Annual Report of the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria

To the Members -

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Council of your Society now reports on the Society's activities during the year ended 31st December, 1955.

ROYAL SHOW

The Society's 1955 Show, which was staged from 22nd September to 1st October, was officially opened on Friday, 23rd September by His Excellency, the Governor of Victoria, Sir Dallas Brooks who was accompanied by Lady Brooks.

The Council is most appreciative of the keen interest displayed by Sir Dallas and Lady Brooks in our Royal Show.

An excellent entry of 22,457 was received for the Show and the exhibits displayed were generally of a very high standard.

The early part of the Show was marred by adverse weather which greatly affected the attendances on these days but despite this 648,137 people visited the Show. This total is 29,324 less than the all-time record for 1954.

Over 7,000 children took advantage of the Council's offer of admitting at half the usual price, parties of school children accompanied by their teachers.

The Arena programme, although somewhat up-set on the first Friday by wet weather, was well organised throughout the Show. Special Arena attractions were not all of a standard required by the Society but every effort is being made to improve these attractions for 1956, which should encourage greater patronage from our City people.

Public reaction to the Navy Display featuring the Helicopter and the finish of the Warrnambool to Melbourne Bicycle Race indicates that both of these events are well worthy for consideration for the 1956 Show. The Grand Prix Jumping Contest and the special night for Night-Trotting also brought very favourable comments.

These are the type of events which should greatly help our Arena program.

The Wood-chopping events in a separate Arena again provided good competitive entertainment for a large number of spectators. The new "Baker" judging machine proved most successful and will benefit the Society in future years by allowing more axemen to compete in the various heats thus saving log supplies.

The new Dairying Industry Display was an outstanding attraction and was a step further in the desire of the Council to give practical demonstrations of the workings of major primary industries of Victoria.

The mechanical section of the display showed in full scale the operations connected with the production of pasteurized bottled milk. Approximately 65,000 bottles of milk were bottled in the display and all were disposed of in the Milk Bar. The Dairy Display Sandwich Bar was well patronized and over 150,000 sandwiches were sold. The special Dairy Sample Bag stand completely sold out the 60,000 bags prepared.

One third of the space was made available to the processing section of the industry and through their Dairy Industry Committee they staged a colourful display of all milk products made in Victoria.

Homogenised flavoured milk was introduced in Victoria at two special milk bars. 30,000 bottles were sold and it is anticipated that this new milk drink will develop extensively in this State in the near future.

The International Fleece Competition was again well supported and made an attractive display in the Centenary Hall.

A larger area was made available for an aquarium and the display staged by the Association proved a good public attraction.

The demand for stands at the Show was again far greater than the space available. The 1955 Standholders, by erecting new buildings and extending and generally improving existing stands, helped to add much colour to our Show.

MEMBERSHIP

The Medallions made available for full Membership of the Society this year brought favourable comments from many members.

DIVISION OF CATTLE BREEDS

Owing to the compulsory demolition of part of No. 2 Cattle Pavilion to make way for the New Grandstand it was decided to divide two Dairy Cattle Breeds i.e. Australian Illawarra Shorthorns and Guernseys at the 1955 Show. This move appeared to be satisfactory and further consideration will be given to this matter.

DEVELOPMENT OF GROUNDS

The additional land with buildings at the western end of the Show Grounds purchased during the year and the demolition of the old houses in Leonards Crescent will give the Society the opportunity of further developing the Grounds.

OVERSEAS SCHOLARSHIP

It is desired to place on record the Society's keen appreciation for the generous gift made by the Trustees of the H. V. McKay Trust in making available sufficient funds to enable a Victorian farmer to travel overseas.

With the co-operation of the Nuffield Foundation Organisation, the Society has arranged for a Victorian farmer to travel abroad early in 1956.

The successful applicant for this first Scholarshipwas Mr. R. M. Butler of Newstead.

The Society feels that Mr. Butler will prove a worthy representative and that he will, on his return, be able to impart his knowledge to other farmers in our State.

COUNCIL

At the annual election of office-bearers, Mr. T. N. Mitchell was re-elected President of the Society and His Honour Judge Mitchell, Messrs. J. Bott and L. M. Dugdale were re-elected Vice-Presidents.

It is with deep regret that the deaths of Capt. A. E. T. Payne and Mr. J. A. Beattie are recorded.

Capt. Payne was elected to the Council of the Society in 1908 and was a Trustee of the Society from 1921 to 1949. He also occupied the position of Vice President on several occasions. His great assistance and enthusiasm in connection with the Society's activities will always be remembered and valued.

The late Mr. Beattie was elected to the Council in 1911 and his efforts over these years are greatly appreciated.

Leave of absence, during various stages of the year, was granted Messrs. A. R. Creswick, K. G. Luke and T. Luxton, Jnr. who travelled Overseas during the year.

NEW GRANDSTAND

Satisfactory progress is now being made in connection with the erection of the New Grandstand and it is anticipated that the first section of the Stand will be available for use early in the new year. When completed the stand will provide members of the Society with much greater facilities during the Show period.

FINANCE

The financial statements and Balance Sheet for the year ended the 31st December 1955 are attached to this report. The revenue has been considerably increased due to some extent to the increased use of the grounds between Shows for Night Trotting, storage and soccer. The expenditure of the Society has however, shown an increase due mainly to increased costs of labour and materials and improvements made to the grounds.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

The Council's appreciation is recorded for the presence of the Premier, The Hon. Mr. H. E. Bolte and members of the State Cabinet and many other members of the State Parliament, also the numerous members of the Federal Government, who visited our Show.

Special thanks are due to the Lord Mayor (Sir Frank Selleck) and the Mayor of Essendon (Cr. E. B. Basford) for their interest in our Royal Show and also to the Minister for Education (The Hon. Col. W. W. Leggatt) and the Director of Education (Major General A. H. Ramsay) who again permitted parties of school children to visit the Show on various days.

The Overseas Judges were Captain and Mrs. Will Judy of U.S.A. who judged a number of the dog classes, Mr. L. Sherriff of New Zealand who judged Aberdeen Angus and Mr. D. Holden also of New Zealand who judged in the Horse Section and together with the many other judges, Stewards and Stewardesses, carried out their duties most efficiently.

It is desired to record thanks to Mr. A. H. Mullett who recently retired as Director of Agriculture for the co-operation which he rendered to the Society during his term in Office.

Congratulations are extended to Mr. P. Ryan who has been appointed as Mr. Mullett's successor.

Thanks are extended to the various Breed Societies, Public bodies, the Press and Broadcasting Stations for their great part in making our Show such a success.

The Council also desires to record its appreciation of the splendid work done by the members of the staff during the year.
