#### TO THE MEMBERS.

#### LADIES AND GENTLEMEN-

Your Council has pleasure in presenting the following report of proceedings of the Society for the year 1913:-

#### Permanent Buildings and Works.

During the past year your Council expended a large sum of money in further improving the roads and paths throughout the Grounds.

Both groups of refreshment rooms were sewered, and further alterations made which proved of great convenience to the caterers.

A fine, large, well-ventilated hall was made available by the extension of the District Exhibits Building under the uncovered Grandstand which was erected in 1912.

An up-to-date Dog Pavilion was built at the Eastern end of the Grounds, and provision made for its future extension.

Your Council deemed it advisable to have its chief executive officer residing on the Show Grounds. An artistic and comfortable residence was therefore built for the Secretary at the city end of the Show Grounds on the block of land recently acquired by the Society.

The Wine Kiosk and Band Stand were removed from their old positions adjacent to the Grandstand, and Plummer Avenue was thus widened. This alteration removed all congestion in that portion of the grounds even during the busiest days of the Show.

The accommodation for sheep was greatly improved by the provision of pens in the No. 3 pavilion, and the officials of the Bank of Victoria were provided with a more commodious office.

An extensive scheme for providing more up-to-date accommodation for horses and cattle has been adopted by your Council, and this work will be proceeded with as soon as financial arrangements can be made.

Another section of the ramp buildings that were commenced in 1912 was erected by five exhibitors during the year. On the busiest days of the Show these points of vantage were greatly appreciated by those patrons desiring to secure a good view of the arena events. On the works specified, together with a number of other minor improvements, the sum of  $\pounds7492$  15s. 3d. was expended during the year. This amount brings the total expenditure on buildings, maintenance and works up to  $\pounds89,588$  15s. 8d.

#### The Exhibition.

The Annual Exhibition was held from the 22nd to 27th September. The Prize Schedule was again carefully revised, and several sections and a great number of classes were added.

The entry secured by your Society in 1912 was a record for Australasia, but this record of 8548 entries was easily eclipsed this year, when 9844 entries were received.

The gate money, including £898 8s. 3d. from the Grandstands, amounted to £7312 15s. 9d., which is £247 4s. 6d. in excess of the highest amount previously taken.

For the purpose of comparison the following tables are published to show the number of entries in the several sections for the Shows of 1912 and 1913:—

Your Council invited the Judges to send in reports on their Sections, and no fewer than 44 complied with this request. As these reports will be of educational advantage to exhibitors and others, extensive extracts from them are being published as an addendum to this report.

The entries in horses and cattle were so unexpectedly large that accommodation could not be provided for all the exhibits on the Show Grounds, and your Council was compelled to utilise Messrs. Adamson, Strettle and Co.'s commodious stables, which are situated at a convenient distance from the Show Grounds.

What was probably the most satisfactory feature of the entries, as far as horses were concerned, was that the classes for aged animals in the Draught Section showed by far the largest entry the Society has yet received, and in the chief saddle and harness classes the entries were not only phenomenally large but the standard of quality was higher than in any previous year.

The arena events were watched with intense interest, and when it is remembered that no fewer than 632 entries were received for these contests, it can readily be understood that there was hardly a moment to spare from mid-day on Tuesday, when these events commenced, until 5.30 p.m. on Saturday, when the Show was brought to a successful conclusion.

In both beef and dairy cattle, quality was the predominant feature, even though the entries were so exceptionally large.

Notwithstanding the increased accommodation provided for the sheep, double banking had again to be resorted to, and your Council has decided to do all in its power to eliminate from the Show those animals which do not come up to a satisfactory standard, and which are evidently brought to the grounds solely for the purpose of sale.

A fine and representative entry was received in the Swine Section, and the quality of the previous years was well maintained.

There was a slight falling off in the number of entries received in the Poultry Section, but here again the quality was all that could be desired.

Pigeons showed an advance on the previous year, and the entries in the Dog Section were more extensive than ever before.

In the Farm Produce Section a most interesting competition was instituted for the various varieties of wheat, and in this connection your Council is convinced that the Judge's report will be read with much interest.

Farm Produce, Dairy Produce and the other Sections were much the same as previously, but the competition in the Women's Industries Section has increased in popularity to a greater extent than was ever anticipated.

The Machinery Stands and non-competitive exhibits again covered every available space on the Grounds, and the businesslike appearance of the stands was favourably commented upon by patrons of the Show.

The weather conditions were the most favourable experienced by the Society for a great number of years past, and at the beginning of the week was all that could be desired. Unfortunately the Thursday of the Show, which was the public holiday, was boisterous and threatening, and another unfortunate feature was that the Saturday of the Show clashed with the final match of the Victorian Football League. The attendance at the Show suffered in consequence of these drawbacks.

Nevertheless the attendance constituted a record, with 184.637. as against 167,390 in the previous year, and the profit on the Show was  $\pounds7432$  16s. 7d., being  $\pounds927$  18s. 11d. greater than last year's record.

#### Draught Horse Stud Book.

During the year Volume VII. of the Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia was published, and it contains the pedigrees of 151 stallions and 204 mares which had been registered since the publication of Volume VI., and also 179 colts and 217 fillies, the progeny of mares registered in Volume VII. and previous volumes.

Photographs of the Champion Stallion and the Champion Mare at the 1912 Show were reproduced in the volume.

In order to extend the scope of the Stud Book so that it will embrace all breeds of Draught horses, your Council decided to open Sections for pure bred Suffolk Punches and pure bred Percherons. The Draught Horse Stud Book of Australia now contains five sections, each of which is distinct and separate from the others, but for convenience all are bound in one volume. The sections are as follow :—(I) Clydesdales, (2) Shires, (3) Horses showing a combination of Clydesdale and Shire Blood, (4) Suffolk Punches, and (5) Percherons.

Your Council again desires to express its indebtedness to Mr. Ewen T. Campbell, of Kirk's Bazaar, for having revised and extended the pedigrees in Volume VII.

#### Flock Book.

The fifth volume of the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Australia was published during the year, and it contains the histories or annual returns of all flocks regarded as registered at time of publication.

A revision of the rules has been adopted by your Council on the recommendation of the Flock Book Committee, and in future no sheep will be admitted to the Book unless they are descended from sheep registered in an approved flock book.

The compulsory individual registration of stud rams has been insisted upon, and a more accurate annual return is required.

Many other alterations have been made, which all tend to raise the standard of quality of the flocks as well as to make it easier to secure fuller and more accurate pedigrees than has been possible in the past.

#### Shorthorn Herd Book.

The work of compiling the first volume of the Shorthorn Herd Book of Australia is still in hand, but owing to the difficulties being encountered in tracing back a number of the pedigrees it will be some time yet before the Committee will be in a position to publish the initial volume.

It is gratifying to your Council to note that the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales has resolved to officially recognise this herd book as the basis upon which entries in the Shorthorn Section will be accepted at future shows in the Mother State.

#### Ayrshire Herd Book.

The Ayrshire Cattle Herd Book Society of Australasia published the eighth volume of its Herd Book during the year. This Herd Book contains the pedigrees of 951 bulls and 2753 cows, and entries for Volume IX. are now coming to hand in satisfactory numbers.

#### Registered Stock at Shows.

In order to raise the general standard of stock at future Shows, and at the same time to attempt to limit the number of exhibits, your Council has decided to restrict the entries to registered stock in several sections. The following conditions will therefore apply in the sections mentioned:----

In and after the year 1914 no Ayrshires will be allowed to compete except those entered in a recognised Ayrshire Herd Book.

Commencing at our 1914 Show, entries in the Sheep Section must either be registered or eligible for registration in an established Flock Book, only excepting fat sheep, and breeds for which there is at the time of entry no established Flock Book in Australia.

In and after the year 1914 entries in the Swine Section will be limited to only those pigs in the Herd Book, for animals over the age of six months, and the sires and dams of animals under that age must be registered, also in classes for sows suckling their litters, the sires and dams of litters must be registered.

#### Chamber of Agriculture.

The eleventh Annual Convention of the Chamber of Agriculture was held at Bairnsdale on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd July, 1913.

It was officially opened by His Excellency the Governor, Sir John M. F. Fuller, K.C.M.G., and was attended by the Hon. the Prime Minister and other leading politicians, as well as by a large and representative gathering of delegates from all parts of the State.

In June last the late Mr. Angus McNaughton, who had represented your Society on the Council for a number of years, tendered his resignation on account of ill-health, and Mr. T. A. Grant was appointed in his stead.

At the Convention the compliment was bestowed upon Mr. McNaughton of electing him as an honorary life member of the Executive Committee.

The delegates from your Society submitted an interesting report of the proceedings to the Council, and a hearty vote of thanks was accorded the Bairnsdale Agricultural Society for its courtesy in connection with the arrangements made for the accommodation and entertainment of your Society's representatives.

#### Horse Parade and Sales.

As mentioned in last Annual Report your Council decided to hold a Horse Parade and Sale at the Show Grounds each year. The first of these fixtures will be held from 20th to 25th July, 1914, and a satisfactory entry is confidently anticipated.

#### Paper on Draught Horses.

At the Society's office in the Equitable Building, on the evening of Thursday, 25th September, during Show Week, Mr. Thomas Patterson, late Secretary of the Society, read a most interesting and instructive paper entitled "Draught Horses and Their Breeding: Historically and reminiscently treated, with a general sketch on the horse on like lines, with observations on stock, etc., mainly derived from a recent visit to Europe."

The paper was listened to with much interest by those present, and your Council considered it of such a high educational value that with Mr. Patterson's kind permission the paper was published in pamphlet form and copies were posted to all members of the Society, as well as to exhibitors in the horse sections at the recent Show.

#### Alteration of Show Dates.

For many years past the Royal Show has been held during the week which included the First Thursday in September.

The weather at this time of the year is generally unfavourable, and the date was also considered rather early for stock reared in the Southern Districts of the State.

After giving the matter most careful consideration, your Council decided that it would be to the best interests of the Society and exhibitors as a whole if the Show were held at a slightly later period.

The Society's Shows will in future be held during the last full week in September. The Victorian Legislature passed an Act which changed the public holiday to the Thursday preceding the last Saturday in September, and the Education Department fixed the Michaelmas vacation in the State Schools so that it will also coincide with the Society's Annual Show.

#### Judging at Royal Show.

No branch of your Council's work causes more anxiety than the adjudication of exhibits at the Annual Exhibition.

In the year 1908 it was resolved to give the three systems of judging a trial in successive years, and at the termination of the trial to hold a plebiscite of exhibitors in order to ascertain which system gave the greatest satisfaction.

In 1909 three judges were appointed to act in each section, in 1910 single judging was tried, and in 1911 two judges and a referee were called upon to make the awards. Immediately after the 1911 Show a vote was taken, and though the response in votes was disappointing, preference by a large majority was shown for dual judging, and the calling in of a referee in the event of disagreement. Your Council then resolved to be guided by the exhibtors' vote and give the dual system a further trial.

This was done at both 1912 and 1913 Shows. but the results were not satisfactory. Too much time was taken in making the awards, and the system hindered the establishment of a definite type in the stock sections.

At the November meeting of Council the subject of judging again came up for discussion, and it was resolved by a very large majority to again revert to single judging. For the first time in the history of the Society the official opening of the Show took place on the Tuesday.

His Excellency the Governor General, who drove to the Show Grounds in State, performed the opening ceremony, and afterwards, with His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, the Prime Minister, and other leading politicians and distinguished visitors attended the luncheon.

The innovation was so satisfactory that your Council has determined to have Tuesday regarded as the official opening day at future Shows.

#### Death of Mr. Angus McNaughton.

It was with extreme regret that the announcement of the death of Mr. Angus McNaughton was received by your Council in July last.

Mr. McNaughton was elected to the Council in 1903, and filled the position of Vice-President in 1908.

At the August meeting of Council a motion was carried expressing sincere regret at the death of Mr. McNaughton, and keen appreciation of his special ability, zeal and enthusiasm in the work of the Society was recorded in the Society's books. and a message of sympathy was forwarded to Mrs. McNaughton and her family.

#### The Council.

An election for seats on the Council for the eleven vacancies which had been caused by effluxion of time was held on 6th February, 1913, and resulted in the return of all the old members who sought re-election, and of Mr. Phil Tuckett to the seat rendered vacant by the retirement of Mr. David Gibson.

On the 9th September last, Mr. O. J. Syme was elected to the seat on the Council rendered vacant by the death of Mr. Angus NcNaughton.

In November last Mr. W. B. Cumming lost his seat owing to the fact that he had been absent from three consecutive meetings of Council without leave. In accordance with By-law 15 this vacancy must be filled at the forthcoming Annual Meeting.

Mr. A. E. T. Payne was granted extended leave of absence from January to June on account of his return from the Old Country being delayed.

#### The Journal.

"The Australian Farm and Home." with which is incorporated the Society's official journal, is being conducted in a manner that is highly satisfactory to your Council. Accurate reports of the monthly meetings of Council have been published throughout the year, and a large number of well-written and instructive articles have appeared, which were no doubt read with much interest by members of the Society.

#### Acknowledgments.

Your Council desire to express their heartiest thanks to His Excellency the Governor-General for officially opening the Show and for the kindly interest he displayed in the work of the Society generally.

To His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Lady Madden they are also indebted for having honoured the Society by officially visiting the Show.

They desire to thank the Government of Victoria for having granted the Society a subsidy, and for continuing the grant for Champion medals, which are so keenly sought after by breeders and producers.

They wish to acknowledge their appreciation of the liberality of the donors to the prize fund, particularly of the Shire Horse Society of England for having donated two handsome gold cups valued at  $\pounds_{50}$  each; of Mr. A. E. T. Payne for his donations, which aggregated  $\pounds_{160}$ ; of Mr. S. P. Mackay, for his donation of 100 guineas to the prize money in the Ayrshire Section, and of Mr. Norman Dale for the handsome painting of the Champion Draught Stallion at the 1913 Show.

They again desire to thank the Judges and Stewards for the careful and painstaking manner in which they carried out their important duties at the recent Show.

They also acknowledge with thanks the invaluable assistance rendered by the press in bringing so prominently before the public the Society's operations, and to all others who assisted in furthering the interests of the Society they extend their warmest thanks.

#### Finance.

On reference to the financial statement, it will be seen that the revenue for the year was  $\pounds 19,494$  11s. 2d., being an advance of  $\pounds 2883$  11s. 6d. on the previous year.

The expenditure (including £4610 5s. in cash prizes, £7492 15s. 3d. in buildings, maintenance, etc.) amounted to £19,481 13s., the overdraft being reduced from £11,538 15s. to £11,525 16s. 10d.

Taking the expenditure in permanent improvements as assets, the working expenses show a profit on the year's transactions of  $\pounds7505$  13s. 5d., as against last year's record profit of  $\pounds6281$  3s.



# RULES.

I. The Society shall be called The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Stock Raising and Industrial Resources of the State—

- (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
- (2.) By holding meetings for the purpose of popularising rural life and disseminating knowledge of improved methods and new ideas in relation thereto.
- (3.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies, and collecting information for the furtherance of the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of improved kinds of agricultural implements and machinery, the better equipment and construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (5.) By promoting the discovery, investigation, and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (6.) By collecting and distributing information on all subjects concerned with the objects of the Society, including the preparation and publication of Flock Books, Herd Books, Stud Books, Pamphlets, Essays, and Papers, and by the establishment and maintenance of a Library and Reading Room for the use of Members.
- (7.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants and taking measures to encourage the prevention or eradication of such diseases.
- (8.) By remunerating any person for original research work leading to the advancement of the objects of the Society.
- (9.) To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members. The term "Member" shall (unless the context otherwise requires) be deemed to include a Life Member, Life Governor, and Governor. 4. Subject to the provisions of Rule 27, every applicant for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company such firm or company shall nominate in writing one of the members thereof, who shall on the receipt by the Secretary of such nomination, be entitled to and exercise the rights and privileges of membership, and be bound by the Rules, By-Laws, and Regulations of the Society, and may be elected to any office.

5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of ten annual subscriptions.

6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-three Members (elected from amongst the Members of the Society as hereinafter provided), and the Trustees, who shall be *ex officio* Members of the Council.

7. One-third of the Council (the Trustees excepted) shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

8. Land acquired, or to be acquired, for the Society shall be held by and be vested in the Trustees for the time being of the Society for and on behalf of the Society. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due course at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society. Any new Trustee or Trustees shall be appointed at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society, or in accordance with Rule 14. The Trustees shall deal with the lands of the Society as directed by resolution of the Council of the Society (of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence), and they shall be indemnified against risk and expense out of the Society's property.

9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees), a President and three Vice-Presidents.

10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof, and for these purposes the Members of the Society for the time being shall be deemed to have constituted the Council of the Society for the time being their agents.

11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations therefor having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a notice of such nominations having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.

13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its ot.lce-bearers. 15. The Council shall have power to make or amend such regulations as they think necessary.

16. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each member of the Council.

17. The financial year of the Society shall end on the 31st day of December of each year, to which day the accounts of the Society shall be balanced. At the monthly meeting of the Council, to be held in January in each year, the Council shall prepare a list of Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies in the Council. Nominations (other than those made by the Council) of Members who may be candidates for such vacancies must be in the hands of the Secretary prior to such meeting. Every nomination other than those made by the Council shall be signed by at least two Members other than the candidate, and shall have endorsed thereon the consent of such candidate duly signed by him.

18. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council, two paid Auditors appointed, and any other business transacted of which due notice in writing shall have been given before the hour of two o'clock in the afternoon of the second Tuesday in January immediately preceding.

19. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his Deputy shall send to all Members of the Society a ballot-paper, numbered, and initialled by the President or his Deputy, or the Secretary, with the names of all the candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Member desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballotpaper containing more or less than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President (who shall be Returning Officer) or his Deputy at the election. Every such ballot-paper shall be returned before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot-papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

20. Fourteen days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every Member of the Society.

21. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of the Council next after the Annual Meeting the Members elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.

22. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President or on the requisition of twenty Members of the Society, of which meeting there must be given ten clear days' notice stating the business to be transacted, but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

23. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting. 24. At the Annual Meeting twenty Members, including Members of Council, or at a Special General Meeting, ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council, shall form a quorum.

25. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of Members of Council, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, and Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand-stands (subject to such regulations as the Council may make) on production of the member's ticket for the current year. And while the Society issues a monthly Journal a copy shall be posted free to every Member.

26. Any Member neglecting or refusing to comply with these Rules, or any or either of them, or any lawful directions or requirements by the Council made in pursuance or under the authority thereof, or being guilty either before or after becoming a Member of the Society of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions, or other objects, shall be liable to be summoned before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may also be disqualified from exhibiting and may be disallowed from again becoming a Member during the pleasure of the Council. A Member expelled under this Rule shall forfeit all right in and claim upon the Society and its property.

27. Any person being expelled from Membership or disqualified from exhibiting, riding, or competing by any kindred society shall not be allowed to become a Member or to exhibit, ride, or compete at this Society's Exhibitions until such expulsion be rescinded or such disqualification be removed, provided such expulsion or disqualification be confirmed by the Council of this Society.

28. The Council shall be the sole authority for the interpretation of these Rules, and of the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Council upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Society or the administration of its affairs, whether provided for by these Rules or by the By-laws and Regulations made thereunder or otherwise, shall be final and binding on the Members.

29. Every Member shall communicate from time to time to the Secretary his address; and all notices required by these Rules to be sent or given to Members shall be deemed to have been duly sent or given if posted or sent to such address.

30. Every person becoming a Member of the Society thereby undertakes, if at any time required to do so by the Council, to give evidence by statutory declaration or otherwise of any facts within his knowledge or information relating to the subject matter of any inquiry by the Council.

31. Every person becoming a Member of the Society shall thereby undertake to indemnify and shall with every other Member thereof be bound to indemnify the Council, and the individual Members thereof, any Committee of the Council and any Members of any such Committee, against any action or damages in respect of anything done or purported to have been done in accordance with these Rules, or the By-laws or Regulations made thereunder, during the continuance of his Membership.

32. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting.

# BY·LAWS.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

------

1. Notice of the Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the Members of Council at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for by at least three members present. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given in accordance with Rule 18.

2. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his Deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

#### THE PRESIDENT.

3. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Members, and shall take the chair when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may decide.

#### THE COUNCIL.

Salar to the fact

4. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such a day and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.

5. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss, and decide by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

6. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council. 7. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

8. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting, of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.

9. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some person present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

10. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding. Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants at the Society's Exhibitions.

11. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees when they shall think proper.

12. The Council shall appoint a banker or bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

13. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all' such payments.

14. If any Member of Council, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

15. The Secretary shall notify to the Council any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other members of the Council, at the meeting of the Council at which or next after such vacancy occurred, and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice, provided that if any such vacancy occur after the ordinary monthly Council meeting in November such vacancy shall not be filled except at the next Annual Meeting.

16. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by the senior Vice-President then present; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes. (The senior Vice-President shall be deemed to mean the Vice-President who has been a member of Council for the greatest number of years in the aggregate.)

17. The quorum of a monthly or special meeting of Council shall be five.

18. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows :-

(1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.

- (2.) Business arising from minutes.
- (3.) Election of officers, and nominations for vacancies.
  (4.) Committee's Reports.
  (5.) Motions.
  (6.) Correspondence.

  - (7.) Postponed business.(8.) General business.

  - (9.) Notices of motions.

19. All minutes and reports read to and adopted by the Council, -shall be signed by the Chairman.

20. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January or at some adjournment thereof.

#### COMMITTEES.

21. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the monthly Council meeting in February as they think fit, and such Committees shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting -in the ensuing year, two members of Committee to form a quorum.

22. The President shall be ex officio a member of all committees.

23. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.

24. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

#### THE SECRETARY.

25. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep copies of all letters on the business of the Society.

26. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the Society's bank, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bank. He shall have the charge of the expenditure for petty cash.

27. He shall have the custody of all books and property of the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

28. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he may think of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

29. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of  $\pm 500$ , the premium to be paid by the Society.

30. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Member of the Society.

#### FINANCE.

31. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each monthly meeting, as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

32. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.


33. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

34. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

35. The accounts of the Society shall be audited as may be required by the Council by two professional accountants to whom a balance-sheet shall be submitted by the Secretary immediately after the close of the financial year, and such, when audited, shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.





# Extracts from Judges' Reports on Exhibits at Royal Show, 1913.

#### DRAUGHT HORSES (Males.)

Mr. Charles Pilgrim, Marnoo.

I have no hesitation in saying that the Draught Stallions, 4 years and over, were an exceptionally good class, with very little between the first four horses. The other classes were, however, not up to the standard of the two previous years.

#### DRAUGHT HORSES (Females).

Mr. H. J. Bodey, Mt. Gambier, South Australia.

In the whole of the female classes of the Draughts there was a big improvement on last year. The class for Brood Mares was a very good one, both for quality and substance, and I am sure that some of these mares' offspring will be heard of in future years.

Dry Mares were fair, most of the good mares showing age.

The three-year-old Fillies were a splendid lot, showing bone, quality, substance and action, and with the three placed fillies it was difficult to decide which was the best.

The two-year-old Fillies were rather mixed, and it was hard to follow our class out on type. Many fillies lacked substance, though they possessed quality. The first and second prize winners were good, showing both size and quality.

The class for Yearling Fillies was a good one, and the first prize filly was a rare sort, showing quality, bone and substance. She was followed by a couple of other fillies that I think will some day be heard of.

## ARABS, THOROUGHBREDS, ROADSTERS, SADDLE HORSES AND PONIES.

#### Mr. John H. Davis, Cloverlea, Caulfield.

In Section (3) Arabs, with one or two exceptions, the class was decidedly poor.

In Section (4) Thoroughbred Stallions, four high class horses were exhibited, three of them being imported. There were no mares shown in this section. Section (6) Roadsters.—In the Stallion Class there was a fine exhibit, both as regards quality and number, but the mares were moderate, only two being shown.

In Section (10) Saddle Horses and Ponies, there was a splendid display in all classes, the Heavyweight Hacks and Ladies' Hacks being a particularly fine lot, and in my opinion were a credit to even the Royal Agricultural Show. I may me tion that I heard several good judges remark that in all Classes of this Section the exhibits were the best seen at the show for

#### many years.

#### MILITARY EVENTS.

Major J. K. Forsyth, Victoria Barracks, St. Kilda-road.

Two Military Events were carried out:-(a) A Fugitive Race; and (b) a Victoria Cross Race. Entries were not numerous, six teams taking part in the former and six competitors in the latter. Both events demand excellent horsemanship, including jumping, pluck, dash and agility, for their proper execution, and all competitors put up a highly meritorious performance.

From a spectacular point of view these events are highly exciting, whilst at the same time affording many incidents of humour, and in both aspects appeared to be intensely enjoyed by the onlookers.

That the necessary practice for and the eventual competition in such events tends largely to cultivate those qualities of dash and pluck so essential to the good mounted soldier is duly appreciated by all military men.

In providing for such contests the Royal Agricultural Society is helping to popularise the Commonwealth Forces, and setting a standard of excellence in the qualities required for their performance.

#### WOOD CHOPPING AND SHEAF TOSSING.

Mr. E. W. Robinson, 333 Lonsdale-street, Melbourne.

In the Wood Chopping competitions there was a record entry, but owing to the toughness of the wood the times were somewhat slow.

The Sawing Handicap was closely contested, but I was disappointed with the small entry, specially so as the prize money is higher than is usually given for such contests.

The Sheaf Tossing was also well contested. It brought forth a record entry, and the event seemed to be a very popular one.

# HEREFORDS, POLLED ANGUS, RED POLLED AND DEVONS.

#### Mr. Richard Bach, Oakey, Darling Downs, Queensland.

I was very disappointed on opening the Judges' Book, for the Hereford and Red Polled Sections to find so few entries. The Champion Bull in the Herefords has a mellow touch with nice top, and underline. The first prize Bull Calf is a heavyfleshed calf, with well-sprung ribs and good top. The females were not quite so smooth in their fleshing as the Bulls. The Champion Cow was an easy win, with her nice character, great back, well sprung ribs and deep thighs.

Amongst the Red Polled Bulls the Champion stands clean out from his opponents. The Champion Cow possesses great quality and substance and promises to be a heavy milker.

# MILKING SHORTHORNS, HOLSTEINS AND SOUTH DEVONS.

### Mr. John Bell, Kangaroo Ground.

In the Milking Shorthorn Section the Bulls in the aged class were not up to the standard of former years, but the First Prize taker was a good specimen of the type. He is of a good length and depth, but rather coarse towards the tail. In the Younger Bull Classes, some of the prize-takers were of good quality, and exhibited very good dairy points, but others were not up to the standard required for the production of a good dairy herd, being more inclined to beef than milk. The Aged Cows in milk, and dry, were good, but few in number; the first and second prize-takers in each class were splendid specimens of dairy cows, the competition being particularly close in each case.

The Heifers were, in my opinion, rather defective in udder and teats, taken as a whole, but a few of them were of very nice quality and showed good breeding. The competition in the South Devons and Holsteins was very limited. As the former is a comparatively new class here, the breed does not appear to come into favour very much. The cows have a great capacity for carrying milk, but otherwise I do not think there is very much in their general outline to recommend them for other purposes.

The Holsteins were poorly represented in numbers and quality. The want of condition had probably a good deal to do with them as to quality.

# MILKING SHORTHORNS, HOLSTEINS AND SOUTH DEVONS.

Mr. Richard McCurry, Rochester.

Amongst the Milking Shorthorns, some splendid animals were paraded. The four and five-year old cows in milk and dry are splendid animals, and a great credit to the breeders. I think the Milking Shorthorn is the most profitable cow

I think the Milking Shorthorn is the most profitable cow on a farm, and other societies should follow your Society's example, and give more encouragement for the breeding of this valuable breed.

The Holsteins and South Devons were splendid specimens of their breeds, the cows in both classes showing great capacity as heavy milkers.

## GUERNSEYS, DEXTER KERRIES AND KERRIES.

#### Mr. M. A. O'Callaghan, Dairy Expert, Agricultural Department, Sydney.

I have pleasure in stating that excellent specimens were exhibited, representing both Guernseys and Dexter Kerries, the parade of aged Dexter Kerry Cows being an exceptionally fine one. The Guernseys, though deficient in numbers, were of good quality, and I think it is rather a pity that the State of Victoria has not a larger number of this breed, which has proved itself such a remarkably successful one for dairying.

#### DAIRY CATTLE.

#### Mr. J. C. Wedlock, Marrickville, N.S.W.

I found a great improvement in both Dry Cows and Milkers in the Dairy Section since my previous visit two years ago. There was keen competition all through. The Champion Cow competition brought out a splendid lot of animals, and it was also a very hard class to judge.

#### MERINOS.

#### Mr. G. D. Cumming, Maroona.

The Merino Sheep were not sufficiently represented for a close report.

The Prize Winners were of excellent quality and worthy representatives, but, unfortunately, the exhibits lacking in numbers.

## MERINOS.

## Mr. James Sloane, Mulwala, N.S.W.

The competition was very limited, but the quality of the exhibits, with one exception, was decidedly good.

# LINCOLN RAMS.

#### Mr. R. A. D. Hood, Merrang, Hexham.

The sheep shown in the aged and under  $2\frac{1}{2}$  and over  $1\frac{1}{2}$ years were very good classes. The prize sheep in both classes were very good and well up to the standard of previous years, both in carcase and style of wool. The Champion and Reserve Champion were both very fine sheep, carrying heavy fleeces of good style of Lincoln wool, very even, good on points, and large frames. The Younger Classes, in my opinion, were not so good. There were some wellgrown sheep shown, carrying nice style and character of wool, but nearly all of them were faulty on some of their points, and some very inferior sheep were shown in these classes. As a whole, I think the Young Rams this year were disappointing.

## LINCOLN EWES.

Mr. Walter Oliver, Shaftesbury, Cootamundra.

I think that I have seen more quality in the prize winners in the past, but the exhibits as a whole were more even than previous years.

# ENGLISH LEICESTERS.

Mr. J. F. Burn, Richmond, Tasmania.

It is a difficult matter to judge with a Victorian, as he is accustomed to his type, as I have been to the Tasmanian. There were three types shown.

I think it would be advisable for the Council of the Royal Agricultural Society to call a conference of breeders to decide on one type.

#### ENGLISH LEICESTERS.

Mr. A. H. Blake, Leicester, Lang Lang.

In the English Leicester section, types and quality were mixed.

It is to be regretted (with so valuable a breed) that breeders, in their own interests, do not try to arrange for the recognition of one type. The farmers have no confidence in a breed of sheep where breeders themselves are at variance as to which is the true type. It is undoubtedly confusing to the public to see so many types of sheep in the one class, and hard for the judges to follow one type in awarding prizes, owing to inferior sheep being sent in for sale purposes. The latter may be true to type, but deficient in quality. There is one prize I cannot pass without comment, that is a prize for the most symmetrical sheep in the long wool classes (confined to the Champions). This is a most unsatisfactory prize to award. Firstly, there are often more symmetrical sheep in the section than the Champion (wool being no consideration). Secondly, it is hard to judge sheep for symmetry that are carrying so much wool, and often expertly trimmed to improve their appearance. If this was a special section, "sheep to be shown shorn," it would be interesting and educational to the public.

#### BORDER LEICESTERS.

Mr. Joseph Wood, Talygarup, Gnowangerup, W.A.

There was a decided improvement in the classes over last year. Some very good specimens were shown. In the aged class, Over  $2\frac{1}{2}$  Years, for Rams, a very good type of In the a sheep was shown. It was proportionally made, and well up in the shoulders, and carried his head well; also had splendid quality of wool, with a good staple. The second prize winner was a very good quality sheep, but much too light in his wool, and not so good in his hind quarters. In the Rams Under 21/2 Years, the winning exhibitor showed a fairly good sheep, but again too light in his wool. This class was fairly well represented, but not so many good sheep were shown as in some of the other classes. In class for Rams Not More Than 18 Months, the winning ram was an exceptionally wellgrown sheep, but his head might have been smarter. The second prize sheep was a very promising one, with a splendid head, and good wool, but not quite so well grown as the former. In the Ewe (Any Age) Class, the winner was an exceptionally good ewe. She is the right type of a Border Leicester, good length, round rib, splendid head and neck, and very good wool. The second-prize ewe is a well-deserving sheep, as she was very good quality, but not so good in her wool.

Amongst the Ewes, Over  $2\frac{1}{2}$  Years Old, the first prize winner is a splendid type of a ewe, but rather light in her wool. She was also Reserve Champion. The second prize winner also was a very nice ewe. The winner in the class for Ewe, Under 2<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> Years, is a very smart sheep; the second ewe is an exceptionally nice sheep. In class for Ewe, Not More Than 18 Months, the first is a very good ewe, but not so good in her wool as she might have been; the second prize winner is better in the wool, but not so good in the body.

## ROMNEY MARSH.

Mr. Frank File, Bolaro Station, via Cooma, N.S.W.

In the Kent, or Romney Marsh Sheep, the exhibits were not numerous, but they were thoroughly representative of the breed. I have seldom seen a 'better lot of young sheep—viz., Rams and Ewes Under 12 Months, and, judging by them, I should say that the breed is making rapid improvement every generation.

# DORSET HORNS, CORRIEDALES, SOUTHDOWNS, HAMPSHIRES AND SUFFOLKS.

Mr. David Porter, Riverview, Tallarook.

There was keen competition right through the Southdown Section. The quality was exceptionally high, especially in the older classes. The 4-tooth ram which secured the Champion Card was, I consider, the best ram of the breed which I have had the pleasure of handling for some considerable time.

Only four Dorset Horn Sheep were shown, but they were good specimens of the breed, but not in anything like Show condition.

There was not much competition in the Hampshire Section, the ewes being typical specimens, but we did not consider the rams worthy of a prize.

The Suffolks were decidedly good, and well shown. There was also fair competition. We found some difficulty in judging the Corriedales, as they varied considerably as to type; also in carcase and quality of wool. The winners were good all-round sheep.

# DORSET HORNS, CORRIEDALES, SOUTHDOWNS, HAMPSHIRES AND SUFFOLKS.

## Mr. T. B. Cowan, Benalla.

In the Dorset Horn Section the entries were few in number, but the sheep were good specimens of the breed, but not shown in very good condition. In the Southdown Section there were good entries, and keen competition. All the sheep were shown in excellent condition. The younger sheep not quite so good as the older ones. The quality of the older sheep was equal to, if not better than, anything ever shown at the grounds. Only four Hampshires were shown, two of which were shown in very bad condition. The others were in good condition. and were good specimens of the breed. There was more competition in the Suffolk Section than in former years, and sheep were shown in good condition. All were typical sheep of the breed.

The Corriedales were shown for the first time. All the sheep were shown in good condition, but seemed to vary a good deal in type, and also with regard to size and wool.

#### FAT SHEEP.

## Mr. F. Howe, C/o Angliss and Co., Bourke-street, Melbourne.

I consider that all fat stock should be considered from a butcher's point of value, and should the Council wish to have a prize for the fattest sheep, a special class should be included for this purpose. In order that sheep exhibited in Class 331 should have a reasonable market value as "freezers," no stud sheep should be exhibited. Amongst the Export Lambs (Class 332), some of the exhibits were thrown out as being too heavy for the "Export Freezers."

## SKINS.

## Mr. A. Glover, 528 Collins-street, Melbourne.

The exhibit in the Sheepskin Section was disappointing. This was chiefly due to a misconception, on the part of the owners, of the merits upon which the exhibits would be judged. Many exhibits were not entered on this account.

As the aim of the Society is educational, I took the liberty, as Secretary of the Victorian Sheepskin Buyers' Association, of placing under the exhibits a typewritten statement of the way in which we consider the countryman and butcher should take care of his stuff.

Judging by the enquiries made since the Show, it would seem that next year's entries will be much more numerous.

I would suggest that the wording of the conditions be made to read "that the care and preservation," etc., etc., not "the value per skin," are the points to be taken into consideration in the judging. Of course if the contests were for the most valuable skins, then it would be confined to twelve months' growth, etc.

It would be well if provision were made to show the exhibits in a better manner where they could be seen by visitors. At the last show they were hung up on a wall out of reach, and so defeated the object aimed at by the promoters.

The hearty good wishes of the Association are with you in your efforts to make this exhibit a success.

## SWINE-BERKSHIRE AND BLACK BREEDS.

Mr. R. H. Madden, Drumgold, Batesford.

In the class for aged Berkshire Boars I did not think they were up to the standard of previous years. The Young Boars I thought were a very fair lot, with nothing very striking amongst them. In the Sows I thought there was a decided improvement in the Aged and Younger Classes.

## WYANDOTTES AND ORPINGTONS.

Mr. J. B. Jamieson, Shrewsbury Esplanade, Middle Brighton.

I may say that the Orpingtons, as a whole, were mixed, but special mention may be made to the winning Black Orpington Cock; also the winning Buff Orpington. Wyandottes were also mixed, but some of the winners were of the best quality.

# POULTRY, ANY OTHER VARIETY.

Mr. J. Maude, Kogarah, N.S.W.

There was a very good even lot of Dorkings, and the winners in the Silver Grey Classes were especially good, both in length and depth of breast and in colour. They also possessed fine bone.

The first prize bird in the Cock Class, which was reserve for one of the Government Medals, is the best I have seen for some years. That useful fowl, the Plymouth Rock, was not so numerous, or even so good in quality, as they might be. There was, however, some very good birds in the Farmers' Trio Class. There was also a very strong section of the French table fowl, the Faverolle, and the competition was the keenest I have seen in Australia. Langshans appear to be losing favour, which is to be regretted, and, although there was a fair collection of Hamburgs, with one or two exceptions quality was not in evidence.

#### EXPORT POULTRY.

#### Mr. R. Hart, Government Cool Stores.

The number of entries in the Export Poultry was small, but the quality of the First, Second, and Third in the Chicken Classes was good. The first prize went to a very fine pair of chickens of the Indian Game Breed. Their age was about five to six months, very plump in the breast, and a good depth of breast meat, but failed in condition on the back to the second prize birds. The second prize birds were of the Sussex breed, and reflected great credit on the owner for the splendid condition in which they were shown; but he failed to win the prize on the plumpness of the breast and the age of his birds. They were full of eggs, and did not kill out so plump in the breast as the winners. I would advise the owner of the second prize birds, in future, to show his birds before they start to lay, as the breast is always plumper and the skin of better texture. The third prize birds were of the White Orpington breed, plump in the breast, fine in bone, but failed to first and second in size and condition. I would recommend in the interest of export trade, and to ensure a large entry, that in future all breeds and colour of legs compete together, and two classes be made, one for Cockerels, and one for Pullets, as the Cockerel has no possible chance to beat the Pullet, as she is always plumper in breast and finer in bone, which scores very heavily as a table bird.

In the Duck Class the competition was keen, and the best breeds were represented—Aylesbury first, Pekin second, and Black Buff third.

The First, Second and Third were of good quality, the second failing to the first in size, weight, and unevenly matched; the third prize was plump, but failed to first and second in size and colour of flesh.

In conclusion, I must say that the Poultry Section, on the whole, is a credit to the Royal Agricultural Society, and many breeders look upon a win there as the Melbourne Cup of the year. If the prices of the birds were placed on the coops of each pen, it would give the farmer an opportunity to make purchases, and be a greater convenience to the public generally.

Re Turkeys.—I recommend that there should be two classes, best pair of cocks, and best pair of hens. The entries for Turkeys last year were very small, but next year the farmers promise to make a record entry. The breeder of Turkeys makes a great mistake by not topping his birds off one month beforesending to a market or show, as they lose hundreds of pounds every year by sending them off the grass and stubble, as they always do. By topping them off they would kill out better, freeze: a better colour, and would be several pounds a bird heavier. I would also suggest that the Society give a special class for Black Norfolk Turkeys, as they are very plump in the breast, fine in the bone, hardy and quick maturers.

#### PIGEONS: HOMERS.

#### Mr. T. H. Barnes, 3 Narong-road, Caulfield.

I was very pleased to find some grand birds in the Working Homer Classes, the Blue or Black Chequer Cock was a very strong class, and I had to choose the winner by the best conditioned bird, and the prize-winners in all the classes I considered a good stamp of Working Homer; but I would have liked to see the classes better filled, and I consider the prizes offered by the Society deserve better support from the Working Homer fanciers in future.

#### PIGEONS: FANCY BIRDS.

#### Mr. A. Wurz, 52 Gooch-street, Northcote.

As far as the Fancy Pigeon Section is concerned, the quality was very high, all the birds were shown in tip top condition, notwithstanding the late season the show was held. The number of entries in some classes did not come up to expectations, and I hope there will be better support at the next show. The best specimens were shown in Dragons, Magpies, Short-faced Tumblers, and African Owls. The judgment for the best fancy Pigeon in the show stood between a sweet little African Owl and a very typical Silver English Owl Cock.

## NON-SPORTING DOGS: OTHER THAN TERRIERS.

#### Mr. D. V. Rennie, Australian Buildings, Elizabeth-street, City.

The Non-Sporting Dogs section at the show was comparatively unimportant in view of the large entries and keen competition in the Sporting and Terrier sections. The breeds best represented were Collies (19 entries) and Bulldogs (17 entries), which made a good show with some good specimens on view, the winners in each of these breeds being fully up to Championship quality, although the dogs were decidedly superior to the bitches, particularly in Collies.

St. Bernards (7 entries) brought out one exceptionally good dog, which stood well out from the others, which were hardly up to the English standard of quality.

Great Danes (4 entries) brought out four fine, big, harlequin specimens of good size and substance, also good in colour, with sound legs and feet. Toy Poodles (7 entries) were very good in quality, and included three full champions. They were of good type, and were in excellent show condition. The Any Other Variety classes contained three good Pomeranians, a couple of nice quality Chows, and a brace of Whippets. The arrangements generally were good, and the new pavilion was much appreciated, although it will probably have to be extended for future shows. I would suggest that at future shows all exhibitors be supplied with a card bearing the number of their exhibit, such card to be shown by the exhibitor during the judging, which would enable the spectators around the judging ring to identify the different dogs and the various awards. This practice is enforced at all English shows, and adds considerably to the interest during the judging. I would also suggest that in future the classes be so arranged that the dog and bitch classes shall not be intermixed.

## SPORTING DOGS: OTHER THAN TERRIERS.

# Mr. John Clark, Glenroy.

1913

The Sporting Dogs at the Royal Show were of fair average quality. The few Borzois and Deerhounds exhibited were good; the Greyhounds somewhat mixed; the Pointer Dogs coarseheaded. The Pointer Bitches were much better, the winning bitch being a real good one. The Winning English Setter Dog and Bitch were very good, the Dog especially so. The same remark can be applied to the Winning Irish Setter Dog and Bitch, while the Gordons show a marked improvement. The Champion Retrievers were true to type, and, in my opinion, were the best sporting dogs shown. The Spaniels, both Field and Cocker, were very even. Speaking generally, the Sporting Dogs show a deterioration in substance and quality; and fresh importations, especially in Setters and Pointers, would be greatly appreciated. Might I be permitted to suggest that the judging ring for the Sporting Sections be enlarged. These dogs are accustomed to range, and naturally require space to show themselves in.

## SADDLERY.

## Mr. Thomas Heath, Bacchus Marsh.

As judge of the Saddlery exhibit at the recent Show, I desire to state that all the work exhibited was of excellent quality and reflected much credit on the exhibitors. I discovered no slummed work, and the material used was of the very best. The number of exhibits in the various sections was fair. The difference in points between first and second prize-takers, in most cases, was small, and gave me difficulty in deciding. There was not an article exhibited which was not worthy of a prize.

#### WHEAT.

Mr. A. E. V. Richardson, Department of Agriculture.

The Wheat sections comprised Macaroni Wheats, High Strength Red, High Strength White, and Low Strength White wheats. In all, twenty-four wheats were entered for the four sections. Competition was keenest in the Low Strength White Class, sixteen entries being received.

In judging the wheats, the milling and baking qualities of the flour made from each wheat were taken into consideration, in addition to the general appearance and condition of the wheat. In order to arrive at the proper estimate of the milling and baking qualities of the wheats, samples were carefully milled in the Experimental Flour Mill of the Department of Agriculture, and the percentages of mill products, colour, gluten content and strength of the flour were carefully estimated. The flour from each wheat was then made into dough and baked in an electric baking oven under absolutely uniform conditions, and the volume, weight, and texture of the loaf determined. Points were awarded for each of these qualities in accordance with the following scale:—

In the Low Strength White Class competition was very keen. The first prize was awarded to No. 4642, with a fine bright sample of wheat of good milling and baking quality. The weight per measured bushel, 68.6, was exceedingly high, the general appearance and condition of the sample very good, and the strength, gluten content of the flour, and the weight and volume of the bread, very satisfactory for a wheat of its class. The total points awarded were  $86\frac{1}{2}$ .

The second prize was awarded to No. 4635 for a bright sample of wheat of fine appearance and good milling and baking quality. The weight per bushel was 67.6, and the colour of the flour excellent. The total points awarded to this wheat were  $84\frac{1}{2}$ . Close up were No. 4641, which secured  $83\frac{1}{2}$  points, and No. 4643 with a total of 83 points.

Macaroni Wheats.—Three entries were received in this class; No. 4620 lost points for containing an admixture of bread wheat. The amount of bread wheat present in this sample accounts for its comparatively high baking qualities. No. 4619 was awarded the First Prize, with a total of 78½ points. Its chief characteristics were comparatively high bushel weight, fine appearance, high flour yield, and flour strength. The Second Prize was awarded to entry No. 4621, the wheat and flour of which was of high protein and gluten content. Third Prize, No. 4620.

In the High Strength Red Class, there were two entries, but one of these should properly be included in another class, Low Strength Red. The prize was awarded to entry No. 4622, with a magnificent, hard, red wheat of exceptional strength and milling quality. The sample was extremely uniform, of high bushel weight (68.5 lb.), very attractive in appearance, and gave a loaf of excellent pile and texture.

High Strength White.-Three entries were received for this section, and, though the varieties appeared to be similar, considerable differences were observable in the behaviour of the samples in the mill and the oven. The first Prize was awarded to No. 4625, with a total of 90 points. This sample weighed extremely well (68.6 lb.) per measured bushel, gave a good yield of strong flour of excellent baking quality. The Second Prize was awarded to No. 4626. This wheat also gave a good yield of strong flour and high gluten content, and scored a total of 86 points. Third Prize, No. 4624. The Championship of Australia is awarded to No. 4622, a wheat of excellent quality. Its high bushel weight, bright appearance, exceptional strength, high percentage of gluten, and baking quality combine to make it the best wheat exhibited of all the sections. As this is the first occasion on which wheats have been judged at the Royal Show from the result of actual milling and baking tests, I took the liberty of submitting with each entry actual samples of the flour, bran, and pollard made in the Experimental Flour Mill from each wheat, and loaves of bread made from each of the flours. Moreover, in order that competitors and others interested would be able to compare the various entries, printed placards were placed alongside each exhibit, indicating the percentage of mill products, weight per measured bushel, colour. strength, gluten content of the flour and the volume of a 2lb. loaf of bread made from the flour; also the familiar Pekar's test for the colour of the flour was indicated on ground glass slides together with photographs of the bread made from each sample. Finally, for the purpose of comparison, detailed results showing the milling and baking qualities of the F.a.g. wheats for 1913 of New South Wales Victoria, and South Australia were indicated in tabular form on the walls. These tables enabled comparisons to be made between the wheat we ordinarily export to London and the wheat which some of our best farmers can produce.

In conclusion, though the number of entries in some sections was not as great as might have been expected, nevertheless, the competition was keen, and the growers of the prize wheats are to be congratulated on the general excellence of the wheats submitted for competition.

#### FARM PRODUCE

Mr. George McCarthy, c/o R. and A. Onians, Collins-street, City.

In the classes that came before me at your recent show, I should say that in both Algerian and White Oats some excellent grain was shown, and the number of exhibits in each of these classes could also be considered very satisfactory.

In English Barley an improvement can be looked for both as to quality and number of exhibits. I know that we have many growers who could have sent along better barleys than those exhibited. Why they were not attracted to the show I cannot just account for, as your prizes are fairly liberal.

In the various classes of Peas no one could take exception to the quality, as the grain was first-class, but here again one would like to see a larger number of exhibits. The quality of the Rye Grass seed was very good, indeed, and no fault could be found with the Linseed.

It would be well if agricultural societies could get the producers to come more generally into these competitions. In most cases only those who specialise or improve their samples by special treatment, or even hand picking, come along, and very often the largest and best growers, as far as markets generally are concerned, will not be bothered with exhibiting, as they have not the time, or will not take the trouble above referred to. If some conditions could be inserted that the owner of grain to whom a first prize was awarded would have to be prepared to supply to your Society, if requested, say, a couple of hundred bushels, equal to the exhibit for which the prize had been given, it might lead to the removal of the specialist as an exhibitor, and to the bringing in of the general grower.

#### MAIZE.

## Mr. H. James, Orbost.

The exhibits in the Maize classes were unsatisfactory. Although the winning exhibits were of good quality, the class of maize in each case was not a good one. A significant thing is the absence of exhibits of good marketable samples of ordinary maize. The winning exhibits in both Yellow and White shelled maize being of a class seldom or never grown for feed or milking purposes. As the proportion of seed for fodder maize required represents only about 5 per cent. of the general output, it is regrettable • that only the fodder varieties are exhibited. As the Prize Schedule should attract the exhibits, I can only ascribe the poor entries to the indifference of growers. It is to be hoped that this indifference will disappear, and that exhibits worthy of the Society will in future be obtained. As to the exhibits at the recent show, the quality of the shelled maize taking the first prize was excellent, and could scarcely be excelled. The ears (cobs), however, were not so satisfactory, and generally showed a lack of breeding. In the winning exhibit of Yellow Ears there were two or three of fine quality. Well-shaped ears, deep grain, rows close together, small cob, well-filled tips and butts, but the remainder were only fair quality, and some poor.

The ears of white maize were of very poor quality, and, although a prize was awarded, they were really not worthy of it. I would like to emphasise the point that maize can be only properly judged in the ear, and in any alteration of your prize schedule, it is advisable to keep this in view.

#### FARM PRODUCE, EXCEPT CEREALS.

## Mr. J. Hill, King-street, City.

Nothing of special merit came under my notice. The Chaff, Carrots and Mangolds were very good, the other classes not calling for special mention. May I suggest that there be two classes for horse carrots—one White Belgian, and the other for Coloured Varieties.

#### AGRICULTURAL, HIGH AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

# Mr. H. Pye, Dookie.

In the Agricultural High Schools' Competition, the exhibits of fodder crops, cereals in the grain, and straw and grasses were especially good, but in most of the other sections of the schedule there were omissions of individual exhibits from them. Although every effort should be made to encourage Forestry, it seems to me that unless the exhibits in this division are growing on the High School farm, the School situated in the vicinity of a public garden, or in an old-settled district, where forest trees have been planted, have greater opportunities of scuring high marks in the Forestry Section. I am of opinion that only exhibits grown on the school farm should be staged.

# SOCIETIES' COMPETITIONS.

## Mr. H. Mau.

I beg to state that, in the District Exhibits, the Dairy Produce and Foods were fairly well represented, and the quality all round was good; but I would recommend that, in staging these exhibits, greater facility should be given for judging them. This portion of the exhibit cannot be judged by merely viewing it. The exhibits require to be handled and tasted, and if the competition in this class increases (and I see no reason why they should not), this portion of the exhibit will require to be very closely judged. I also think that it is a mistake for Factory and Home-cured Bacons to compete against one another in these sections.

In the One-Farm Exhibits, the Dairy Produce, instead of being one of the main features, was very poor, both in quality and quantity. Here, again, the bacon and meat was hung right at the top, and quite out of reach for judging. These competitions should be very much better patronised.

## STATE SCHOOLS DISTRICT COMPETITIONS.

Mr. J. H. Refshange, Agricultural High School, Ballarat.

The exhibits in Grains and Potatoes in the State Schools Competitions were quite up to the standard of, and, in two or more cases, were superior to, those shown in previous years. Fodders, on the whole, were not quite as good as those shown on previous occasions.

Generally speaking, the exhibits were well arranged, but in a few cases much extra work was caused by the neglect shown in classifying the exhibits. At the conclusion of the judging, I placed in each stall a detailed list of points awarded to the exhibitors. After acting as a judge each year since the inception of the Schools' Competition, I have come to the conclusion that a revision of the schedule is necessary. Up to the present, the best exhibit in a section may have received no recognition. For instance, a district may exhibit the best root crops or fodders, and, on account of weakness in the other sections, the total points obtained may be less than in the case of a district which excels in no particular section, but has a high average in all. I would suggest that in future prizes be awarded to the best exhibit in the several sections.

#### CHEESE.

Mr. G. C. Sawers, Government Expert, Melbourne.

I wish to state that the quality of the Cheese exhibited at the recent Royal Show was of a uniformly high standard. The manufacture and preparation of most of the exhibits left nothing to be desired, and reflected credit on the makers. With regard to the staging of the cheese, I would suggest that instead of being sloping, as at present, this be made level.

#### BUTTER.

Mr. P. J. Carroll, Government Expert, Melbourne.

In connection with classes for salted and fresh butter, the only outstanding feature was the paucity of exhibits. The butter was of the usual quality, with a few exceptions.

In the class for powdered butter, the exhibits varied in quality and preparation.

## BACON, HAMS, ETC.

Mr. G. E. Battarbee, Warrnambool.

I think that, instead of having 6 Sides of Bacon, the number should be reduced to Two—One Smoked, and One Unsmoked. The competition would be greater, and there would then be plenty of space. Prizes, I think, could be increased with advantage, and Highly Commended and Commended Cards awarded. These would be appreciated in the Dairy Produce, more, perhaps, than in any other Section.

## APICULTURE.

#### Mr. J. T. Chambers, Beekeepers' Supply Co., Swanstonstreet, Melbourne.

Exhibits were scanty and poor in the Apiculture Section. The exhibits, with one or two exceptions, being those of one trading firm, exhibiting in triplicate. Apiculture having long since passed the experimental stages (there being in Victoria hundreds of successful honey producers), no value whatever attaches to exhibits of apiarian appliances. The exhibition of these goods is a commercial speculation, as in the case of all other goods, and no bonus is needed, or of any value, except to the exhibitor. I respectfully beg to suggest that, in future, prizes for only honey and beeswax of different grades should be offered. (1) That each grade of honey should be of the previous season's gathering, and its source of supply named 

# WOMEN'S INDUSTRIES.

Mrs. Harvey Smith, Upper Beaconsfield, and Mrs. Cole, 368 Ascot Vale-road, Moonee Ponds.

The increase in entries upon previous years clearly demonstrates that the Women's Section is rapidly springing into public favour, and, although only instituted three years ago, fully justifies its inclusion, as part of the Royal Show. As regards the exhibits in general, a great improvement was manifest in the quality of the work shown, so much so that in several sections the awarding of prizes was most difficult. The work of the unsuccessful competitors was very little inferior to that of the prize winners, more particularly the Hand Embroidery, on linen or lawn. The artistic design, fineness and accuracy of the work being excellent.

Crochet Tray Cloths is a very popular entry, and created great rivalry amongst exhibitors. Here again we have to favourably comment on design and work. Knitted Socks showed that great pains had been taken, some of the socks being quite equal to any of the finest machine-make, being regular and even in stitch, and clearly shows that knitting of socks in the home is not yet a lost art. Though one or two articles of canvas work were good, the majority of the exhibitors appear to lose sight of the fact that correct crossing of the stitch is an important detail.

The Lace Classes were not patronised so well as in previous years, though some good work was shown. On our visits to country shows we have noticed that a collection of Plain and Fancy Needlework makes a most effective entry, and we suggest that this item be added to next year's schedule.

#### FOODS.

Miss Gertrude M. Lee, Brunswick Cookery Centre.

The exhibit of Foods was good in parts, but not good enough for such an institution as the Royal Agricultural Show. The pickles and the preserves stand out as worthy of the highest commendation. 229
