# TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

#### GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1888:---

# TENURE OF SHOW GROUNDS.

In last year's report the action taken with regard to procuring a new deed was explained; and it was stated that the Council had resolved to accept the deed in the form approved by the Crown Solicitor, viz., with clauses relating to borrowing money similar to those in the Scots' Church grant. These clauses, while they do not allow the Society to part with the fee simple of the land, give the trustees power to borrow any sum of money up to £15,000 on the security of the land and the rent and profits thereof. The deed in the form stated has been procured and lodged with the Bank of Victoria.

# PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

Extensive improvements have been carried out on the show grounds during the past year. The railway entrance to the yards was altered, and a new poultry house and a dog house on most approved plans were erected near the entrance gates. The carriage shed was enlarged, a wine room was constructed under the grand stand, and the whole of the original buildings and the picket fencing were painted, the Council wishing to make the grounds present an attractive appearance in Centennial year. The cost of the poultry house was £773 10s. 4d., the dog house £791 5s., additions to carriage shed £731 7s. 11d., painting and other works £839 6s. 9d. These are the contract prices which, with the extras on the contract and the expenditure on additional stalls for cattle, erected after the entries for the show were made, involved an outlay of £4,303 1s. 8d., making the total expenditure on permanent buildings and works on the grounds £24,437 2s. 8d.

#### THE EXHIBITION.

The Annual Exhibition took place on the 28th, 29th, 30th, and 31st August and 1st September. In view of the Centennial International Exhibition being about to be held, early action was taken to insure a specially good show of live stock, so that visitors might be made acquainted with the high standard reached by breeders in the Australasian Colonies. A deputation from the Council waited on the Government, and obtained a special grant of £500 from the Minister of Agriculture, to be offered as Centennial International Prizes for live stock, in addition to the usual £500 offered as Grand Champion Prizes of Australia. An exceedingly liberal prize list was issued, in which over £3000 was offered for competition, £819 18s. of this amount having been received as private donations. The total number of entries at the Show amounted to 2992, the live stock entries being largely increased from the previous year, while the entries in some of the other classes-probably owing to the Exhibitionwere scarcely so numerous as last year. Unfortunately the weather on the principal days of the Show was very unfavourable, and the attendance was not so good as on the corresponding days of the previous year. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horse stock, of which there were 131 entries, were particularly good, and maintained a very high standard throughout. The thoroughbred section, although containing one, or two good exhibits, was again the weakest in point of number in the Show. The trotters and roadsters, of which there were 50 entries, were very good, and attracted much attention. Hackneys were fairly represented, and there was a fine show of ponies. In buggy horses there were some good exhibits, but in carriage stock the judges did not think the exhibits of sufficient merit to justify them in awarding His Excellency the Governor's special prize. The show of heavy and light-weight hunters was again an excellent one, and the high-jumping contest was one of the best exhibitions of jumping ever seen. A rough-riding contest was also carried out on the grounds. Shorthorn cattle (162 entries) were of an exceptionally high class. Herefords (32 entries) were also remarkably good. Polled Angus (86 entries) were very well represented, and when it is remembered that in 1886 there were only 4 exhibits of these cattle, their increase must be considered remarkable. Ayrshires (171 entries) and Jerseys (91

entries) were also particularly well represented, and there were a few Holsteins and Brittanies, as well as some excellent exhibits of fat stock. The Leader Special Prize for the best milch cow subject to test was keenly competed for, the first prizes for weight of butter and quantity of milk being both won by a Merino sheep (34 entries), Lincolns (61 entries), Holstein cow. and Leicesters (48 entries), were of a very high class, and there were several pens of Downs and fat sheep. The exhibition of swine was the largest and best yet held by the Society, there being 122 entries. Poultry (207 entries) and dogs (129 entries) contained very high-class exhibits, but, owing to an injunction from the Supreme Court, the latter had to be removed from the grounds after they were judged. Carriages and buggies, of which there were 139 entries, were not so numerously represented as last year. The dairy produce section, consisting of butter, cheese, hams, bacon, &c., was a very creditable one-the best the Society has yet held. The wine exhibits, although not numerous, contained some excellent samples, the new wine room being appreciated by both judges and exhibitors. The exhibition of machinery (in motion) implements and miscellaneous articles, although scarcely so large as on the previous year, was still an extensive and varied one. Although there was a falling off in the attendance owing to the adverse weather, the exhibition itself, taken as a whole, was the best yet held by the Society, and was pronounced on all hands to be a credit to the colony.

## THE TRAVELLING DAIRY.

The following report regarding the action taken to establish a travelling dairy is given at length for the information of subscribers.

"For some years letters have appeared in the papers charging the National Agricultural Society of Victoria with neglect in not giving more attention to the education of the farmers of the colony in the latest and most approved modes of dairy practice with a view to raising the status of the industry; and, on the 5th April, while the last Farmers' Conference was sitting in Melbourne, Dr. Plummer, the President of the Society, was interviewed by Mr. Whitley and other gentlemen, who suggested that that would be a most opportune time to hold a meeting to discuss the best mode of initiating a travelling dairy scheme and other means of educating the farmer, with a view to promoting an extensive export trade in Accordingly a meeting of members of the Council of the butter. Society and other gentlemen desirous of improving the status of the dairy industry was held at the Society's office on the 6th April. when, after a lengthy discussion, it was resolved that the Minister of Agriculture be asked by deputation for a grant of £5000, to be used for the development of the dairy industry of the colony by the

establishment of a travelling dairy and other practical means considered necessary for furthering the dairy interest. The Secretary was instructed to write to the Minister, asking him when he would receive the deputation; and also to obtain the support of a large number of members of Parliament who had been good enough to promise assistance. A Committee, consisting of Messrs, D. Whitley, Melbourne; D. Wilson, Mount Egerton; and R. W. Wightman, Alexandra, was appointed to act with a Committee of the National Society to carry out the project in the event of the deputation to the Minister being successful, the members of the Committee representing the National Society being :- Dr. Plummer (President), Messrs. T. Brunton, John Hurst, and Job Smith. On the 11th April the Minister received the deputation, which was a numerous and influential one, and was accompanied by a large number of members of Parliament. After the object of the deputation had been clearly stated and influentially supported, the Minister expressed his sympathy with the movement, and promised that if the Committee would draft a scheme of which he could approve he would grant the sum of £5000 asked for. On the 17th April the Committee met, and after a general discussion resolved that one plant capable of working the milk of 80 cows and another capable of working the milk of 20 cows be obtained, to be worked first at the Melbourne Show by experts and then to be travelled round to the country shows and worked at them; that a building 80 ft. x 60 be put up on the grounds of the National Society for the working dairy, and that the Committee provide for the payment of half cost of same ; that the country be divided into three districts and that one plant be obtained to be travelled and worked in each district by experts-in addition to those working at shows. It was also resolved that a grand Intercolonial Show of dairy produce should be held at some place in Melbourne, and that if a suitable gentleman could be secured in London to write a report as an expert on the whole subject of marketing, packing, &c., a report should be obtained from him, and that a sum should be set aside for providing means of cooling dairies in this warm climate by refrigerating or otherwise. A rough statement of proposed expenditure was set down as follows :---

The same day the Committee waited on the Minister and submitted their scheme, and suggested that the Hon. J. Buchanan, M.L.C., and Mr. Martin, the Secretary for Agriculture, or any other gentleman the Minister would suggest, be added to their number to represent the Government. After the scheme had been thoroughly discussed and the details fully explained, the Minister informed the Committee that they might go on with it and the Government would let them have money as required. The Committee thanked the Minister and withdrew. On the 20th a letter, dated 19th April, was received from the Minister, thanking the Committee for their co-operation, and stating that he had carefully considered the proposals submitted on the 17th inst., and that it would be undesirable to increase their number beyond, perhaps, the addition of Mr. Yeo, who would represent the northern localities, and that it would be inadvisable to appoint Mr. Martin for the reason that his time could not be spared from his departmental duties and that his position would be anomalous, as he would have to receive from the Committee all proposals of expenditure and attend to the payment of accounts. The letter further stated that the Minister wished to be relieved from the proposal to pay half the cost of a building on the National Society's Show Grounds, as it would form a precedent on which other important societies would base claims for similar concessions. The Minister concluded by saying he would be glad to receive from the Committee particulars as to the pattern plant they would recommend, and he would have it sent for at In consequence of this letter, of the 19th April, Dr. Plummer, once. the Chairman of the Committee, had an interview with Mr. Dow on the 25th, to inform him that, after conferring with several members of the Council of the National Agricultural Society, he thought he could release him from any responsibility as to the payment of half the cost of a building on their grounds for the working dairy. After this was determined, Dr. Plummer consulted generally with the Minister for some time on the action to be taken and the plants to be ordered, and received advice and suggestions from him with a view to placing them before the meeting of Committee, which he informed him would be held next day. At this meeting so held, after the letter of the 19th had been read, Dr. Plummer informed the Committee of his interview with Mr. Dow, assured them of the sympathy and co-operation of the Minister, and stated that they might go on with their work with every confidence. It was then resolved-That the clause of the letter relating to the payment of half cost of a building on the National Society's grounds be referred to the Council of the Society. That the Agent-General in London be requested to supply the most modern and economical working dairy plant for cheese and butter complete (excepting driving power) capable of working the milk of 80 cows, to arrive before

1st August. (It was intended to request the Minister to cable to the Agent-General in order to have the plant by date mentioned). That Mr. Bartram, the agent, be requested to order 3 Al (about 90 gallons per hour) Laval Separators, and four Baby (about 12 gallons per hour) Laval Separators. This was resolved, after full discussion, in which it was concluded that this was the best Separator to order, and as the agents had none on hand it was considered that the order should be given at once. That an advertisement be put in the papers inviting makers of dairy plants to communicate with the Secretary and to submit plans, specifications, particulars and prices of working dairy plants before Wednesday, May 9th, at noon. That the Committee advertise for a practical dairy expert to travel with working dairy, and give instructions to farmers-liberal salary to first-At noon, the day after the meeting (the earliest class man. possible opportunity), the Chairman and the Secretary called at the Minister's office to submit the minutes of the meeting for his approval. They found he was not there, and were informed that he would not be there on Saturday. As time was of the utmost consequence Dr. Plummer then instructed the Secretary to advertise in Saturday's papers for a plant and for an expertpursuant to resolution of Committee. On the 30th a letter was received from the Minister, dated 28th April, in which he conveyed his thanks to the gentlemen of the Committee for the trouble they had taken in outlining their ideas of a scheme by which the Government might aid towards an improvement in the butter and cheese-making industry of the Colony, and that he was pleased to find the ideas of the Committee coincided with his as to the desirability of making the travelling dairy system a leading feature in the scheme, and that he had decided to at once procure a plant for this purpose of the best type, together with the skilled labour necessary, and that he would be quite willing to exhibit the plant, in full working order, under the supervision of the Government dairy expert, at the National Society's Show. He then said that the Department of Agriculture, with the special facilities it possesses, had arranged its plan of operation and would now attend to all details of management. The Committee would, therefore, not be required to take further trouble in that direction, but the Minister would always be glad to receive any suggestion. In consequence of this letter, Dr. Plummer, the Chairman, called the Committee together on the The letter was read, and, after a discussion, a resolu-4th May. tion was passed to the effect that it be received, and that the Committee express surprise at its contents, as they fail to understand it after the promises already made. It was resolved that an account for expenses incurred be forwarded to the Minister, and the Committee adjourned sine die.

No further action would have been taken, but in consequence of the statements in the papers being so totally at variance with facts and misleading to the public, Dr. Plummer and other members of the Committee resolved to again call the Committee together to draw up a correct report of the proceedings in order to place the truth before the public. They also wish to refer particularly to an account of an interview with the Minister by a representative of the Daily Telegraph, published in that paper, which is totally misleading throughout, in which the Minister is asked the question—' But did you not in the first instance intend to place the management of the dairy in the hands of the Committee ?' to which Mr. Dow replied : 'No, certainly not.' As a matter of fact, when the Committee waited on Mr. Dow with their scheme on the 17th April, eight days after the large deputation had waited on him and obtained the promise of a grant, after it had been fully explained, the Minister told the Committee to go on with their scheme and he would supply the money as required, his words being-'If you go on we will let you have the money as you require it.' Mr. Dow is also reported to have said from what he had seen of the Committee he thought the scheme for making the dairy was not practicable, for instance (said he), 'one of their ideas was to send a dairy through the country, show the farmers how it was worked, and try to persuade them to buy similar ones.' As a matter of fact, Mr. Dow was not only aware all along that the Committee's idea was to send travelling dairies through the country, but he personally advised Dr. Plummer, at his interview with him on the 25th, as to the style of plant that should be procured for the purpose, and suggested 'that makers of plants would be only too willing to follow up by offering plants as required by the farmers at such terms as would enable them to get to work under the new system at once.' In an explanation in the Leader, purporting to be correct, it is stated that the Committee 'passed resolutions appointing an agent to visit England, &c.," which is not true. The statement that the Committee's sole object was to get £5000 unreservedly in their hands was deliberately untrue, as evidenced by the fact that they suggested on their first interview with the Minister that the Secretary for Agriculture be added to their number for the express purpose of supervising and dealing with the payment of accounts. It is impossible, however, to deal in detail with the whole of the incorrect statements published, but the Committee trust that they have said enough to prove the discourteous manner in which they have been treated by the Minister of Agriculture, and only now wish to add that had he at any one of the interviews with the Committee intimated to them that he had a scheme of his own, and that the Department of Agriculture was prepared to carry it out, they would have

been only too pleased to be relieved of the onerous duties they had undertaken."

It is to be noted with satisfaction that since the Council initiated this movement to place the dairying industry on a more satisfactory footing, the Minister of Agriculture has established a working dairy at the Centennial Exhibition, and also a travelling dairy in the country, so that the object aimed at by the Society has been in a measure attained as the result of its action.

### IMPORTATION OF STOCK.

In January the Council adopted the following resolution :--"That in consideration of the neighbouring colonies having passed a resolution to open their ports for the introduction of stock from Europe, we Victorians are standing in our own light if we persist in keeping our ports closed, and thus give the other colonies an advantage." The ports were shortly afterwards opened, when a Committee was appointed to confer with the Minister administering the Act, with a view to perfecting quarantine regulations and making them of a federal character.

# QUARANTINE ACCOMMODATION.

At a special general meeting in November the unsatisfactory state of the quarantine accommodation for stock was discussed, and a deputation was appointed to wait on the Government to point out the necessity for a change in the quarantine arrangements, a promise being obtained that the matter would receive attention.

# STUD BOOK.

In the last report the action taken towards the establishment of a Draught Horse Society of Victoria, with the object of bringing out a stud book, was explained, and it was stated that the rules had been submitted to the Societies of the colony, only six of which had replied. Nothing further was heard from them, and in February the Secretary was directed to convene a meeting of subscribers to the Society and breeders, which was done, but so few attended that the whole project has been allowed to drop for the present. This result must be attributed to the apathy of breeders, in whose hands the Council, after having initiated it, left the matter.

# TAX ON STALLIONS.

In August the following resolution was passed by the Council, viz., "That with a view to improving the stamp of horses the Society ask the Government to place an annual tax of £10 or upwards on stallions three years of age or over." This resolution was forwarded to the Government, and a reply has been received from the Secretary for Agriculture stating that the subject was under consideration.

# NEW VOTING SYSTEM.

At the last annual meeting it was resolved to alter the old system of voting for members of Council, and a rule was passed to the effect that a ballot paper be sent by post to each subscriber residing over 20 miles from Melbourne. Subsequently a special meeting was called, and this rule was rescinded, with the object of passing regulations to the effect that a ballot paper be posted to every subscriber to the Society. These new by-laws, which it is hoped will cause increased interest to be taken in elections, will come into operation this year.

#### THE SYDNEY SHOW.

In January the Secretary was appointed to represent the Society at the great Centennial Exhibition of the Agricultural Society of New South Wales in Sydney, which he accordingly did. There he met the Secretary of the Canterbury Agricultural Society of New Zealand, and the Secretary of the National Agricultural and Industrial Society of Queensland, who were also visitors to the Show, an account of which appeared in the Society's journal for February.

## THE JOURNAL.

Incidental allusion has already been made to the Society's Journal, which has been for nearly four years conducted successfully on the lines on which it was established. During this period the publishers have printed and posted the paper to subscribers and others free of cost, and in addition have paid the Society a bonus for the privilege of securing the right to all monies received for advertisements in the Journal. At the end of the term of four years the Journal will become the joint property of the Society and the publishers, in terms of agreement dated the 27th day of August, 1885.

# THE COUNCIL.

In March, Mr. John Jones was granted seven months' leave of absence, on account of being about to visit Europe, and in the same month Mr. Frederick Peppin was granted 12 months' leave for a similar object. Both gentlemen were furnished with letters accrediting them to kindred societies in England and elsewhere. In July, Mr. J. C. Cochrane's seat became vacant through non-

attendance, and in the following month Mr John H. Finlay was elected in his place. In October, Mr. Walter J. Clark resigned his seat on the Council, and his resignation was accepted with regret. Mr. Thomas Harmer was elected in the room of Mr. Clark. In December the attention of the Council was called to the death of Mr. William Learmonth, who had been a member The Council adjourned out of respect to his memory, from 1878. and ordered that a letter of condolence be written to his widow. In December, Mr. S. G. Staughton resigned his seat on the Council, his resignation being accepted with great regret. In February, Mr. J. K. Joynt was elected in the place of Mr. Learmonth, and Mr. John Kernan in the room of Mr Staughton.

#### HON. VETERINARY SURGEON.

In July the attention of the Council was called to the death of Mr. Graham Mitchell, F.R.C.V.S., the Society's honorary veterinary surgeon, and a resolution was passed recording in the minutes the regret of the Council at the loss sustained through the death of their honorary officer. Applications were called for the position, and Mr. Benjamin Owen Meek, M.R.C.V.S., was elected in the place of Mr. Mitchell

# ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council wish to record their indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Loch for their continued interest in the Society and their kind patronage of its exhibitions. They also thank the Government and the Parliament of Victoria for the special gift of Centennial International Prizes in addition to the Grand Champion Prizes of Australia. They also wish to thank Mr. Bradbury, the special Commissioner of the Mark Lane Express, for his presentation of twenty framed drawings of some of the best cattle in England, as well as a bound volume of the Mark Lane Express, and Mr. Bosisto, C.M.G., for his kindly offices in connection therewith. They beg to convey their hearty thanks to the donors of prizes at the show for their liberal contributions to the prize fund. They also thank the judges for the performance of their really arduous duties, and the stewards for their active ser-They also wish again to express their appreciation of the vices. great assistance received from the press in furthering the interests of the Society.

# FINANCE.

On reference to the Financial Statement, which has been carefully audited (*vide* report on next page), it will be seen that the receipts for the year, including  $\pounds 1$  1s. 1d. cash in hand from the previous year, amounted to £7332 4s. 6d., which shows a falling off from last year of over £1000. The expenditure amounted to £9792 13s. 1d., increasing the overdraft by £2460 8s. 7d., or from £8121 11s. 9d. to £10,582 0s. 4d. As stated in a previous portion of the report, the amount expended on permanent buildings during the year was £4303 1s. 8d., so that, although the revenues of the Society suffered so severely through adverse weather during the Show, there is still a profit—exclusive of the building account—of £1842 13s. 1d. on the actual working expenses for the year.

# RULES.

1. The Society shall be called "The National Agricultural Society of Victoria."

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :—

- (1.) By holding Exhibitions, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such Exhibitions.
- (2.) By holding Meetings, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which Meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural Publications and Scientific Works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which. in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President. six Vice-presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The President, Vice-President and Trustees shall be elected from the class of Governors, being, or having been, Members of Council; and the Trustees may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound, annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one Member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.

8. The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members, including the President, Vice presidents, and three Trustees, to be elected from the class of Governors only; the remainder to be elected indiscriminately from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society.

9. One-half of the Council, excepting the President and Trustees, shall retire annually, but be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and Object of the society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society. and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12 The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body, created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting to appoint Auditors, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the place of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance sheet shall be read, all office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. The Secretary shall report to the meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

19. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such meeting other than that for which it has been called.

20. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next Monthly Council. 21. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions and grounds at all times.

22. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and if found guilty shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

23. These rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

# BY-LAWS.

# GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report, and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper; provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council, at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election, shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his deputy shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the requisite number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of Election. and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the Poll.

6. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

#### THE PRESIDENT.

7. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks. and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

## THE COUNCIL.

8. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

9. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes, on a show of hands, all questions, not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object, and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

10. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council. 11. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

12. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member if only one be present, or the Secretary if no Member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

13. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

14. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every, the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, Officers and Servants of the Society, as well as on all Exhibitors, or their Assistants, at the Society's Exhibitions.

15. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

16. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of moneys received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

17. No money shall be drawn from the Society's Banking Account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

18. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive Monthly Meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

19. The Secretary shall notify to the Council. on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, or Members of Council, at the Meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the Monthly Meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.

20. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

21. The quorum of a Monthly or Special Council shall be five.

22. At every Monthly Meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—(1). Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2). Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies (3). Finance Committee's Report. (4). Postponed business. (5). Correspondence. (6). Motions. (7). Notices of Motions.

23. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

24. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in that month, or at some adjournment thereof.

#### COMMITTEES.

25. The Council shall elect such Standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

26. Each Committee, at its first meeting. shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the committee for the occasion; and any Member of any such committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a Member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

27. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

## THE SECRETARY.

28. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered. 29 Under the direction of the Finance Committee, he shall be responsible for all moneys received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amount allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

30. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

31. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

32. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of  $\pm 500$ , the premium to be paid by the Society.

33. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

#### FINANCE.

34. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form :—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council should vote the moneys required without such report.

35. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

36. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

37. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

38. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting there shall be an Audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balancesheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.


