LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1893 :

PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

During the year a number of valuable improvements were carried out at the Show grounds. A building for bars and luncheon rooms was erected beside the restaurant at the front entrance gates, at a cost of £433 9s. 6d. This building greatly improves the appearance of the grounds, and does away with the necessity for an unsightly temporary canvas erection at the main entrance. An asphalt path was formed along the outer line of the machinery ground from the corner opposite the Secretary's office to the farther end of the grand stand, at a cost of £52, the Ayrshire cattle court was formed and metalled, at a cost of £43, the fronts of the cattle stalls and pig pens were gravelled, and other minor works were carried out. These improvements are of a substantial character; and as the painting of all the woodwork in the yards has been attended to, the grounds and buildings are now in really good order and repair. The amount laid out on the yards during the year was £782 1s. 2d., which brings the total sum expended on permanent buildings and works up to £29,752 16s. 11d.

THE EXHIBITION.

The annual Exhibition was held on the 29th, 30th, and 31st August and 1st and 2nd September. As the amount of money offered in prizes had been increased every year for some time, the Council thought that, in view of a possible falling off in receipts, a reduction might be made; consequently, the individual prizes were reduced, but the programme issued was still a liberal one. The Government declined to continue the vote for Grand Champion prizes, but instead they offered valuable silver medals as Champion prizes. The total number of entries received was 4012. This large entry was attributable to the great number of machinery, implement, and miscellaneous exhibits, the number of live stock on the whole showing a considerable falling off. The money taken for admission, including £265 13s. 9d. at the grand stand, amounted to £2075 6s. 9d., being £768 19s. below the sum received in the previous year. The entry fees and ground rent amounted to £709 8s., as against £814 14s. 11d. the year before. With regard to the exhibits, the draught horses (69 entries) were in number about the same as last year, while the quality of the animals showed a distinct advance on several previous years. In thoroughbreds (6 entries) there were one or two high-class stallions, but the section was otherwise almost a blank. Trotters and roadsters (20 entries) were less numerously represented than for some years, but Cleveland (7 entries) showed a slight increase. Hackneys (14 entries) and ladies' hackneys (2 entries) were rather behind last year, but carriage and buggy horses (25 entries) made an excellent display; while brougham horses (9 entries), introduced for the first time, were a really good class. Saddle and harness ponies (49 entries) were very well represented, and there were 14 exhibits of breeding ponies. The hunters' classes again filled well, there being 19 heavy weights and 31 light weights, the horses and their performances reaching a very high standard. The maiden class, introduced in the previous year, was altered to a juvenile hunters' class, which drew 12 entries of fairly good young horses. The high-jumping contest (17 entries) was again a great success, and proved very attractive to the public. Shorthorn cattle (107 entries) were rather behind last year in point of number, and the section otherwise was scarcely so conspicuously strong as in previous years. Herefords (35 entries) were one over last year, and the competition was very keen. Polled Angus (22 entries) again showed a drop in numbers from the previous year. In Devons there were two entries. Ayrshires (63 entries) were over 100 behind last year's entry, which is accounted for principally by the entire absence of exhibits from New Zealand, from which colony a large contingent has been

received for several years past. Jerseys (39 entries) were also again short in numbers, but the exhibits reached a very high standard throughout. There were 16 entries of Holsteins, which were brought out in very attractive form. Sections were introduced for Kerries and Dexter Kerries, and in each there were three entries of cattle which were a novelty in the colony. There were three exhibits of Brittanies and four dairy cows, while three dairy cows competed for the special prize given for the best butter-producing cows, subject to a test which was carried out on the grounds. There were 13 entries of fat cattle, and three for Cattle Derbies. Merino sheep (12 entries), Lincolns (53), Leicesters (33), Romney Marsh (12), Southdowns (48), Hampshire Downs (14), Shropshire Downs (11), and Fat Sheep (3), showed a falling off on last year's entry in all sections. Swine (89 entries) were again short of the previous year's entry; but the exhibits were very good. Poultry (566 entries) were a very strong class, both in number and quality. Dogs (149 entries) comprised most of the well-known prize-takers of the colony. Carriages and buggies (127 entries) were below the previous year's entry, but made a good display; and there were 34 exhibits of saddlery and harness. In farm produce (63 entries) the exhibits, although not numerous, were very superior. In dairy produce (160 entries) the quality of the butter, cheese, hams and bacon left little to be desired, and the exhibits were really well got up. Preserves, dried fruits, &c., were not well represented, and there was much room for improvement in this section. There were three exhibits of artificial manures. Wines were represented by 161 entries, which were judged in the Exhibition Building before the Show opened, and samples of exhibited wines were retailed to the public in the wine kiosk during the Show. In machinery a special prize was offered for a sheep-shearing machine, and also for a milking machine. There were two entries in each case, the work done being very interesting, and the competition, particularly in the sheep-shearing machines, being very close. There were 138 stands of machinery (in motion), implements, and labour-saving appliances, making the most extensive display yet seen on the grounds. The Department of Agriculture exhibited their working dairy, and business firms exhibited all the latest improvements in connection with the dairy industry; while the importers and manufacturers of all classes of machinery and implements vied with each other in showing to the best advantage everything required in connection with the work of the producing interests of the colony, the general result being that the machinery section was in itself a splendid object lesson and means of education to the patrons of the Society's Show. Auction sales of exhibits of stock were held on the grounds on

Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, and were fairly successful but the total amount realised was much short of that received in previous years. The weather on the opening day was wet and unfavourable, but afterwards was fairly good throughout, and the Show, on the whole, more than realised the expectations of its promoters, who, in view of the prevailing depression, were not sanguine of its success. It is, therefore, gratifying to be able to report that on the whole the entries almost reached the previous year's record, when for the first time in the Society's annals they exceeded 4000, and that the quality of the exhibits, taken all round, was well maintained.

THE JOURNAL.

In consequence of the term of the agreement between the Society and the publishers of the journal having ended in August, it was necessary to make new arrangements. After the matter had been fully considered, it was resolved that the journal be amalgamated with the *Farmer and Grazier*, and that it be called *The Journal of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, incorporated with the Farmer and Grazier*; also that the publisher be paid £60 per annum, a similar amount to that which the previous publishers received. The journal is now published on these lines, and is an attractive and useful paper.

ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

In June a notice of motion was submitted by Mr. Skene to the effect that a Special General Meeting be called to consider a proposition stating that it was desirable that a Central Association should be formed, which would, by eliciting the opinions of representative bodies of a similar character throughout the colony, be placed in a position to deal in an authoritative manner with all matters affecting the general interests of producers, and to take such steps for their advancement as might from time to time be deemed necessary. Also that the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria be the nucleus of such an Association, and that steps be taken to have the Societies of the colony, either individually or in groups, represented on the Council. The motion was considered at the following meeting, when it was resolved that, instead of calling a special general meeting, a committee be appointed to draw up a scheme to be submitted to the Council. The committee agreed on the following proposals, which were afterwards adopted by the Council, viz.:

That an Association be formed, to be called "The Association of the Agricultural Societies of Victoria."

That the objects of the Association shall be to deal with all matters relating to the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, Viticultural, Fruit Growing, and kindred interests generally.

That the Association shall have full power to discuss and deal with all political and other questions which have a distinct and practical bearing upon agriculture, and to take such steps as they may deem desirable to give effect to their decisions and to carry out their objects.

The Association shall consist of representatives of contributing Agricultural Societies receiving Government subsidy on the following basis: Societies paying away £500 and under per annum in prizes, 1 representative; over £500 and under £1000, 2 representatives; over £1000 and under £1500, 3 representatives; over £1500, 5 representatives. The contribution to be at the rate of £1 per annum for each representative, to be paid into a fund for defraying the expenses of the Association.

The Association shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, and Representatives of Agricultural Societies.

The President and Vice-Presidents shall be elected annually by ballot.

Meetings shall be held in Melbourne at least quarterly, and in case of urgency when required, on the direction of the President or at the request of five members of the Association.

A conference of representatives of Agricultural Societies was held in the Society's office on the Friday evening in Show week, when it was resolved that an Association be formed, to be called "The Association of the Agricultural, Pastoral, Horticultural, and Viticultural Societies of Victoria," and the other proposals were adopted with some slight amendments. A provisional committee was appointed to draw up rules, &c., and it was arranged that a conference be held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on the 8th November, for the adoption of the rules, &c. The conference was accordingly held, the rules were adopted, and a provisional Council was formed. The President of this Society (Mr. Peppin), who was also the chairman of the provisional committee, and who has taken a very active interest in the matter, read a paper on the objects of the Association, which was afterwards printed and circulated. A meeting of representatives of contributing Societies will be held in the Town Hall, Melbourne, on the 7th February next, when the first Council of thirty members will be elected, and the Association will, it is hoped, be at once got into active working order.

A GOVERNMENT VETERINARIAN.

The matter of the appointment of a veterinary surgeon in connection with the Stock Branch of the Department of Agri-

culture, was brought under the notice of the Council by a letter in May, and also at the monthly meeting in June by a deputation of veterinary surgeons, who interviewed the Council by appointment. The veterinary surgeons stated that experts were not employed by the Department, but that the duties of inspection were carried out by men who had no knowledge of disease, and that the practice was bound eventually to prejudicially affect the agricultural and pastoral interests. At the conclusion of the interview a resolution was passed to the effect that it was the opinion of the Council that a veterinary surgeon should be attached to the Stock Department, and a copy of the resolution was forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture.

THE BOT FLY.

In February, Mr. Robert Clarke brought under the notice of the Council the matter of the bot fly in sheep in New Zealand, in relation to the admission of sheep from that colony which had been declared clear of scab. A deputation was appointed to wait on the Minister, and ask if the bot fly pest in sheep in New Zealand had been brought under his notice, and, if so, what action he intended to take. The deputation accordingly waited on the Minister, and suggested that sheep from New Zealand should not be admitted till the subject had been fully inquired into, and the Minister promised to act in accordance with the suggestion of the Council. Subsequently a committee was appointed to draft a letter to the principal Agricultural Society in each of the other colonies, calling their attention to the bot fly pest not only in sheep but in stock generally, and suggesting co-operation in dealing with the matter. The Secretary also wrote to the Royal Agricultural Society of England, and obtained copies of all the writings of Miss Omerod (the Society's hon. consulting entomologist) on the bot fly and kindred subjects. These publications, which contain much valuable information, have been added to the Society's library.

CHEESE-MAKING PAMPHLET.

In April a pamphlet on the Canadian Cheddar system of cheese-making was brought under the notice of the Council, and as the pamphlet contained very complete information on the subject, the Council purchased 850 copies and forwarded one by post free of cost to each subscriber to the Society.

INTERCOLONIAL WINE EXHIBITION.

In November, 1892, a letter was received from the Secretary of the Central Wine Association, stating they intended to hold in the Autumn an Intercolonial Wine, Fruit, and Grain Exhibition, on similar lines to that held in 1884. They stated they had decided to invite at least fifty guarantors at £20 each, and asked the assistance of the Society. The Council agreed to guarantee the Association to the amount of £20. Unfortunately the Exhibition was not a financial success, and the Society had to pay the amount of the guarantee, as set forth in the annexed statement of accounts.

CHANGE OF OFFICE.

At the Council Meeting in March attention was called to the Society's office, and it was suggested that a change should be made. However, it was decided to postpone the matter till the termination of the lease in October. In August a letter was received from the landlords stating that the lease would expire on the 31st October, and asking if the Council desired to renew. The question of office accommodation was then referred to the President and Mr. McGregor. These gentlemen, after making several inquiries, resolved to call in the full Finance Committee, of which they were members, to assist them in dealing with the matter. In October the Finance Committee reported that they had inspected a number of offices, and that they approved of the Society taking two rooms on the fifth floor of the National Mutual Buildings, at the corner of Collins and Queen streets, at a rental of £100 per annum, and they also recommended that they be authorised to secure these rooms. A resolution to remain in the old office for a year longer was moved, but on being put to the meeting it was lost. Some members of Council took exception to going upstairs, or in a lift, to an office, and expressed their preference for a ground floor, and the report was eventually adopted with the latter part amended to read—"That the committee should make the best arrangements they could for the National or any other offices, and to decide on their own responsibility." The Committee then again inspected a number of offices, and eventually resolved to secure the present ones—reporting to the Council in November that, in view of the objection of some members of Council at last meeting to going upstairs, or in a lift, to an office, they had altered their previous recommendation, and had taken the offices now occupied by the Society, on the ground floor of The Rialto, at a rental of £100 per annum for five years. They had had the old furniture, as far as they considered it suitable, cleaned and polished,

and had also provided such new furniture as they deemed necessary. The office furniture and fittings are therefore sound and in good repair; and as the same remark was made in a previous section regarding the condition of the buildings at the Show grounds, the whole of the Society's property is at the present time in really good order and condition.

THE COUNCIL.

For the first time for many years no change has occurred in the Council during the period covered by the annual report, no vacancy or vacancies having arisen either through death, resignation, or otherwise. Temporary leave of absence has in one or two cases been granted for a month or so, but it is matter for congratulation that the *personnel* of the Council has remained the same throughout the year.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council desire to acknowledge their obligations to His Excellency the Governor and the Countess of Hopetoun for their kind patronage of the Society's exhibition. They also desire to thank the Department of Agriculture for their gift of Champion Medals. They beg to convey their very hearty thanks to the donors of prizes at the Show for their liberality in subscribing to the prize fund. They also desire to thank Mr. Robert Simson for his gift of seeds of Maltese clover and Maltese melons for distribution amongst the members, and Mr. C. French for Part II. of his work on Destructive Insects. They wish to thank the judges at the Show for their very valuable services, and the stewards for their assistance in carrying out the arrangements at the yards. They desire, also, to thank the Press for their very excellent reports of the Show, as well as for the prominence they give to the Society's operations generally.

FINANCE.

On reference to the Financial Statement, which has been carefully audited (*vide* report below), it will be seen that the revenue for the year amounted to £5979 ls., being £1677 16s. 11d. short of the previous year. The general expenditure has, however, been kept down, so that the overdraft has been reduced by £609 16s. 6d. On further reference to the Financial Statement it will be seen that £782 ls. 2d. was laid out in

permanent buildings and works, and £58 17s. 2d. on new office furniture, which are investments; so that, leaving out these items, the ordinary working expenses show a profit on the year's transactions of £1450 14s. 10d. The overdraft stands at £6494 12s. 11d., as against £7104 9s. 5d. last year. It may be mentioned that at the end of 1888 the overdraft stood at £10,582 0s. 4d., so that it is satisfactory to state that in the last five years the Society's liability has been reduced by £4087 7s. 5d., while at the same time during that period £5317 3s. 5d. has been expended in permanent buildings and works.

RULES.

1. The Society shall be called *The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria*.

2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony:

- (1.) By holding exhibitions, at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.
- (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
- (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
- (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
- (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
- (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
- (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

(8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society ; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.

(9.) By remunerating any person who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.

3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents, three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.

4. The President shall be elected annually.

5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.

6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.

7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription, to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a Member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same and may be elected to any office.

8. (a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four Members to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society.

(b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.

9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.

10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society ; but

no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed, unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each Member of the Council.

11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.

12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.

13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each member of the Council.

14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.

15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office-bearers.

16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a Preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.

17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.

18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.

19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the report and audited balance sheet for the preceding year to

31st December shall be forwarded to every subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.

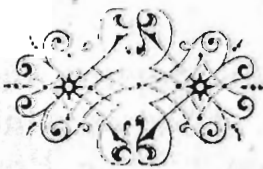
21. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society ; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.

22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council ; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.

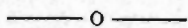
23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-room, Lectures, and, with two ladies, to the Society's Exhibitions and ground at all times.

24. Any Member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.

25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the Members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.



BY-LAWS.



GENERAL MEETINGS.

1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member ; and all matters, except the election of the office-bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any questions to the Council respecting the matters contained in such Report and comment thereon ; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General Meeting.

2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council ; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and Members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the meeting.

3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.

4. The President, or his deputy, shall conduct the Election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President, or his deputy, to assist in making up the state of the poll.

5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the Trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected at the latter.

Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

THE COUNCIL.

7. The Council shall hold a Meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.

8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money, brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.

9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.

11. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of Members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if only one be present, or the Secretary if no Member be present, may adjourn such Meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

12. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or in case of his absence, by some Member present, whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the

proceedings of their own Meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.

14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whenever they shall think proper.

15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.

16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee, and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.

17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.

18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or Members of Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council, which shall take place next after such notice.

19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.

20. The quorum of a monthly or special Council shall be five.

21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows: (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.

22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by, the Council shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

COMMITTEES.

24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit, which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.

25. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.

26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council, and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amount allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society shall be stamped with the Society's stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £500, the premium to be paid by the Society.

32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting and lay before it in the following form—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made, together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.

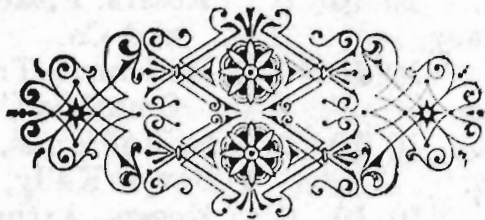
