# Future looking bright

The showgrounds will continue to be a venue for agricultural excellence, writes Stephen Carter

**T**HE Royal Melbourne Show is Victoria's oldest and most-loved event.

The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria (RAS) and the Show face a confident future following the Government's announcement it will invest \$101 million for the redevelopment of the Showgrounds.

The decision resolved many issues that had dominated our planning for the years ahead.

It will enable the RAS and the Government to work in partnership to ensure the Ascot Vale site becomes the true centre in Victoria for agriculture and agribusiness.

We are delighted the Government has shown confidence in the future of this vital industry.

It goes far beyond bricks and mortar. It places Victoria at the forefront of agribusiness and sets the stage for us to achieve the following shared objectives:

**TO ENABLE** the Victorian food and agribusiness sector to grow to help achieve the Government's target of \$12 billion in agriculture and food exports by 2010.

**TO CONTINUE** to develop the RAS into a creative catalyst for superior outcomes for agribusiness and rural and regional communities through competitions, showcasing and knowledge exchange.

**TO DEVELOP** improved understanding between urban and rural and regional communities.

**TO ENSURE** the RAS provides co-ordinated (with other peak industry groups) promotion, knowledge exchanges and showcasing of the agribusiness sector to domestic and overseas buyers.

**TO ENSURE** the maintenance and enhancement of the Royal Melbourne Show as a significant state event, including increasing participation with an emphasis on visitors from interstate and overseas;

**TO DEVELOP** in partnership with other peak industry groups an integrated statewide show and non-show structure, enabling knowledge and information exchange, and the enhancement of agricultural productivity at state and regional levels.

Detailed discussions with the Government are under way to ensure we meet the challenge to redevelop the showgrounds into a rural development and education centre that can be used year-round.

There is much work to be done in the next three years.

Our future is full of promise and we invite the people of Victoria to share this exciting journey.

## The mouse that roars

**T**HE Mad Mouse is one of the oldest rides at the Royal Melbourne Show.

Built in the early 1960s by Alf Green and Bob Thomas, the ride made its Melbourne debut in the mid-1960s and remains one of the most popular at the Show.

When not operating in Melbourne, the whole matchstick-like support structure is dismantled and shipped to Sydney for the Royal Easter Show.

Make sure you don't miss out on this Show favourite.

## Ride 'em, thrillseekers

**A** VISIT to the Show simply would not be complete for many people if they didn't push their fear threshold to the max.

Maybe last year it was the Scorpion that made your heart miss a beat.

Perhaps it was the traditional favourite, the Mad Mouse, that tested your courage.

Well, there are plenty of new challenges this year.

Start with the Slingshot, a reverse bungy-style ride that durls people strapped in an open-air cage 110 metres in the air.

Apart from the adrenalin rush, riders will enjoy one of the best views of the show, even though it might be upside down.

You could follow with a trip through the Roller Ghoster, four levels of combination rollercoaster

and ghost-train, or Circus Circus, a brightly coloured, three-storey building with 24 interactive tricks for old and young.

Don't miss the inflated Space Shuttle. Bright orange and white in colour, the shuttle will be ready for sliding at \$3 for three slides.

If your thirst for adventure is not satisfied, there is still plenty of fun on the favourites, including the Gravitron and the Breakdance, situated on the Epsom Rd boundary.

A variety of games and earth-based challenges can be found throughout the amusement area.

Put that aim, honed by hours of practice on computer games, to good use and see if you can leave laden with prizes to reward your accuracy.

There are also Outback Pony rides in Merrett Ave, opposite the

dog-judging pavilion, where kids can take a short trip on some of the sturdiest small horses in town.

Several amusement areas have been created for very young thrillseekers. One is just near the Cadbury Animal Nursery.

If you're big enough to hold on tight, ride the antique carousel imported from Switzerland or the mini show-train.

Challenge the kids to feel the breeze in their hair on the mini aeroplane ride, also situated in the children's amusement area.

The other kids' rides area is known as Adventure Island, where they can spend hours on the mini drop tower, the Wave Swinger, Cups and Saucers and elephants and giraffes.

Most rides for kids cost \$3-\$4 and the average for bigger rides is \$4.50.

**E**VERY year, the Royal Melbourne Show runs several days devoted to particular themes. This year, they are:

### FARM SUNDAY

The Showgrounds come alive to the sounds of rural Australia on Farm Sunday, September 22, when a living history of agriculture is paraded in the Main Arena.

Farm Sunday evokes the spirit of country life and embraces a host of hands-on activities, including the Beaut Ute Competition and Sheepdog Trials.

### VIP KIDS DAYS

The first two days of the Show have been declared VIP Kids Days. Primary-school kids can gain entry for \$5 and get the red-carpet treatment. Group bookings are essential. Ticketek: 9299 9030.

### YOUNG RURALS DAY

Saturday, September 21, is devoted to rural youth and matters close to their hearts. The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria has several special package deals (including entry to Show, seminars and meals). Details, ph: 9281 7480.

### SENIORS DAY

Tuesday, September 24, is a must for every senior member of the public — it's a day of special activities and entertainment designed to appeal to senior citizens.

### SUPER SECOND SUNDAY

An undoubted highlight of Super Second Sunday (September 29) will be the Not So Grand Parade — a wonderfully colourful version of the real thing involving street performers, characters, floats, music and theatre roaming the Showgrounds in the afternoon.

# Welcome to your Show

Lots of new sights, sounds, attractions and experiences await showgoers this year

**C**ELEBRATE what makes Victoria great by enjoying a day of fun and excitement with the family at the Royal Melbourne Show, Victoria's biggest and best event.

The Show will have a wonderful new feel this year. There will be a new-look Main Arena, spectacular new attractions, new displays, new venues housing a broad range of displays, competitions and commercial offerings, and new theme days.

The Show will run from Thursday, September 19, to Sunday, September 29.

The gates will be open daily from 8.30am to 10pm, except on the last day, when the gates will shut at 8.30pm.

Most pavilions and halls will be open from 9am-9pm. Some will close earlier. The animal pavilions will close at 8pm.

The new look will be reflected in building and groundwork done since the State Government announced \$101 million would be spent on redevelopment of the grounds.

Work so far has centred on the eastern end of the Main Arena, where there has been substantial demolition, earthworks, preparation and new landscaped gardens. This has brought about a dramatic improvement to the site.

A feature of the Main Arena will be the Epicure Enclosure, a two-storey structure for top-class dining and entertainment.

The Epicure Enclosure will showcase gourmet food and beverages made from the highest-quality Australian produce.

The atmosphere of the Enclosure will be enhanced by the Wool and Natural Fibre Fashion Shows featuring the finest creations of local designers.

Other new attractions at the Show are Outback Thunder, an evening extravaganza. The Main Arena will come alive with stockmen and horsemen, horses, cattle, sheep, motorbikes and dogs.

The Year of the Outback will be celebrated throughout the grounds with displays of pioneer skills, storytelling, chainsaw sculpting and more.

Take a ringside seat at the judging arenas to watch the Clydesdales, saddle and harness horses, show-jumpers and magnificent beef and dairy cattle in competition.

If you've ever wondered what a petite basset griffon vendeen is or looks like, try this year's Show

**D**O YOU keep a petite basset griffon vendeen in your back yard? Or what about the hamiltonstovare or puli? No, they are not part of the shrubbery. While definitely exotic, they are in fact dogs!

These glamorous pooches will join other rare canines and compete at the Show this year.

Some 5000 dogs will put their best paw forward and vie for the exclusive blue ribbon awarded to the best examples of the 180 or so breeds to be judged at the William Cockbill and Woodfull Pavilions.

Dogs will be on show from 9am to 5pm daily (judging is usually finished by 3.30pm).

All up, about 30,000 pets and farm animals are entered in Show competitions.

More than 4000 horse entries have been received. Clydesdales take centre stage on the Main Arena for the first three days of the Show as these gentle giants are put through their large paces.

Clydesdale judge this year is Julie Peel from New South Wales (led classes). Harness Clydesdales judge is Murray Goodall, from Queensland.

The famous Garryowen Trophy event for women riders has been returned to its long-standing competition day of Tuesday, September 24 — plus some of Australia's best hunting, riding, show-jumping, novelty, stockhorse and camp-drafting events will all take place on the Main Arena.

Showjumping is an important part of the equestrian line-up. The Pacific League World Cup qualifying round

will be held on Thursday September 27 on the Main Arena while the challenging six-bar event is scheduled for 3pm on Friday, September 27.

This year's showjump course designer is John Wilsher, from South Australia.

Rounding out the horse schedule are many other competitive classes, including sidesaddle, harness and special turnouts such as the decorated business classes.

Australia's best cattle will strut their stuff, with more than 1000 beef and dairy animals entered. Judging is scheduled for the Main Arena and the *Weekly Times* BFB Pavilion.

Beef cattle judging will be split into the first and second week of the Show. The feature breed in the first week is the brahman, while in the second week the well-muscled simmental takes centre stage.

Dairy cattle judging is scheduled for the first three days of the Show, September 19-21, so be sure to check them out because after Sunday, September 21, they will be back in their home paddocks.

More purrfectly turned-out animals putting their reputations on the line are the

cats. Take a look in Centenary Hall where you'll find the Wonderful World of Pets and where cats will be on show from Monday, September 23 to Sunday, September 29.

All the big-name feline breeds such as ragdoll and siamese will be there, as well as some of the not-so-well-known or more exotic species. For specific judging days and times, see the daily planner.

The Wonderful World of Pets will also host cavy (judged on September 21), cage birds (September 19) and rabbits (September 22).

Seventeen breeds of our finest sheep will be judged and displayed from September 19-23.

You will see some of the rarer breeds such as shropshires and wiltshire horns.

And if you want to see the best of the best, the Interbreed sheep judging takes place in the *Weekly Times* Livestock Pavilion on September 22.

The curious and charming alpaca contingent return to that pavilion. The huacayas are being judged on September 28, and the suris on September 29.

Goat breeders also take centre stage in the *Weekly Times* Livestock Pavilion where dairy goats will be on display on September 28.

Boer goats will be judged on September 25 from 1pm and angora goats (the feature breed this year) will go under the judges' eyes on September 19.

Mohair is judged before the Show and on display during the Show.

Thirty horses and riders appear in a flurry of hoofs, pounding horseflesh and leather.

And it's not long before they're mustering sheep and driving cattle, with help from some modern counterparts such as motorbikes and a ute.

A group of whipcrackers will be wielding the leather to ensure everyone stays on their toes.

Pay particular attention to the 26-horse Quadrille. This is the same one that was such a big part of the opening ceremony of the Olympics in Sydney.

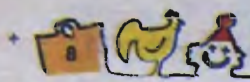

# Crowds go to the dogs

The canine capers always provide one of the biggest highlights of the Show

**T**HE Pedigree Royal Melbourne Championship Dog Show is one of the biggest drawcards, not only in terms of exhibitors but also in popularity with showgoers.

This year there are almost 5000 entries and about 180 breeds will be on display.

The dogs, their breeders and owners can be found in the William Cockbill and Woodfull pavilions for the 11 days of Show.

The dogs will be on display from 9am to 5pm daily.

The rare or exotic breeds include the petite basset griffon vendeen, the leonberger, the large munsterlander, the portuguese water dog, the havanese, the harrier, the hamiltonstovare and the bouvier des flandres.

In its first appearance at Royal Melbourne this year is

the black russian terrier, to be judged on Friday, September 27, and benched in the Cockbill Pavilion if you want to chat to an owner.

The Royal Agricultural Society Pedigree Annual Puppy Award for best puppy bred in Australia will be judged on September 22.

Further canine capers can be seen at the Flyball, an action-packed relay event for dogs of all shapes and sizes that is hugely popular with dog clubs.

It will be staged in the Woodfull Pavilion on Sunday, September 29, as teams from around Australia vie for a Show title.

Part of the Flyball will be the crowning of the Victorian state champion team.

Other highlights include Agility Trials outside on the judging lawn, and a puppy

creche, another first for the Show.

Situated in Pedigree World (Cockbill Pavilion), the creche will feature two litters of pups from different breeds each day. Open from 11am-3pm, creche exhibitors will talk on the merits of the dogs.

The junior showmanship competition is a great way for children who have showing experience to get further involved in the event.

Heats will be held daily on the main judging lawn. Entry is \$5.50.

This will give kids a chance to experience what it's like to show a dog at one of Australia's premier events.

You can enter the junior showmanship competition as many times as you like until you qualify for the big final, scheduled for Saturday, September 28.

### TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE SURROUNDINGS

Take a breather on one of the many lawns around the Showgrounds.

Grab lunch from one of the great food outlets or pack your own. Either way, a picnic on the lawns is a great way to relax and plan your next move.

Don't forget to bring a picnic blanket so the family can stretch out in comfort.

Remember Melbourne's weather can change quickly so it's wise to dress sensibly.

But you don't need to bring the kitchen sink to survive a day at the Show.

A range of items can be hired that will do away with the need to lug heavy backpacks or push prams groaning under the weight of essential travel items.

ATMs are at four major locations around the Showgrounds — two lots are at the RAS administration building, three at the western end of the poultry pavilion and others in Kids Country (formerly the Country Music Muster).

### BABY CARE

Baby care is in the same building as the centre for lost children.

This centre operates year-round as a creche when the Show is not in swing, which means the space is purpose-built, private and close to the public entrance/exit on Langs Rd.

And rest assured, if the unthinkable happens and youngsters become separated from the group, they will be taken to the centre and cared for until everyone is reunited.

### WHEELCHAIR AND PUSHER HIRE

A great bonus if you're travelling by public transport or with members of the older generation for whom the grounds are too big to walk around.

### AND DON'T FORGET...

A cloakroom is near the Langs Rd turnstiles where non-essential items can be stored while you're exploring.

Lockers are for hire at four locations if your treasures begin to weigh you down.

It is the Cute Capital, where kids and parents can get close to lambs, piglets, chooks, chicks, ducks, goats, the odd donkey and a calf or two.

While you're in the Cadbury Animal Nursery, visit the patting paddock, where you and the kids will be able to experience all the fun, smells and feel of some very cute animals in a safe, friendly environment.

# Forging is for real

Blacksmithing is an art — and a serious contest

**T**HIS year's Show will play host to the National Forging Titles, where the age-old art of blacksmithing will be on display from some of the country's finest farriers.

Show patrons may be surprised to know that the Forging Championships are a

regular part of the Royal Melbourne Show, and over the past decade or so they have grown to become one of the top events for farriers in Australia.

Among the 40 or so farriers competing this year is the present Victorian Heavy Horse champion, Jonathan Leoncini,

and national champion, Craig Jones, from Queensland. Jonathan and Craig will be competing in events such as the three-man draft, where a team of farriers make and fit a horseshoe from scratch, the Open and Intermediate Blueprint, where competitors have to make a blacksmithing item from drawn plans, and the eagle-eye classes, where farriers have only 10 minutes to make a horseshoe

from scratch after seeing the horse's hoof for just 10 seconds.

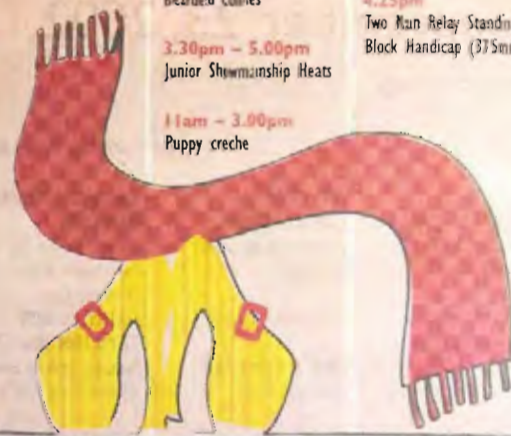
The Forging Championships are organised by the Farriers and Blacksmiths Association of Victoria and will be held from Thursday, September 26, to Saturday, September 28.

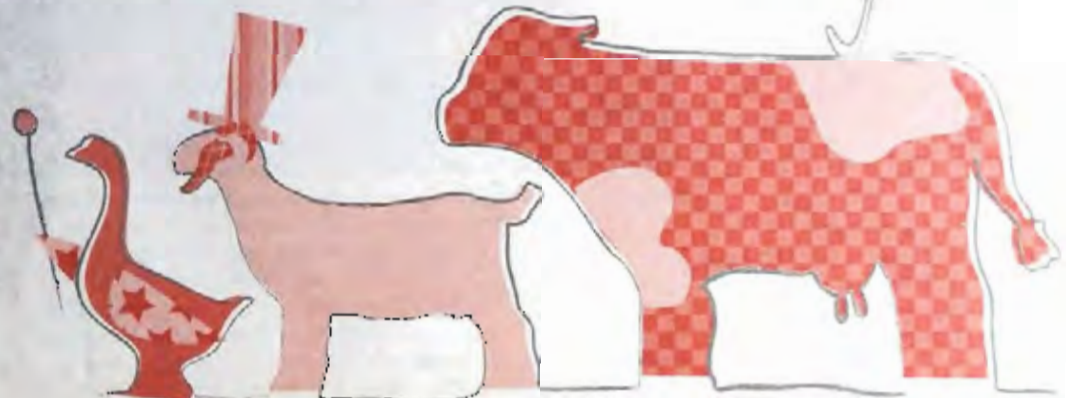

**T**HE Show is a great place for patrons to get better acquainted with their taste-buds through hundreds of quality meal and snack choices.

There's something for every palate, from sit-down, three and four-course meals to healthy take-aways and light snacks.

A great place to start your Show dining is in the Arena Alfresco, a new, purpose-built catering set-up housing 15 purveyors of fine food.

Situated on the eastern end of the Main Arena, not far from the ferris wheel, the Arena Alfresco is set in landscaped gardens with undercover seating for 350.

It's part of the redevelopment of the Main Arena and features a mix of international gourmet-style cuisine, all made in Melbourne and fresh on the grounds during the Show.

You could try a Sintokin' Doughs gourmet pizza, a souvlaki, a German sausage from Wagners, a variety of sushi dishes from Koshi Sushi and one of the 10 or so flavours from the Ice Creamery.

The Arena Alfresco is the home of vegetarian curries, including dishes such as vegetable dhal, chickpea

There is also tortillas de pagas, which is scalloped potatoes, sliced onions and fresh eggs cooked in small pans to create golden omelettes that are served with freshly made etili conander salsa.

Other fine dining in the Arena Alfresco includes the Gourmet

BBQ, specialising in game meats, the Maldon Yabbie Barn, Australian Coffee Co, Jas Soup, Panhandlers Dutch poffertjes and Gaijin Sense Catering for moofies.

Once you've sampled the Arena Alfresco, head down to the Global Gourmet in the Schweppes Arcade,

which also houses a variety of cuisine.

Stop at Stavros, of the multi-award winning Stavros Tavern, or visit the Royal Show Hotel for refreshing CUB beers.

For a different experience, Rustlers Tavern celebrates traditional Australia and hearty Aussie food.

It's a great place to savour a chef's steak or a garlic damper in front of a roaring fire.

Drop into the Cactus Bar & Grill in Kids Country, serving healthy and hearty breakfast, lunch and dinner with a special kids' menu. While the kids enjoy themselves you can indulge in foccacias, burgers, a range of steak and salads from the dine-in and takeaway menus.

And who could forget the catering institution, the CWA kitchen, which last year moved to a new home in the Mitchell Stand?

This modern venue is the source of some of the heartiest meals.

Try the home-made scones, a CWA specialty, filling breakfasts and warm cups.

If you are still hungry after all that, Paddock to Plate, in the Royal Pavilion, has everything from vubby pies and venison burgers to corn on the cob.

So the Show does cater for all tastes, whether it's aromatic chicken, or hot dogs, golden brown chips, fresh fruit or roasted nuts.

Rippling muscles, flashing axes and flying chips make the woodchopping one of the great events at the Show

EVER wondered what makes the woodchopping so popular at the Royal Melbourne Show? Maybe it's the fast-paced action, maybe the ultra-competitive spirit of the axemen and women, or maybe the spectacle of razor-sharp axes wielded with speed and precision.

Whatever the attraction, the woodchopping should not be missed.

And it's easy to see it under cover, in tiered seating in the Boral Woodchopping Stadium.

Running every day of the Show except for the last day, the Boral Woodchopping Stadium is a hive of non-stop action, devoted to the skill of cutting timber using axes and cross-cut saws.

When you see the competitors in action, you will begin to understand just what it takes to handle an axe in the heat of competition.

You'll also realise just what it takes to match it with champions such as David Foster.

He will be there, along with more than 100 other competitors from

around Australia and New Zealand, including Kiwi champion Jason Wynyard.

The Kiwis will ensure the competition is fierce, especially in the Vic Bitter Australia v New Zealand Test series. The series is a highlight of the woodchopping and Australia has it all to do, having lost last year and being down four to two from the past six meetings.

If you would like to see any of the three tests, in which the Aussies and New Zealanders compete in a variety of woodchopping events, they are scheduled for Sunday, 22 September, Tuesday, 24 September and Saturday, 28 September, all at 1.30pm.

Other must-see events include the Australian tree-felling championship and the standing-block championship, on Thursday, 26 September.

Another crowd favourite is the underhand championship, scheduled for Friday, 27 September, and the hard-hitting finals will be held on Saturday, 28 September.
