TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1899.

PERMANENT BUIDINGS AND WORKS.

Last year it was mentioned that at the December meeting in 1898, the Council had adopted a report recommending a number of important alterations and improvements in the grounds. All the works proposed in that report have been carried out during the year, the principal items being: Metal road from side gate to front entrance, £142; additions and alterations to pig shed, £334; ventilation of sheep shed, £21; new horse wash, £21; accommodation under grand stand steps, £263 13s.; cinder track round trotting course, £57; new sanitary accommodation, (behind restaurant,) £128, (for members of Society), £177 16s.; extra cattle pens and telephone office, £224 10s. 2d.; and other general minor items bring the outlay on improvements for the year up to £1731 19s. 6d., making the total expenditure on buildings and works at the grounds £35,791 16s. 2d.

LAPSED AUTUMN SHOW.

As stated in the previous report the Council arranged to hold an Autumn Exhibition on the Show Grounds in March. attractive and varied programme of prizes was prepared and published; the Show was freely advertised and also well paragraphed, the Society receiving valuable assistance from the press in this connection. Notwithstanding the publicity given to the proposed event, the response of Exhibitors was so disappointing that immediately after the entries closed, the Special Show Committee was summoned to consider the position. After hearing a detailed statement of the number received, they resolved that in consequence of the paucity of entries the Show should not be held, and that the decision should be at once notified to the press. Intending exhibitors were informed that the show was abandoned, and their entry fees were in due course The cost incurred in connection with the returned to them. Show for advertising, printing, and other expenses amounted to £149 15s. 11d. The result of this proposed new departure goes to prove that the great bulk of exhibitors prefer to concentrate their energies on one big event in the year and to make it a conspicuous success, rather than to divide their efforts between two Shows; and it also settles the hitherto annually recurring question of holding an Autumn Show on the Society's grounds, at any rate until entirely new conditions arise.

THE EXHIBITION.

PERCHANGER TO A SECTION OF A N D - WOLLD

The Annual Exhibition was held on the 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th September. The prize schedule was carefully prepared, with a view to making it as comprehensive as possible, and the varied programme attracted 5,006 entries, this being a record number of exhibits, the Society for the first time turning the corner into the sixth thousand. The entry fees and ground rent, an annually increasing item, reached £882 11s., against £775 16s. last year. The gate money, including £365 17s. 6d. at the grand stand, amounted to £3,195 11s. 6d., being £881 6s. 2d. in advance of the previous year. Dealing with the Exhibits in the order of the schedule, the draught horses (122 entries) showed an advance of 20 in numbers from the year before, the high standard and great improvement specially recorded in last report being well maintained. In thoroughbreds there were only 5 entries, the section

being poorly represented. Two Arab stallions were shown as extras. Trotters (27 entries) made a strong section, while in roadsters there was but I entry, and 4 Clevelands were shown. Breeding ponies (21 entries) were 5 behind last year, but there was good competition. In heavy-weight hunters (6 entries) the field was the smallest for some years, and in light-weight hunters (18 entries) there was a falling off of 11 from last year's large entry. Juvenile hunters (13 entries) 10 ahead of the year before, was the largest entry yet received for this class. Ladies' hunters (8 entries) were I behind the previous year, and high jumpers (5 entries) were 8 short of last year. Hackneys (15 entries) were good classes, and ladies' hackneys (5 entries) were I in advance of the year before, while cavalry and mounted riflemen's horses were as last year, small classes. Carriage, brougham and buggy horses (32 entries) were about as last year in number, and of somewhat improved quality, and there were 8 entries of spring cart horses. Saddle and harness ponies (42 entries) I in advance of last year, were attractive classes. Shorthorn cattle (139 entries) showed an increase of 31 from the year before, and the usual high standard of the prize-taking animals was well maintained. Herefords (29 entries), 7 ahead of last year, were again of great merit. Polled Angus (7 entries), the same as last year, still showed the falling off specially commented on in the previous report. In Red Polls 2 cows were shown, but for the third time in succession there were no entries in Devons. Ayrshires (239 entries) were 48 in advance of last year's largely increased entry, and Jerseys (121 entries) 8 more than the year before, were an attractive section, strengthened by recent importations. Holsteins (7 entries) were about as last year, and although classes were provided for Kerries and Dexter Kerries, these breeds were There were 18 entries of dairy cows, and entries of milch cows subject to test, with five pens of dairy heifers, one of the features of the show being the largely increased entry in all the principal cattle sections. There were again 16 exhibits of fat cattle, and 3 heifers were paid up for, for the cattle Derbies. Merino sheep (23 entries) were again a small section. Lincolns (66 entries) were 17 in advance of the previous year, and Leicesters (29 entries) were 4 ahead. Leicesters (43 entries) showed an increase of 20 from the year before, and Southdowns (21 entries) were 6 in advance; while Hampshires (19 entries) were 13 ahead. Shropshires (69 entries) again showed a large advance, and were for the second year in succession the largest section of sheep in the show.

prizes for pens of three sheep were introduced and resulted in excellent competition. In Cotswolds there were 8 entries, and in fat sheep 34, an increase in the latter of 14 entries. In Swine (176 entries) there was a very large increase, so that the extended accommodation was fully occupied. Poultry (501 entries) showed and increase of 39 exhibits, and Dogs (214 entries) an increase of 58—these exhibits for the first time not being required to come into the yards till the second day of the Show. Carriages and buggies (181 entries) were 58 short of the previous year, but still formed an important section, and in saddlery and harness there were 28 entries, or 3 behind the year before. Farm produce (64 entries) showed an advance of 20 exhibits. Dairy produce (157 entries) were 24 ahead. Wines, &c. (207 entries), were 10 in advance of the year before. Preserves-dried fruits, &c. (25 entries) were 9 ahead of last year, and there were again 4 exhibits of artificial manures. There were 169 stands of machinery (in motion), implements, and miscellaneous exhibits—the largest collection ever brought together on the grounds. The weather, although unfavourable on the Vice-regal day, was the best that has been experienced by the Society for years, and the attendance was very satisfactory, it having been publicly asserted that there were more country people in town in connection with the Show than there were at Cup time. On all hands the increasing importance of the event was commented on, and it may be fairly recorded that it was the best all round exhibition ever held by the Society.

FLOCK BOOK.

The Central Committee of the Flock Book are continuing to receive and file the annual returns in connection with the flocks registered in the first volume of the Book. They have arranged to appoint a delegate to the International Conference of sheep-breeders to be held in England at York, in June, 1900. The Committee has also recommended the Council to undertake the publication of a Flock Book for Merino Sheep in Australia, and correspondence has been already opened up with the other colonies to ascertain what support will be received before actually undertaking the work, which it is proposed shall be carried out on somewhat similar lines to those so successfully adopted in connection with the Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep in Victoria.

CHAMBER OF AGRICULTURE.

At the Annual Meeting in February the retiring President, Mr. Skene, threw out a suggestion for the establishment of a Chamber of Agriculture, which was supported by Mr. Peppin, who afterwards proposed that a Committee should be appointed to deal with the matter. This was done and the Committee recommended that the Society should take the initiative in calling a Conference, to be held during Show week, to establish a Chamber on such lines as the Conference might adopt—the proposed objects of the Chamber being to assist, protect, encourage, and promote the general welfare of the agricultural and producing interests of the colony. A large and representative Conference was held in the Board room adjoining the Society's office on the evening of the 7th September, Mr. Thomson, the President of the Society, being elected chairman, when the following resolutions were passed:—

- "That in the opinion of this meeting it is advisable to form an Association, having for its objects the care and protection of the general interests of producers, the promotion of Agriculture in the colony, and the encouragement of minor industries and mixed farming; to advocate improved methods of cultivation, treatment, and marketing of products; to collect and diseminate information on all matters of interest to the agricultural community; to prevent, as far as possible, the introduction and spread of pests; to foster the desire of our cultivators for technical and scientific knowledge appertaining to their industry; to use every means in its power for the redress of greivances; to form a code of practice whereby the transaction of business may be simplified and facilitated; to arbitrate on all matters submitted by disputants, and to record decisions for future guidance; and that steps be now taken to form such an Association, to be called THE V1CTORIAN CHAMBER OF AGRICULTURE."
- "That the Chamber shall consist of a Central body, with branches throughout the colony."
- "That the Council of the Central body shall consist of 40 members—25 to be elected by the contributing Agricultural Societies, 5 by contributing Dairying Companies, 5 by contributing Viticultural and Horticultural Societies, and 5 by individual members of the Chamber."
- "That each contributing Society shall have the privilege of nominating a candidate for a seat on the Central Council."
- "That the Annual Subscription for Societies shall be £1 for every 100 members (or part of 100) up to 500, £1 for every Dairying Company, and 10s. for every individual member."

- "That any person engaged in, or interested in, agriculture, viticulture, horticulture, or dairying shall be eligible as a candidate for membership, and, after election, shall be, on payment of his subscription, eligible for election to any vacant seat on the Council."
- "That candidates nominated by agricultural and kindred societies and dairying companies be elected in the manner following
 - (a) A printed list of candidates duly nominated to be sent to each contributing body.
 - (b) Each contributing body, through its Committee or managing body, to mark with a number the name of each candidate in their order of choice.
 - (c) The paper then to be sent to the Council of the Central body, whose President, or his deputy, shall act as returning-officer to determine which candidates have been elected; counting the votes by the number against each name, those having the lowest aggregate totals to be declared elected.
 - (d) In the event of a number of societies forming themselves into a group, they shall have power to elect as many members of Council as will form their fair proportion of the number to be elected."
- "That individual members shall elect their 5 representatives by ordinary ballot."
- "That the Committee appointed by The Royal Agricultural Society to prepare proposals, viz.:—Messrs. W. Thomson, Kyneton; F. Peppin, Loch; and T. Skene, Armadale and Rupanyup—be appointed by the Conference to enroll societies and members, to conduct the first election of Council, and generally to bring the Chamber into working order."
- "That Mr. T. Patterson be appointed Secretary, pro tem."
- "That a hearty vote of thanks be passed to the Chairman."

The Committee appointed to enroll societies and members has taken the necessary action, and has asked for subscription and nominations for 31st December, after which date the first Council of the Chamber will be elected. Mr Peppin has been nominated as representative of this Society.

THE JOURNAL.

The agreement with Messrs. J. Twomey & Co., the proprietors of The Farmer and Grazier, with which the journal of the

Society is incorporated, has been again renewed for 12 months on the same terms as before, and is being carried on very satisfactorily. The show number of the paper this year attracted particular attention. It is of special interest to members of the Society, as it contains an illustrated article on the early history of the Institution.

THE COUNCIL.

At their first meeting in February, the Council (in accordance with the new rules), elected Mr. William Thomson, president, and Messrs. J. K. Joynt, George Young and A. McCracken, vice-presidents. In October, Sir Rupert Clarke, Bart., resigned his seat on the Council on account of leaving the colony on a tour, after having held office for 14 months. Mr. H. Cliff was elected in his place. During the year two members, Mr. D. Mitchell and Mr. D. Gibson, lost their seats through non-attendance and were re-elected.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their obligations to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Brassey for their kind patronage of the Society's show. They also thank the Hon. the Minister of Agriculture for again granting Gold and Silver Medals for Champion Prizes. They desire to record their warm thanks to. the donors of prizes, the list being again headed by His Excellency Lord Brassey, for their very liberal support. They thank the Judges at the Show for the very valuable honorary services, and the Stewards for their active aid, and they cordially acknowledge the enterprise of the press in giving publicity to the show, the illustrations this year having been particulary attractive. They thank the Shropshire Sheep Breeder's Association, Shrewsbury, England, for their Gold Medal. They desire to acknowledge receipt of a bound copy of The Farmer and Grazier for 1898 from Mr. J. Twomey, and several pamphlets from the Department of Agriculture, all of which form welcome additions to the Society's library.

GENERAL

(THE COLLECTOR).

Mr. A. Howlett, who had been appointed Collector to the Society in the previous year, resigned in February, and Mr. Noel E. Ruck was appointed in his place.

(MEMBERSHIP).

Last year it was reported that the Council had taken specially active measures to increase the number of subscribers to the Society, with a considerable amount of success. This year the work has been continued, with the gratifying result that the Society has now over 1,000 subscribers on its roll. This is a record number of members for the Society, and indeed for any Agricultural Society in Australia.

(TROOPS AT SHOW GROUNDS).

On the first occasion of the Government of the Colony's ending Troops to South Africa, the Council placed the Show Grounds at the disposal of the Mounted Rifles as an encampment, free of charge, and afterwards received a letter from Colonel Price, thanking them for having done so. The Grounds have again been placed at the disposal of the Defence Department for the accommodation of the Second Contingent.

(TECHNICAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATION).

In last report it was stated that the Society had appointed delegates to a Conference which had determined to establish an Association for the promotion of Technical Education. The Society subscribed to the Association which was duly formed, the Secetary being elected to the Council and Mr. Skene to a vacancy in the Vice-Presidents. Shortly after the establishment of the Association, the Government appointed a Commission on Technical Education which practically cut the ground from under the feet of this Association.

FINANCE.

On reference to the financial statement which has been carefully audited (vide report below) it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounts to £6521 14s. 9d. and the expenditure to £6197 5s. 5d. (including £1659 7s. prize money). The revenue exceeds that of the previous year by £1162 10s. 5d.; the overdraft at the Bank has been reduced by £324 9s. 4d.; while during the year £1731 19s. 6d. has been expended in permanent buildings and works. This latter sum is an investment, so that practically the working expenses show a profit on the year of £2056 8s. 10d., including provision for £149 15s. 11d. loss on lapsed Autumn Show. The overdraft stands at £4053 4s. 7d., against £4377 13s. 11d. last year.

RULES.

- 1. The Society shall be called The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.
- 2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial Resources of the colony.
 - (1.) By holding Exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions, if deemed desirable.
 - (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meeting papers may be read and discussed.
 - (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications, Scientific and other works, as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
 - (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
 - (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
 - (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit: and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
 - (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person, if thought fit—who shall ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice—for any loss incurred by such experiments.
- 3. The Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.
- 4. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the annual meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company any one member of such firm or director of such company may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.
- 5. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.
- 6. The Society shall be managed by a Council consisting of thirty-two members elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society as hereinafter provided and also the Trustees who shall be ex-officio members of the Council.
- 7. One-half of the Council, except the Trustees, shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 8. The Trustees shall hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.
- 9. The Council shall, at their first meeting after the annual election in each year, elect out of their own number (which includes the Trustees) a President and three Vice-Presidents.
- 10. The Council shall have the entire management of the income and funds of the Society, and all other affairs thereof.
- 11. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers of the Society.

- 12. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members; nominations having been submitted at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council. The Honorary Scientific Members shall retire annually, and shall be eligible for re-election.
- 13. Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.
- 14. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.
- 15. The Council shall be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as shall from time to time be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new one proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each member of the Council.
- 16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the second Tuesday in January following, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid and an Honorary Auditor, and to nominate gentleman to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members nominated by them to fill the vacancies, to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.
- 17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in February, at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be submitted, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.
- 18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. Every such ballot paper shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at three o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

- 19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding financial year shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).
- 20. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies in the Council.
- 21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society, but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.
- 22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council, but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution at the subsequent Ordinary Meeting.
- 23. The privileges of Membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Readingroom and Lectures, and, with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds, and grand stands at all times. And while the Society publishes a monthly journal, a copy shall be posted free to each member.
- 24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its General Meetings, its Meetings of Council, its Exhibitions or other objects, shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.
- 25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

- 1. Notice of the Preliminary, Annual, and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division is called for. At every Annual General Meeting the minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and the minutes of the preceding Preliminary General Meeting, shall be read and confirmed; a report, together with a financial statement from the Council, shall be submitted, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report and comment thereon, or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.
- 2. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.
- 3. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting, nominations to be made at the former meeting and elections to take place at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

4. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name or on the behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

- 5. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such aday and at such an hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at its discretion.
- 6. At the monthly meetings the Council shall have full power tooriginate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought beforeit; provided that if any three Members present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, they may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.
- 7. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.
- 8. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.
- 9. If within half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if one only be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment, providing that no meeting shall be held on a public holiday, and should an Ordinary Meeting fall on a holiday the Secretary shall be empowered to postpone the date of such meeting, and call it not later than ten days after the date on which it otherwise would have been held.
- 10. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.
- 11. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of the Council, and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary, Honorary Scientific, and Corresponding Members, officers, and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibition.
- 12. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or takeaction on any special matter relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

- 13. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.
- 14. No money shall be drawn from the society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Financial Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. Entries shall be made of all such payments.
- 15. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council withou leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.
- 16. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or other Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.
- 17. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should none of these officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall chose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.
 - 18. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.
- 19. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—
 - (1.) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting.
 - (2.) Business arising from minutes.
 - (3.) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies.
 - (4.) Finance Committee's Report.
 - (5.) Correspondence.
 - (6.) Postponed business.
 - (7.) Motions.
 - (8.) Notices of motions.
- 20. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.
- 21. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

- 22. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in February as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year, two Members of Committee to form a quorum.
 - 23. The President shall be ex officio a Member of all Committees.
- 24. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for the year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion.
- 25. All Committees shall make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall hold office until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the first Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease, providing that Standing Committees shall retain office till their successors are appointed.

THE SECRETARY.

- 26. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and of Committees, and shall keep all the Society's books. He shall also conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.
- 27. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's bankers. He shall have the charge of the expenditure of petty cash.
- 28. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.
- 29. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.
- 30. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

31. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

32. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's funds, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting in the following form:—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented at the Meeting of the Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

- 33. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.
- 34. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.
- 35. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.
- 36. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, assisted by an honorary auditor, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
