

# Nomination of Preferred Arrival and Departure Times

Please note Exhibitors have the option of nominating an earlier arrival and/or a later departure time to allow flexibility to all. Please indicate your preferred arrival and departure times when entering.

During your nominated departure time, those with greater distance to travel will be allowed to leave first.

### **PRIZE MONEY**

All Ordinary Classes will receive prize money as follows:

- 1st \$35
- 2nd \$25
- 3rd \$15

# Entry, Scanning, Locker and Vehicle Fees

Enter online at melbourneroyal.com.au/sheep

- \$5.00 per exhibit scanning fee
- \$30.00 per sheep (members)
- \$55.00 per sheep (non-member)
- \$20.00 per sheep (schools)
- \$100.00 per locker plus \$20.00 refundable key deposit. Refunds will be issued on return of key
- \$85.00 per vehicle for Show duration.

### **Accommodation Lockers**

Accommodation lockers are available for Exhibitor use. Melbourne Royal reserves the right to limit locker allocation in an effort to accommodate all Exhibitors.

A key deposit will apply for the use of accommodation lockers during Show, with the deposit to be refunded upon return of the key.

### **Straw and Bedding**

Melbourne Royal will be providing the following allocation free of charge for each sheep exhibit:

 1 bale of straw per sheep upon arrival, plus ½ bale per day.

### **Truck Parking and Shuttle Bus**

Melbourne Royal will again be running a free shuttle bus service between car and truck parks and Melbourne Showgrounds during arrivals and departures.

The service is available for all exhibitors. Full route maps and pick-up points will be detailed in the Exhibitor Information booklet.

### **Catalogues Available to Download Free**

Printed Catalogues are available for purchase (\$15.00) when entering and will be included in your Exhibitor Pack.



### Ram Trifecta is on Again in 2023

This is the ultimate challenge of all breeds! Three rams of any age that are entered in the ordinary classes will be selected by each Breed Society (or a delegate thereof) as a representation of their breed. The rams can be owned by any exhibitor, and do not need to be from the same sire.

Prize money of \$1600 will be split between the winning Breed Society's Victorian Branch (\$1000) and the owner/s of the three rams (\$200 each). Entries are due at the Superintendent's Office before the commencement of your breeds judging. The winning breed society will be required to invoice Melbourne Royal for the amount sponsored.

# **Interbreed Lamb Production Ram Pairs Classes**

Exhibitors are reminded to refer to the Interbreed section of the schedule and catalogue for information regarding the Lamb Production Ram Pairs Classes.

### **Exhibitors' Meeting**

### Health Status Declaration: The OJD Management Plan

The Melbourne Royal Show will continue to conduct its animal health and biosecurity practices to the highest of standards, and will ensure all operations are in line with the National OJD Management Plan.

Exhibitors are required to complete a National Sheep Health Declaration (Version July 2019), and submit these forms when entering. Copies are available for download from melbourneroyal.com.au/sheep.

Please take time when completing your National Sheep Health Declaration, as this information will be used to comply with penning and biosecurity requirements.

### **Fodder Merchant**

For the convenience of Exhibitors, fodder merchants will be located on the Showgrounds for the duration of the Show. A detailed list of products and pricing will be sent to Exhibitors prior to your arrival on the grounds.

### **Property Identification Code**

The Property Identification Code of the Melbourne Showgrounds is 3MWAG001.

### **Promotional Space**

If possible, Melbourne Royal shall make space available to Breed Societies for the purpose of providing marketing and educational material pertaining to that breed. These spaces will not be made available to individual studs. Allocation of space is at the discretion of Melbourne Royal.

We invite breed societies and associations to contact Melbourne Royal in relation to breed promotional material for the judging ring.

# SF11 – PERFORMANCE CLASS: RAM, UNDER 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ YEARS OLD

Born after 1st April in the preceding year.

Exhibitors must advise Melbourne Royal in writing of the tag number of the sheep no less than one week prior to the commencement of the Show.

Entrants will need to be current participants in Lambplan for Group Lambplan figures and 80% of rams in the Exhibitors flock must be tested by Lambplan.

Exhibitors are not to wear EBV cards during judging. The objectives of the Performance Class are:

- To make show selection closer to practical ram selection with the Judge ranking rams as potential sires for use in a commercial prime lamb operation.
- To promote improved genetic selection procedures. To allow breeders to compare rams between flocks using Estimated Breeding Values (EBV's).
- To maintain the spectacle of the show ring and the interest of ram breeders and the general public.

An outline of the selection method for the Performance Judging Class is shown below:

Visual (fertility, judge to allocate points from 0 to 50)
Performance figures

50 points 50 points 100 points

Points allocated for fertility and EBV's for leanness and growth will be calculated prior to judging. Points allocated for Breed Character and Structural Soundness will be allocated while sheep are in the judging ring. The target market for these sires is the production of Elite Lambs: 22kg carcase weight, fat score 2 and 3.

The Sire's prefix, number and individual registration number to be advised at the time of entry. The winner of this class is eligible to compete in the Sire's Progeny Championship in the All Breeds Sheep Interbreed.



### SF14 - BREEDER'S GROUP OF 3 SHEEP (SPECIAL)

To consist of 3 sheep. Must be **one ram and two ewes** any age, and any wool length. Combinations to be drawn from the Ordinary Classes, all owned by the one exhibitor. All exhibits must be entered in the name of one exhibitor at the time of entry. The winner of this class is eligible to compete in the Breeder's Group Championship in the All Breeds Sheep Interbreed.

- 4. Judges will be announced to the participants upon their arrival to the Melbourne Show.
- 5. If a participant fails to hand in their Judging Sheet prior to the completion of the rotation, they will be awarded a score of 0 for that rotation
- 6. In the Event of a tie on any Best Award, a countback will be undertaken using the following rules:
  - Handler: Will be determined on a countback on the following in order: 1st Showman, 2nd Attitude and 3rd Presentation
  - Sheep Judging: Will be determined on a countback on the following in order: 1st Reasons, 2nd Placing and 3rd Handling
  - Best Junior: Will be determined on a countback on the following in order: 1st Short Wool Judging Total Score, 2nd Long Wool Judging Total Score and 3rd Handler Judging Total Score



#### **JUDGING**

Schools and individuals will be judged under the sections as follows:

#### 1. Junior Judging

Participants will have two minutes to complete this component and will judge two different sheep breeds, in each age group category:

Junior: Under 12Intermediate: 12-15Senior: 16-19

200 Points are awarded to the individual for the following:

- 100 points for Long/Short Wool reasons for selecting their order of sheep
- 50 points for Long/Short Wool handling of the sheep during the judging component
- 50 points for Long/Short Wool correct placings of the sheep

Judging criteria: The judges will be looking for confidence in delivery, assessment of sheep structure and an overall knowledge and depth of understanding of sheep judging. Keep in mind all parts of the sheep must be judged to maximise your score!

#### 2. Virtual Sales Pitch

Participants will prepare a sales pitch video on a sheep of their choice. The purpose of the video is to promote/market a sheep to perspective buyers. Participants are encouraged to include relevant information that supports their sales pitch, a good visual of the animal, supporting evidence in the form of actual weights, performance data and the need for true and verifiable sales information.

Participants must submit a three-minute (max.) video. This is to be submitted prior to the commencement of Show. A date will be confirmed at the time of entries opening. Assistance with video filming is acceptable, however, if it becomes apparent that there is coaching from the sidelines, the contestant may be disqualified. Whilst we encourage innovation, we are not looking for, or encouraging, a "million dollar" production.

Up to four finalists from each age group will be required to demonstrate their judging skills at the show in the judging ring on the day of competition.

Contestants to demonstrate

- · Their knowledge of their chosen breed.
- Explain the strong attributes of their sheep, including any relevant information
- · Handle, parade and stand up their sheep
- · Utilise any technology available

200 Points are awarded to the individual for the following:

- · 20 points for Selection of location/background
- 30 points for Presentation of sheep
- 30 points for Presentation of individual
- · 30 points for Clarity of speaking
- 40 points for Use of relevant terminology
- 40 points for Use of data and demonstrate comprehension/competency of data relevant to their sheep

 10 points for Use of any other unique sales pitch or technology

#### 3. Sheep Identification Activity

This activity will be held during the junior program on Sunday 24 September. Participants will be supplied a worksheet and must correctly identify the breeds of sheep from the pictures supplied. If it becomes apparent that there is coaching from the sidelines, the contestant may be disqualified.

104 Points are awarded for the following:

· 4 points per correct answer/identification of a breed

#### 4. Fleece Judging

This activity will be held during the junior program on Sunday 24 September. Participants will have sufficient time to complete this component and will judge multiple fleeces from at least two different sheep breeds.

Points will be awarded for this section. Total points and allocated time to complete this section are to be confirmed and distributed shortly.

#### **SCORING SYSTEM**

Scores from each category are totaled on the last day of competition to give an overall score. This total gives the overall winning school.

Scores from each of the above sections are totalled and combined with the best maintained team score, results will be announced during the Interbreed section on Sunday 24 September. The combined totals are allocated to each school and the overall winning school announced, as will each placing in the relevant sections. Individuals (within the age brackets mentioned) may compete in each of the above four competitions but will not be eligible for the Best Maintained Team award.

Schools will accrue points based on their placings in each of the 4 sections listed above as follows:

- a) Classes with 1 to 10 entries: 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
- b) Classes with 11 to 30 entries: 1st 4 points, 2nd 3 points, 3rd 2 points, 4th 1 point.
- c) Classes with over 30 entries: 1st 5 points, 2nd 4 points, 3rd 3 points, 4th 2 points, 5th 1 point

## Best Maintained – School Team, and Best Maintained – Youth Team

200 Points are awarded to teams for the following:

- · 60 points for pens cleanliness and general area
- 40 points for sheep breed and team information display
- 40 points for assisting other exhibitors (during judging, weighing scanning or help feeding etc)
- 40 points for assisting as stewards or other organisation activities (iPad etc).
- 20 points for interaction with the general public (could include general behaviour, teamwork and dress code)

WHEREAS Melbourne Royal has agreed to effect a Public Liability insurance for certain Animal Exhibitors at the 2023 Melbourne Royal Show the following applies:

**Insured Party:** Animal and Livestock Exhibitors participating in competitions and events

**Period of Insurance:** From seven days prior to the competition until seven days thereafter.

Insured Activities: All activities undertaken whilst within and from the confines of the event venue consistent with the Insured's livestock exhibit activity including setting up and removal

**Description of Cover:** Insurance in respect of the Insured Party's liability to pay costs and compensation in respect of loss of or damage to third party property and death of or injury to third party persons caused by and arising out of the Insured activities, all subject to Melbourne Royal's policy terms, conditions, exclusions and warranties, etc.

**Amount of Cover:** \$10,000,000 any one occurrence

Deductible: \$10,000 any one occurrence

**Geographic Limits:** At and from the event venue

Claims Payable: Worldwide excluding claims made USA and Canada

Insurer(s):Primary - \$10,000,000 Lloyds of London

**Address:** Lloyds Australia Ltd., Suite 2, Level 21 Angel Place, 123 Pitt Street, Sydney, NSW, 2000.

**Policy Numbers:** B1262PC0723919 and B1262PC0724019.

#### **Important conditions**

- The Insured Party must exercise reasonable care to maintain all premises, fittings and plant in sound condition.
- 2. The Insured Party must take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury and damage to persons and property.
- The Insured Party must give immediate notice of an incident which may give rise to a claim or of receipt of advice of a claim.
- 4. The Insured Party must not make any admission, offer or promise in connection with any claim and must not any time admit liability.
- 5. The Insured Party must make themselves aware of and comply with the following Notices:-

**Duty of Disclosure:** Before you enter into a contract of General insurance with an insurer, you have a duty, under the Insurance Contracts Act 1984 as amended, to disclose to the insurer every matter that you know, or could reasonably be expected to know, is relevant to the insurer's decision whether to accept the risk of the insurance and, if so, on what terms.

**Non-Disclosure:** If you fail to comply with your duty of disclosure, the insurer may be entitled to reduce his liability under the contract in respect of a claim or may cancel the contract.

Average Provision: The insurer will pay legal expenses in addition to the sum insured, if however, the total amount of the loss (less legal expenses) ultimately paid to the claimant(s) exceeds the sum insured then insurers will only pay (in addition to the sum insured) that proportion of the legal expenses as the sum insured bears to the loss.

**Third Party Interests:** This policy will only provide cover for your interest and does not cover the interests of any third party (e.g. financiers, lessors, etc) unless the interests of the third party are noted in the policy.

Waiver of Insurer's Rights: You must not enter into any agreement without the written authority of the insurer whereby any of their rights to which they become entitled as your insurer after settling or agreeing to settle a claim are prejudiced or limited in any way otherwise all benefit under the policy will be forfeited.

- 6. THIS INSURANCE ONLY APPLIES TO INSURED PARTIES ENTERING COMPETITION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GENERAL REGULATIONS.

#### **Close of Entries**

- 2. Entries in the Melbourne Royal Sheep
  Competition must be received at the
  Melbourne Royal's Administration Office
  located at Melbourne Showgrounds, Epsom
  Road, Ascot Vale, Victoria 3032 by the date
  stipulated in the Important Information for
  Exhibitors section of the Schedule.
- 3. All entries must be accompanied by the applicable fees, your property's Ovine Brucellosis Accreditation Certificate that states the Flock Accreditation No. and Expiry Date and a National Sheep Health Declaration (Version July 2019) signed by the Exhibitor or authorised agent.
- 4. The onus is entirely on the Exhibitor to submit particulars on time.
- In accordance with General Regulation 9.2, Melbourne Royal reserves the right to amend, consolidate or cancel classes offered in this competition schedule.

#### **Entry Fees**

6. The cost of entry can be found in the Information for Exhibitors in the Schedule. Entry fees include bedding.

7. The entry fee entitles the Exhibitor to enter the animal in all eligible classes, subject to General Regulation 2.7. Please specify selected class/es when entering.

#### **Scan Fees**

- All rams must be scanned (excluding ram lambs born after 1 April of the current year, Black & Colored and Merino rams do not require scanning).
- 9. All Texel, Hampshire Downs and White Suffolk Ewes must be scanned.
- 10. Scan fees must be paid at time of entry.
- 11. Rams required to be scanned that are not scanned will not be eligible to be shown.
- 12. Each Exhibitor will be issued with a scanning card after the required animals have been scanned. Scanning cards are required to be worn in the Judging Ring.
- 13. If scanning cards are not displayed, the Exhibit may not be eligible for a prize.

#### **Parking**

- 14. Parking for trucks, trailers and floats is available. Apply by completing the relevant section when entering and forward the fee with the competition Entry Fee.
- There is to be no camping in any of the Melbourne Royal parking areas under any circumstances.
- 16. Any vehicle, including trucks, stock transports, trailers, and horse floats, located on the Showgrounds, or any area leased by Melbourne Royal, shall be at the sole risk of the owner. Melbourne Royal accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage, including loss or damage



caused by negligence of Melbourne Royal, its officers, employees, or agents to any vehicle, or the contents of any vehicle, located on the Melbourne Royal's property or in the area leased by Melbourne Royal.

#### **Arrival and Departure of Exhibits**

- 17. All Exhibitors are to comply with the arrival and departure times allocated, unless otherwise notified directly by Melbourne Royal. Times for arrival and departure are listed in the Timetable.
- 18. All Exhibitors arriving prior to the official Show opening must wear high visibility vests whilst within the Melbourne Showgrounds.
- 19. Sheep may not be removed from the Showgrounds until after the set departure time, unless otherwise directed by the Superintendent.
- 20. Departure times are as prioritised by the Superintendent, with preference for earlier departure slots to long distance travelers.

#### **Storage/Accomodation Lockers**

- 21. Storage and accommodation lockers are available onsite, subject to availability, and will be allocated by Melbourne Royal. Apply by completing the relevant section when entering. Locker fees are for the duration of the Sheep Competition.
- 22. Lockers must be vacated and all gear removed as soon as possible, and not later than end of departure times for the Competition, or such earlier time advised by the Superintendent.

  Melbourne Royal will endeavor to return any item left behind in lockers, but is not responsible for any loss or damage.

#### **Bedding**

23. Melbourne Royal will arrange for the strawing of all pens prior to the Show. The charge for each pen is included in the Entry Fee. Straw is allocated per pen on one bale upon arrival, and half a bale top-up during the Show.

24. No bedding other than straw may be used in pens.

#### **Cleanliness of Pens**

- 25. Mucking out of pens is to be carried out between 8:00pm and 7:00am. These times will be strictly enforced.
- 26. Exhibitors must keep the pens allotted to their animals clean and give proper attention to their stock throughout the Show. Exhibitors must complete cleaning of pens occupied by their Exhibits before 7:00am each day that sheep are at the Show.

#### **Stock Attendant Passes**

- 27. A Confirmation of Entries document will be issued prior to the Show and is required to gain entry to the Melbourne Showgrounds.
- 28. Upon arrival at the Showgrounds, Exhibitors are to collect their Stock Attendant Passes from the Superintendent's Office once Exhibits have been penned, and will be issued in accordance with the formula outlined in Information for Exhibitors section of the Schedule.

#### **Health Declaration**

 As a condition of entry, all sheep Exhibitors are required to complete and submit the National Sheep Health Statement (Version July 2019).

#### **Ovine Johne's Disease**

- 30. The Melbourne Royal Sheep Competitions will be conducted under the guidelines as set out in the Johne's Disease Market Assurance Program (SheepMAP). Exhibits must comply with the following:
  - a) come from properties located in a Regional Biosecurity Area; or
  - b) are tested negative to OJD through one of the following four means:
    - i. Faecal 350: A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in



smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or equivalent test in pools of up to 50 sheep.

The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

- ii. **Abattoir 500:** At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.
- iii. Abattoir 150: At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.
- iv. Other: Post mortem examination by a SheepMAP vet with no indication of OJD, or other negative test.

OR

- c) are approved vaccinates through one of the means outlined below:
  - Approved Vaccinate: A sheep that is identified by an NLIS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:
    - Vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine by 16 weeks of age; or
    - Vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
      - was in the SheepMAP, or
      - had undertaken a negative Faecal
         350 test in the two (2) years
         preceding the vaccination, or
      - had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.

#### **Ovine Brucellosis Free Exhibits**

31. All entries must come from an Ovine
Brucellosis accredited free stud. During the
entry process, all exhibitors must provide proof
of their current Ovine Brucellosis accreditation
including the Flock Accreditation No. and
Expiry Date.

#### **Ovine Footrot**

32. All Exhibits must be declared free of Virulent Footrot within the National Sheep Health Declaration (Version July 2019) to be eligible for competition.

#### **Advertising**

- 33. Exhibitors are permitted to display cards over the pens allotted to them stating that an animal is for private sale. These cards are not to exceed 30cm x 25cm. No other advertisement or notices (except by permission of the Melbourne Royal) are permitted on or in any stalls or buildings.
- 34. Each Exhibitor is permitted to display one sign 60cm x 120cm in size provided that such sign carries only the stud name, address, telephone number, e-mail address and web address.

#### **Eligibility of Exhibits**

- 35. Entries will only be accepted from Exhibitors holding current financial registration with the relevant breed society or association.
- 36. No Exhibit in the Pair Ordinary Classes can compete in Single Ordinary Classes and vice versa.
- 37. Sheep need not be entered by name or tag number, except when otherwise stated, and no particulars other than the breeders' name and stud will be published in the Show Catalogue.
- 38. Sheep must be identified by tag number and date of shearing on the Inspection Form. The Inspection Form is provided by Melbourne Royal prior to inspection to qualify as an Exhibit and become eligible to compete.



#### **Excess Entries**

- 39. In the event of more entries being received than can be accommodated, ewe entries will be reduced to one in each class from any one Exhibitor.
- 40. If necessary, the number of sheep of each breed from any one Exhibitor may also be reduced to a figure determined by Melbourne Royal. The Exhibitors will have the right to nominate the sheep to be withdrawn should this reduction be necessary.

## National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS)

- 41. All sheep are required to have a NLIS tag attached when attending the Show.
- 42. All sheep born after the 1 January 2017 will be electronically scanned upon arrival at Melbourne Showgrounds. All electronic scan data will be uploaded to the NLIS database by Melbourne Royal.
- 43. Any lamb born at Melbourne Showgrounds will be fitted with a Melbourne Showgrounds NLIS tag in its ear.

#### **Ewes in Lamb**

44. A ewe entered as "with lamb of her own breed progeny at foot" may be transferred to the class provided for ewes of her age if she has not lambed prior to judging day, and vice versa.

#### **Preparation of Sheep**

- 45. Exhibitors or their employees are not permitted to prepare (i.e. trim, etc.) Exhibits in any passageway or in any judging area in the pavilion after 5:00pm on the day prior to judging day.
- 46. No preparation (including trimming) of shorn sheep will be permitted after the commencement of inspection unless extenuating circumstances exist and permission is granted by the Chief Steward. The granting of such permission is entirely at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

- 47. No trimming will be permitted after judging except with the permission of the Chief Steward.
- 48. No tattooing of sheep is permitted on the Showgrounds.
- 49. The washing of legs of Poll Dorset sheep is not permitted on the Showgrounds.
- 50. Exhibitors are not permitted to use powders or other substances on the face and/ or colour on legs and feet in the preparation of sheep.

#### **NLIS Tags**

- 51. All sheep born on or after 1 January 2017 must be identified with an electronic NLIS (Sheep) tag before being consigned to an agricultural show in Victoria or elsewhere in Australia.
- 52. All sheep born before 1 January 2017 must be identified with either a visually readable or an electronic NLIS (Sheep) tag before being consigned to an agricultural show.
- 53. All tagged sheep will be scanned and reported to the NLIS database.
- 54. NLIS FROM 2019: From 1 January 2019, all sheep and non-exempt goats introduced from interstate and born after 1 January 2017, must be electronically tagged before being dispatched from a Victorian property (including Showgrounds).

#### **Inspection of Exhibits**

- 55. Every animal exhibited in the Sheep section must be inspected by an Inspector appointed by Melbourne Royal at the inspection times.
- 56. All Exhibitors are to comply with the inspection times outlined in the timetable.
- 57. The Inspector or Inspectors shall examine all sheep entered for breed characteristics and class eligibility.
- 58. If inspection cards are not handed in, sheep will not be inspected and are therefore not eligible for judging.



- 59. Sheep not in their allotted pens at the time of Inspection may be disqualified by the Chief Steward. Any decision or determination of disqualification is entirely within the discretion of the Chief Steward and shall not be challenged or called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.
- 60. Any sheep found to be not visibly and legibly tattooed in accordance with their breed regulations may be liable to be disqualified by Melbourne Royal.
- 61. No Exhibit may have their teeth filed or ground.
- 62. Lambs at foot are eligible to compete in lamb classes and must be held when not in their pen.
- 63. In accordance with General Regulation 8.6, the dams of sheep entered in the lamb classes must not be brought on to the Showgrounds unless they are entered for exhibition in another class.
- 64. Disqualified sheep shall not be offered for sale on the Showgrounds. Exhibitors of disqualified sheep may remove them from the Showgrounds at the direction of the Superintendent or Chief Steward.

#### **Inspection Appeals**

- 65. An Exhibitor or competitor may appeal against an inspector's decision.
- 66. Subject to General Regulation 12.1 to 12.8, appeals shall be addressed to the Chief Steward, and be lodged at the Sheep Superintendent's office before 6:00pm on the day the decision in question has been made. Such appeals shall be accompanied with a deposit of \$50.00 that may be forfeited to Melbourne Royal if in the sole opinion of the Chief Steward the appeal is unfounded, frivolous or vexatious.60. The Chief Steward shall set up a Protest Committee prior to the commencement of the Show. The Committee shall comprise the Chief Steward as the Chair and two ordinary members not associated with the alleged incident. A meeting will be convened within 30 minutes of the protest

- being received. The Protest Committee shall immediately investigate the protest and if found to be valid, initiate appropriate action.
- 67. The appeal and all matters arising there from shall be determined conclusively as to all matters by Melbourne Royal and shall not be the subject of any appeal to any court or any order for review or of a similar nature.

#### **Physical Soundness**

68. All male animals must be completely entire and deemed physically sound. Any male animal not deemed to be completely entire and physically sound by Melbourne Royal's Veterinary Surgeon shall not compete or be offered for sale on the Showgrounds. Any marks of speying on females shall disqualify them from competing.

#### **Disapproved Exhibit**

- 69. The owner or Exhibitor of any Exhibit disapproved of as an Exhibit by the Melbourne Royal or a Veterinary Surgeon of Melbourne Royal must immediately upon notice to that effect remove such Exhibit from the Showgrounds. Subject to General Regulations 8 and 9, Melbourne Royal reserves the absolute right to decline to receive entries in future years from any person who Exhibits stock that is not in the opinion of Melbourne Royal, up to a satisfactory standard, that is not exhibited in reasonable Show condition, or that is not given proper attention during the Show. Such a decision or determination is entirely within the discretion of Melbourne Royal and shall not be questioned or challenged in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.
- 70. Exhibits must not be rugged after judging during the hours the Show is open to the Public. Exhibitors will be liable to a fine of \$50.00 for every infringement of this regulation.



#### **Tampering of Exhibits**

- 71. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure the animal is not subject to prohibited practices, prior to and whilst on the Showgrounds.
- 72. Melbourne Royal may make or cause to be made, any test of any Exhibit to determine whether any drug or other substance has been administered to the Exhibit and may take possession of any such Exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such Exhibit for such period as Melbourne Royal deems necessary. Procedures for the testing of prohibited substances may include random tests on Exhibits.
- 73. Should a positive test to a prohibited substance or practice result, any costs associated with testing will be borne by the Exhibitor.
- 74. In accordance with General Regulation 8.1, should a positive test to a prohibited substance or practice result, Melbourne Royal reserves the right to forfeit an award.

#### **Shorn and Unshorn Sheep**

- 75. All sheep in the ASSBA Breeds, Texel and Poll Dorset Classes (except shorn sheep) over 18 months old must have been fairly and evenly shorn between 1 August of the preceding year and 31 March of the current year.
- 76. Corriedales must be shorn on or after 1 July of the preceding year.
- 77. In accordance with the classes entered, Merino Exhibits must be shorn as at 15 August of the year prior or as at 1 March of the current year.
- 78. The minimum wool length for Poll Dorsets and ASSBA Breeds (Shortwool) in all woolly classes shall be 4cm. Exhibits of shorn sheep, except those entered in Romney Classes for Machine Shorn, must be closely and evenly shorn on or before 1 September of the current year with wool length under 2cm unless otherwise stated in individual breed regulations..

- 79. Sheep entered in Romney Classes for Machine Shorn must be machine shorn with standard thickness combs on or after 1 June of the current year.
- 80. Corriedale sheep entered in shorn classes may not have more than 5cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.
- 81. Border Leicester sheep must be shorn in accordance with the regulations appearing at the beginning of that section.
- 82. No Longwool sheep (except Romney and Border Leicester) entered in a shorn class may have more than 4cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection and no Shortwool sheep entered in a shorn class may have more than 2cm of wool on any part of its body at the time of inspection.
- 83. Exhibits in the wool are not eligible to be entered in the classes provided for shorn sheep, and if found to be so entered shall be removed from the Showgrounds.

#### **Judging**

- 84. The following regulations shall be read subject to General Regulations 11.1 through to 12.8 inclusive.
- 85. Any animal entered that can be proved to the satisfaction of the Chief Steward to have received hormones shall be disqualified. The decision or determination of the Chief Steward shall be final and shall not be called into question in any proceedings or in any manner whatsoever.
- 86. Except as otherwise directed, every attendant of an Exhibit whilst parading such Exhibit either before a Judge or in a Grand Parade, shall be dressed in a neat and tidy manner, including long trousers. Sheep Exhibit numbers and scanning cards must also be displayed during judging, unless otherwise directed.
- 87. Persons in charge of Exhibits at or in the Judging Ring shall not address the Judge unless authorised by the Steward in Charge or the Judge themself.

#### Interbreed Tie

88. In the event of a tie during the interbreed judging, the following regulations apply to ensure separation:

**Step 1 Countback**: Sheep with the most firsts is declared the winner, if a draw remains after firsts are counted, it goes down the line until a separation occurs.

**Step 2 Overjudge**: In the event of a tie after the countback is completed, an Overjudge will be selected by the Sheep Committee. The Overjudge's decision is final.

#### **Sheep Sales**

89. Sheep not paraded before the Judge shall not be eligible for sale. This regulation does not apply to the sheep that is not rejected in a paired class where the Inspector rejects one of a pair.

#### **Prizes**

- 90. Ribbons may be awarded up to 8th place as follows:
  - a) 1 to 10 Exhibits per class: 1st, 2nd & 3rd ribbons.
  - b) 11 to 20 Exhibits per class: 1st, 2nd, 3rd & 4th ribbons.
  - c) 21 to 30 Exhibits per class: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th ribbons.
  - d) Over 30 Exhibits per class: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th & 8th ribbons.

The colour of each ribbon will be as follows: 1st Blue, 2nd Red, 3rd White, 4th Yellow, 5th Green, 6th Brown, 7th Lime Green, 8th Orange, Highly Commended Lavender.

Judging is subject to General Regulation 11.

The Judge is under no obligation to award the prizes listed in the table where he considers in his absolute discretion that such prize or prizes are not to be awarded.

#### **Payment of PRIZE MONEY**

91. Prize money as stated in the relevant Prize Schedule includes GST, if applicable. By indicating that you are GST registered you are agreeing to receive a Recipient Created Tax Invoice (RCTI) for any prize money won, and for prize money to include GST.

Melbourne Royal has allocated prize money to Ordinary classes for each breed. No money is allocated to Special or Group classes unless otherwise stated.

#### **Most Successful Exhibitor Awards**

- 92. The Most Successful Exhibitor Awards in all breeds will be calculated from placings in Ordinary Classes as follows:
  - a) Classes with 1 to 10 entries: 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
  - b) Classes with 11 to 30 entries: 1st 4 points, 2nd 3 points, 3rd 2 points, 4th 1 point.
  - c) Classes with over 30 entries: 1st 5 points,
     2nd 4 points, 3rd 3 points, 4th 2 points,
     5th 1 point.

Placings in Trophy Classes, Objective Measurement Classes and Group Classes will not be taken into consideration when deciding these awards. Such classes are indicated by "Special" following the class description.

In the event of a tie, two points will be allotted for Champion Awards and one point for Reserve Champion Awards. If a tie still exists, a count back approved by Melbourne Royal will be made to determine the winner.

### **Objective Measurement Classes**

- 93. All entries in the Objective Measurement classes must be drawn from the Ordinary classes. The winning Exhibit in these classes is not eligible for Championships or Most Successful Exhibitor Awards unless it has won its Ordinary class.
- 94. An approved operator will measure Exhibits entered in Objective Measurement Classes.



#### 1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

#### 1.1 **DEFINITIONS**

The following definitions apply unless the context requires otherwise.

**Agent** includes any person, agent, association or corporation engaged by or on behalf of the Exhibitor and any person acting or purporting to act on the Exhibitor's behalf (including any person who is an invitee of the Exhibitor and regardless of whether the person is remunerated or not).

**Assistant Chief Steward** means the person occupying or acting in the position of Assistant Chief Steward of a section.

**Body** includes any society, organisation or body within or outside Australia having similar objects to Melbourne Royal and, without limitation, includes:

- Royal Agricultural Society of the Northern Territory Inc;
- Royal National Agricultural & Industrial Association of Queensland;
- Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society of South Australia;
- · Royal Agricultural Society of NSW;
- · Royal Agricultural Society of Tasmania;
- · Royal National Capital Agricultural Society;
- · Royal Agricultural Society of WA; and
- any breed association or society recognised by Melbourne Royal.

**Business Day** means a week day on which banks in Melbourne are open for business.

**Chief Executive Officer** means a person occupying or acting in the position of Chief Executive Officer of Melbourne Royal.

**Chief Steward** means the person occupying or acting in the position of Chief Steward of a section.

**Closing Date** means the date and time set out in the Relevant Schedule after which entries for the Event will not be accepted by Melbourne Royal.

**Drug** has the meaning set out in the Relevant Schedule.

**Event** includes competition and class and without limitation includes any event listed in a Schedule. Event also includes the period of bump-in and bump-out for the Event and the period of the Event competition.

**Entry Form** means an entry form (or online equivalent) supplied by Melbourne Royal for an Event.

**Event Participant** includes judges, stewards, contractors, spectators, Exhibitors and all persons present at the Venue during the Event.

**Exhibit** means the animal, person or item entered into an Event by an Exhibitor.

**Exhibitor** means the owner of the Exhibit, and if the owner is less than 18 years of age, the parent or guardian of the owner who signs the Entry Form.

**Inspector** means a person described as such in the Regulations.

**Judge** means a person appointed by Melbourne Royal to judge an Event.

**Motor Vehicle** includes a truck, trailer, horse float and stock transporter but does not include a caravan.

**Melbourne Royal** means Melbourne Royal (ACN 006 728 785).

#### Regulations means:

- (a) Melbourne Royal's General Regulations For All Competitions;
- (b) the rules, regulations and conditions of entry set out in the Relevant Schedule; and
- (c) the rules, regulations and conditions of entry set out on the Entry Form for the Event.

**Relevant Schedule** means the Schedule which applies to the particular Event in which the Exhibitor has submitted or proposes to submit an entry in accordance with these Regulations.

**Review Committee** means a committee appointed under Regulation 12.4.

**Schedule** means a Schedule of events and prizes issued by Melbourne Royal and without limitation, a reference to a Schedule includes a reference to the rules, regulations and conditions set out in the Schedule.

**Show** means the Melbourne Royal Show.

**Showgrounds** means the Melbourne Showgrounds, Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, Victoria and includes without limitation all areas owned, used, rented or leased by Melbourne Royal.

**Steward** means a person occupying or acting in the position of steward.



**Venue** means the site or location at which the Event is held.

**Veterinary Surgeon** means a veterinary surgeon appointed by Melbourne Royal.

#### 1.2 INTERPRETATION

Headings are for convenience only and do not affect interpretation. The following rules apply unless the context requires otherwise.

- (a) The singular includes the plural and conversely.
- (b) A gender includes all genders.
- (c) If a word or phrase is defined, its other grammatical forms have a corresponding meaning.
- (d) A reference to a person, corporation, trust, partnership, unincorporated body or other entity includes any of them.
- (e) A reference to a Regulation is a reference to a Regulation of these Regulations.
- (f) A reference to a Regulation, rule or condition of entry is to the regulation, rule or condition of entry as amended, varied, supplemented, novated or replaced, except to the extent prohibited by these Regulations.
- (g) A reference to a right or obligation of any two or more persons confers that right, or imposes that obligation, as the case may be, jointly and severally.

In the event of an inconsistency between the Regulations and a Schedule, the Regulations prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless otherwise provided.

#### 1.3 EXEMPTIONS

Melbourne Royal may, by notice in writing, exempt an Exhibit or an Exhibitor from one or more of the obligations or requirements contained in these Regulations.

#### 1.4 CONSENTS OR APPROVALS

Where the doing of any act, matter or thing under these Regulations is dependent upon the consent or approval of a person or is within the discretion of a person, the consent or approval may be given or discretion may be exercised conditionally or unconditionally or withheld by the person in its absolute discretion and without giving or assigning any reason for it.

#### 2. ENTRIES

#### 2.1 REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTERING AN EVENT

An entry to an Event must be:

(a) submitted on an Entry Form;

- (b) acknowledged by a physical signature or electronic authorisation by the Exhibitor or, if the Exhibitor is less than 18 years of age, acknowledged by the Exhibitor's parent or guardian;
- (c) fully paid for as set out in the Relevant Schedule:
- (d) submitted before the Closing Date to Melbourne Royal's Registered Office or electronic service; and
- (e) Any Exhibit entered into an Event must be disease free and in good health and condition.

#### 2.2 WARRANTY

The Exhibitor represents and warrants to Melbourne Royal that the information set out on the Entry Form is complete, accurate and not misleading in any way.

#### 2.3 RULES AND REGULATIONS

An entry is subject to the:

- (a) Regulations; and
- (b) Relevant Schedule.

#### 2.4 ENTRIES SUBJECT TO RULES AND REGULATIONS

Upon submission of an entry in accordance with Regulation 2, the Exhibitor agrees to be bound by the rules, regulations and conditions referred to in Regulation 2.2 and to ensure that each Agent of the Exhibitor complies with those rules, regulations and conditions. An act or omission of an Agent of an Exhibitor may be deemed by Melbourne Royal to be the act or omission of the Exhibitor.

#### 2.5 ALTERED ENTRIES

Subject to the discretion of Melbourne Royal an entry may not be altered after the Closing Date.

#### 2.6 NUMBER OF ENTRIES

Melbourne Royal may restrict the number of entries in any Event.

## 2.7 LIMIT ON ENTRY INTO MULTIPLE ORDINARY CLASSES

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, an Exhibit must not be entered in more than one Ordinary Class. Should any Exhibit be sought to be entered in more than one Ordinary Class, the Exhibit will only compete in the Ordinary Class in which the Exhibit's or the Exhibitor's name first appears in Melbourne Royal's Catalogue unless Melbourne Royal otherwise directs. For the purposes of this Regulation, Sweepstakes, Special Classes, Trophy Classes and Championships are not an Ordinary Class. 'Ordinary Class', 'Sweepstakes', 'Special Class', 'Trophy Class' and 'Championship' have the meaning given in the Relevant Schedule.



#### 3. ENTRY AND NOMINATION FEES

- 3.1 The entry fee and, if applicable, the nomination fee, become the property of Melbourne Royal on receipt by Melbourne Royal and, without limitation, the entry fee and, if applicable, nomination fee paid in respect of an entry which is withdrawn, or which does not satisfy the requirements for entry or conditions of eligibility will not be refunded.
- or a competition/awards program is cancelled due to COVID-19 health regulations or if state borders restrictions are enforced and the Exhibitor is unable attend the Show, Melbourne Royal will provide a full refund on entry fees, pre-purchased onsite accommodation fees (lockers and camping), showgrounds parking fees, showgrounds stabling/bedding fees and pre-ordered catalogues. Melbourne Royal will not be liable for any other costs incurred. Melbourne Royal will provide a pro-rata refund of fees in the event that Show days are cancelled due to COVID-19.

## 4. DOCUMENTS FOR PRESENTATION WHILST AT THE SHOWGROUNDS

Animal Registration papers, AAR microchip papers, show-jumping performance cards and birth certificates, or certified photocopies thereof, are not required to be submitted to Melbourne Royal or to accompany an Application for Entry. Such documentation will be required to be on hand whilst the Exhibitor and the Exhibits are on the Showground (if the Application for Entry specifies such documentation is required) and must be produced upon request for perusal by the Chief Steward or other Melbourne Royal authorised person. Failure to produce such documents if requested will result in the Exhibit being ineligible for the Event.

#### 5. OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

#### 5.1 OWNERSHIP ON ENTRY

At the time Melbourne Royal receives the Entry Form for entry to an Event; the Exhibit entered into that Event by the Exhibitor must be the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at that time.

#### 5.2 OWNERSHIP ON JUDGING

At the time of judging an Event, each Exhibit entered into that Event by an Exhibitor must be

the property of the Exhibitor or be held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at that time. An Exhibit which is not the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence at the time of judging will be ineligible for the Event.

#### 5.3 INELIGIBILITY FOR EVENT

An Exhibit which is not the property of the Exhibitor or held by the Exhibitor under a written lease in existence both at the time Melbourne Royal receives the Entry Form and at the time of judging will be ineligible for the Event.

#### 6. EXHIBITION OF EXHIBITS

#### 6.1 GROUNDS FOR NOT EXHIBITING AN ANIMAL

The Exhibitor must not withdraw an Exhibit from an Event, and an Exhibit must be exhibited, unless a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon is lodged with Melbourne Royal certifying that the Exhibit is unable to compete for one or more of the following reasons:

- (a) the Exhibit, being an animal, has died;
- (b) the Exhibit, being an animal, is unfit to be exhibited due to injury or disease;
- (c) the Exhibit is ineligible for the Event; or
- (d) some other cause Melbourne Royal considers reasonable.

#### 6.2 TIME FOR WITHDRAWING AN ANIMAL EXHIBIT

A certificate given under Regulation 6 must be given to Melbourne Royal:

- (a) before the date for admission of the Exhibit to the Showgrounds (as set out in the Relevant Schedule), if the cause for withdrawal of the Exhibit occurs or arises before that date; or
- (b) otherwise, as soon as possible after the cause for withdrawal of the Exhibit occurs or arises.

#### 6.3 TRAINING OR PREPARING EXHIBITS OR EXHIBITORS

Exhibitors must not enter into an Event that is to be judged by a person who has trained or prepared the Exhibitor or Exhibit within six months of the date of the Event.

#### 7. EXHIBIT TICKET

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, Melbourne Royal will issue an exhibit ticket for an Exhibit unless it otherwise determines. The Exhibitor or an Agent must produce the exhibit ticket upon a request from Melbourne Royal or a Steward.



#### 8. CONDUCT OF EXHIBITORS AND AGENTS

#### 8.1 COMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS

Where an Exhibit and/or Exhibitor and/or an Agent fail to comply with any of the Regulations, Melbourne Royal may impose one or more of the following penalties on the Exhibit or Exhibitor or both of them:

- (d) disqualification;
- (e) suspension;
- (f) a fine;
- (g) order the Exhibit or the Exhibitor, his or her family, invitees and Agents be removed from the Showgrounds; or
- (h) any other penalty.

Without limiting the above, Melbourne Royal may forfeit an award, and upon forfeiture, the Exhibitor must return any ribbon, money, prize card or other evidence of that award to Melbourne Royal within seven days after receiving notification of the forfeiture. Nothing in this Regulation limits Regulation 8.10.

#### 8.2 COMPLIANCE WITH DIRECTIONS

- (a) The Exhibitor and/or Agent must fully comply with the directions and requests of Melbourne Royal. Without limitation, directions and requests of Melbourne Royal may apply to the Exhibit, the Exhibitor, the Agent, the conditions of the Event, the conduct of the Exhibitor, the conduct of the Event, the conduct of the Agent, the decision of the Judge, or the award of prizes.
- (b) Without limiting Regulation 88.2, upon a request from Melbourne Royal, an Exhibitor and/or Agent must make a statutory declaration in the form and with respect to matters Melbourne Royal in its discretion requires.
- (c) Without limiting Regulation 88.2, upon a request from Melbourne Royal, an Exhibitor and/or Agent must submit his or her Exhibit for inspection by a Veterinary Surgeon.

#### 8.3 STATEMENTS

The Exhibitor and/or Agent must not make a statement regarding an Exhibit, which in the opinion of Melbourne Royal, is fraudulent, false, erroneous, misleading or deceptive or likely to mislead or deceive.

#### 8.4 TAMPERING

An Exhibit must not be or have been tampered with or otherwise improperly dealt with by an Exhibitor.

#### 8.5 UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR

Melbourne Royal is committed to providing a fair and equitable Venue for all participants, free from all forms of harassment, bullying and violence. The following behaviours will not be tolerated and may result in the event participant/Exhibitor being removed from the competition Venue and/or disqualified from the competition and formal procedures initiated:

- (a) violence;
- (b) bullying;
- (c) harassment;
- (d) sexual harassment;
- (e) unlawful discrimination;
- (f) victimisation.

Persons breaching acceptable standards of behaviour may be banned from entering future Melbourne Royal Events and/or the Venue.

#### 8.6 ANIMALS AND LIVESTOCK

Unless Melbourne Royal gives prior written approval, pets, animals or livestock other than Exhibits must not be brought onto or permitted to enter or remain on the Showgrounds.

#### 8.7 MUTUAL RECOGNITION

Melbourne Royal may recognise, act upon and enforce any penalty imposed by a Body on an Exhibit or Exhibitor or Agent at any time.

#### 8.8 FURTHER PROCEEDINGS

Melbourne Royal may conduct further proceedings in relation to any matter concerning an Exhibitor, an Exhibit, an Agent, a potential Exhibitor, or a potential Exhibit, and impose any suspension, fine, disqualification, withdrawal or forfeiture of an award, handicap, reprimand, warning or any other penalty, irrespective of whether a Body has already imposed a penalty on the Exhibitor or the Exhibit or Agent, or on the potential Exhibitor or the potential Exhibit.

#### 8.9 RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENTS

Melbourne Royal may enter into reciprocal arrangements with a Body in relation to any matter concerning an Exhibit, an Exhibitor, an Agent, a potential Exhibit or a potential Exhibitor.

#### 8.10 SMOKING

Melbourne Showgrounds is a completely smokefree venue (effective 1 September 2016). Exhibitors, staff, patrons and contractors wanting to smoke will need to exit the venue to do so.



## 9. POWERS OF MELBOURNE ROYAL IN RESPECT TO CONTROL OF THE EVENT

#### 9.1 POWER TO REFUSE TO ACCEPT AN ENTRY, EXHIBIT OR EXHIBITOR

Melbourne Royal may refuse to accept an entry for an Event, an Exhibit or an Exhibitor or any of them.

#### 9.2 POWER TO CANCEL OR ALTER

Melbourne Royal may:

- (a) alter the Closing Date for an Event, or the Closing Date for receipt of any particular entry;
- (b) remove any Exhibit from the Showgrounds or cause any Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds;
- (c) amend an entry for an Event to, without limitation, substitute an alternate competition or class for the competition or class in which the Exhibit is or was entered;
- (d) alter the conditions of any Event;
- (e) refuse to display an Exhibit;
- (f) rule that an Exhibit or Exhibitor may not compete or is ineligible to compete;
- (g) alter the date, time or place on or at which any Event is scheduled to take place or to be judged;
- (h) alter the Judge scheduled to judge any Event; or
- (i) cancel any Event.

The rights set out above apply notwithstanding:

- (a) Melbourne Royal's acceptance of an entry for an Event;
- (b) inclusion of an entry for an Event in the Event Catalogue;
- (c) the issue of an exhibit ticket to an Exhibitor or in respect of an Exhibit or an Event; or
- (d) the issue of any other document to an Exhibitor or in respect of an Exhibit or an Event.

#### 10. ILLNESS OF AN ANIMAL

#### 10.1 ANIMAL HEALTH STATUS

If the Exhibitor or any Agent of the Exhibitor detects or suspects any illness amongst any of their Exhibits whilst the Exhibits are at the Showgrounds, the Exhibitor must:

- (a) report this fact immediately to the representative of Melbourne Royal responsible for the applicable livestock section (the Superintendent);
- (b) ensure that the Exhibit(s) concerned is/ are contained within the space allocated by Melbourne Royal for the Exhibit(s), unless advised otherwise by the Superintendent or a member of Melbourne Royal veterinary panel on duty; and

(c) where feasible to do so, contain soiled bedding from the Exhibit(s) concerned within the space allocated by Melbourne Royal for the Exhibit(s).

The Exhibitor may engage or consult a private veterinary surgeon in respect to the illness only after the above action has been taken and only after first consulting with a member of Melbourne Royal veterinary panel on duty.

#### 10.2 TREATMENT UPON ILLNESS OR INJURY

If an Exhibit is ill or injured, a Veterinary Surgeon may in his or her discretion attend to or treat the Exhibit. The Veterinary Surgeon may do so even in the absence of authority from the Exhibitor, or contrary to that authority.

#### 10.3 DESTRUCTION OR REMOVAL

Where, in the opinion of a Veterinary Surgeon, an Exhibit should be destroyed or removed from the Showgrounds:

- (d) the Veterinary Surgeon or any other person approved by Melbourne Royal may destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds, or both: or
- (e) Melbourne Royal may require the Exhibitor to immediately destroy or remove the Exhibit from the Showgrounds or both.

All costs and expenses incurred by Melbourne Royal pursuant to this Regulation must be reimbursed by the Exhibitor to Melbourne Royal. Nothing in this Regulation limits Regulation 9.2.

#### 10.4 NECROPSY

If an Exhibit dies while at an Event, Melbourne Royal may require that a necropsy be conducted on the animal. The Exhibitor must allow for the immediate release of the body to Melbourne Royal if requested by Melbourne Royal.

#### 10.5 VETERINARY SURGEONS

Where an Exhibitor wishes to engage or consult a veterinary surgeon who is not appointed by Melbourne Royal, the Exhibitor must first inform the representative of Melbourne Royal responsible for the applicable livestock section. A Veterinary Surgeon, a Judge and Melbourne Royal itself is not required to have regard to or to consider any opinion of a veterinary surgeon so engaged or consulted by the Exhibitor, and a decision of a Veterinary Surgeon, a Judge or Melbourne Royal is final regardless of whether or not the Exhibitor has engaged or consulted a veterinary surgeon not appointed by Melbourne Royal.



#### 11. JUDGING

#### 11.1 INTERFERENCE

The Exhibitor and Agents of the Exhibitor must not consult, influence or interfere with a Judge or attempt to consult, influence or interfere with a Judge or do any other thing which may influence or interfere with the Judge's freedom of choice or judgment unless it is expressly authorised by the Relevant Schedule.

Unless with the permission of Melbourne Royal, no Exhibitor or Agent of an Exhibitor may occupy the position of Judge or become in any way identified with the judging or handling of Exhibits in any class in which that person or that person's employers, family members or associates are interested. This does not apply to Stewards.

#### 11.2 INDICATIONS OF OWNERSHIP

The Exhibitor, any Agent of the Exhibitor and the Exhibit must not be equipped with or wear or display anything indicating the ownership of the Exhibit before or during judgment of the Exhibit unless it is expressly authorised by the Relevant Schedule.

#### 11.3 DECISION

Except as otherwise expressly provided in the Regulations, the decision of a Judge as to the merits of the Exhibit and the Exhibitor or either of them will be final, and the Exhibitor may not protest or appeal the decision.

#### 11.4 PRIZES

Subject to the Relevant Schedule, a Judge may in his or her opinion:

- (a) award a second or third prize in place of a first prize:
- (b) withhold a prize where a prize should not be awarded;
- (c) where there is a tie for any placing in an Event, award subsequent placings so that the next placing will be the number of Exhibits already placed plus one (for example, if two Exhibits tie for first place, award a third for the next placing);
- (d) where all the prizes offered in an Event have been awarded and a further Exhibit is of sufficient merit to deserve a prize make a reserve number of the further Exhibit; or
- (e) give commendations where they are deserved.
- (f) award an Exhibitor more than one prize in any class where more than one entry is permitted.

#### 11.5 DISQUALIFICATIONS

Where an Exhibit or an Exhibitor is disqualified and the applicable award is forfeited, Melbourne Royal may (but is not obliged to) promote the Exhibit next in order to that prize, whether the Exhibit next in order was awarded a prize or a reserve number. Exhibits next in order, whether awarded a prize or reserve number, may also be promoted to the prize next in order.

#### 11.6 PRIZE CARDS

The Exhibitor must ensure that prize cards awarded for an Exhibit are displayed with the Exhibit while it is on exhibition.

## 11.7 JUDGING/STEWARDING COVID HEALTH REGULATIONS

Melbourne Royal will not reimburse any costs (accommodation, meals, loss of income etc) incurred by judges, stewards or other event participants due to enforced COVID-19 isolation and/or quarantine.

Please note, some judging positions may need to be changed without notification to Exhibitors. Melbourne Royal retains the right to fill a judging position at its own discretion in the event a judge is unable to participate for any reason, including COVID-19 or any travel related restrictions.

#### 12. PROTESTS AND APPEALS

#### 12.1 RESTRICTED TO CLASS

Protests and appeals may only be made by Exhibitors with Exhibits in the class to which the protest relates.

#### 12.2 PROTEST TO STEWARDS

The Exhibitor may protest to the Chief Steward of the relevant section in relation to conduct, judging or any other matter relating to an Event. A protest must be made in accordance with the procedures set out in the Relevant Schedule and be received by the Chief Steward within 24 hours after the conclusion of the applicable Event.

#### 12.3 APPEAL

The Exhibitor may appeal against:

- (a) a decision made by Melbourne Royal pursuant to Regulations; or
- (b) a decision of the Chief Steward or if the Chief Steward delegates the person to make the decision to the Assistant Chief Steward, the decision of the Assistant Chief Steward in relation to a protest under Regulation 12.



#### 12.4 FORM OF APPEAL

To be an appeal for the purpose of Regulation 12.2 an appeal made by the Exhibitor must be:

- (a) in writing setting out in reasonable detail the grounds for the appeal;
- (b) addressed to:
   The Chief Executive Officer
   Melbourne Royal Limited
   Melbourne Showgrounds
   Epsom Road, Ascot Vale, Victoria, 3032;
- (c) accompanied by a deposit of \$200.00 (or such other amount as is notified from time to time by Melbourne Royal for the purpose of this Regulation 12.3(c)); and
- (d) received by the Chief Executive Officer by 5 p.m. on the Business Day which is 10 Business Days after the day on which the decision the subject of the appeal was made.

#### 12.5 REVIEW COMMITTEE

If an appeal is made in accordance with Regulation 12.3, the Chief Executive Officer must appoint a Review Committee comprised of three people, being persons who were not part of, and who are independent of, the committee or personnel who made the decision the subject of the appeal.

Within a reasonable time after receipt by the Chief Executive Officer of an appeal complying with Regulation 12.3, the Review Committee will meet to consider the appeal.

#### 12.6 PROCEEDINGS OF THE REVIEW COMMITTEE

In considering an appeal, the Review Committee

- (a) give due consideration to the grounds of appeal submitted by the Exhibitor, and to any other evidence submitted by the Exhibitor;
- (b) give the Exhibitor an opportunity to make oral representations to the Review Committee; and
- (c) in its discretion, call for and hear expert opinion.

## 12.7 NOTIFICATION OF REVIEW COMMITTEE'S DECISION

The Chief Executive Officer will notify the Exhibitor of the Review Committee's decision within 48 hours after that decision is notified by the Review Committee to the Chief Executive Officer. The decision of the Review Committee is final and the Exhibitor will not have any right of appeal in respect of the Review Committee's decision.

#### 12.8 FORFEITURE OF DEPOSIT

Where an appeal is upheld by the Review Committee, the deposit referred to in Regulation 12.3 will be refunded to the Exhibitor when or within a reasonable time after the decision of the Review Committee is notified by the Chief Executive Officer to the Exhibitor. Where an appeal is not upheld by the Review Committee, the deposit referred to in Regulation 12.3 will be retained by Melbourne Royal.

#### 13. ACCOMMODATION

## 13.1 NO OBLIGATION TO PROVIDE EXHIBIT SPACE OR ACCOMMODATION

- (a) Melbourne Royal is not obliged to provide space for an Exhibit or accommodation for an Exhibitor or any Agent of an Exhibitor.
   For the purposes of these Regulations, "accommodation" includes provision of a space for a person to sleep.
- (b) Where Melbourne Royal, in its discretion, allocates space for an Exhibit or accommodation for an Exhibitor or any Agent of an Exhibitor, only the allocated areas may be used, and only for the purpose designated by Melbourne Royal.

#### 13.2 PERSONAL EFFECTS

Melbourne Royal has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage:

- (a) suffered by an Exhibitor or any Agent of an Exhibitor using space provided for an Exhibit or accommodation for an Exhibitor or any Agent of an Exhibitor; or
- (b) caused to personal belongings, equipment or property which is brought onto the Showgrounds by an Exhibitor or any Agent of an Exhibitor.

#### 14. FIRE REGULATIONS

#### 14.1 FLAMES

The Exhibitor and any Agent of the Exhibitor must not smoke, cook, or heat water by any means whatsoever or use any device involving naked flame in or near any animal pavilion, stall, pen or locker.



#### 14.2 ELECTRICAL INTERFERENCE

The Exhibitor and any Agent of the Exhibitor must not:

- (a) subject to Regulation 14.2, use mains powered electrical devices in or near any animal pavilion, stall, pen or locker or any Exhibit.
- (b) alter or interfere with any electrical wiring, switch, plug or socket whatsoever on the Showgrounds.

#### 14.3 EXCEPTIONS

Nothing in Regulation 14(a) prohibits the use of main powered electrical appliances which are, in the opinion of Melbourne Royal, essential to animal care, or the use of a light-bulb in a locker if the light-bulb is fitted in the socket provided.

#### 15. VEHICLE PARKING

#### 15.1 LOADING AND UNLOADING

With the prior consent of Melbourne Royal, Motor Vehicles of an Exhibitor or an Agent of an Exhibitor may enter the Showgrounds or any area under Melbourne Royal control, for the purpose of loading or unloading only. Motor Vehicles must not remain on the Showgrounds, or any area under Melbourne Royal control, and must be removed immediately upon completion of loading or unloading.

#### 15.2 CARAVANS

Caravans of an Exhibitor or an Agent of an Exhibitor must not enter or remain on the Showgrounds, or any area under Melbourne Royal control, for any purpose, unless in accordance with the prior written consent of Melbourne Royal.

#### **15.3 TOW AWAY**

Any Motor Vehicle or Caravan entering or remaining on the Showgrounds, or any area under Melbourne Royal control, in contravention of the Regulations or of any other parking rules or restrictions, may be removed from the Showgrounds, or any area under Melbourne Royal control, by Melbourne Royal and stored. Any costs incurred by Melbourne Royal pursuant to this Regulation must be paid by the Exhibitor.

#### 16. LIABILITY AND INDEMNITY

#### 16.1 RELEASE

Entry to, remaining on and using the Showgrounds or any part of them by an Exhibitor is entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor and, to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor releases Melbourne Royal (which term includes in this clause Melbourne Royal's officers, employees, members, contractors and agents), from all claims, demands and liabilities of every kind resulting from any accident, damage, injury or illness occurring at the Showgrounds and, without limitation, the Exhibitor acknowledges and agrees:

- (a) Melbourne Royal has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to or caused by any Exhibit;
- (b) Melbourne Royal has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness to or caused by any Exhibitor or any Agent;
- (c) Melbourne Royal has no responsibility or liability for any loss or damage to a Motor Vehicle or any of its contents whilst it is on the Showgrounds or in any car park under Melbourne Royal's control; and
- (d) without limiting Regulations 16(a) and 16(b) above, Melbourne Royal has no responsibility or liability for any loss, damage, injury or illness resulting from the sale, treatment, failure to treat, destruction, disposal or other dealing with any Exhibit, or for any loss, damage or injury to any personal belongings, equipment or property brought onto the Showgrounds by any person.

#### 16.2 INDEMNITY

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Exhibitor indemnifies and keeps indemnified Melbourne Royal and its officers, employees, members, contractors and agents from and against all actions, claims, demands, losses, damages, costs, expenses and liabilities including without limitation, consequential loss and loss of profits for which Melbourne Royal is or may be or become liable in respect of or arising from:

- (a) loss, damage, injury or illness to any person in connection with the Exhibit or the relevant Event;
- (b) without limiting Regulation 16(a), loss, damage, injury or illness to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor, or any Agent of any other Exhibitor, or to the property of Melbourne Royal, or its members, or to the general public, or any member of the general public, caused or contributed to or by any act or omission of an Exhibit of the Exhibitor or by the Exhibitor or any Agent of the Exhibitor; and



(c) without limiting Regulation 16(a), loss, damage, injury or illness to the Exhibit, or to the Exhibitor or any Agent of any other Exhibitor caused or contributed to by an act or omission of an Exhibit or by the transportation, feeding, housing or exhibiting of an Exhibit.

#### 16.3 REMOVAL FROM SHOWGROUNDS

Without prejudice to any other provision in these Regulations, where Melbourne Royal, its officers, employees, members, contractors or agents removes an Exhibit, or causes an Exhibit to be removed from the Showgrounds, the Exhibit is removed or caused to be removed entirely at the risk of the Exhibitor. The person or persons removing the Exhibit will be deemed to be the agent of the Exhibitor, and his or her acts and omissions will be deemed to be the acts and omissions of the Exhibitor.

## 17. ANIMAL OWNER'S LIABILITY INSURANCE

Melbourne Royal may arrange owner's liability insurance cover for Exhibitors of Exhibits that are animals, and, if Melbourne Royal does so, the Exhibitor is bound by the terms and conditions of this insurance and by applicable duties of an insured under the Insurance Contracts Act (1984). Details of owner's liability insurance cover arranged by Melbourne Royal are set out in the Relevant Schedule.

#### 18. INFORMATION HANDLING

Melbourne Royal is bound by the National Privacy Principles of the **Privacy Act 1988** (Cth) and other applicable laws governing privacy.

#### 18.1 COLLECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

- (a) Melbourne Royal may collect, hold and use personal information about Exhibitors, their family members, invitees or Agents.
- (b) The types of information that may be collected include names and contact details, credit card details, qualifications, results of the Exhibitor's entry into the relevant Event and any reprimand, fine, disqualification, withdrawal of an award or penalty imposed on the Exhibitor in connection with entry of the Exhibit in the relevant Event. Information may also be collected from other Bodies relating to the Exhibitor's entry into events held by that Body including, without limitation, reprimands, fines, disqualifications, withdrawals of awards or penalties imposed.

- (c) Personal information is collected for the purpose of administration of Events and the Show, as well as related purposes including, without limitation, promoting the Events and the Show, maintenance of records of information relevant to qualifications for future events, maintenance of health and safety records in relation to Events, applicable insurance cover for Events and making claims under Melbourne Royal's insurance for incidents which involve an Exhibitor and occur during an Event.
- (d) Personal information may also be used for the purpose of informing Exhibitors about other events and services. Melbourne Royal may send an Exhibitor publications and information about other events and services unless the exhibitor indicates to Melbourne Royal that the Exhibitor does not want to receive such publications or information.

#### 18.2 SHARING OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

- (a) Melbourne Royal may share information which has been collected by Melbourne Royal under Regulation 18.1 with other organisations and service providers to assist in administering the Events and the Show, including co-sponsors of Events and health service providers, indemnity or insurance providers or other Bodies, or any entity that may subsequently administer the Event
- (b) Melbourne Royal may also publish winners details on its websites or publications or disclose information about an Exhibitor to the media for the purpose of publishing articles on the Exhibitor's participation in the Event, unless the Exhibitor has requested that the Exhibitor's personal information not be published or disclosed for these purposes.
- (c) Melbourne Royal may also disclose information if otherwise required or authorised by law.

#### 19. COVID SAFE SHOW

Melbourne Royal will work closely with DHHS to ensure that the Melbourne Royal Show is compliant with all COVID Safe requirements as directed by Government and to optimise the safety for all patrons, Exhibitors, staff and competitors.
