SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL

OF THE

Rational Agricultural Society of Pictopia,

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1886 :---

TENURE OF SHOW GROUNDS.

In the last Report it was stated that the Council, at the suggestion of the Government of which Mr. Service was Premier. had had a bill drafted conferring on the Society power to borrow money on mortgage, which had been forwarded to the Cabinet for consideration; but that no reply had been received regarding it. Nor was any afterwards received. The Council, therefore, took action to interview Mr. Dow, the present Minister of Lands who said he thought he could support the suggestion of having a bill passed through Parliament to grant the Society the fee simple of the grounds, so that the deed might be a negotiable article, on the security of which the Council could The bill which had already been drafted borrow money. was accordingly submitted to the Minister and Secretary for Lands, when, on consideration, they suggested that instead of going on with it, certain clauses similar to those in the Scotch Church grant, giving the Society power to mortgage, might be introduced into the deed. This suggestion was adopted, when it was afterwards found that something further was required, and that a clause to the effect that the Governor-in-Council should first sanction the amount of mortgage, and that in the event of the Society failing to comply with its obligations, the Government should have power to resume possession, the mortgage being a first charge on the land. This was consented to by the Minister. The Trustees then temporarily surrendered the deed, in order that a fresh one might be issued embodying those clauses; which, while they will not give the Society power to absolutely sell the land, will be sufficient to make the deed a security on which the Council will be able to borrow any sum of money required in connection with existing or further improvements. Although the matter is at present delayed by the Crown Law Department, it is hoped that before long it will be satisfactorily arranged.

ERECTION OF GRAND STAND.

In January a report of the Works Committee, in favour of the erection of a grand stand on the show-grounds was adopted by the Council. Messrs. Billing and Son, architects, were directed to prepare plans and specifications for a stand, in which there would be accommodation for 2000 people. In March, the tender of Messrs. Martin and Peacock, for £3993, was accepted. Mr. Rees Davies was appointed Clerk of Works, and the work was at once pushed on by the Contractors. Afterwards the tender of Messrs. Martin and Peacock, of £580 16s., for enclosing and flooring the space below the stand was accepted, and the whole was satisfactorily completed in time for the show. The total cost of the building, including Architects, Clerk of Works, and extras, amounted to £5269 17s. 7d.

OTHER BUILDINGS.

Alterations and additions which were much required were made to the office accommodation on the show grounds. There is now a Secretary's office with a press room attached, a judge's room with lavatories and conveniences for refreshments, and a Council Meeting-room, which additions have very much facilitated the carrying out of the business of the Show.

THE EXHIBITION.

The Exhibition, which was held on the 25th, 26th, 27th, and 28th August, was an altogether unprecedented success with regard to attendance, while there was such an increase in the number of exhibits—particularly in the live stock classes—that a large amount of extra accommodation had to be put up after the entries closed. The Council issued a very liberal programme of prizes, amounting in the aggregate to considerably over £2000, of which £854 3s. was contributed by private donors, and £500 was offered by the Parliament of Victoria, as Grand Champion Prizes of Australia. The total number of entries was 2478, and the amount of money taken for admission during the four days of the Show, including £609 15s. for the grand stand, was £3265 1s. 3d. The amount received for the privilege of supplying refreshments and catering was £425, and for the right of printing

catalogues, £131 10s.; while the sum received for entry fees and ground rent was £279 0s. 5d. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horse sections were well filled with animals of the usual high standard, which is now looked for in this class of stock at the Society's Shows. The thoroughbreds were limited in number. The trotters and roadsters, which were mostly driven on the grounds, attracted considerable attention. The heavy and lightweight hunters, for which there were 34 entries in all, and the ladies' hunters, for which there were seven entries, were excellent The trials, which were witnessed from the grand stand, classes. were a great attraction to the public. Unfortunately, in the lightweight hunters, one of the horses fell and injured his rider so severely that a few days afterwards he died from the effects of the fall. There was a good turn out of hackneys, and a fine lot of ponies. In the carriage horse class, His Excellency the Governor offered valuable special prizes for the best pair of coaching colts, for which, however, only one entry came forward. His Excellency has promised to continue his prizes, so that it is to be hoped they will stimulate breeders to produce a class of stock very much wanted in the Colony. In buggy horses there were a few good exhibits. A rough-riding contest, for which there were five entries, was held on the grounds, and proved a great attrac-The shorthorn cattle, of which 110 were entered, were tion. quite up to the high standard reached last year, and as a class were very much admired. The Herefords, although not nearly so numerous as the shorthorns, contained some exceptionally good exhibits. A few polled Angus cattle were shown. These cattle are gaining favour with Victorian breeders. The Ayrshires (75 entries) were very superior; competition in this class for the first time being intercolonial. Jerseys (80 entries) were also a superior class, containing many animals of the very best strains procurable, and brought out in splendid condition. For the first time a few Holstein cattle-a breed famed for the quantity of milk they produce-were exhibited. A number of Brittainies and dairy cattle were shown. A special prize of £20 was offered by the proprietors of The Leader for the best milk cow-to be tested during the three first days of the Show, as to the quantity of butter produced. There were thirteen entries, of which six went through the competition. The prize was won by an Alderney cow, which produced $118\frac{3}{4}$ lbs. of milk, $35\frac{3}{4}$ lbs. of cream, and 4 lbs. 13 ozs. of butter. There were a few pens of very fine grass. fed fat cattle. Three exhibits of West Highland cattle, which were shown as extras, attracted much attention, as they were quite a curiosity in an Australian Show-yard. The Merino sheep shown (57) were very good. 73 Lincoln and Leicester sheep of high quality, and a few pens of Downs and fat sheep, were shown. There were 94 exhibits of swine of a very superior class, including a number from South Australia; and 153 exhibits of poultry, a considerable improvement being noticeable in this class, in which,

also, the competition was intercolonial; while dogs were scarcely as well represented as they were last year. There was a large and very fine collection of carriages, buggies, and other vehicles, and some good exhibits of harness. There were some excellent exhibits of cheese, butter, and bacon, but a poor display of farm produce. A few good exhibits of wine were shown, but in these two last classes there is great room for extension. The display of agricultural machinery and implements, together with laboursaving appliances and stands of exhibits, was the best yet seen on an Australian Show-ground, and was so extensive and varied, that the opinion was very generally expressed that the time during which the exhibits in this department remained on the ground should be extended, in order that they may be properly seen by visitors. The Melbourne Show, as it is usually called, has now grown to such dimensions that it stands out prominently as one of the great events of the year. The interest in it is not confined to Victoria, but extends throughout the sister colonies, whence come many exhibits as well as numerous visitors, so that the exhibition is quite intercolonial, or Australian, in character,

STUD BOOK.

In accordance with instructions received from the Committee appointed to deal with this matter, the Secretary wrote to England for a copy of the Clydesdale Stud Book, together with entry forms, all of which were received in due course. The Committee then recommended that the Council should undertake to compile a Victorian Draught Horse Stud Book. As the draught breeds had been so much mixed up, the Committee considered it impossible to have a Clydesdale Stud Book, so they recommended the establishment of a Stud Book which would be a record of the draught horses of the colony, admitting both the English Shire and Clydesdale breeds, but distinguishing between them. They also recommended the appointment of a Committee to go fully into details and draw up a scheme. The report was adopted, and the members of the previous Committee were again appointed to deal with the subject. They have not yet reported to the Council.

DEFINITION OF BREEDER.

A question which was first asked by a correspondent in the Society's Journal, viz :— "Whether an animal foaled in the colony, but got in England, was imported or colonial bred," was afterwards formally submitted to the Council tor decision, when the following rulings, which it is considered advisable to record here, were given, viz.:— "That an animal born in the colony, no matter where its sire and dam were mated, be classed as colonial bred;" and, "That the owner of the dam at the time an animal is born be held to be the breeder."

PAPERS.

Mr. E. M. Curr read a paper before the Council in June on "The prohibition of the importation of stock," and in December Mr. J. C Cochrane read one on "The mananagement of the Society's Exhibition." Both papers were published in full in the Society's Journal.

THE JOURNAL.

Incidental allusion has already been made to the Society's Journal, which has been conducted so far successfully, while the interest in it has been well maintained. It is to be regretted, however, that members of the Society do not avail themselves more freely of its columns for the discussion of subjects of practical To a certain extent they have done so, but it is worthy interest. of note that in some of the valuable papers-particularly American ones-received in exchange for the Journal, the great bulk of the matter is made up of letters from correspondents, resulting in the accummulation of a mass of practical information. Many of the articles appearing in the Journal have been purposely written with the object of eliciting criticism resulting in correspondence, in which regard they have not been unsuccessful; but it is hoped that members of the Society will in the future be less backward than they have been in using its columns as a means of giving publicity to their ideas on all matters relating to agricultural and pastoral pursuits.

VEGETABLE PRODUCTS COMMISSION REPORT.

In February a communication was received from the Secretary of the Royal Commission on Vegetable Products, stating that it was the intention of the Commission to issue progress reports of the evidence taken, and asking the Society to distribute them. The Council at once undertook their distribution as requested. Three separate progress reports, which contain information of great value to the farming community, have been received, and a copy has been sent by post to each member of the Society.

FEDERATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

In the last report it was stated that the Federation of the Societies had been organised, and a promise had been obtained from the Premier of a grant of money being placed on the estimates, in order that the scheme might be set in motion; while Mr. Dow had given notice of his intention to introduce a bill into Parliament, giving the federation movement legislative recognition. Owing to a change in the Ministry the matter was delayed. After Mr. Dow was appointed Minister of Agriculture a deputation waited on him to ask him to carry out the promise of the Premier of a grant of money. At this deputation the Minister said that, before he moved further in the matter, he would like to have an expression of opinion from the societies of the colony as to whether they were in favour of the federation scheme being carried out to completion, and worked on an independent basis; or whether they were in favour of the scheme being allowed to lapse into the Council of Agricultural Education. The Central Board has accordingly issued a circular inviting an expression of opinion, to which replies are now being received.

THE COUNCIL.

In May the Hon. W. McCulloch, M.L.C., resigned his seat on the Council in consequence of change of residence. Mr. McCulloch, who was a member of the first Council of the Society, was elected a vice-president in 1872, which position he held for two years, when he retired from the Council till 1882, when he was again elected. Mr. J. M. Peck was elected in the room of Mr. M'Culloch. In August a vacancy was reported in the Council through the death of Mr. Hugh Lennon. Mr. Lennon, who was elected to the Council in 1874, was one of its most active members, as well as one of the best supporters of the Society's exhibitions. In 1878 Mr. Lennon held the office of President, and on several occasions he read valuable practical papers before the members of the Society. The Council ordered that a letter of condolence be written to his widow, expressing their deep regret at the loss sustained through his death. Mr. John Bond was elected in the room of Mr. Lennon. In October Mr. Job Smith resigned his seat on the Council in consequence of having gone to reside in England. Mr. Smith, who was elected in 1874, was one of the most indefatigable workers in the Society. He was President during the year 1879. Mr. Smith's resignation was accepted with regret, and a letter was written to him thanking him for his many services to the Society. Mr. John Jones was elected in his place. In December Mr. Robert Simson resigned his seat on the Council. Mr. Simson was held in such high esteem that on three different occasions (1872, 1874, and 1880) he was unanimously elected President. Mr. Simson's resignation was accepted with great regret, and a letter was written to him thanking him for his valuable services. In the same month Mr. Francis Henty resigned his seat in consequence of inability to attend as regularly as he would wish. Mr. Henty has since consented to allow himself to be re-elected. In the same month also Mr. Samuel Gardiner lost his seat through non-attendance. Mr. Gardiner, who was elected to the Council in 1875, was for several years one of the vice-presidents of the Society.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their high appreciation of thesupport of His Excellency the Governor and Lady Loch in connection with the Society's Exhibition, as they are much indebted to His Excellency for the influence of his example in materially assisting the Society's prize fund; and are deeply sensible of the kindly interest manifested by Lady Loch in her visits to the grounds, which have done much to popularise the They also wish to thank the Government and Exhibition. Parliament of Victoria for continuing the special vote for Grand Champion Prizes of Australia, which give rise to a keen spirit of emulation amongst breeders and producers; and the Government for granting a public holiday on the official opening day of the They beg to convey their thanks to the donors of prizes-Show. for the handsome amounts they contributed to the prize fund. They also thank the judges at the Show for the careful performance of their really onerous duties, and the stewards for their active services. They wish specially to allude to, and to acknowledge, the invaluable assistance they have received from the press, which has been a most important factor in bringing the Society to its present position.

FINANCE.

On reference to the financial statement, which has been carefully audited (vide report next page), it will be seen that the receipts for the year, including £17 19s. cash in hand from the previous year, amounted to £7,266 10s. 10d., and the expenditure to £10,379 13s. 6d., the overdraft being thereby increased from £6,435 3s. 6d. to £9,548 6s. 2d. This overdraft will shortly be reduced by about £1,200 by the payment by the Government of the Grand Champion Prizes, which, although handed over to the winners, had not at the end of the year been received by the Society; and by the Government subsidy on the prizes awarded at the last Show. The amount expended in buildings during the year was £6,004 3s. 5d., bringing the total expenditure on permanent works on the Show Grounds up to £18,085 13s. 2d.



RULES.

1. The Society shall be called "THE NATIONAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY OF VICTORIA."

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :—

- (1.) By holding Exhibitions, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions.
- (2.) By holding Meetings, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which Meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from agricultural publications and scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.
- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved

C

original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9.) By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The President, Vice-Presidents and Trustees shall be elected from the class of Governors, being, or having been, members of Council; and the Trustees may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound, annually in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Provided that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members, including the President, Vice-Presidents and three Trustees, to be elected from the class of Governors only; the remainder to be elected indiscriminately from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society.

9. One half of the Council, excepting the President and Trustees, shall retire annually, but be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society. 13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint Auditors, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance-sheet shall be read, all office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

19. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

20. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next Monthly Council.

21. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of all office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions and grounds at all times.

22. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and if found guilty shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

23. These rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

BY-LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper; provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council, at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election, shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his Deputy shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, and the ballot shall be kept open from 12 noon to 3 p.m.

5. To allow of a ballot being taken, printed lists of the Governors and Members duly proposed shall be given by the Secretary to each Member of the Society present, two scrutineers shall be chosen, and each Member desiring to vote shall hand to the Chairman his copy of the said list, with such names erased therefrom as he may think fit. Any list containing more than the requisite number of names unerased shall be rejected by the scrutineers. 6. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

7. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

8. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

9. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes, on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object, and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

10. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

11. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

12. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if only one be present, or the Secretary if no Member be present, may adjourn such Meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

13. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

14. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members. officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all Exhibitors, or their assistants, at the Society's Exhibitions.

15. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

16. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

17. No money shall be drawn from the Society's Banking Account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or Members of Council, at the Meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the Monthly Meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a Monthly or Special Council shall be five

21. At every Monthly Meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—1. Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. 2. Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. 3. Finance Committee's Report. 4. Postponed business. 5. Correspondence. 6. Motions. 7. Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting in February shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in that month or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such Standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any Member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a Member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter-books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amount allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models, and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of $\pounds 500$, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form :—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Hon. Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an Audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
