

Any Gymkhana affiliated with the Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch) and each Country Agricultural Society in Victoria is invited to co-operate in qualifying competitions for these trophies, by providing annually riding competitions for competitors under 15 years of age on the day of its show.

2. Each Society conducting qualifying competitions is required to notify the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria of the names and addresses of the winners and "runners-up", so that if it is found that, for any reason, the winners were ineligible, an opportunity may be given the "runners-up" to com-pete in the Championship Competitions.

3. Such competitions to be named "The Good Hands Qualifying Riding Competitions," and the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria to provide suitable certificates for presentation to the winners.

4. The holder of a R.A.S. Qualifying Certificate, won in the same year, shall not be eligible to compete.

5. The competitors shall be judged solely on their riding ability-mount, saddlery or costume will not be taken into account, but special attention will be paid to hands and seat, general man-agement and control of the horse or pony.

### **CHAMPIONSHIP** COMPETITION

6. Only holders of qualifying certificates won during the preceding twelve months will be eligible to compete for the Challenge Trophies at the Royal Melbourne Show. No entry fee will be charged.

7. The Championship Competition shall be judged on the same basis as the qualifying competitions, but the Judge, before finally making his award, shall require his six finalists to execute a figure 8 at a canter, ride away from the Judge, return at a slow canter, stop at the Judge's signal and back, all six using the same mount (with snaffle bridle) which will be selected by the Society's referee, from horses ridden in this competition.

8. Eligible competitors are accepted on the condition that they will be prepared to provide the selected mount.

9. The names of the winners will be engraved on the Challenge Trophies, and they will be entitled to hold them until 31st August in the year following their success.

10. Suitably inscribed Championship Sashes will be presented to each successive winner of the Challenge Trophies.

11. The winners of the Challenge Trophies will be eligible to compete in future years, subject to age.

# JUMPING COMPETITIONS.

(Affiliated Equestrian Federation of Australia)

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO NOTE THAT RIDERS MAY NOT RIDE MORE THAN TWO HORSES IN ANY EVENT UNLESS OTHER-WISE STATED.

A surcharge of 10 cents per horse shall be imposed on all horses, galloways and ponies entered in Sections 9 and/or 11. This surcharge, which must be remitted with the entry fees, shall be paid into the Overseas Team Fund of The Equestrian Federation of Australia.

The Steward in charge has been authorised to scratch any horse if it is not ready to compete at the time directed by the stewards.

Owners desirous of scratching their horses for any event must do so with the Horse Superin-tendent at least two hours before the advertised time of starting. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to a penalty of \$1 for the first offence and \$2 for second or later offences.

All entrants in jumping competitions must state performances of horse or pony on the entry form. After the close of entries, the Horse Committee will go through all forms, and from the information supplied will determine which entries will be accepted, and for which animals accommodation will be provided. All entrants will be notified of the Committee's decision, and all fees paid on any entries not accepted will be refunded. In Jumping Contests competitors may be limited as under:

Group A, Maximum of 40. Group B, Maximum of 25. Group C, Maximum of 25.

All animals entered for Jumping Competitions Groups A, B, C, D and E, must be registered in the Equestrian Federation of Australia's Register. For particulars regarding registration, apply to the Secretary, Equestrian Federation of Australia (Victorian Branch), Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032.

3

Owners and riders of horses in Groups A, B, and E, must be members of the Equestrian Federation of Australia.

Competitors in jumping competitions must compete in the order directed by the steward in charge.

Exhibitors will please note that entries should not be made for individual classes except for Section Fours.

The jumping section is divided into groups.

Group A, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in that Group.

Competitions in Group A will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group B, is for horses over 14 hands 2 inches whose past performances indicate that they are up to the required standard for competitions conducted under Tables B and C and Special Rules.

Competitions in Group B will be judged under Tables B or C (as specified) and Special Rules.

Group C is for ponies and galloways and horses judged by the Committee to be worthy of inclusion in the group to be ridden by riders under 17 years of age on the first day of the Show.

Competitions in Group C will be judged under "TABLE A".

Group D is for qualified hunters.

Group E is for Section fours, trios, and special competitions.

Intending competitors in Groups A, B or C will not enter for classes by number but simply indicate the number of classes in which they desire to compete.

The Committee after studying the performances will grade the horses and allocate them to the various classes.

In Group D, entries will be accepted only from Masters of Associated Hunt Clubs.

Exhibitors wishing to enter in the teams and section four events will enter in the class or classes in which they wish to compete.

(In these classes horses may be made up into teams, irrespective of the group in which they may be graded.)

Horses and galloways competing in Group A are not eligible for Section Fours.

In Group E there will be no grading and intending exhibitors will enter their ponies, galloways and horses for the classes in which they are eligible to compete.

Entry fees must be forwarded with entry forms for jumping competitions. After entries have been graded they will be allotted to classes and refunds made in respect of those not accepted.

#### WEIGHT

No minimum weights in Classes where age of rider is restricted.

In Classes open to all riders over the age of 15 years all riders must carry 11 st. 11 lbs. (165 lbs.).

The loss of weight during a Competition entails elimination.

Weighing is obligatory after each Competition and must be carried out in the presence of an official especially appointed for this purpose. It is absolutely forbidden for a rider to dismount until he has received permission from the Steward in charge of the Weighing Enclosure. Any infringement of this Rule entails elimination.

Riders may weigh in with their saddles, weight cloths and numbers, but NOT whips. In the event of a competitor being unable to

In the event of a competitor being unable to make the weight, up to 2 lbs. will be allowed for the bridle, martingale and any other form of equipment carried by the horse.

Riders are responsible for the provision of any necessary weights and weight cloth.

There is no minimum weight provision for competitors in Groups C and D and Section Fours.

All jumping competitions are for amateur or professional riders unless otherwise stated.

Owners entering their horses or ponies do so entirely at their own risk, and it is a condition of entry that no liability of any kind attaches itself to the Society, its Council officers, officials or members in any respect whatsoever, other than the liability for refund of entry fees in the event of abandonment of any competition.

Male or Female riders may take part in all events unless otherwise stated.

All events to be run over course and obstacles as the Council may decide.

IN ALL EVENTS OVER OBSTACLES AND HURDLES OF ANY DESCRIPTION, UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED, RIDERS MUST BE 15 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

#### DRESS

#### Ladies and Girls:

In hack classes and riding competitions ladies should wear either:----

- (a) Black bowler hat, black or dark coat, stock or collar and tie, breeches and black riding boots. OR—
- (b) Felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat, collar and tie (not a stock), jodhpurs and jodhpur boots.

1

In Equestrienne Turnout classes and Jumping Contests, ladies must wear (a) above.

#### Gentlemen and Boys:

- (a) In hack or pony classes and riding competitions — bowler or felt hat or hunting cap, tweed coat collar and tie (not a stock) either breeches and riding boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots.
- (b) In jumping competitions gentlemen riders must wear, (a) hunting livery of a recognised hunt club, (b) black coat, with stock, white breeches, black boots, or (c) tweed coat with tie, fawn breeches, black or tan boots. Boys under 16 shall wear hunting cap, tweed coat and WHITE shirt with jodhpurs. Stocks or ties must be securely pinned.

#### **ELIMINATIONS**

In all jumping competitions the rider is eliminated for the following occurrences:

- (a) Failure to be ready to enter the arena when called.
- (b) Jumping any obstacle in the arena before the starting signal, even if it is not included in the course.
- (c) Crossing the starting line before the starting signal is given.
- (d) Failing to cross the starting line within 60 seconds of the starting signal.
- (e) Third disobedience in the whole round.
- (f) Showing any obstacle to the horse before starting, or after a refusal.

- (g) Entering or leaving the arena dismounted without the special permission of the President of the Ground Jury.
- (h) Resistance of the horse during the round at any one time exceeding 60 seconds.
- (i) Taking more than 60 seconds to jump an obstacle (except in the case of a fall).
- (j) Jumping an obstacle without having rectified a deviation from the course.
- (k) Jumping an obstacle not forming part of the course.
- (1) Jumping an obstacle in the wrong order.
- (m) Passing the wrong side of a flag, if not rectified.
- (n) Exceeding the Time Limit.
- (o) Jumping an obstacle which has been knocked down, before it has been re-set.
- (p) Starting again after an interruption, before the signal to continue has been given.
- (q) After a disobedience or fall at a double, treble or multiple obstacle, failing to re-start jumping over the whole obstacle except for a completely closed obstacle.
- (r) Failing to jump each fence of a double, treble, or multiple obstacle, separately.
- (s) Failing to cross the finishing line mounted, before leaving the arena.
- (t) The rider and/or horse leaving the arena, before the completion of the round.
- (u) Receiving unauthorised assistance, whether solicited or not, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (v) Failing to have the required minimum weight when weighing in after completion of the round.
- (w) Entering the arena on foot after the start of the competition, at the discretion of the Ground Jury.
- (x) Failing to comply with the conditions of a competition stipulating that part of the course is to be ridden at a trot or walk.
- (y) Jumping an optional obstacle more than once in a jump-off.
- (z) All other reasons for elimination set out in the rules.

#### DEFINITIONS, GENERAL RULES AND PENALTIES

#### **OBSTACLE KNOCKED DOWN:**

1. An obstacle is considered as having been knocked down when through the fault of the horse, or rider:

(a) Any part, or the whole, of it is knocked down, even when the falling part is arrested in its fall by any other portion of the obstacle.

(b) When at least one of its ends is dislodged from its support.

(c) Any framework intended to maintain the solidity of the obstacle, and forming an integral part of its support falls. Touches and displacements, in whatever direction, do not count.

2. (a) When an obstacle, or part of an obstacle, is composed of several elements placed one on top of the other and in the same vertical plane, the dislodging of the top element alone is penalised.

(b) When an obstacle to be taken in one jump is composed of several elements not fixed in the same vertical plane (oxer, brook, triple bar, water jump or

ditch, preceded or followed by another obstacle, etc.). the fall of one or more elements or foot in the water is counted only as one fault, irrespective of the number and position of the elements knocked down.

(c) If an obstacle that has been knocked down does not actually fall until after the horse has left the arena, it will not be penalised.

(d) If any element of an obstacle that has been knocked down prevents the horse from jumping the next obstacle it must be removed. The time required for doing this is deducted from the total time of the round.

(e) All obstacles with water (with the exception of the water jump which is subject to special rules) must be marked by a lath both on the take-off side and on the landing side.

#### **DISOBEDIENCE:**

3. The following are considered as disobediences and are penalised as such:

Rectified deviation from the course.

Refusal.

Run-out.

Resistance.

Any form of circle or series of circles, in any part of the course for any reason, except that a horse may circle once or more without penalty to re-take the track after a run-out or a refusal. In a course that is not marked by a continuous line, unless there is any indication to the contrary on the plan or notified by the Jury, any circle (whereby the horse crosses its original track), wherever it may be on the course, is penalised as a disobedience. Approaching an obstacle sideways, or zig-zagging, or turning sharply towards it, do not constitute a disobedience, provided the horse has not passed the obstacle.

### **DEVIATION FROM THE COURSE:**

4. There is a deviation from the course when the horse does not follow the plan for the course as shown on the diagram posted up, as when the rider:

(a) Disregards a flag to indicate the course to be followed.

(b) Does not clear the obstacles in the prescribed order.

(c) Jumps an obstacle outside the course, or misses one on the course.

5. (a) To rectify a deviation from the course the rider must resume the course from the spot where the error was committed.

(b) A deviation from the course rectified before clearing an obstacle is penalised as a disobedience.

(c) A deviation from the course not rectified, or rectified only after taking an obstacle, whether this forms part of the course or not, incurs the penalty of elimination. Officials or others in the arena are never allowed to warn the competitor of his error.

#### **REFUSAL:**

à

(a) A refusal consists of stopping in front of an obstacle to be jumped, whether or not the horse knocks it down or displaces it.

(b) Stopping at an obstacle without knocking it down and without reining back, followed immediately by a standing jump, is not penalised.

(c) If the halt is perceptible, or if the horse

(c) If the half is perceptible, of it the horse steps back even a single pace, voluntarily or not, or retakes the track, a refusal is incurred. (d) If a horse, having knocked down an obstacle in stopping, jumps this obstacle before it has been re-erected, he is eliminated.

(e) If a horse slides through an obstacle, the officiating judge must decide immediately whether it is to count as a refusal or as an obstacle knocked down. If he decides it is a refusal, the bell is sounded at once and the competitor must retrace his steps and re-jump the obstacle. Should he fail to do so and jumps an obstacle, other than another of the same combination, he is eliminated. Should the Judge decide it was not a refusal, he will not ring the bell and the competitor must continue his round. He is then penalised as for an obstacle knocked down.

(f) The action of showing an obstacle to the horse after a refusal and before resuming the course is penalised by elimination.

#### **RUNNING OUT:**

7. It is considered as running-out and the horse must be brought back to jump the obstacle again, failing which he is eliminated, when:

(a) The horse, not being properly under control of his rider, avoids the obstacle he should

have jumped.(b) He jumps the obstacle outside the boundary flags which mark it.

#### **RESISTANCE:**

8. It is considered to be a resistance when the horse, wherever he may be, refuses to go forward (stops, runs back, turns round more or less completely, rears, etc.). All horses are eliminated that:

(a) Resist their riders for a period of sixty consecutive seconds during the round.

(b) Take more than sixty seconds to jump an obstacle, except in the case of a fall.

(c) Have not passed the starting line sixty seconds after being given the signal to start.

#### FALLS:

9. (a) A rider is considered to have fallen when he is separated from his horse which has not fallen, in such a way as to necessitate re-

mounting, or vaulting, into the saddle. (b) A horse is considered to have fallen when the shoulder and quarters have touched either the ground, or the obstacle and the ground.

10. (a) A fall is penalised wherever it takes place within the course and whatever the cause. After a fall the rider must continue the course from the point where he fell, or from any other point, provided he does not reduce the length of the course.

(b) The penalty to be imposed for a fall is set out in Table "A", "B", or "C".(c) When the horse or rider falls in knocking

down an obstacle the penalties for both occur-rences are added together. The same applies to a fall following a disobedience.

#### **UNAUTHORISED ASSISTANCE:**

11. Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not, with the object of facilitating the task of the rider or helping his horse, is unauthorised assistance and is forbidden under penalty of elimination.

1 - 78

The judges have full powers to decide whether the rider will be eliminated or not.

Bringing back a runaway horse after a fall or helping the rider to re-adjust the saddlery, or to remount, is not considered as unauthorised assistance. The course must be re-taken at the exact spot where it was interrupted.

Handing his whip to a rider who has dropped it during the round is unauthorised assistance.

# DOUBLE, TREBLE AND MULTIPLE OBSTACLES:

12. A double, treble, or multiple obstacle is one composed of two, three or more fences or parts, with a minimum inner distance between each of them of 23 ft. (7 metres) up to a maximum inner distance between them of 39 ft. 5 ins. (12 metres), (with the exception for the Hunting Competitions where the distance may be less than 23 ft.), which must be taken in two, three or more successive jumps. The distance is measured from the base of the one fence on the landing side to the base of the next fence on the take-off side.

In double, treble and multiple obstacles, each fence or part of the whole must be jumped separately, on penalty of elimination. When there is a refusal, run-out, or fall, the rider must take the whole obstacle again, or he will be eliminated. Exception is made for completely closed obstacles.

All the faults for mistakes and resistances made at each fence and during the various attempts are counted separately and added together, but should a refusal be due to a fall between two fences it will not be penalised.

#### BANKS, SLOPES AND RAMPS:

13. Banks, slopes, ramps and sunken roads, irrespective of whether they include any sort of fence and whatever the direction in which they should be taken, will be regarded as double, treble, multiple or closed obstacles. Each part must be jumped separately and faults will be penalised as for these obstacles.

The Jury must decide before the competition whether the obstacle is to be considered as closed or as a double, treble, or multiple obstacle. This decision must be included on the plan of the course.

14. A bank or platform (-butte-) without the addition of a fence, or with only one pole, can be taken in a flying jump. This way of jumping does not incur any penalties.

#### **OBSTACLES COMPLETELY CLOSED:**

(15). (a) If an obstacle is completely closed (such as in-and-out, square or hexagonal) the rule for rejumping the whole obstacle does not apply.

(b) In such cases, if the horse leaves the enclosure on the wrong side, he is considered as having jumped an obstacle that is not part of the course and he is eliminated.

(c) If, on the other hand, once in the enclosure, there is a refusal or fall, the rider is obliged to leave the enclosure by jumping out of it in the correct direction. If he is unable to do so within 60 seconds or after several attempts, making in all three refusals during the round, he is eliminated. He has not the right to displace, or cause to be displaced, or to modify any of the elements of the obstacle.

#### TIME:

(a) Unless otherwise stated in the conditions of the Class the "Time Allowed" for the course will be announced before each event.

(b) THE "TIME LIMIT" IS TWICE THE "TIME ALLOWED".

(c) FAULTS FOR TIME:—FOR EVERY SECOND OR PART OF A SECOND EXCEEDING THE "TIME ALLOWED" & FAULT. EXCEEDING THE "TIME LIMIT". ELIMINATED.

#### **JUMPING-OFF:**

In jumping competitions judged under Table A, the winner will be decided by one of the following methods (to be indicated in the competition concerned).

Table "A1". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off the prize will be divided.

Table "A2". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the second Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A3". In the event of equality of faults for first place in the first Jump-off time will decide.

Table "A4". In the event of equality of faults for any award in the first round of the Competition time will decide. In the event of equality of faults and time for first place there may be one Jump-off at the discretion of the Judge.

#### **DEFINITION OF JUMPING ARENA:**

The Jumping Arena will, when practicable, be entirely enclosed, but if not, will be clearly marked with flags or some other easily recognised indicator. At all times the Trotting Track will be taken as off the Jumping Arena. It will be the responsibility of all competitors to acquaint themselves with the extent of the arena and its markings before competing.

THE COUNCIL RESERVES THE RIGHT TO INTRODUCE A STANDARD AT ANY TIME.

CRUELTY TO HORSES is forbidden either in the arena, exercise area or elsewhere. A competitor found guilty of committing a definite act of cruelty will be disallowed from taking part in any further competitions at the Show where the offence was committed. The decision rests with the Judge and no appeal will be considered.

## **GROUP** A

Competition in classes in this group is open only to horses over 14.2 hands whose past performances, in the opinion of the committee, warrant their inclusion in the group.

From the entries received, the Council will select the horses with the best performances (up to a maximum of 20 horses) to compete in PART I, and the next best (up to a maximum of 20) to compete in PART II.

PART II-Classes 262 to 267.

Horses in Group "A" may not compete in groups "B" and "C", but they may compete in groups "D" and "E" excluding Section Fours.

All competitions in this Group will be judged under "Table A".

Riders must be 15 years of age or over.

Six obstacles will be valued at 100, 90, 80, 70 60 and 50 points, and of the remainder, two will be valued at 40, two at 30, one at 20 and one at 10 points. If an obstacle is knocked down the Competitor may not jump or attempt to jump it again. The Competitor having passed through the start will jump the obstacle designated as the first obstacle, thereafter the Competitor may jump any obstacle in either direction and any order within a time limit of 60 seconds. No obstacle may be jumped more than twice. First and second refusals over the course, or fall of horse and/or rider will not count as these will increase the time. At the third refusal the competitor will be eliminated. 



- 9. Ordinary hay forks must be used. No accessories of any kind will be permitted. Forks must not exceed six feet in length. Black insulation tape may be used as a grip.
- If a sheaf touches the cross-bar and goes over, it is to be counted as a successful throw. A sheaf that goes over the bar without touching beats one that touches.
- 11. The limit man shall throw first; other competitors shall follow in rotation.
- 12. The height for first toss shall be thirty feet in the handicap competition with rises of two feet up to forty feet and thereafter rises of one foot and twenty-five feet in the novice competition, with rises of two feet up to thirty-three feet and thereafter with rises of one foot, and bar shall be raised progressively until the winner is declared. Each competitor's handicap will be added to his throw for the purpose of deciding such throw.
- 13. A novice is defined in the Rules of the Australian Sheaf Tossers' Association.
- 14. Competitors will be required to furnish on entry form the details of last six performances.

- 19. The competition shall be conducted under the supervision of officials of the Society.
- 20. Competitors will be notified of the time and date of the competitions.

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND EXHIBITION, ETC.

(See also the conditions at the head of each Breed Section)

Entries will only be received subject to the rules and regulations of the Society and the decisions of the Council. At time of entry and until after exhibition, all exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or held by the exhibitor under a written lease recognised by the Society.

The foregoing clause regarding leases does not apply in the Ayrshire Section. All exhibits in that Section must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.

Only one exhibitor will be recognised as an owner from any one holding, and any exhibitor who enters, or permits the entry of any of his stock, in the name of any other exhibitor, shall be disqualified.

The breeding year for Dairy Cattle dates from 1st July in each year.

Entries are accepted on the distinct understanding that stock may not be removed from the Showgrounds until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September.

The conditions governing the number of entries permitted will be found at the head of each breed section.

No exhibit may be entered in more than one ordinary class unless otherwise stated at the head of the section. Special classes or championship prizes do not count as ordinary classes. Throughout the schedule special classes are denoted with a star (\*). Should an exhibit be incorrectly entered in more than one ordinary class, such exhibit shall be deemed ineligible to compete in any class other than the first in which its name or particulars appear in the Show Catalogue.

The Council reserves the right to reject at any time any entry or prohibit any person or animal from competing in any class.

When a Special Prize is not in a numbered class, a separate entry is not required. No entry can be changed after entries close.

Every animal entered must be exhibited unless a certificate signed by the owner is lodged with the Society prior to the date of the Show, stating that the animal is unable to compete on one of the following grounds:—

(i) The animal has died.

- (ii) The animal is unfit for exhibition due to injury or disease.
- (iii) The animal has become ineligible for the class entered.
- (iv) Some other cause which the Council or Director of the Society considers reasonable.

Failure to comply with this rule renders the owner or entrant liable to a fine of not more than \$10 for every animal not exhibited, and in addition the Council may debar the owner or exhibitor from taking part in any further exhibition conducted by the Society.

All entries must be made in writing on forms supplied by the Society. Entries for all cattle sections must be in the hands of the Director, at his office, Royal Show Grounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, 3032, on or before the time stated at head of each cattle section.

Except where otherwise determined by Council, all cattle must be certified Tuberculosis free. Animals from herds listed as accredited or in process of accreditation under the Accredited Tubercle-free Herd Scheme conducted by the Department of Agriculture, Victoria, need not be individually tested, but all other cattle exhibited must be Tuberculin tested within ninety days prior to opening date of the Show. Certificates for these individual tests must accompany entry forms, or, if not available at that time, must be in the hands of the Director no later than 14 days prior to the opening day of the Show.

All exhibits must be placed where directed by the Director or his deputy, and (except in accordance with Regulation 19) must not be removed from their allotted places during the Exhibition without the written consent of the Director being first obtained.

Unless authorised by the Society no livestock will be permitted to enter the Grounds other than those entered for exhibition.

The General Regulations and Regulations appearing at the heading of each section and the conditions on the entry form also form part of the conditions of entry.

#### **ENTRY TICKETS**

Entry tickets will be issued about a week before the Show opens. The entry ticket of each exhibit shall state the number of its box, stall, pen or stand, as the case may be, which shall correspond with its number in the official catalogue, and if the box, stall or pen be not occupied by such exhibit by noon on the first day of the Show, the accommodation reverts to the Society. The entry ticket must be produced at the gate, when it will admit the exhibit and attendant to the grounds. It must be retained, and again produced when the exhibit leaves the grounds. Attendant's passes will be issued by the Superintendent at his office on the Show Grounds.

### CATTLE

#### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE OF EXHIBITS

Exhibitors are required to deliver their Cattle (except Fat Cattle) to the Show Grounds in time to ascertain from the Cattle Superintendent where their exhibits are to be placed and to have them in their allotted positions by 9 a.m. on Wednesday, 18th September.

The entry of cattle, fodder, bedding or equipment to the Show Grounds prior to the Friday preceding the first day of the Show, is not allowed without special permission being granted by the Society.

Exhibitors will not be permitted to remove their stock until 11 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September.

#### NECK NUMBERS

Numbers corresponding to the exhibit numbers in the catalogue must be worn by the exhibits when appearing before the Judge.

Neck numbers must be obtained by the exhibitor from the office of the Superintendent .

#### "IN MILK" CLASSES AND DISPOSAL OF MILK

A Cow or Heifer entered as "in milk" can be transferred to the "in calf" class, if she has not calved prior to judging, or vice versa.

Cows and heifers, in milk, except Dairy Shorthorns, Jerseys and A.I.S., must be fully milked out in readiness for "stripping out" by the Stewards at 5.00 p.m. on Wedneseday, 18th September.

Dairy Shorthorn cows and heifers, in milk, must be in readiness for "stripping out" at 8.00 p.m. on Wednesday, 18th September.

Jersey and A.I.S. cows and heifers, in milk, must be in readiness for "stripping out" at 5.00 p.m. on Sunday, 22nd September.

The owner or his representative must be in attendance when females are being stripped out, and the exhibits which are to receive such attention must be in readiness in the stalls allotted to them.

Before entering the Judging Ring exhibits in the "In Milk" Classes will be checked with the Milk Stewards' reports to ascertain that they have been fully milked out in compliance with the conditions.

Entries of milking stock (Sections 25 to 31 inclusive) will only be accepted subject to the following regulations regarding the disposal of milk.

In order that the Society can comply with the provisions of the Dairy Supervision Act, exhibitors are not permitted to dispose of milk prior to and during the currency of the Show, either by sale or gift, other than to the Society's agent, who is situated at the Milk Room (beside the No. 1 Cattle Pavilion). All milk will be purchased according to butter-fat value, based upon a complete test of the bulked milk, and returns, less dairy costs, will be forwarded to exhibitors after the Show. No milk will be paid for unless approved milk utensils are used and hygienic methods are adopted.

Exhibitors must provide their own receptacles for the delivery of milk to the Society's dairy on the Show Grounds.

#### JUDGING

Judging will be in catalogue order and will take place at the time stated at the head of each breed section. Any exhibitor who shall, without due cause, fail to parade any animal before the Judge, when required so to do by the Steward of the Section, shall be liable to a fine of \$10.

Judges have the right to order any Cow competing for Championships to be milked dry before finally awarding the prizes.

Attendants leading stock in the judging ring or on parade must wear uniform grey coats, which can be procured from the Society, and the showing of a name or names on the wearing apparel or about the person of the attendant is prohibited. This regulation will be strictly enforced.

#### AGE, DEFORMITY AND USE OF HORMONES

The Society's Veterinary Surgeon's decision regarding age shall be final.

If, in the opinion of the Director, exhibits in these Sections be deemed to be deformed, the owner or owners of such exhibit or exhibits shall, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Show Grounds.

All male animals competing in the breeding classes must be completely entire. Any male animal in the breeding classes not deemed to be completely entire by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon may not compete or be offered for sale on the Show Grounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing in such classes.

In all Cattle Sections any animal entered which can be shown to the satisfaction of the Society to have received Hormones will be ineligible for a prize.

#### **INSPECTION OF STOCK**

Exhibitors in the stock sections shall, if requested by the Steward-in-Chief of the Section or by the Director or his agent, submit his exhibits in whole or part, for inspection by a Veterinarian or Veterinarians appointed by the Society.

The Owner or Exhibitor of any exhibit or Stand of exhibits disapproved of as an exhibit by the Council of the Society, must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits from the Society's Grounds. The Council reserves the right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who exhibits stock that is not up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show. See also regulations at head of Beef and Dairy Cattle Sections.

#### SECURITY OF ANIMALS

All male exhibits of Beef and Dual Purpose Cattle born on or before 31st August, 1967, and all male exhibits of Dairy Cattle, irrespective of age, shall be rung through the nose and at all times shall be led by such ring. If, in the opinion of the Stewards or Society's officials, any bull is considered unsafe, such bull shall be placed under such control as directed by the Stewards or Society's officials.

All bulls exhibited in the Dairy Sections shall be tethered by the nose ring in addition to the headstall or neck rope.

All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of \$4 for every infringement of this regulation.

#### CATTLE

Each exhibitor is required to see that each of his exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. All exhibitors of Beef Cattle must provide neck straps or neck ropes, as well as halters for tethering their cattle. Every poll bull and every wholly or partially dehorned bull entered in Beef and Dual Purpose Sections, must be securely tethered by an effective headstall in addition to a nose ring or neck strap or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Director, any exhibit or exhibits of stock be deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's Grounds.

#### PARADES

All prize-winning cattle must be taken on parade in accordance with the printed programme.

Exhibits of Jersey and A.I.S. cattle must be taken on parades conducted prior to judging of exhibits in these Sections. The numbers paraded are to be commensurate with the prizes offered in each of the ordinary classes for these breeds.

After judging, only the prize-winning cattle, except Fat Cattle—will be permitted to be taken on Parades. Exhibitors shall be subject to a fine of one dollar in each case in which this regulation is not complied with, and shall also be liable to forfeit the prize or prizes awarded to their exhibit or exhibits. All cattle parading must wear exhibit numbers. No ribbons will be permitted on exhibits except those won during the Show.

Attendants leading stock on parade must wear uniform grey coats which can be procured from the Society.

This regulation will be strictly enforced.

#### SALES AND NOTICES

Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the stalls stating that an animal is for sale; such cards not to exceed 12 in. x 10 in. and must not be put up until after 12 noon on Wednesday, 18th September. No other advertisements or notices (except by permission of the Council) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.

Any animal offered for sale may wear, in the sale ring, only those ribbons won in single competition.

In the Beef Cattle Sections no bull shall be sold whilst at the Show Grounds, either by public auction or private treaty, for less than 400 dollars and no female for less than 300 dollars.

A commission of 1 per cent. shall be paid to the Society in respect of all stock sold on the Show Grounds.

#### PAVILIONS—Cleanliness and Hours of Exhibition

Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the Cattle Superintendent:

- (i) Keep each stall allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.
- (ii) Clean out their stalls or boxes before 8 a.m. each day.
- (iii) Refrain from leading exhibits from their stalls to water troughs between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. each day of the Show.

Failure to comply with this rule shall render the exhibitor liable to a fine not exceeding \$10 for each separate offence.

Any exhibitor or his employee putting manure out of a box, stall, or pen, or putting out a trough, or cleaning out an alley way after 8 a.m. on a Show day shall be liable to a fine of one dollar.

The placing of bales of straw along the passageways is not permitted.

All cattle pavilions will be open to the public from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. daily, and on the first Saturday, the Wednesday, the second Thursday and the last Saturday of the Show will, in addition to the aforementioned period, remain open between 6.30 p.m. and 9 p.m., also between 1.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Sunday.

Exhibits must not be rugged between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of one dollar for every infringement of this regulation.

#### FEED SHEDS, MIXING BINS, FODDER ARRANGEMENTS AND BEDDING

In all Sections feed sheds are available for exhibitors. Charge, \$7.50 during the currency of the Show. Feed-mixing bins may be hired for \$1.00 each. Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the Cattle Pavilions except on the fodder lofts or in their own feed sheds.

No bedding other than straw or hay (except grass hay), may be used in any boxes or stalls.

For the convenience of exhibitors fodder merchants will be situated on the Show Grounds for the purpose of accepting orders for stock foods, etc., delivery of which must be made before 9 a.m. each day during the Show.

#### CHAMPIONSHIP PLAQUES

Plaques denoting Champion and Reserve Champion are provided by the R.A.S. for display over the winning animals.

#### VETERINARY ARRANGEMENTS

A veterinary service commencing on the Sunday preceding the Show will be available until the Sunday immediately after the Show.

#### TRUCKS, TRANSPORTS AND CARAVANS.

Motor vehicles, including trucks and stock transports will not be permitted to remain on the Show Grounds after unloading. They must be removed immediately, and will not be re-admitted until after 11 p.m. on Saturday, 28th September, to load for the return.

Caravans will not be admitted to the Show Grounds.

#### **INTER-BREEDS COMPETITIONS**

Two cash prizes of \$20.00 each, presented by the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, will be awarded for—

- (a) the Best Prepared and Maintained Breed of Beef Cattle during the Show;
- (b) the Best Prepared and Maintained Breed of Dual Purpose or Dairy Cattle during the Show.

The prize money will be paid to the Victorian Branches of the Societies of the successful breeds.

#### **GENERAL RULES**

- 1. Exhibits in this Section can only be entered in one ordinary class, except in the case of exhibits entered in Classes 9 and 10. These may, if eligible, also be entered in Classes 11 or 12, and vice versa.
- 2. An exhibit cannot be entered in a special Class unless it has been entered in Class 1, 2 or 3.

\*Denotes Special Class.

- 3. All exhibitors in this Section shall state on their entry forms:-
  - (a) The breed, cross of breeds or mixture of breeds of each animal entered so far as this is known. e.g., "Poll Shorthorn — Hereford cross. Sire, Burton Lea Poll Shorthorn; dam, grade "Poll Shorthorn — Hereford cross. Hereford cow."
  - (b) The name, breed and registered number of the sire and/or dam of each animal entered when either or both of these are known to be registered.
  - (c) Whether an exhibit has been artificially bred.

- 4. Any exhibitor who is awarded a cash prize in this Section may elect to receive a trophy to the value of that prize money or any part thereof
- 5. The Society reserves the right to reject or limit entries at its discretion. Accommodation is limited.
- 6. Except in those classes where suitability for export trade is required, suitability for local trade is implied.
- 7. Where an exhibitor's entry is based on age as shown by its teeth, it must not show evidence of having had more teeth than specified for the class.
- 8. Unless otherwise stated all entries in this Section are required to be grass-fed. "Grass-fed" means that the exhibit has been grazed on pasture or crop and may have received hay or ensilage but not grain or concentrates and must not have been stall-fed.
- 9. In Classes where particulars of feeding are required to be shown on the entry form exhibitors are asked to indicate whether or not their exhibits have been foster-mothered.
- 10. The Council reserves the right to display all or any part of any carcase in the refrigerated show-case at the Meat Hall.

#### **GENERAL JUDGING RULES AND** ARRANGEMENTS

- A complete Timetable of the arrangements for this Section will be forwarded to each exhibitor after entries have been .eceived.
- 2. Live judging in all ordinary classes will be carried out by the official Fat Cattle Judge.
- 3. Special classes will also be judged alive by the official Fat Cattle Judge, who will award a maxi-mum of 100 points for conformation.
- 4. In all special classes the prize is awarded for the animal obtaining the highest aggregate of points from both live and carcase judging. These points are not aggregated in the ordinary classes.
- 5. In classes where three animals are penned the prize is awarded on the basis of total points scored by all three exhibits in either the live judging or carcase judging and not on the basis of the best individual of the three penned.
- 6. The Chief Steward may, at his discretion, transfer any animal or pen of animals from the class in which they were entered to any other class.
- 7. In single animal Classes 1 to 8 exhibits will not be awarded a points score when judged alive, but will be placed first, second and third at the Judge's discretion.


