TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1892 :---

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

The principal works carried out on the show grounds during the year include improvements to the carriage shed, the floor of which was levelled in terraces and asphalted, at a cost of £254. This espenditure has guite altered the character of the building, making it very suitable for the display of vehicles, so that the improvement is one which is much appreciated by exhibitors and the public. The row of cattle sheds at the west end of the trotting track was levelled up and gravelled along the front, at a cost of $\pounds 25$ 5s. Od. The building originally erected for sheep—the half of which was last year used for poultry—was this year entirely devoted to these exhibits, having been enclosed, glazed, and specially lighted from the roof. In consequence of the increased number of exhibits of sheep, 137 of the cattle stalls were altered to sheep pens, and a number of other minor improvements and alterations were made in connection with the show, the amount expended in buildings during the year being £580 14s. 2d., bringing the total expenditure on buildings and works at the show grounds up to £28,970 15s. 9d.

THE EXHIBITION.

The annual exhibition was held on the 23rd, 24th, 25th 26th, and 27th of August. A programme of prizes on a more extended scale than in any previous year was published, including £500, Grand Champion prizes, and £706 15s., contributed by private donors. The entries received again showed an increase on the previous year, the total number being 4,075. The money taken for admission, including £426 at the grand stand, amounted to £2,844 5s. 9d., which was £420 10s below the sum recei ed in the previous year, but about the same as the takings two years before. The amount received for entry fees and ground rent was £814 14s. 11d., which beats all previous records. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horse stock (73 entries) showed a considerable falling off in numbers from the previous year, but the quality was well maintained. The thoroughbred stallions (7 entries) were a stronger class than usual, but the thoroughbred section, as a whole, was still about the weakest in the show. In trotters and roadsters (44 entries) the classes were well filled, and the 5 Clevelands comprised fine specimens of that breed. Hackneys (17 entries) and ladies' hackneys (10 entries) were fairly well represented, and there were 40 entries of carriage and buggy horses, with 40 of saddle and harness, and 26 of breeding ponies-these classes being better represented than usual. Valuable prizes were offered for four-in-hand turnouts, but the result was disappointing, only two teams having been shown. The hunters' contests were again attractive features of the show, there being 20 entries in the heavy, and 26 in the light weights, almost all good horses and clever jumpers. A class for maiden hunters, introduced for the first time, drew 12 entries. The high-jumping contest again attracted a large crowd, but while the jumping was good, there was nothing sensational in the performance of the horses. 'The shorthorn cattle comprised 129 entries of an excellent type, and many of the animals were shown in very high condition. Herefords (34 entries) were, like the Shorthorns, of a very high standard. Polled Angus (27 entries) showed a drop in numbers from the previous year, but their quality was well maintained. Ayrshires (165 entries) were again a very strong section of the show. Jersevs (66 entries) showed a considerable falling off in numbers, but their high standard has been well maintained, and indeed raised by recent There were 12 entries of Holsteins, which were importations. brought out in nice condition, and a good deal of attention was attracted to this breed, which has on various occasions made wonderful milking records. Three Brittanies were exhibited, 22 Dairy Cows and 11 fat cattle. Merino sheep (31 entries), Lincolns (95 entries), Leicesters (70 entries) showed a considerable increase over previous years, and Romsey Marsh, introduced for the first time (13 entries), South Downs (53), Hampshire Downs (11), Shropshire Downs (24)

showed a large increase, and these breeds of farmers' sheep made Swine quite a new and gratifying feature in the yards. (128)entries) showed a falling off in numbers from the previous year. The Berkshire breed, which maintains its popularity in the colony, still greatly predominates at the show but a few exhibits of the Tamworth breed, which is much esteemed in England, were shown for the first time. In poultry the single bird entry was introduced, and the change appeared to be appreciated, for there were 437 entries, nearly four times the number received last year. There were 153 dogs, comprising most of the noted prize takers of the colony, In carriages and buggies there were 179 entries, and as they were well displayed in the newly asphalted and terraced shed, they formed a very attractive feature of the show. There were 24 entries of saddlery and harness. In farm produce (90 entries) the quality of the exhibits was excellent, the roots especially being unusually fine, and so large as to excite the wonder of all beholders The dairy produce (157 entries) contained exhibits of first-class quality, and the display of hams and bacon was very creditable to exhibitors Preserves (10 entries) were also exhibited, and there were 3 entries of manures. In wines there were 157 entries, which were judged at the Exhibition cellars before the Show opened, and were very favorably spoken of by the jurors. Prize wines were sold in the kiosk on the grounds during the show, and so popular has this department become that the stewards are already agitating for an enlargement of the kiosk. The only prizes offered in machinery were specials for sheep shearing machine, bush-fire extinguisher, and tank cleaner, respectively; the prize in each case being awarded. There were 131 stands of machinery (in motion), implements and miscellaneous exhibits, making the most extensive display ever seen on the Society's grounds. Auction sales of stock were held in the yards on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, and were fairly successful. In relation to the shows of the society, it may be stated that the number of entries has steadily increased year by year, and this year, for the first time, they have exceeded 4000, so that it is gratifying to report that notwithstanding the prevailing depression the Exhibition was the most extensive and varied that has been held by the society. The weather on the opening day was very wet and unfavourable, and had a deterrent effect on intending visitors on that and succeeding days, and the municipal elections throughout the colony also took place on one of the show days. These facts are quite sufficient to account for the falling off in attendance from the previous year, which cannot, therefore, be regarded as showing a diminished interest by the public. With favourable conditions, the society's exhibitions, while increasing in their extent and representative character, will doubtless also continue to receive corresponding public patronage.

THE WINE TASTING.

It was resolved by the Council to give those interested in Australian Wines an opportunity of tasting the samples stored in the Exhibition cellars, where the society is collecting a stock of wines which is anually increasing in quantity and value. With regard to the tasting, which took place on the 2nd November, the following is from the report of the Committee of Management :---

"Owing to his many engagements, His Excellency The Governor was unable to be present, as the Committee of Management had hoped, but a number of representative citizens more or less interested in the wine industry responded to the Council's invitation. The wines submitted were those remaining over from the judging at the 1891 show, which had since lain in bottle in the cellars. Almost without exception they were found to be in excellent condition, and were very favourably commented on."

EXHIBITS FOR IMPERIAL INSTITUTE.

The Council enabled the Exhibition Trustees to procure a number of valuable samples of cereals at the show, to assist in making up a collection for the Victorian Court in the Imperial Institute, for which they received the thanks of the Trustees.

THE JOURNAL.

In September a letter was received from H. W. Mills, editor, stating that the publishers were losing money on the Journal; and making certain proposals to the Council. The matter was dealt with, and it was resolved to continue the publication of the Journal, and to pay the publishers (Messrs Reardon and Mitchel, late H. W. Mills and Co.) a sum of $\pounds 60$ per annum, or $\pounds 5$ per monthly issue of the paper, and an agreement on these terms for one year was drawn up between the Society and the publishers.

RATING OF SHOW GROUNDS.

In the report for 1890 it was stated that the Council, on the advice of their hon. solicitor. Mr. McKean, had appealed against the rating of the show grounds at the Court of Petty Sessions, and the appeal was allowed. The Borough Council, however, took the case to the Supreme Court, and it was eventually dealt with by the Full Bench of six judges, the result being that the former decision was upheld, so that it may be now regarded as definitely settled that the Society can only be rated at the nominal sum of one shilling.

MESSAGE OF CONDOLENCE TO QUEEN AND ROYAL FAMILY.

On the occasion of the lamented death of the late Duke of Clarence, the following resolution was forwarded to Her Majesty the Queen, through His Ecellency the Governor :--- "The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria desires to convey to Her Majesty the Queen, the Prince and Princess of Wales, and the Princess Mary, an assurance that it sympathises and condoles with them in their recent unhappy bereavement, and to express its sorrow for the loss they have sustained by the death of the Duke of Clarence; a loss in which this Society participates in common with the Empire."

A reply came to hand in due course, stating that His Excellency had received a despatch from the Right Honourable, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in which he was requested to express, on Her Majesty's behalf and that of Their Royal Highnesses, the Prince and Princess of Wales, their grateful thanks for the sympathy which had been shown them in the great loss they had sustained on the occasion of the death of His Royal Highness, the Duke of Clarence and Avondale. Also that Her Serene Highness, the Princess Victoria Mary of Teck, had requested that her sincere thanks might be conveyed for the personal sympathy expressed to herself in the Society's resolution.

THE COUNCIL.

In January Mr. Peck wrote tendering his resignation, as he intended to take an extended trip to Europe and America. Mr. Peck being an old and valued Member of Council it was proposed that instead of accepting his resignation the Council should grant him twelve months leave of absence, and also furnish him with a letter accrediting him to kindred Societies; and this resolution was unanimously adopted. In August a vacancy occurred in the Council through the death of Mr. Woodmason. Mr. Woodmason, who was elected to the Council in October, 1889, in the place of Mr. Ramsden (resigned;) took a lively interest in the Society. A resolution was passed recording the regret of the Council at the loss sustained through his death, and a letter of condolence was written to his widow and family. Mr. George Young was elected in the room of Mr. Woodmason. In December a vacancy was reported in the Council through the death of Mr. T. Matthew McCaw. Mr. McCaw was elected to the He had, however, been connected with the Council in 1890. Society as a Life Member and Steward for several years previously; and his father, the late Mr. Matthew McCaw, who was one of the founders of the Society, was the President in 1876, he having held that office at the time of his death. The Council passed a resolution expressing their great regret at the loss sustained through the death of Mr. McCaw, and ordered that a letter of condolence be written to his widow. Mr. Thomas Skene was elected to the seat rendered vacant by Mr. McCaw's death.

THE SECRETARY.

In the last report it was stated that the Secretary had been granted six months leave of absence to enable him to visit Europe for the benefit of his health. The Council desire to congratulate the Subscribers on his having returned to resume his duties before the expiration of his term, with his health completely renovated by the rest and change. During his absence a great deal of extra work and responsibility were necessarily thrown on the President, Mr. McGregor, who cheerfully undertook the duties, so that the Council are much indebted to him for his valuable services under the special circumstances.

THE COLLECTOR.

In April the Collector, Mr. Segerberg, was given one month to continue collecting subscriptions, and was informed that after that date his services would be dispensed with. He, however, failed to bring in his books, and though repeated efforts were made to induce him to do so, they were unavailing, and it was found necessary to issue a warrant for his arrest. On his books being examined it was seen that he was considerably deficient in his cash, and subsequent investigations showed that he was £65 short; which, less commission due to him, made the actual loss to the Society £57 8s. 6d. Mr. John Hedrick, who had previously held the position, was afterwards appointed collector to the Society. With a view to increasing the number of Subscribers the Council issued a circular to the public. they gave collecting books to several of the Members of Council, and they also appointed a number of country collectors. Though these latter were not very successful, it is gratifying to report that as a result of the effort made the subscriptions received exceed those of the previous year, notwithstanding the dullness of the times.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS.

The Council desire to acknowledge their continued indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor and the Countess of Hopetoun for their kind patronage of the Society's exhibitions, and to express their appreciation of the keen interest manifested by His Excellency and the Countess in the various departments of the show. They wish to express their thanks to the Government and Parliament of Victoria for the annual grant of £500 offered as grand champion prizes of Australia. They beg to convey their very hearty thanks to the donors of prizes at the show for their liberality in subscribing to the prize fund. They have also to express their appreciation of the valuable services of Mr. McKean, the Society's Honorary Solicitor. They wish to specially thank the judges at the show for their valuable gratuitious services; and the stewards for their active assistance and co-operation. They desire also to thank the press for their valuable services in giving prominence to the operations of the Society.

FINANCE.

On reference to the Financial Statement, which has been carefully audited (vide report below), it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounted to $\pounds 7656$ 17s 11, exceeding that of the previous year by $\pounds 276$ 11s 2d, and as the expenditure for the year amounts to $\pounds 6123$ 5s 1d, the overdraft has been reduced by $\pounds 1533$ 12s 10d. On further reference to the statement it will been seen that $\pounds 580$ 14s 2d was laid out on permanent buildings and works, which may be looked on in the nature of an investment, so that excluding this item the ordinary working expenses show a profit of $\pounds 2114$ 7s on the year's transactions. The overdraft stands at $\pounds 7104$ 9s 5d, as against $\pounds 8638$ 2s 3d last year.

RULES.

1. The Society shall be called The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony :—

- (1.) By holding exhibitions, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.
- (2. By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such Information from Agricultural Publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilization of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, livefences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society ; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number, and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members, one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same and may be elected to any office.

8. (a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four members, to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society. (b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.

9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it. conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof,

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Societv's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid (Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February ; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance-sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock, p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the Poll.

19. Seven days at least before the annual meeting a copy of the report and audited balance-sheet for the preceding year to 31st December shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (governors or members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.

22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.

23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, Lectures, and, with two Ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions and ground at all times.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the roll of members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten members, exclusive of members of Council.

BY=LAWS.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such report and comment thereon ; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper; provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office bearers. Previous to the day of meeting, the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election, shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President or his deputy shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

7. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice begiven to the Council.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. If before half an hour after the time at which any meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of members be not present, the members present, or the majority of them, or any one member, if only one be present, or the Secretary if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

12. Minutes of the proceedings of every meeting of the Council or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or in case of his absence, by some member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own meetings, which shall be binding on the members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every, the Governors and members, Honorary and Corresponding members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.

14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.

15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or members of Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council, which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows:—(1). Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in that month, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion ; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meeting of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be reponsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amount allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, phamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society. shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superiatendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council meeting in each month, in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form —

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an Audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance-sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.
