Technology and Tourism Pavilion



From Paddock to Plate

eat has always been a

It all began more than 200 years ago when the First Fleet settlers arrived in Port Jackson with a small load of chooks, horses, convicts and two bulls and five cows.

The cattle were destined to breed for feeding hungry free settlers but the small herd escaped and settled at "Cowpastures" near Camden in New South Wales. There was no controlled breeding, they couldn't be caught and the herd eventually died out.

Every ship thereafter brought some cattle, as the colony was never far from starvation. By 1800 the official census gave the cattle population at 1044, with another 300 wild in the bush.

Early farmers realised that only strong sturdy breeds would survive in this rugged new country. By 1826 the first Herefords were imported by the Cressy Company and by the 1890s, there was more than 5 million head of cattle in Australia.

The well-known "Australian made" Murray Grey cattle are this year's Nissan Feature Beef Breed at the 1995 St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show, a breed which were developed by accident in the early 1900s, from Angus

Murray Greys are now one of our country's most significant exports. Chief executive of the Murray Grey Beef Cattle Society, Mr Ken Cooper, says Murray Grey beef is gaining in popularity around the world for its fine taste and low fat content.

At this year's Show, Murray Grey cattle are one of the focal points for the general public, with breeders proudly exhibiting their cattle and the Australian Meat and Live-stock Corporation emphasising the importance of meat at exciting displays in the Meat Promotions Centre.

The international feel of Australia's beef industry continues, with American Angus breeder, Mr Brian McCulloh from Viroqua Wisconcin in the United States, Judging major beef events.

Mr McCulloh's is touted as one of the top three US beef judges, and his chosen carcase will be processed and served as the feature beef dish at the Soclety's Best of the Land Dinner on 27th October.

Australia has come a long way in its beef cattle industry – we can now see literally dozens of different breeds of cattle in the pavilions with more than 188 Simmental entries and 138 Murray Grey entries.

Murray Grey breeders will be hoping to take out the most prestigious beef award at the Show – the Borthwick Trophy. For the last two years, the breed has won the 42-year-old trophy for the best group of three steers judged both on the hoof and hook. The trophy, considered the commercial producers' equivalent to interbreed stud awards, has been won by Murray Greys on 10 occasions – more wins than any other breed since they first entered the event in 1967.

The Feedlot Industry

"When you look at the massive feedlot development that is taking place in northern Victoria and the NSW southern Riverina which can carry up to 100,000 head of cattile, you can see the Murray Grey is increasingly in demand. This makes it appropriate Murray Grey is this year's Show feature breed," Mr Cooper says.

"Murray Greys work well in feedlots

because they have a doclle temperament, meaning that when the animals are purchased, it helps with profitability if they can adapt, converting feed into meat," he explains.

Bazadaise Beef Cattle

The little known French Bazadaise, which is rapidly becoming known as the "perfect butcher's beast", is also featured at the Show this year.

Bred on the French-Spanish border, a handful of Bazadaise cattle were shipped to Australia in 1991 by Cobram-based farmer Bernie O'Kane.

Bazadalse cattle created enormous interest throughout the Australian cattle industry after successfully being used in one of Australia's most ambitious breeding programs in the Northern Territory at Bullo River Station.

You will all remember Bulio River Station and its famous owner Sara Henderson, after she won the 1991 Businesswoman of the Year award. Sara and her devoted daughters turned around the fortunes of their cattle station after husband Charles died, leaving them with a million-dollar debt.

"We expect offspring to grow faster than Brahman cattle and produce a 300 kilogram animal for the live export trade to Asia in between 12 and 18 months," the family said recently.

With only 17 members in the recently formed Bazadaise Breeders Association, the breed still has a long way to go before proving Itself in this competitive commercial beef market. But, as Bernie O'Kane says, "the Northern Territory is the toughest place the Bazadaise could have come. . .and it has thrived."





atting paddocks, feed displays and animal information signs are just some of the many improvements which have been made to the National Australia Bank Animal Nursery for the 1995 Royal Melbourne Show.

"We're trying to make it a lot more interactive this year," explains Maree Jamieson, who is managing the event with her husband Paul. "We want it to be more than just a look over the fence."

The Animal Nursery has been a favourite of Show patrons for more than 30 years and Maree believes that creating the facilities for people to actually touch the animals will make it even more popular.

"Children who visit the Show long to touch the animals," she says. "But because most of the animals are usually there to be 'shown', the children aren't always able to touch them."


The Nursery has been set up to represent a typical farmyard, complete with paddocks, fences, trees and sheds. Surrounding walls feature information boards with basic facts about the animals.

Children can experience the "feel" of the farmyard through both the patting paddock and through a feed display which they are able to touch.

"Sometimes people don't know just how lovely it is to run their hands through a bag of oats," Maree says.

Animals which are represented in the Nursery include sheep, goats, calves, pigs, chooks and ducks. There is also a section of exotic farmyard animals which features

llamas, alpacas, miniature pigs, miniature ponies, deer and emus.

Owners of the more exotic animals stay with their animals so that they can answer questions from the public. Students completing a course in animal handling at the Box Hill College of TAFE, Paul and Maree Jamieson and other co-ordinators are on hand to answer questions about the other animals.

Animals In the Nursery cope well with their time in the spotlight. Most of them come from the Jamieson's mobile farm, which is taken to primary schools throughout Victoria in a pre-Show education program.

"They're usually either babies or they've been born into the environment," Maree says. To ensure that everybody who visits the

Nursery has the same opportunity to enjoy the animals, the Jamiesons have introduced a queuing system for the first time in 1995.

"Crowds at the Nursery are always big," Maree explains. "And we need to make sure that smaller children can see."

"The Animal Nursery is enjoyable, interactive and educational," she adds. "And it's definitely worth waiting to see."



Authority, is the new addition to the 1995 Show Family. The display's interactive emphasis not only breathes new life into Show Time entertainment, but also into a new generation of the farmyard animal kingdom.

Nature's Way emphasises the family. Special guests on Show include a cattle family, comprising a bull, cow and a calf. They make special appearances during the day in the demonstration ring, alongside cows which have already calved or are about to calve.

Other animals in the Nature's Way cast include the sheep, goat, horse, dog and poultry families. The display aims to show children aged about 8-14 how animals are brought into the world and cared for during the first year of life.

Frequent presentations on reproduction are being made by leading scientists from Agriculture Victoria. They are assisted by agriculture and veterinary university students.


We invite people young and young at heart to come and see for themselves animals coming into the world. If Ilve births don't happen before patrons' eyes, at the very least they can watch it happen on a large video screen.

Other things at Nature's Way to see in action include the use of ultrasound – just like in humans – in monitoring unborn animals. You can also see how scientists and experienced stock people assist Mother Nature during birth and throughout early stages of growth.

Pigs & People



Meal time for plgs is a highly sclentific occasion, and is the focus of this year's St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show Pigs And People display.

The display comes to the show via a joint effort by Agriculture Victoria, Australian Pork Corporation and the Pork Research and Development Corporation.

Since 1993 the Society team comprising pig experts from Agriculture Victoria and agriculture and veterinary university students, has

invited patrons to take a closer look at Australia's multi-million dollar pork industry.

This year the display shows what it is that contented pigs eat, and the high level science enlisted to keep a hungry pig satisfied.

Pig producers are extremely dependent on the skills of scientists to prepare a pigs' carefully mixed high protein diet of wheat, maize and sorghum. And pigs, like humans, have special dietary requirements at different stages of their lives.

Pig weaners, just off their mother, need a high protein dlet. A 'grower' pig's feed mixture is slightly different to a 'breeder's' while a sow when she's lactating needs a bit extra in her dlet again.

Pigs And People also demonstrates that like most farm livestock, different breeds of pigs are used for different purposes. Breeds on display during Show time Include the Large White, Duroc, Landrace and Hampshire. Each pig breed has a speclal role to play in the pork industry.

The display also includes a sow with her litter, plus a foster mother nursing several piglets of different breeds at once. Because pigs cannot sweat, the Society team has set up a glassed 'ensuite' for patrons to watch pigs keep themselves cool and clean – complete with drinking nipples!

Especially for smaller patrons, the RASV team has VIK seating – for Very Important Kids, of course! This seating arrangement will ensure special guests will be able to not only hear the expert commentary provided by Agriculture Victoria, but also see the porky action up front.


One Australia will be parked near the Animal Nursery and she will be fully rigged for the 11 days of the Show.

o you want to learn a bit about horses? Farrier's Forge has everything that you need to know.

"Farrier's Forge is most importantly a learning medium for the public," says Carl O'Dwyer who has been organising the exhibition since it began seven years ago. "We would like to help people develop better horsemanship and farrier techniques."

Carl, who is a farrier by trade and the owner and chairman of O'Dwyer Horse Shoe Sales in Kilmore, Victoria, believes that not everybody who buys a horse knows everything associated with actually looking after it.

Amongst the facts which will be pointed out to the public is how a horse's shoes need to be replaced on a regular basis. "Horses need to be shod every five or six weeks," Carl explains. "Many people overlook this and as a result, the horse will suffer."

There is also a horse dentist who can show people how to look after their horse's teeth correctly and representatives from drug companies who will explain how to control parasites.

Other things worth checking out at Farrier's Forge are demonstrations from the Harness Racing School and a variety of farrier competitions.

You can also see the most modern techniques in horse-breaking, as demonstrated by Ron Connelly and John Patterson.


Ron and John have both had plenty of experience in this particular field – Ron is a horse breaker from Omeo (traditionally known as Man From Snowy River country) while John has a horsebreaking business in Flemington and is a Clerk of the Course at Flemington Racecourse.

Keeping an eye on proceedings is Tok Maher, a 93 year old blacksmith who specializes in wheelwrighting.

Carlton & United Breweries Moodchopping Carnival

ome people say woodchopping Is one of the best kept secrets of international sport. At this year's St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show it's far from that! In fact, it's taking centre stage throughout the eleven-day program.

With 153 axemen and women competing in this age-old-competition, veteran woodchopper from Tasmania, David Foster, says he's ready for anything. Wearing his 150th recent world title with just a hint of pride he says: "We were bred for this competition."

This six foot four chunky Burnie-based legend has what it takes to beat his rivals this year – he's bringing his entire family with him to take on some of the best in the game including the Caldwell family of Gippsland.

Woodchopping was developed in Tasmania in the mid 19th century and while it is a competition mainly unique to Australia and New Zealand, the 1995 St. George Bank Royal Melbourne Show is eager to announce a newcomer, an axeman from Denmark.

Jesper Witzke was happily accepted as a late entry, and, according to the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria's woodchopping secretary, John Holt, he is eagerly awaiting a chance at the big hit!

There are four main events to see in Woodchopping in both handicap and championship classes.

Chairman of the Woodchopping

Committee, Neil Edwards, says every event begins with a count.

"Competitors with the lowest handicap can start at the count of one. Our best men can sometimes start at 123 seconds," he explains.

He says the eventual winner will always be the one who severs the block in the least number of blows.

In the competition you will see:

- The Standing Block, where competitors cut the log whilst it is fixed in a vertical position. They must put their axe to wood in a fixed number of chops and as the chips fly they must sever the log.
- The Underhand, where the axeman stands on top of the log in foot holes which are prepared before the event.
- Tree Felling, where the axeman climbs a tree with three boards. It's been described as the toughest of all four events as the top board is about THREE metres from the ground. A true balancing act!
- Sawing is conducted in both double handed (with a partner) and single handed. The Jack and Jill this year witnesses David Foster's daughter Janelle teaming up with her grandfather, Henry Munday, for the first time.

These events are all conducted under the rules of the Australian Axeman's Association and the competition is indeed flerce and without favor.

A FEW COMPETITORS:

David Foster O.A.M.: The current world champion. He possesses the speed and strength to be rated the best all round axeman in the world. With his late father he holds the double handed sawing world title. At the 1990 Royal Melbourne Show he won the grand aggregate from 30 seconds behind.



Judging is completed before fleeces are displayed in Centenary Hall during the Show. Fleeces are assessed for their truness to type, length, soundness, handle, color or bloom, character, density, evenness and clean fibre content. The judging task is taken on by nationally-renowned experts.

Premier events include best carpet wool, feature fleece (this year Merino ewe & wether), most successful exhibitor and the JF Guthrie Perpetual Challenge Trophy for the most valuable skirted Corriedale ram fleece in Show. A special lambs' wool competition has also been created.

The Polwarth Sheepbreeders' Association of Australia (Victoria branch) is offering prizes for the breed's best fleece while the Henry W. The ever-popular shearing competitions are back again.

Shearing in entenar

he sheep themselves have not been forgotten and again star in the Show's ever popular shearing competitions.

Shearers from all over Australia vie for the prestige of winning a St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show class, with competition scheduled in Centenary Hall on September 29, 30 and October 1.

Competitors are given a time limit to shear a set number of sheep (probably between four and eight, depending on time constraints) and lose points for wool left on or cuts to the animals. It is not just speed which is important, careful shearing means better quality fleeces which in turn, means better returns for the farmer.

Shearing Demonstrations are on four times daily until the competitions starts.



t is said that Australia rode on the sheep's back for many years. This is the chance to see the variety and quality of sheep we have in Australia.

While the Merino gained pride of place in Australian history, many of the other 18 breeds of sheep featured in this year's Show also played important roles in our development.

This year's Feature Breed is the White Suffolk. Bred for their large framed, heavyweight lambs which are quite lean, White Suffolks are ideal for the breed's major calling among the prime lamb industry.

White Suffolks grow shorter wool in comparison to other breeds like Merino. As the name suggests, White Suffolks are completely white, although traditional Suffolks feature black head, legs and feet.

very exhibitor treats the 300-odd St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show Judges with just a little caution and a great deal of respect – because it is these men and women who can determine the success or failure of a \$10,000 steer, a pot of Jam, a fleece of wool or the latest designs in eggshell art!

There are about 5000 competitive classes this year with more than \$250,000 in prize money on offer and 13,000 sashes and ribbons to give away.

You'll see all the traditional entrants come back but there are also entrants that have only recently been part of the Show.

Just ask Arthur Pepper, who has entered the traditional European alcoholic-honey drink called MEAD. He's certain to make the tastebuds tickle! Judging this year's mead competition is Cliff Heard, a Wine Show veteran of 31 years.

"There are about 13 entrants in this year's Show who are all using different ingredients and developing different characters for their own drinks," Cliff says.

But how do you judge mead? Out of 20 points, Cliff Heard will allocate a maximum of 3 points to the color and the clarity; 7 points for bouquet, and 10 points for palate.

"It's a difficult judging competition for the very reason that there are literally hundreds of different types of honey which could be used, like leatherwood, or ironwood and so on".

And ever wondered how they judge the poultry? Just ask postmaster Neil Penny. Being the Poultry Superintendent, he explains that judging is based on the British Poultry Standard, where Judges look for fowl with broad shoulders, flat backs and slopes to the tail. There are 780 classes of fowl this year incorporating 175 varieties.

And for the beautiful, sometimes weird but definitely wonderful, you cannot go past taking in the cream of Victoria's creative crop displayed in the Arts and Crafts pavilion, Centre Point Building and William Angliss Gallery.

Inside, enjoy medal winning displays of arts, crafts, cookery plus competitions for schoolchildren and the disabled which provides a forum for not only traditional work like knitting, preserves, photography and painting, but also surprises like book binding, eggshell work, bead craft, bark art, calligraphy and even porcelain figurines!

hooks are only judged on one day of the St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show, but every year Neil Penny spends at least double that amount of time getting his birds ready for the event.

"There's a lot of work done prior to the Show," Neil explains. "You've got to train them to sit in their pens, you've got to handle them so that they're used to people and then you've got to make sure that their toenails are the right length, that they are vermin-free, and that their feathers and legs are clean."

Washing, in fact, is one of the biggest tasks in preparing chooks for show.

"All birds should be washed at least once in their showing life," says Neil. "And white birds should be washed for every show."

Nell, who specialises in leghorn bantams, will usually spend an entire weekend making sure that his birds are clean – and if you think that it's as simple as a quick dip in a bucket of water, think again.

"It takes at least an hour to wash a bird," says Neil. "You have to be extremely careful about the way you wash them so that their feathers don't get broken."

Neil washes his chooks in a laundry trough using either Velvet or Lux soap flakes (sometimes he will also throw in a Rickett's Blue Bag which will give the bird an added whiteness). Legs and feet are scrubbed clean with a toothbrush and then the task of rinsing them begins.

"The trick is to make sure that you get all the soap out. Otherwise they end up with a yellow tinge to their coats," he explains.

Neil generally finds that the birds need two or three rinses before they are pronounced clean. In the final rinse, he will add some Martha Gardiner's Wool Mix to help ensure that all the soap is gone.

"Anything which you can wash your delicate clothes in you can wash your chooks in," Neil says.

Neil believes that there is more to showing a chook than simply placing it in a cage for the judges to see. "As exhibitors, we've got to highlight the birds' good features," he explains.

"Just like a person has a good and bad side to their profile, so does a chook and we've

got to try and make sure that the judges see their good side."

Neil says that in a class where there are 20 or more entries, there are often very fine distinctions which will determine whether or not a bird is a winner.

"A bird should be judged on its good points first," he explains. "But it often depends on how well the bird holds itself while it is being judged."

Nell has been showing at the Royal Melbourne Show since 1966 and has also shown at a variety of other places – including Bendigo, Ballarat, Warragul and Newcastle.

He believes that the Royal Melbourne Show rates as one of the best shows and every September he takes three weeks of annual leave from his job as Postmaster at the Melton Post Office to ensure he can be there.

"The Royal Melbourne Show is regarded as one of the better Royals," he says. "It's certainly the highlight of my showing year." oan Henderson believes that providing people with the opportunity to see many different breeds is one of the biggest advantages of being part of the Whiskas Cat Section at the St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show.

"It's an exhibition and it gives people the opportunity to see all the different breeds," says Joan,who first showed her Abyssinian cats at the Royal Melbourne Show in 1970. "It helps the public to establish which cats are best for them."

Joan says that another major benefit of having the cat section at the Show is that it helps to improve the standard of cats in general.

"Competition encourages better breeding because obviously everybody likes to win and the healthy, vigorous cats who best meet the standards win," she explains.

Like most exhibitors, Joan rates the Royal Melbourne Show as the "most prestigious" in her showing calendar. "There's a great deal of prestige in winning at the Royal because we generally have an overseas judge," she says. "There's also the fact that there's usually such a large number of cats entered."

A day of exhibiting cats at the Show starts extremely early, with judging beginning at 9am, and a routine veterinary inspection before that.

"It's extremely important that every cat is declared healthy," Joan explains. "They have their ears and teeth checked, their temperature taken and their claws inspected."

Cat owners are required to leave the pavilion while judging is taking place. The general public can see the cats from 12.30 pm to 5 pm on the day of judging (Friday 22nd to Sunday 24th September).

Cat owners will usually go to a considerable amount of time to decorate their animals, but the cats themselves are usually a bit more nonchalant about the whole affair.

"The majority of cats will just take it in their stride – especially if they've been shown as kittens," Joan says. "Mostly, cats are very sensible and just curl up and go to sleep.



avies – or guinea pigs as they are better known to many people – are one of the most popular exhibits at the St.George Bank Show and Robert Brown, who has been exhibiting them for more than 23 years, attributes this to their nature.

"They are an excellent pet for children," he says. "They are very quiet and have a lovely inquisitive personality."

Preparing cavies to go on show is no mean feat. They must be bathed, groomed (for owners of long haired breeds of cavies,

this often means putting their hair in rollers) and trained to sit on a judging table.

"If you're going to show cavies, it really is important to handle them from a very young age," explains Robert, who specialises in Abyssinian, Self-Blacks and Black Crested cavies. "They have to be quiet enough to sit on the table."

Robert baths his cavles in Triocil animal shampoo and spends a considerable amount of time grooming them before they are judged.

He has exhibited at many shows around Victoria and the Cavies National Show in Narrandera, New South Wales, but ranks the Royal Melbourne Show ranks as one of his favourite events. "It really is the premier agricultural show," he says.

Around 200 cavies will compete at this year's Show, and this will include a number of interstate entries.

They are amongst the most interesting animals to see at the Show, so make sure you stop at the Mitchell Stand and have a look.

Rian Emmott loves the feeling of winning – and it is a feeling which he has come to know well.

Brian and his son Heath exhibit Nevityn, Dwarf and Polish rabbits in the Rabbit section at the St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show and have won the coveted Best Rabbit in Show prize on more than one occasion.

With around 300 entries – many of them from interstate – the Royal Melbourne Show boasts the biggest rabbit show in Australia.

Judges come from as far afield as New Zealand and England, and exhibitors will go to a great deal of trouble to ensure that their rabbits are groomed immaculately.

"Everybody enjoys showing at the Royal Melbourne Show," Brian says. "Because the thing about the Show is that there's so many entries and the quality is so high.

"A win at the Show puts you in the category of best in Australia."

Dogs Have Their Day

very dog will literally have its day at this year's St.Ceorge Bank Royal Melbourne Show, with about 5600 dogs entered in 20 classes over 11 days of the Pedegree Pal Dog Judging program.

Dog judging and all the proud exhibitors will be here every day in the Woodfull Pavilion and the William Cockbill Pavilion, where you can take a close look at the popular german shepherds, rottweilers, rhodesian ridgebacks and staffordshire terriers. And last year's favorite and fashionable Alaskan Malalute is also back to delight the crowds.

Two exciting new breeds, the Dogue de Bordeaux (from Turner and Hooch fame) and the American Bluetick Coonhound, will take their turns to go on parade in the dog arena.

Judging each day is broken up into seven categories of dogs – the toys, the terriers, the gun dogs (retrievers), hounds, working dogs, utility dogs and non-sporting dogs.

The Victorian Canine Association's Merliyn Syme says the VCA dog showbag will again be around for the third year running: Valued at \$32.98 it is selling to doglovers for only \$5 and includes information about purebred dogs and dog obedience schools, two tins of Pal dog

The Dice of Experience

hen Tonya Syme steps into the show ring with her Alaskan Malamutes, she can be sure that she has the right amount of experience for the job.

Tonya started showing dogs when she was only seven years old and since then, has not missed one Royal Melbourne Show.

"I started with Great Danes," she explains. "And I have been showing Malamutes for the past 17 years."

To prepare her dogs for the Show, Tonya will spend a large amount of time on training and grooming.

She will also spend a considerable amount of time "dressing up" the dog's bench. To do this, she will put up signs, the dog's name and other kinds of decorations.

"When the dog is on the bench he is on display to the general public," Tonya says. "And you've got to be aware of that."

The public are keen to learn about the dogs and will usually ask questions about how much they cost, what they eat, their name and their breed.

Tonya has enjoyed many moments of glory at the Royal Melbourne Show.

Amongst the many prizes she has collected is a "Best Exhibit in Show" trophy – the pinnacle of success for any Australian dog owner.

She is bound to be a major contender, once again, in 1995.

food, the latest edition of Pedigree Pal Breeder news, dog toys and dog "goodies".

Dog judges will be available, among other experienced dog people, to give specialist advice and to answer any questions you might have about your dog in the information caravan near the dog arena.

"We try to help people make a decision if they are thinking of buying a certain breed and we have a lot of literature to give out to people on most dog breeds at the Show," Merilyn Syme says.

An Early Start For a Big Day

or Margaret Wilby, a day of exhibiting at the St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show means getting up at around 4.30 in the morning to prepare for the day ahead.

Margaret, who breeds and exhibits corgis, says that there are many things to take care of before she even leaves home.

"First of all the dogs which aren't being exhibited at the show have to be let out for some exercise and fed," she explains. "Then the dog which you are showing has to be exercised and most importantly, kept clean. You then have to allow enough time to actually get to the Show, park the car, and get the dog onto the bench."

Dogs which are exhibited at the Royal Melbourne Show must be kept on their bench from 9,00 am until 6,00 pm (except, of course, for those times when they are in the show ring).

This means a long day for both the

dog and the exhibitor.

"Older dogs will usually just sleep," Margaret says, "But you

have to keep them company so they don't get bored."

Preparing a dog for exhibition starts many months before the actual event. "You have to ensure that they have lots of road work for their feet and you have to make sure they don't get too fat," says Margaret. "Then there will sometimes be things which are beyond your control – they might lose their coats or if its a female

their coats or if its a female, there's always the danger of them going into season."

Margret Wilby with Kelly and

her young pup, Sumo.

Margaret has now been showing corgis since 1960 (she received her first corgi as a

birthday present in 1959) and ranks the Royal Melbourne Show as one of the most

important in the dog-showing calender.

She has picked up many prizes at the Show, but says that this is not the only joy of being an exhibitor.

"It's also a great opportunity to introduce corgis to the public and teach them what the breed is about," she comments.

"Then sometimes I might meet up with somebody who has bought a puppy from me – that's always a thrill as well."

Margaret says that she never exhibits more than three dogs at a time. This year, she has prepared just one dog – four year old Kelly – for exhibition.

f there's one man who can tell you all about the treasures and delights to be found in a showbag, it's Tom Carter.

Tom's family has been in the showbag business for more than 40 years, beginning when Tom's father (also Tom) began packing showbags for Guest's biscuits.

*Dad started in 1956," Tom explains. "Ken Guest wanted to find a way to have his products sampled, and he decided that showbags were the answer."

The Carters estimate that since then, they have supervised the packing of more than 30 million showbags. Amongst the many well known bags which have been packed by Showbag Marketing (the company which they own) are Violet Crumble, Minties, Fantales, Bertle Beetle and Kit Kat.

"It's a happy business," Tom says. "Because even with things like video games and other entertainment for kids, going to the Show is still the one day of the year which kids look forward to."

Showbags were created early this century by companies who wanted to expose their products to a large portion of the public.

"It was harder for companies to advertise back then, because they didn't have television," says Tom. "They saw that a lot of people attended agricultural shows, so they decided to try and reach them."

It was a strategy which proved to be successful and over the years, showbags have developed from small sample bags to the huge creations which can be found today. "Now you get the best value ever in a showbag, because the competition is so great," Tom says.

Many of the showbags which can be found at the Show have actually been around for many years. The Mintles showbag, for example, was first launched in 1922 and the Violet Crumble showbag was developed more than 60 years ago. The Bertie Beetles showbag, which has been at

the Show for over 30 years, has also stood the test of time.

Showbags are a concept which are unique to Australia and Tom believes that it is unlikely that they will ever develop to the same extent in other countries.

"Put it this way," he says. "It would take a long time for them to get to the stage overseas that they are at in Australia now."

Tom is delighted that he is able to make his living from such a happy Australian industry.

"I saw my Dad having so much fun when I was growing up," he explains. "Every time he walked in the door he had a smile on his face and a Violet Crumble or a Polly Waffle in his hand.

"He was always dealing with a public

that was happy, so when he retired in 1989 I thought 'This wouldn't be a bad industry to get into.' I left my job at the bank and have been having a great time ever since."

Tom visits all of the major Royal Agricultural Shows throughout Australia (except Perth, where he has an agent). His bags are also sold by community groups such as Apex and Rotary at the smaller country shows.

At this year's Royal Melbourne Show, Tom can be found spruiking in the Hall of Manufactures, so make sure you go along and say hello.

Maybe you could even buy a showbag from him – If you get half as much fun from the showbag as Tom Carter does, then you're guaranteed of a big treat.

St.George Bank Royal Melbourne Show. Each year an estimated 1.5 million people flock through the Showgrounds, visiting either the Royal Show or the host of other year-round events staged at the venue by the Royal Agricultural Society.

In 1994 over 660,000 people walked, munched, laughed and learned their way through the 136th Show to reverse the downward attendance record of recent years. This increase was recorded despite the loss of the public Show Day holiday, and represented a 6 per cent jump on the tally of patrons through the turnstiles in 1993.

An exit poll of patrons last year indicated more than 95 per cent enjoyed their stay at the Show and the Society is gearing up to welcome its 44 millionth visitor this September.

The Society is focused on redeveloping the Showgrounds to enhance its traditional rural use and improve Show Time facilities for exhibitors. At the same time, work is also being done to improve facilities to attract exhibitors and activities to utilise the Showgrounds as a year-round exhibition, functions and sporting facility, with a great tourist and educational value.

The Society is working its way through a comprehensive change in the way it operates to meet its mission statement: "To promote the progress and pursuit of excellence within all aspects of Victorian Agriculture".

The broad strategy involves significantly improving the Society's financial vlability beginning with ensuring the Royal Show continues to be one of Melbourne's major community events. The Show is a unique forum for interaction between city and country. Over the next few years, we will c ntinue to improve the standards of food, entertainment, customer service, educational and tourism opportunities, the physical environment and the commercial relevance to rural Victoria.

And while much of the Show's public attraction lies in tradition, the Society is working hard to ensure the event moves in step with community needs so that future generations of Showgoers continue to catch a glimpse of what life outside the city's boundaries is really like.

Part of this commercial relevance also focuses on the competitors who put their livestock, produce, art and integrity on the line every year. Winning medals awarded by the Show brings them rewards difficult to put a monetary value on, but the finanical gains are very real.
