allot 3 points for first, 2 for second and 1 for third according to their placings of individual animals.

If considered to be worthy, both nominations of any one breed can be placed first, second or third.

A Steward appointed by the Society will assess the points and the cow gaining the greatest number of points, shall be the winner.

In the event of a tie, an independent referee appointed by the Society shall then decide the winner.

At the conclusion of judging, each Judge's placings will be announced.

Section 34 — Government Herd Test Prizes

At the request of the Minister of Agriculture the Awards for Champion and Reserve Champion Herd Test Herd and Herd Test Cow have been suspended until the 1969/1970 Season.

TYPE AND UTILITY CLASSES

Prizes are presented by the Government of Victoria.

SPECIAL TYPE AND UTILITY CLASSES are provided in each Dual Purpose and Dairy Breed Section. They will be judged according to the following conditions:—

As a basis of qualification cows competing in these classes must have produced the following amounts of butter fat:—

2 year olds	300 lbs.
3 "	"	350 "
4 "	"	400 "
Mature cows	450 "

The specified quantities of butter fat must have been produced under Government Herd Test, the Victorian Herd Improvement Association, or any other recognised testing organisation during a lactation period of 300 days that followed the calving on, between or including 1st September, 1968, and 31st August, 1969.

In the 3,000 lbs. butter fat production class, it is not necessary for cows to have gained a certificate during the aforementioned period.

In all cases where the tests are other than those of the Victorian Government Herd Test or Accreditation Schemes, certificates issued by the Department or organisation which conducted the tests, must accompany the entry forms, except that in the instance of the V.H.I.A. when unit number, herd number and cow number are to be stated.

Judging will be on a type basis only.

No points will be allotted either for production or type.

Competition is restricted to animals entered in the ordinary Classes.

SHEEP

CONDITIONS OF EXHIBITION, ETC.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society and must be in the hands of the Director, at the office of the Society, before 4.30 p.m., Wednesday, 22nd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11.00 p.m. on Thursday, 24th September.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

No exhibit in the pair classes can compete in single classes or vice versa except class 112.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

Every animal entered must be exhibited, unless a certificate signed by the owner is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:—

- (i) The animal has died.
- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.

Failure to comply with this rule renders the owner or entrant liable to a fine of not more than \$10 for every animal not exhibited, and in addition the Council may debar the owner or exhibitor from taking part in any further exhibition conducted by the Society.

Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number, and no particulars other than the breeder's name and date of shearing will be published in the Show Catalogue.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on or in any stall or building.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as the owner from any one holding.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each Section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

ENTRY TICKETS

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its pen, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Sheep Superintendent at his office at the Show Grounds after 10 a.m. on Wednesday, 16th September, 1970.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS

Exhibit numbers for attachment to each exhibit and numbers to be worn by handlers whilst judging is in progress must be collected by exhibitors from the Sheep Superintendent's office.

EWES IN LAMB

A ewe entered as "with a lamb of her own breed at foot" may be transferred to the Class provided for ewe of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, or vice versa.

PERIOD OF EXHIBITION

Sheep in Sections 35 to 50 inclusive must be penned before 8.00 a.m. on Saturday, 19th September and may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11.00 p.m. on Thursday, 24th September.

Sheep Pavilions will be open to the public from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. daily from 19th September to 24th September and between 6.00 p.m. and 8.00 p.m. on Saturday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday and between 1.30 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. on Sunday, 20th.

AGE OF EXHIBITS

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

OVINE BRUCELLOSIS TEST

Exhibitors of rams and ram lambs over the age of 4 months on 1st September are required to lodge with the Society prior to the Show (preferably at time of entry) a certificate from a registered Veterinary Surgeon certifying:

- (a) That rams and ram lambs have given a negative result to the complement fixation blood tests for Ovine Brucellosis, carried out within the 90 days preceding 1st September, 1970.
- (b) That rams and ram lambs have been manually examined at the time of blood sampling and found free of any palpable testicular abnormality at this time.

The eartag or tattoo numbers of rams and ram lambs tested and examined must be included in the certificate.

SHEEP

Owners should particularly note:—

- (1) That blood sampling should be carried out early in the prescribed period to avoid congestion and delay in the testing laboratory at the end of the period.
- (2) That a sufficient number of rams and ram lambs should be tested to ensure that all possible exhibits finally forwarded to the Show are included in this number.

If exhibitors produce evidence that their flocks have been accredited free of Ovine Brucellosis a veterinary certificate will not be required.

PHYSICAL SOUNDNESS AND DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

Exhibitors must sign a statutory declaration to the effect that no sheep exhibited by them are affected by foot-rot, or show any signs or symptoms of the disease at time of exhibition.

All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire and physically sound by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

Exhibitors in the stock sections shall, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

The owner or exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

RUGGING

Exhibits must not be rugged after judging day during the hours the Show is open to the public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of one dollar for every infringement of this regulation.

PREPARATION OF SHEEP AND CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

Exhibitors or their employees are not permitted to prepare (i.e. trim etc.) exhibits in any passageway or in any judging area in the Pavilion after 8 a.m. on any judging day.

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of one dollar.

Note:—No manure, straw or other refuse shall be deposited in lane ways or judging areas after 7 p.m. on Sunday, 20th September, until judging has been completed.

REGISTRATION

All sheep entered in Sections 35 to 50 inclusive must be recorded in the registered flock of the exhibitor.

For particulars of registration in the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia, apply to the Secretary, Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep, Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Corriedale Flock Book, apply to the Secretary of the Australian Corriedale Association, Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032.

For particulars of registration of Perendale Sheep, apply to Mr. Alan Knowles, Hon. Sec. Australian Members of Perendale Sheep Society of New Zealand, Cardinia, V., 3978.

INSPECTION OF EXHIBITS (TATTOOS, ETC.)

Prior to judging, Inspectors will examine all exhibits of registered British Breeds, Poll Dorsets, Corriedales and South-Suffolks and discard all not up to standard and those not shorn in accordance with the regulations.

The inspection will commence at 9.00 a.m. on Sunday, 20th September.

Sheep not in their allotted pens at the time of the official inspection may be disqualified.

All British Breeds of Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Society of Breeders of British Sheep in accordance with the Rules of that Society.

All Poll Dorset Sheep exhibited must be tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Poll Dorset Association in accordance with the rules of that Association.

All Corriedale Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian Corriedale Association in accordance with the Rules of that Association.

All South-Suffolk Sheep exhibited (except imported sheep, which must be tattooed in accordance with the regulations of the recognised Flock Book of the country of origin) must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeder's registered flock number and the trade mark of the Australian South-Suffolk Sheep Society in accordance with the Rules of that Society.

All Perendale sheep exhibited must be visibly and legibly tattooed with their breeders' registered flock number of the Perendale Sheep Society.

Any found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed will be disqualified.

LINCOLNS

Disqualified sheep may not be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Exhibitors of disqualified sheep may remove them from the Show Grounds or leave them in their pens. If sheep are left in the pens a notice carrying the words, "Rejected by Inspectors and not permitted to be offered for sale," must be erected over them.

SHORN AND UNSHORN SHEEP

All sheep in the British Breeds, Poll Dorset and South-Suffolk Classes (except shorn sheep) over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn between 1st August 1969 and 31st January, 1970. Date of shearing to be given on entry form. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1st July, 1969.

Exhibits of shorn sheep must be closely and evenly shorn on or before 1st September, 1970. No Longwool sheep (except Romney Marsh) entered in a shorn class may have more than one and a half inches of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection. No Romney Marsh entered in a shorn class may have more than one inch of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection, and no shortwool sheep may have more than three-quarters of an inch of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.

No shorn sheep will be permitted to be trimmed after 9.00 a.m. on Sunday, 20th September.

Sheep not shorn in accordance with the above regulations will be disqualified.

Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the Classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the grounds.

FEED SHEDS, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Sheep Sections. On application to the Director, sheds will be reserved. Charge: \$3.75 during currency of Show. Several large feed sheds are also available, and may be reserved on payment of \$7.50 each.

Exhibitors must provide their own locks for feed lockers.

No bedding other than straw or hay (except grass hay) may be used in any pens.

For the convenience of exhibitors, fodder merchants will attend the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9.00 a.m. each day during the Show.

JUDGING

Judging of all Registered Sheep will commence at 8.30 a.m. on Monday, 21st September.

Judges may, if they so desire, commence the judging on the sheep under 1½ years old.

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge when required to do so by the Steward of the Section shall be liable to a fine of \$6.

PARADE OF CHAMPIONS

A Parade of the Champion Rams and Ewes of all breeds will be held during the Show on a date to be fixed. Attendants will be required to wear white dust coats which will be provided by the Society.

STRAWING OF PENS

The Society will arrange for the strawing of all pens prior to the Show. Charges covering this service must be forwarded with entry fees. The charge for each pen will be 50 cents.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately and will not be re-admitted until after 11.00 p.m. on Thursday, 24th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

SHEEP SALES

Sheep not paraded before the Judge shall not be eligible for sale. Such regulation not to apply where one of a pair is rejected by the Inspectors.

No sheep shall be sold whilst at the Show Grounds, either by public auction or private treaty for less than \$100 for rams and \$40 for ewes.

Exhibitors who sell sheep during the period of the Show must make arrangements for the Exhibit Entry Tickets to be handed to the purchaser or his agents to enable the sheep to be moved from the Pavilion at the conclusion of the exhibition.

All entries must be accompanied by the full entry fee.

No fleece will be accepted unless full freight has been prepaid.

Judges must be satisfied that all fleeces are exhibited in their correct classes and unskirted or insufficiently skirted fleeces will be correctly skirted under direction of the Chief Steward or Supervisor in charge.

Fleeces which, in the opinion of the Judges, are overgrown will be judged accordingly.

All fleeces are to be shorn from sheep that are the bona fide property of the exhibitors.

No championship award need be made if, in the opinion of the Chief Judge, the standard does not warrant a championship being awarded.

The Society reserves the right to draw a $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. sample from each fleece and retain it for future reference and to display an amount of wool necessary to form a comprehensive display.



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entries will be accepted on the understanding that should they be in excess of the accommodation, the number of exhibits will be reduced accordingly.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society at the time of entry.

All goats entered in this Section must be registered in a herd book recognised by the Society or recorded in the appendix sections.

For particulars of registration in the Goat Herd Book of Australia, apply to the Secretary, The Goat Breeders' Society of Australia, Box 4317, G.P.O., Sydney, N.S.W.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until 11 p.m. on Thursday, 24th September.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for the goat section must be in the hands of the Director, at his office, Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, on or before the time stated at head of this section.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Sweepstakes, special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are indicated by a star (*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class, such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate, signed by the owner, is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:—

(i) The animal has died.

(ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.

(iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.

(iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.

Failure to comply with this rule renders the owner or entrant liable to a fine of not more than \$10 for every animal not exhibited, and in addition the Council may debar the owner or exhibitor from taking part in any further exhibition conducted by the Society.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Director or his deputy, and (except in accordance with Regulation 18) must not be removed from their allotted places during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Director being first obtained.

If, in the opinion of the Director, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

The General Regulations and Regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

"IN MILK" AND "DRY" CLASSES AND SUCKLED KIDS

Doe entered as "in milk" can be transferred to a "dry" or un-kidded class, whichever is applicable, if she has not kidded prior to judging day, or vice versa.

Does in milk must be at the Grounds on Wednesday, 16th September. They will be fully milked out and stripped dry between 8 p.m. and 9 p.m. in the presence of the Stewards or whom they may appoint. (See Classes 16 and 17 for 24-hour milk production record.) They will be judged first on Thursday morning. The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out.

Kids not entered for competition will not be permitted in the Show Grounds unless actually being suckled by their mothers, which must be entered for competition.

Judges have the right to order any Doe competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

PAVILIONS OPEN TO PUBLIC

The Goat Pavilion will be open to the public from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. daily from 18th-24th September, and between 6.00 p.m. and 8.00 p.m. during the evenings of Saturday 19th, Tuesday 22nd, Wednesday 23rd, Thursday 24th September, and from 1.30 p.m. to 6 p.m., Sunday, 20th September.

JUDGING AND PARADES

Judging of all Dairy Goats will commence at 9.00 a.m., Thursday, 17th September.

The judging of Angora Goats will commence at 9.00 a.m., Thursday, 17th September.

The judging of exhibits in the Angora Fleece Competition will be carried out on Thursday, 17th September.

GOATS

Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of \$10.

Attendants leading goats in the judging ring or on parade must wear uniform grey coats.

Good quality coats can be supplied by the Society at \$5 each on return of which at the conclusion of the Show a rebate of \$4 will be made providing that the coats are in good condition.

Prize-winning goats only will be permitted to take part in parades. All prize-winning dairy goats must be taken out on parade, in accordance with the printed programme. Prize-winning Angoras may also be paraded provided they can be suitably led. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of one dollar in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. Attendants leading goats in the judging ring and during parades must wear the exhibit number of the goat. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

AGE OF EXHIBITS

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

INSPECTION OF STOCK

All exhibits will be inspected to ascertain that they are of a satisfactory standard and condition.

Inspectors appointed by the Goat Breeders' Society of Australia (Victorian Branch) will examine stock entered for exhibition to ensure that all are tattooed in accordance with the Herd Book Regulations. Any found not correctly or not legibly tattooed may be disqualified.

Exhibitors in the Stock Sections shall also, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits, in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or Stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such Classes.

RUGGING

Exhibits must not be rugged during the hours the Show is open to the public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of one dollar for every infringement of this regulation.

CLEANLINESS OF PENS

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m.

on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of one dollar.

NOTICES

Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls stating that an animal is for private sale; such cards not to exceed 12 in. x 10 in.

No advertisement or notice (except by permission of the Council) is permitted on any stall or building.

FEED SHEDS, BEDDING AND FODDER ARRANGEMENTS

In all Sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, \$7.50 during the currency of the Show.

No bedding other than straw or hay may be used in any box or stall.

For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will visit the Show Grounds to accept orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11 p.m. on Thursday, 24th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

ENTRY TICKETS

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Superintendent at his office on the Show Grounds.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS

Handlers of exhibits during judging are required to wear a number corresponding to the catalogue number of the exhibit. These numbers must be collected by the exhibitors from the Superintendent, whose office is situated in the Sheep Pavilion.

EXHIBITS DUE AT SHOW GROUNDS

Goats other than Does entered in Classes 16 and 17 are required to be in their correct pens before 2 p.m. on Wednesday, 16th September.

They will be on exhibition until Thursday, 24th September.

Exhibitors are reminded that the Society's General Regulations apply to all Sections of the Show and that the Special Regulations hereunder apply to this section only and are merely supplementary to the General Regulations.

Exhibitors must attach a tag showing name and address and class number to each fleece and also to the wrapping used.

If exhibits are sent by rail, address to the Director (Goat Section), Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, Spencer Street Railway Station, Melbourne, Vic.

All exhibitors are requested to include precise instructions as to the desired method of disposal at the conclusion of the Show. The Society will re-pack and re-address or deliver exhibits to any nominated authorised Wool Broker in Melbourne or Geelong if so instructed, or re-address to place of origin. In this regard no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage in transit.

No fleece will be accepted unless full freight has been prepaid.

All fleeces must be skirted to the satisfaction of the Judge.

To determine the age of the fleece, exhibitors are requested to forward the following information to reach this office before Monday, 7th September, 1970:

- (a) Date exhibit was shorn from animal.
 (b) Previous shearing date of the above animal.

All fleeces are to be shorn from Angora goats that are the bona fide property of the exhibitors.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND EXHIBITION

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Show Grounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 26th September. Pigs entered in Sections 56 to 60 must be penned not later than 12 noon on Wednesday, 16th September.

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (*).

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for the Pig Sections must be in the hands of the Director, at the office of the Society, Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, before 4.30 p.m., Wednesday, 22nd July. Entry fee must accompany each entry.

The Australian Pig Society has requested that each exhibitor be required to pay 25 cents per entry towards the cost of the Pig Society's new Club Building. The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has agreed to this request and it is therefore a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall pay a fee of 25 cents per entry. This amount to be sent to the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria with the entry.

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate, signed by the owner, is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:—

- (i) The animal has died.
- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.

Failure to comply with this rule renders the owner or entrant liable to a fine of not more than \$10 for every animal not exhibited, and in addition the Council may debar the owner or exhibitor from taking part in any further exhibition conducted by the Society.

Unless authorised by the Society no live stock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

All sows 9 months old or over must be in pig or have produced a recorded litter within 9 months prior to 15th September, 1970.

All boars over 12 months old must have had their tusks cut back to gum level two weeks prior to the Show, and the Superintendent is empowered to remove from the Show Grounds any boar whose tusks have not been cut.

Any boar, entered in the breeding classes, not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeons may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds.

No pig shall be transferred from its numbered pen without the sanction of the Superintendent.

All pigs entered in the stud classes will be paint branded with exhibit numbers.

Exhibitors in the Stud Sections must be financial members of the Australian Pig Society. All pigs entered for exhibition, except in the Carcase Competitions, must be from herds accredited as Brucellosis-free by the Department of Agriculture.

The General Regulations and regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

PAVILIONS — HOURS OPEN TO PUBLIC

With the exception of both Saturdays and Thursday (Show Day) the Pavilion will be open to the public from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. On the both Saturdays and Show Day the Pavilion will be open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., but will close between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m.

On Sunday, 20th September, the Pavilion will be open to the public from 1.30 p.m. to 6 p.m.

JUDGING

Judging of stud classes will commence at 9 a.m. on Thursday, 17th September.

ENTRY TICKETS

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its pen, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the pen be not occupied by such exhibit by 12 noon on Wednesday, 16th September, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the yards. Attendants' passes will be issued by the Superintendent at his office on the Show Grounds.

INSPECTION OF STOCK

All exhibits will be inspected to ascertain that they are of a satisfactory standard and condition.

Inspectors appointed by the Australian Pig Society (Victorian Branch) will examine stock entered for exhibition to ensure that all are tattooed or ear notched in accordance with the Herd Book Regulations. Any found not correctly or not legibly tattooed or ear notched may be disqualified.

Exhibitors in the Stock Sections shall also, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits, in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

PIGS

DISAPPROVED EXHIBITS

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show.

CLEANLINESS OF STALLS

Exhibitors must keep the stalls allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock right throughout the Show.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 7.30 a.m. on judging day or 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of \$1.

FEED SHEDS, FODDER ARRANGEMENTS AND BEDDING

Several feed sheds are available for exhibitors in the Pig Section. On application to the Director, sheds will be reserved. Charge \$7.50 each, during the currency of the Show.

No bedding other than straw may be used in any box or stall.

For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will visit the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc. delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

NOTICES

With the exception of Sow and Litter Classes exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the pens stating that an animal is for sale; such cards not to exceed 12 in. x 10 in. and must not be put up until after 12 noon on Wednesday, 16th September. Cards may be placed on Sow and Litter pens after completion of judging. No other advertisements or notices (except by permission of the Council) are permitted on or in any pens or buildings.

AGE AND PARTICULARS OF EXHIBITS

Age of all pigs to be calculated to 15th September in each year. The Society's veterinary surgeon's decision shall be final on all matters regarding age. Exhibitors may be disqualified and debarred from further competition for any breach of regulations regarding the age of exhibits.

ENTRIES

In the aged classes for boars and sows, entries are limited to one from each exhibitor.

In the over 4 and not over 6 months old classes for boars and sows exhibitors are permitted to enter up to three pigs but only exhibit two per class. No refund of entry fees will be made.

In all other classes entries are limited to two from any one exhibitor.

The date of birth and name of sire and dam of an exhibit in the over 4 months and not over 6 months old classes must be supplied at time of entry and the name and Herd Book number must be supplied before the 31st of August.

For the under 4 months boar and sow classes the name and particulars of breeding need not be stated on the entry form but such information must be supplied before the 31st August.

HERD BOOK REGISTRATION

In Sections 56 to 60 (inclusive) all exhibits over the age of four months must be registered in an approved Herd Book. Pigs in classes under the age of four months must be from litters notified in accordance with the Rules of the Australian Pig Society. In the classes for sows with litters, the sire of the litter must also be registered, and the litter must have been duly recorded.

For particulars of registration in the Australian Pig Herd Book, apply to the Secretary, Australian Pig Society, Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032.

Pigs not registered prior to 15th July will only be permitted to be entered for the Show on payment of double entry fees.

SOW AND LITTER CLASSES

Judges shall give consideration to sows entered in the "Sow and Litter" Classes when making Champion and Reserve Champion awards.

No sow (other than those entered in the Sow and Litter Classes) will be permitted to be exhibited with a litter.

TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE that it is a condition of entry that motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports, will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 26th September.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.
