### TO THE SUBSCRIBERS

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

The following is a report of the proceedings of the Society for the year 1896:

### PERMANENT BUILDINGS AND WORKS.

Considerable improvements were made in the show grounds during the year. The Secretary's office, Judge's room, press room, and lavatories were enlarged and extended to the full length of the Caretaker's enclosure, and new ladies' rooms were provided at the end of the building next the railway gates; the amount of the contract for this work being £335. These alterations were much required, and proved very acceptable, as they greatly facilitated the work of the Show. A new Judge's box, with dressing and casualty rooms below, was erected in the centre of the ground, taking the place of the old structure which was neither ornamental nor up to present requirements, the cost being £210. A number of fixed seats for ladies were placed throughout the grounds; fixed seats were set in the Judge's rings,

and several minor improvements and alterations were made at the Grand Stand, the dairy produce shed and the Council's luncheon hall. A proposal to cut down the hill inside the trotting track and form a terrace round it was mooted, and designs and estimates were obtained from the Society's Architects, but principally in view of the cost, and for other reasons the work was not proceeded with. The question of providing accommodation in one building for all sheep exhibits was also considered, but further action has been deferred pending the result of an interview with the Australian Sheepbreeder's Association, with regard to proposed amalgamation. The amount actually laid out during the year, was £750 18s 4d bringing the total expenditure on buildings and works up to £31,402 12s 9d.

### THE EXHIBITION.

The Annual Exhibition was held on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th September, having been moved from the usual last week in August in order to avoid the Municipal elections. The schedule of prizes was revised, and the prize money increased by over £100, several new classes being introduced to the list. numbered 4234, the highest total yet reached by the Society. The sum taken for admissions, including £248 6s 3d at the grand stand amounted to £2,126 3s, exceeding the previous year's total by £36 3s 6d. The entry fees and ground rent amounted to £751 1s against £736 10s 6d last year. As a record of the exhibits in the order of the schedule, the draught horses (85 entries), were 4 short of the previous year's number, the quality of the stock being fairly well up to the average. In thoroughbreds there were 7 entries, the stallions being an improved class from last year. Trotters and roadsters (22 entries), were about as last year, and in Clevelands 2 stallions were shown. Breeding ponies (22 entries), again showed an improvement in numbers from last year. In heavy weight hunters (8 entries), there was the smallest field since the Hunter's Plate was introduced, but in light weight hunters (25 entries), there was an increase. Juvenile hunters (9 entries), were 8 behind the previous year, and ladies hunters (11 entries), were 4 in advance, while in the high jumping contest there was the record number of 25 entries. Hackneys (9 entries), and ladies hackneys (4 entries), were rather short of last year's number. Prizes were for the first time introduced for heavy cavalry horses, light cavalry horses, and mounted riflemen's horses, and drew 11 entries. These classes attracted considerable attention, and a largely increased number of entries may be expected next year. Carriage and buggy horses &c., (28 entries), corresponded in number with last year's entry, and saddle and harness ponies (31 entries), were three behind. Shorthorn cattle (132 entries), showed a gain in numbers of 35 from last year, and Herefords (18 entries), remained as before.

Polled Angus (16 entries), were two behind last year's number. In red polls there were ten entries, the first time these cattle were exhibited in competition in the yards, and they were very much admired. No Devons were shown. Ayrshires (92 entries), showed an increase of 11 entries, although the New Zealand contingent, as last year, was absent. Jerseys (75 entries), were 32 in advance of last year, so that it will be noted that the entries in all the leading cattle classes were very satisfactory. Holsteins (9 entries), showed a falling off in numbers. There were 11 dairy cows and 11 entries for the best milch cow subject to test. There were 5 entries of fat cattle a great drop from the previous year, and 3 entries for cattle Derbies. In Merino sheep (34 entries), there was improved competition. Lincolns (57 entries), were 3 in advance of last year. Leicesters (32 entries), showed a falling off, and Border Leicesters (40 entries), a slight increase. Romney Marsh were represented by only 4 entries. Southdowns (30 entries) were 8 ahead of last year, and Hampshire Downs (29 entries), were as before. Shropshire Downs (23 entries), showed a drop of 25 from last year's large entry, and only 8 Cotswolds were shown. Fat sheep grass fed (55 entries), were 23 ahead of last year, and were a spleudid exhibit, well illustrating the capabilities of Australian pastures. Swine (111 entries), were 37 in advance of last year, and a very strong section throughout. Poultry (414 entries), were 57 behind last year's large entry, and dogs (207 entries), showed an increase of 16. Carriages and buggies (147 entries), were 9 in advance of last year, and there were 16 exhibits of saddlery and harness. Farm produce (55 entries), was 7 ahead of last year, and though the number of exhibits was limited the quality was excellent. Dairy produce (124 entries), was rather short of last year's, but was a most attractive department of the Show, the stands of hams, bacon, &c., being very creditable exhibits. There were 194 entries of wines, an increase of 45 from the previous year, and it is pleasing to note that more growers than last year were represented in the competition. Preserves, dried fruits, &c., (21 entries), were far behind last year. One exhibit of artificial manures was shown. There were 142 stands of machinery (in motion), implements and miscellaneous exhibits making a very extensive display, the stands on the whole being better filled than ever before. This while being exceedingly creditable to the enterprise of exhibitors who without the inducement of prizes make the finest display in their lines to be seen at any show in Australia also testifies to the splendid facilities offered by the Society for the benefit of its supporters. The Government granted a holiday for the official opening day of the Show. Unfortunately the weather which on the judging day was delightful was very unfavorable on the vice-regal day, heavy rain coming on about I o'clock and deterring very many from visiting the grounds. However, the remaining days of the Show were fine, and the

### QUEENSLAND TICK.

In July the attention of the Council was directed to the above subject, when the following resolution was passed and forwarded to the Government:—"In view of the disastrous effects upon stock in Queensland of the Cattle Tick, The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria desires to urge upon the Government the necessity to adopt stringent measures to prevent such a calamity as would be caused by the introduction of the pest to the herds of this Colony. They view with satisfaction the action the Government are taking, and would recommend that they proceed even to absolute prohibition of Queensland cattle and hides."

### FLOCK BOOK.

At the Council meeting in November, Mr T. Skene called attention to the necessity for a Flock Book for pure sheep. Such a work had been brought out in New Zealand, and he thought that a register or book on somewhat similar lines should be kept by the Society. The matter was referred to a special committee who recommended to the following meeting that the Society undertake the compilation and publication of a Flock Book for British Breeds of Sheep, it being considered that it would be sufficient work to begin with to embrace only these breeds, and that the merinos might be undertaken later on. This recommendation was adopted by the Council, who appointed a committee to draw up rules and put the work in progress, and the committee has already drafted rules and issued them in circular form for the consideration of breeders throughout the Colony. These rules will be finally dealt with at next meeting of Council.

### SHOW, CUP WEEK.

A proposal by Mr. T. Skene to hold a Show and Fair in Cup week was referred to a special Committee who recommended that a Show and Fair in connection with a Military tournament be held in Cup week subject to the concurrence of the sheep salesmen and consent of the Military authorities. The sheep salesmen were afterwards interviewed and were found to be unfavorable to the project, neither did the military authorities concur, owing to a tournament open to all the Forces being in contemplation. In view of these circumstances the report of the Committee was received and the matter allowed to drop.

### AUTUMN SHOW.

In the last report it was stated that the question of holding au Autumn Show had been postponed for consideration till February.

At that month's meeting the question was postponed till the following month, when it was referred to the Show Committee, who after fully discussing it resolved adversely to the proposal, by a large majority, and the Council adopted their report. Later on, on the failure of the project to hold a Show in Cup week. Mr Stevenson again brought forward the proposal to hold an Autumn Show. The matter was eventually referred to a special meeting of Council when a motion in favour of the Show being held was lost by a two to one majority.

### THE COUNCIL.

In February, Mr H. M. Gooch was granted six month's leave of absence to enable him to visit Europe. In March the Hon. Charles Young was elected a Trustee in the room of Dr. Plummer resigned. In the same month, Mr T. C. O'Brien was elected a member of Council in place of Mr W. Adamson resigned. In May, Mr James McCulloch was elected a member of Council, which body, since Dr. Plummer's resignation was one short of the full number of members, Mr Young, who was elected a Trustee in Dr. Plummer's place, being previously a member of Council. In July, leave of absence was granted to Mr A. McCracken, Chairman of the Finance Committee to enable him to visit England.

### ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

The Council desire to express their indebtedness to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Brassey for their kind patronage of the Society's show. They also wish to thank His Excellency for his valuable gift of a gold medal as a prize for a Dairy Cow. They have to thank the Government for having granted a holiday on the official opening day of the show. They have to again acknowledge their indebtness to the Department of Agriculture for providing champion medals for competition at the show. They have to thank the Shropshire Sheepbreeders Association in England for their gift of a gold medal. They wish to return their very grateful thanks to the donors of the prizes -- the list being headed by His Excellency Lord Brassey-for their liberal support. They have to thank the judges at the show for their very valuable and highly appreciated honorary services, and the stewards for their hearty co-operation, and they desire again, as always, to express their deep indebtedness to the press.

### GENERAL.

(MEMBERSHIP.)

With the object of increasing the membership of the Society

the Council at the instance of the Finance Committee issued 3,000 lithographed circulars calling attention to the relatively small number of members of this Society as compared with the membership of leading Societies in the United Kingdom, and setting forth the privileges enjoyed by subscribers to the Society. These circulars were sent out some time before the Show and also served to call attention to that event; and it is gratifying to note that there is an increase of 80 members this year. It is hoped however that the membership will still more rapidly increase in future years, as with a big subscribers' roll the Society would be greatly strengthened and there would be no further necessity for the annual canvass for donations to the Prize Fund.

(DEATH.)

While it is pleasing to record the enrolment of new members it is a matter of regret that the Society has this year lost by death one of its oldest and best supporters in Mr Simson of Leura, Toorak. Mr Simson was one of the promoters of the Society and was elected a Vice-President when it was established in 1871. The following year he was elected President, a position he again held in 1874, and in 1880. While he was not President he was a Vice-President, an office held till 1882 when he resigned on account of his health. He was therefore either President or a Vice-President of the Society during its first 11 years, and no man who was ever connected with the Society was more highly respected by the Council than Mr Robert Simson.

Since the above was written the Society has also lost another old supporter in Mr Alexander Patterson of St. Germains, Clyde Railway Station, whose death occurred at the end of the year. Mr Patterson was one of the promoters of the Society and a member of its first Council, holding office continuously for 16 years, during three of which he was a Vice-President. Mr Patterson was an exhibitor and active Steward at the shows, and on his retirement a letter was written to him in the name of the

Council thanking him for his long services to the Society.

(SUBSIDY.)

The Council regret that the Society has this year been deprived of its share in the Government Subsidy, and as this expected Subsidy was on the prizes awarded in the previous year, the action of the Government, in making the incidence of the deprivation practically retrospective, was considered very harsh. A deputation was appointed to interview the Government in the matter, but nothing could be ascertained further than that it had been determined by the Minister of Agriculture to exclude this Society from participation in the Grant. When the Government Grant was reduced, this Council was asked by other Societies to join in a deputation of protest, but they declined to do so as they did not wish to embarrass the Government in their scheme of retrenchment, and it is poor recompense to be treated as they have been. Had the Government Grant to Agricultural Societies

been abolished altogether the Council would have been prepared to accept the position in view of the state of the public finances, but that any one Society should be singled out and deprived of its share is considered most unfair treatment and inimical to the interests of Agriculture.

(PRIVILEGES.)

After the 1895 Show the Council, through the Executive Committee, went very fully into the question of privileges, complimentary tickets, luncheon tickets &c., and thoroughly revised the whole list in detail, spending several afternoons at the work. A new basis of issue was arrived at, and all tickets to members of Council, judges, stewards, donors, the press and others required up to the end of the Vice-Regal day, were issued by post, and while some of those interested could not quite realize the new position and were almost inclined to resent it, the idea, while necessarily involving additional previous careful clerical work, came out well in its results at the Grounds, so that the labours of the Committee were not in vain.

(HOLIDAY.)

In August a letter was received in reply stating that the Government had decided to proclaim a half holiday for the opening day of the Show. The President was not satisfied with this concession, and did not rest till he had induced the Premier to proclaim a whole holiday. This was eventually done, and, at the banquet on the grounds, the Premier alluded in laudatory terms to the persistence of the President in his endeavour to gain his point, and added that after this year the holiday for the Show would be an established institution, that he did not think any future Government could refuse to recognise.

(THE JOURNAL.)
The agreement with the publishers of The Farmer and Grazier, with which the Journal of the Society is incorporated, has been renewed for 12 months, and the Journal is being carried on satisfactorily, providing a large amount of useful information to subscribers to the Society.

(THE SECRETARY AT SYDNEY.)

In March, the Secretary was appointed to officially represent the Society at the great Easter Exhibition of the Royal Agricultural Society of New South Wales, at Sydney. and afterwards wrote a report on the Exhibition and read it at the next meeting of Council, when a vote of thanks was passed to him for it.

(THE SECRETARY AT BERRY.)

November the Berry Agricultural Association in the Illawarra District of New South Wales wrote for a Victorian judge of Ayrshire and Jersey Cattle for their National Show. The Secretary was appointed to go, and went. On his return he wrote at considerable length an informal report of his visit and read it at the following meeting of Council. The report was well received, and a vote of thanks was passed to the Secretary for it.

### FINANCE.

On reference to the Financial Statement which has been carefully audited (vide report below) it will be seen that the revenue for the year was £4849 12s 9d being £558 12s 7d less than that of the previous year. In that year however the Society received £698 8s 2d for Government Subsidy on prizes awarded at the previous year's Show. This year no Subsidy was received so that the revenue shows an improvement of £139 15s 7d on the previous year if the item for Subsidy be not taken into account. The overdraft at the bank has been reduced by £344 18s 7s and £750 18s 4d has been expended in buildings and works at the grounds. This latter sum is an investment so that practically the ordinary working expenses show a profit of £1095 16s 11d on the year's transactions. The overdraft stands at £4290 5s 9d against £4365 4s 4d last year.

### RULES.

- 1. The Society shall be called The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria.
- 2. The objects of the Society shall be to promote the development of the Agricultural, Pastoral, and Industrial resources of the colony:
  - (1.) By holding exhibitions at such places and times as the Council shall appoint; and by offering and awarding prizes and premiums at all such exhibitions.
  - (2.) By holding meetings at such places and times as the Council shall appoint, at which meetings papers may be read and discussed.
  - (3.) By collecting such information from Agricultural publications and Scientific works as may be useful in promoting the objects of the Society.
  - (4.) By corresponding with Agricultural and other kindred Societies at home and abroad, and collecting from such correspondence all information which, in the opinion of the Council, may lead to practical benefit in the cultivation of the soil and breeding of stock, as well as in the prosecution of other important industries.
  - (5.) By encouraging the attention of men of science to the discovery of better methods of cultivation, to the improvement of Agricultural implements and machinery, the construction of farm buildings, the application of chemistry to the general purposes of Agriculture, the destruction of insects injurious to vegetable life, and the eradication or utilisation of weeds.
  - (6.) By promoting the discovery and introduction of new varieties of cereals, vegetables, or grasses suitable to the climate, and capable of being cultivated with profit; and also the introduction of desirable kinds and varieties of live stock.
  - (7.) By collecting information regarding the management of plantations, live-fences, and other subjects connected with rural improvement.

- (8.) By investigating the nature of diseases in animals or plants, and taking measures for the publication, at such times and periods as the Council may appoint, of the information thus collected, together with all approved original essays sent in, lectures delivered, or papers read to the Society; besides making provision for the establishment of a Library and Reading-room for the use of Members.
- (9.) By remunerating any person, who shall undertake, at the request of the Council, to ascertain by experiment how far such information may lead to useful results in practice, for any loss incurred by such experiments.
- 3. The Society shall consist of a President, six Vice-Presidents three Trustees, Governors, Members, Honorary Scientific Members (not exceeding six in number), and Corresponding Members.
  - 4 The President shall be elected annually.
- 5. The Trustees shall be elected from the Members of the Society, including Governors and Members of Council, and may hold office until disqualified, or until they are removed in due form at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of the Society.
- 6. Governors shall pay a subscription of three pounds, and Members one pound annually, in advance, with power to compound for life by the payment in one sum of eight annual subscriptions.
- 7. Every candidate for admission into the Society, by giving his name and address, with his subscription to the Secretary, shall be duly constituted a member of the same, and shall have all the rights of Membership till the day after the Annual Meeting then next ensuing. Providing that when any subscription shall be paid in the name of any firm or company, any one member of the same may exercise the rights and privileges belonging to the same, and may be elected to any office.
- 8.(a) The Council shall consist of thirty-four members to be elected from amongst the Governors and Members of the Society.
  (b) From these thirty-four Members the Council shall elect a President and six Vice-Presidents, who shall be selected from the class of Governors only.
- 9. One-half of the Council shall retire annually in rotation, but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 10. The Council is to be regulated in its proceedings by such By-laws as may, and shall, from time to time, be enacted by it, conformably with the Constitution and objects of the Society; but no By-law shall in any case be altered, or new ones proposed,

unless notice of such intention has been given at a previous meeting, and sent to each Member of the Council.

- 11. The Council shall have sole management of the income and funds of the Society, and also the entire management and superintendence of all other affairs and concerns thereof.
- 12. The Council shall have power to appoint and remove all paid officers required for duly carrying out the objects of the Society.
- 13. The Council shall have power to elect Honorary, Scientific and Corresponding Members; notice of such intention having been given at a previous meeting, and a circular having been sent to each Member of the Council.
- 14. All Governors and Honorary Scientific Members may attend meetings of the Council, and take part in discussions thereat, but shall not have power to vote.
- 15. The Council may fill up any vacancies in its own body created by death, resignation, or occurring in any other way amongst its office bearers.
- 16. The Society's financial year shall end on the 31st of December; and a preliminary General Meeting shall be held on the third Thursday in January, to arrange the business and receive notices of motion for the Annual General Meeting, to appoint a paid Auditor, and to nominate gentlemen to fill the places of retiring office-bearers.
- 17. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in Melbourne on the third Thursday in February; at which meeting the Annual Report and Balance Sheet shall be read, office-bearers elected, and any other business transacted of which due notice may have been given.
- 18. Fourteen days at least before the Annual General Meeting the President or his deputy shall send or cause to be sent to all Subscribers to the Society (Governors or Members) a ballot paper with the names of all candidates who have been duly nominated, and each Subscriber desiring to vote shall erase therefrom all names he thinks fit. Provided that any ballot paper containing more than the required number of names shall be rejected by the President or his deputy. All such ballot papers shall be signed by the Subscriber voting, and shall be returned sealed, on or before the closing of the poll, which shall be at 3 o'clock p.m. on the day of the election, and the said ballot papers shall be opened and counted when the Returning Officer is making up the poll.
- 19. Seven days at least before the Annual Meeting a copy of the Report and audited Balance Sheet for the preceding year to

31st December shall be forwarded to every Subscriber to the Society (Governors or Members).

- 20. The Secretary shall report to the Meeting of Council next after the Annual Meeting the gentlemen elected to fill the vacancies, and the minutes shall be confirmed at the following Annual Meeting.
- 21. A special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time by the Secretary, on direction of the President, or on the requisition of ten Members of the Society; but no business shall be transacted at any such Meeting other than that for which it has been called.
- 22. A Special Meeting of the Council may be summoned by direction of the President, or of three Members of the Council; but no business then transacted shall be valid unless confirmed by special resolution by the next monthly Council.
- 23. The privilege of membership shall consist of power to vote at the election of office-bearers, of free admission to the Library, Reading-Room and Lectures, and with one lady, to the Society's Exhibitions, grounds and grand stand at all times.
- 24. Any member guilty of conduct calculated to bring the Society into discredit in connection with its Exhibitions or other objects shall be liable to be brought before the Council, and, if found guilty, shall be subject to reprimand, or to have his name expunged from the Roll of Members, and may be disqualified from exhibiting during the pleasure of the Council.
- 25. These Rules shall not be altered except by a majority of the members present at the Annual or at a Special General Meeting of not less than ten Members, exclusive of Members of Council.

# BY-LAWS.

### GENERAL MEETINGS.

- 1. Public notice of the Preliminary, Annual and Special General Meetings of the Society shall be given in such newspapers as the Council may decide, and by circular through post to every Governor and Member; and all matters, except the election of the office bearers at the Annual Meeting, shall be determined by a show of hands, unless a division be called for. At every Annual General Meeting a Report, together with a Financial Statement from the Council, shall be read, and any Governor or Member present may propose any question to the Council respecting the matters contained in such Report and comment thereon; or may refer to such other matters relating to the government of the Society and the management of its affairs as to him may seem proper, provided that his remarks have reference to some motion of which notice has been previously given at the Preliminary General meeting.
- 2. At the Preliminary General Meeting in January, Notices of Motion for the Annual General Meeting in the following month will be received, Auditors appointed, and gentlemen nominated to fill the places of retiring office-bearers. Previous to the day of meeting the Council shall have prepared a list of Governors and Members whom they propose to fill the vacant offices of President, Vice-Presidents, and Members of Council; to which list of candidates the names of any other Governors and members may be added on their being duly proposed and seconded at the Meeting.
- 3. The Council at the First Ordinary Meeting after the Annual Election shall elect its own President and three Vice-Presidents.
- 4. The President or his deputy shall conduct the election at the Annual General Meeting, at which meeting two or more scrutineers shall be chosen by the President or his deputy to assist in making up the state of the poll.
- 5. Should it be deemed advisable to remove one or more of the trustees from office, notice to that effect must be given at the Preliminary General Meeting, or one month previous to any Special General Meeting. Governors to fill the vacancies, if any, must also be nominated at the former meeting, and elected

at the latter. Extraordinary vacancies amongst the Trustees may be filled up by the Council, or at the Annual General Meeting.

#### THE PRESIDENT.

6. The President shall, in all official relations of the Society, take precedence of all other Governors and Members, and shall take the chair, when present, having (as well as any other Chairman of the Council) the privilege of a casting vote in addition to his own in all cases of equality in a division on any question. He shall sign all such letters, votes of thanks, and other documents as the Council may direct to be written in the name and on behalf of the Council.

#### THE COUNCIL.

- 7. The Council shall hold a meeting at least every month, on such day and at such hour as the Council may decide, for the transaction of the business of the Society, and may adjourn from time to time at their discretion.
- 8. At the Monthly Meetings the Council shall have full power to originate, discuss and decide, by a majority of votes on a show of hands, all questions not involving an unusual outlay of money brought before it; provided that if any Member present regard any proposition brought forward as too important for immediate decision, he may object and demand the usual month's notice, whereupon all discussion on the question shall cease.
- 9. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion previously passed by the Council during the same year, shall be entertained unless one month's notice be given to the Council.
- 10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final in all matters of order and practice.
- 11. If before half an hour after the time at which any Meeting of the Council is called, a quorum of members be not present, the Members present, or the majority of them, or any one Member, if only one be present, or the Secretary, if no Member be present, may adjourn such Meeting to any time not longer than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.
- 12. Minutes of the proceedings of every Meeting of the Council, or of any Committee, shall be taken during their progress by the Secretary, or, in case of his absence, by some Member present whom the Chairman may appoint for the occasion. The minutes shall afterwards be fairly copied into a minute book kept for that purpose.

- 13. The Council shall, from time to time, draw up such By-laws as may appear to them expedient for conducting the proceedings of their own Meetings, which shall be binding on the Members of Council, for the good management of the Society and its concerns; and all such By-laws shall be binding on all and every the Governors and Members, Honorary and Corresponding Members, officers and servants of the Society, as well as on all exhibitors or their assistants, at the Society's exhibitions.
- 14. The Council may appoint Committees to examine into or take action on any special matters relating to the objects or business of the Society, and may dissolve such Committees whensoever they shall think proper.
- 15. The Council shall appoint a Banker or Bankers to the Society, to whom all sums of money received by the Secretary or other persons for the use of the Society shall be paid.
- 16. No money shall be drawn from the Society's banking account but by order of the Council, after a report from the Finance Committee and by cheques signed by two Members of such Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary. A book shall be kept in which a consecutive entry shall be made of all such payments.
- 17. If any office-bearer, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Council without leave having been obtained, his seat shall be declared vacant.
- 18. The Secretary shall notify to the Council, on the Agenda Paper, any vacancy which may have occurred in the list of President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees or Members of the Council, at the meeting of Council next after the happening of such vacancy; and such vacancy shall not be filled up until the monthly meeting of the Council which shall take place next after such notice.
- 19. In the absence of the President, the chair shall be taken by a Vice-President; and should neither of such officers be present, then by such Member as the Council shall choose as their Chairman by a majority of votes.
  - 20. The quorum of a monthly or Special Council shall be five.
- 21. At every monthly meeting of Council the order of business shall be as follows: (1) Reading and confirming minutes of previous meeting. (2) Election of officers, and nomination for vacancies. (3) Finance Committee's Report. (4) Postponed business. (5) Correspondence. (6) Motions. (7) Notices of Motions.
- 22. All minutes and reports read at, and adopted by the Council, shall be signed by the Chairman.

23. The report from the Council to the Annual Meeting, in February, shall be prepared at the Council Meeting first in January, or at some adjournment thereof.

#### COMMITTEES.

- 24. The Council shall elect such standing Committees at the Monthly Council Meeting in March as they think fit which shall remain in office until the Annual General Meeting in the ensuing year.
- 25. Each Committee, at its first meeting, shall elect its own Chairman for that year, and in his absence a Chairman shall be elected by the Committee for the occasion; and any member of any such Committee who shall absent himself from three consecutive meetings without leave shall thereupon cease to be a member of such Committee, and the vacancy so created shall be filled up at the next Council Meeting ensuing.
- 26. All Committees may make or adopt rules for the conduct of their business, and shall make a report of their proceedings to the Council and shall sit until they have made their respective reports; but in case such reports shall not have been made previous to the third Thursday in February next after their appointment, their powers shall then cease.

#### THE SECRETARY.

27. The Secretary shall be immediately responsible to the Council for the discharge of his various duties. He shall attend the sittings of all meetings of the Council, and shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and keep letter books, in which copies of all letters on the business of the Society shall be entered.

28. Under the direction of the Finance Committee he shall be responsible for all money received, paying such sums into the hands of the Society's Bankers, and producing at each meeting of the Finance Committee receipts for the same; and, excepting the amounts allowed him for petty cash, he shall not retain in his hands any money belonging to the Society, but shall pay it over forthwith to the Society's Bankers. He shall have charge of the expenditure of petty cash.

29. He shall have the custody of all books, models and papers belonging to the Society. All books, pamphlets, &c., becoming the property of the Society, shall be stamped with the Society's

stamp at once.

30. He shall have the immediate superintendence over the clerks and servants of the Society, and shall be required to report to the Council any instances of misconduct on their part which he thinks of such a nature as to require the consideration of the Council.

- 31. He shall find, if required, approved security to the amount of £5,000, the premium to be paid by the Society.
- 32. The Secretary shall not exercise any of the privileges of a Governor or Member of the Society.

#### FINANCE.

33. The Finance Committee shall have the immediate care of the Society's accounts, and shall meet on the Friday before the ordinary Council Meeting in each month in order to prepare a report for the Council on the state of the Society's funds, which they shall present to each Monthly Meeting, and lay before it in the following form—

as well as a statement of the payments recommended to be made together with all the books in which entries of cash receipts or payments are made, and such documents as the business of the day may require. Should a report from the Finance Committee not have been presented to the Meeting of Council, the Secretary shall report the state of the funds to the Council, in which case the Council shall vote the moneys required without such report.

34. The Chairman of the Finance Committee shall be the

Honorary Treasurer of the Society.

35. All receipts for money received on behalf of the Society shall be out of a book with counterpart.

36. All moneys received and paid shall be entered daily in a

general cash book.

37. Once in every year, not later than two weeks after the Preliminary General Meeting, there shall be an audit of the Society's accounts by a professional accountant, before whom a balance sheet shall be laid by the Secretary, which audited account shall be presented at the Annual Meeting.




