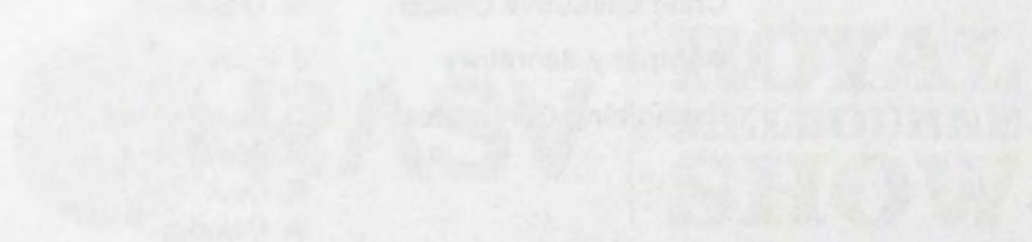

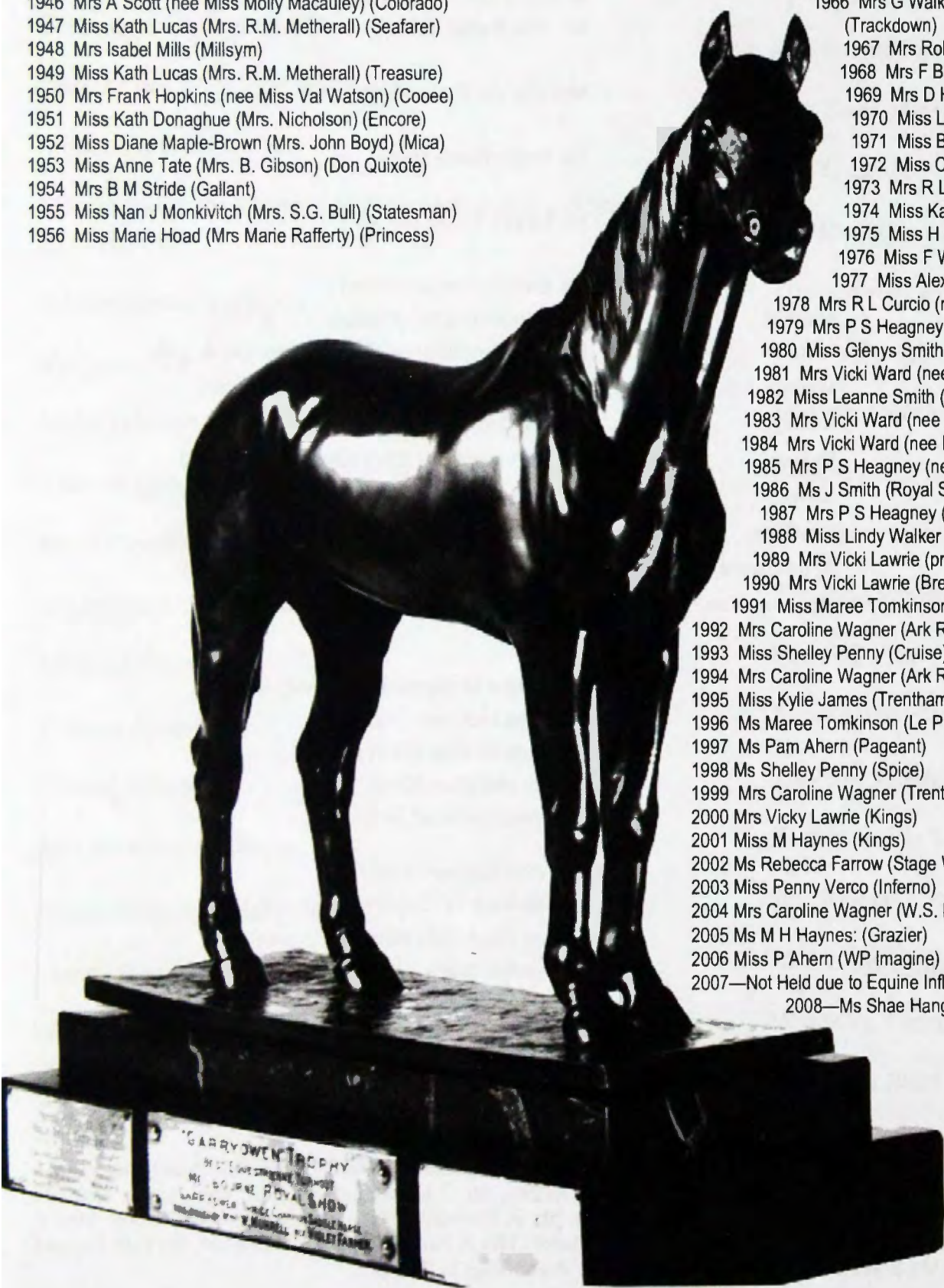

For URGENT veterinary cases out of hours, contact the EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT CENTRE (Ph: 03 9281 7400) who will contact the on-call veterinarian.

Exhibitors are required to pay accounts issued by members of the panel. The service provided and the fee are matters for negotiation between the exhibitor and the veterinarian concerned. The Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria Limited will not act as an arbitrator. A substantial fee applies for all after hours veterinary services. Due to limited resources, major surgery cannot be carried out on the Showgrounds, duty veterinarians can only provide first aid and treat medical conditions which do not require surgery.



SCHEDULE OF CLASSES, PRIZES AND RULES APPLICABLE TO HORSES IN ACTION CLASSES

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

101. The rules appearing in this Schedule form part of the regulations and conditions of entry to an Event at the Show. In the event of any inconsistency between the Regulations and these rules, the Regulations shall prevail to the extent of the inconsistency unless the Regulations provide otherwise.

102. Notwithstanding General Regulation 2.7 Exhibits in this section may be entered in any class or classes for which they are eligible.

STABLING

103. Exhibitors must be prepared to stable Exhibits for the entire period as set out in the Timetable. Exhibits shall be placed where directed by the RASV and where a stable is allotted the Exhibit shall be in occupation of such stable in accordance with instructions to be issued by the RASV.

A stabling fee will apply for each Exhibit entered and the Exhibitor will be billed according to allocations. A straw bedding fee of \$25 (incl. GST) per stable will apply. A stable bond of \$25 per stable will apply, to be refunded **ONLY** after the box is considered to be clean by the Superintendent prior to departure. **These monies must be collected at the Horse Superintendent's Office prior to departure. Failure to collect bond at time of departure will result in forfeiture of bond.** Please ensure you bring suitable equipment for mucking out and transport of waste to bins.

Exhibitors are not permitted to bring any bedding onto Showgrounds for biosecurity reasons. No arrivals or departures will be accepted outside stated times.

104. An Exhibitor and/or person in charge of an Exhibit shall only stable a horse in a stable as directed by the RASV. Any Exhibitor and/or Agent of an Exhibit who fails to observe any such direction shall be guilty of a breach of the RASV's Regulations and may be dealt with accordingly.

The RASV shall also be entitled to move or direct the removal from the Showgrounds of any Exhibit which is stabled contrary to the direction of the RASV.

105. No Exhibitor, or Agent of an Exhibit, or other person, shall enter the stable of another Exhibitor without the authority of such Exhibitor or the person in charge of an Exhibit. Any Exhibitor, person in charge of an Exhibit, or other person who enters a stable without the authority above mentioned shall be guilty of a breach of the RASV.

STANDARD OF EXHIBITS

106. Unless otherwise specified all animals competing in section 1 shall be entire. Female animals competing in Section 1 shall not be speyed. In this regard the decision of a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the RASV shall be final and shall not be open to question in any proceeding.

107. Exhibits which in the opinion of the RASV are not in reasonable show condition or standard shall not compete in the classes entered for and may at the direction of the RASV be removed from the Showgrounds without refund of entry fee.

108. Exhibitors should note that the General Regulations contain a number of provisions relevant to the Exhibition of horses and this Schedule including, without limitation, veterinary inspections, the health of Exhibits, offences, penalties and appeals. As those conditions apply in addition to the foregoing conditions, Exhibitors should make themselves familiar with their terms.

109. An Exhibitor who detects or suspects any illness amongst any of his/her entries whilst the animals are at the Showgrounds must:

- (i) Report this fact immediately to the Horse Superintendent.
- (ii) Ensure that the animal/s is/are contained within its/their accommodation area/s unless advised otherwise by the Horse Superintendent or a member of the RASV veterinary panel on duty.
- (iii) Where feasible to do so, contain soiled bedding from the animal/s within its/their accommodation area.

The Exhibitor may consult a private veterinary surgeon in respect to the illness only after the above action has been taken.

PERFORMANCES

110. Unless otherwise specified, all entries for horses, ponies or riders should be accompanied by performance details. Space is available on the entry form for the purpose of conveying the information required. The information to be furnished is:

- (a) Name of horse, pony or rider (a separate section is to be completed for each Exhibit);
- (b) Age of horse or pony (state if known the day, month and year of foaling);
- (c) Registration number and Society or Organisation with whom registered.
- (d) Details of prizes gained by the horse or pony nominated including Name and Date of Show and Prizes awarded such as first, second or third, etc. (If a horse or pony was Exhibited without gaining a prize, such is to be stated);
- (e) Remarks (Briefly state the nature of the class in which the Exhibit was entered and/or gained prizes. The approximate number of Exhibits in such class is to be given).
- (f) Name of Exhibitor at time of Show;

111. (a) Exhibitors are to provide **all** relevant qualifications for the Saddle Section. Qualifications that will primarily be considered are:

- 1st - 6th placing Capital City Royal Shows
- 1st & 2nd places at affiliated Agricultural Shows
- Barastoc Horse Of The Year and VAS Saddle Horse
- Championship top 10 finalists
- Championships won at any of the above shows

(b) Performances for Saddle Horse, Galloway and Pony Classes should be gained in Open Saddle Classes. The following classes will **NOT** count as qualifying performances:

- Pony Club events
- Maiden Classes
- Novice Classes
- Hack Classes restricted by breed, colour, age or district
- Pleasure or Educated Classes
- Riding and Turnout Classes (for Hack Classes)
- Consolation Classes
- Pairs and Team Classes
- Lady's and Gent's Classes
- Elementary and Intermediate Classes
- Any other Restricted Classes

NOTE: At Shows where more than one ring is conducted, results from only one ring will be accepted. Only performances gained within the 12 months preceding the close of entries will be considered.

In Victoria, only agricultural shows affiliated with Victorian Agricultural Shows Limited will be considered affiliated agricultural shows.

ANY EXHIBITOR FOUND TO HAVE SUPPLIED INCORRECT PERFORMANCE DETAILS ON THEIR ENTRY FORM WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.



(c) The RASV will conduct performance checks on a random sampling basis, or any such basis that the RASV may determine at its sole discretion. If the performance details are found to be incorrect this will result in the disqualification of the entry and possibly the owner of the entry. Depending on the significance of the error, a penalty may be imposed up to five (5) penalty units, currently set at \$100 per unit. In addition, the owner of the entry may be disqualified for a period of up to two (2) years from the date of disqualification.

(d) All winners of competitions will be subject to performance checks, in which case should an entry be disqualified for any reason the award made will be withdrawn and the appropriate penalty, as described in paragraph (c), imposed.

(e) **No appeals for unsuccessful entries will be accepted.**

MINIMUM PERFORMANCES

Exhibitors to provide all relevant performances.

112 (a) SADDLE SECTION

(i) Hack, Galloway and Pony Classes - three first placings in Open Saddle Classes at affiliated Agricultural Shows. Placings 1st to 6th in any saddle class at a Capital City Royal Show in the current season will be recognized as a first placing. Barastoc Horse Of The Year Top 10 placings and Victorian Agricultural Shows (VAS) Saddle Horse Championship Top 10 placings will be considered.

(ii) Show Hunters - three first placings in either Show Hunter or Open Saddle Classes at affiliated Agricultural Shows. At least one of the three wins must be from a Show Hunter class. Placings 1st to 6th in any saddle class at a Capital City Royal Show in the current season will be recognized as a first placing. Barastoc Horse Of The Year Top 10 placings and Victorian Agricultural Shows (VAS) Saddle Horse Championship Top 10 placings will be considered.

(iii) Shetlands - two first placings in either Shetland or Open saddle classes at affiliated Agricultural Shows in the current season. Placings 1st to 6th in any saddle class at a Capital City Royal Show will be recognized as a first placing. Barastoc Horse Of The Year Top 10 placings and Victorian Agricultural Shows (VAS) Saddle Horse Championship Top 10 placings will be considered.

(b) HARNESS SECTION - Exhibits must have exhibited successfully at an affiliated Agricultural Show, Harness Show or Capital City Royal Show.

(c) RIDING COMPETITIONS - One first placing must be achieved at an affiliated Agricultural Show or Capital City Royal Show. Please note regulation 140.

(d) HUNTING SECTION - Hunt Club Master to nominate qualified riders.

NOTE: From the information supplied the RASV will determine which entries are to be accepted. The RASV may, at its discretion, refuse to accept an entry, an Exhibit or an Exhibitor even if Minimum Performance requirements are met.

AGE OF EXHIBITS

113. The breeding year commences on 1st August in each year.

HEIGHT OF EXHIBITS

114. The RASV's duly appointed measurer will be in attendance on the Showgrounds at times determined by the RASV. Where height is stipulated the Exhibit must be measured by the RASV measurer unless otherwise stated by the RASV.

115. All horses and ponies must be correctly bitted when being presented to the measurer.

116. An Exhibit over or under the specified measurement shall be transferred to its appropriate class.

117. When measuring an Exhibit an allowance of 3/8" for shoes may be made by the measurer. Should an Exhibit be measured with its shoes on the Exhibitor may if he so desires have the horse re-measured without shoes. The measurer may at his discretion request the removal of shoes from any Exhibit and re-measure the horse without shoes. No allowance will be made for grass tips.

118. Should the RASV have appointed more than one measurer then an Exhibit having been measured and its height recorded by one of such measurers shall not be submitted for measurement or re-measurement to one of the other measurers.

119. The judge of a class may request any Exhibit to be re-measured in which case the Exhibit shall be re-measured in the presence of the Chief Steward and the Chief Operating Officer or his representative whilst the judging of the class is suspended.

120. An Exhibitor may request their Exhibit be re-measured by applying (on a form available from the measurer) to the Chief Steward within one hour of the original measurement. The Exhibit will be re-measured in the presence of the Chief Steward and the Chief Operating Officer or his representative.

NUMBERS

121. Numbers corresponding to the numbers appearing in the Catalogue must be worn by each Exhibit or competitor when exercising on the Main Arena or designated Exercise Area, Marshalling Area or whilst being judged.

Exhibit numbers for horses must be collected from the Horse Superintendent's office. **THESE NUMBERS MUST BE TIED AROUND THE NECK OF THE HORSE OR WAIST OF HANDLER SO THAT THE NUMBER IS CLEARLY VISIBLE TO ALL OFFICIALS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC.**

CLEANING

122. Exhibitors shall, to the satisfaction of the RASV:

(a) Keep each stable allotted to them and their stock in a clean and proper condition throughout the Show.

(b) NOT DEPOSIT STRAW OR MANURE IN A PUBLIC AREA.

EXHIBITORS FOUND TO BE CONTRAVENING THE ABOVE WILL BE SUBJECT TO A \$25 PENALTY.

Exhibitors are not permitted to stack feed in the laneways between or around the stables.

(c) **All Exhibitors MUST COMPLETELY clean out stables used by their Exhibits and have these checked by the Superintendent prior to departure. FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF \$25 STABLE BOND AND MAY RESULT IN NON-ALLOCATION OF STABLES AT ANY SUBSEQUENT SHOW.**

TESTS AND SWABBING

123. (a) The RASV may make or cause to be made any test of any Exhibit to determine whether any Drug or Stimulant has been administered to the Exhibit and may take possession of any such Exhibit for any of the aforesaid purposes and detain such Exhibit for such period as is deemed necessary by the RASV.

(b) Drug means any substance capable of affecting the performance or behavior of an Exhibit by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the muscular-skeletal system, or the urogenital system including without limitation, analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillisers and vitamins.

(c) The Exhibit, the Exhibitor, the owner of the Exhibit and any other person who the RASV deems to be in charge of the Exhibit, will be liable to a penalty referred to in Regulation 7.1 of the General Regulations if the Exhibit is on the Showgrounds and is found to have had any Drug administered to it.

(d) It is no defence for a person prosecuted for this offence to plead that they were unaware that a Drug had been administered to the Exhibit. It is the sole responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that his / her Exhibit is Drug free whilst on the Showgrounds.

(e) A person who administers, causes to be administered or is involved in the administration of a Drug to an Exhibit or who has in the person's possession custody or control any electric or galvanic apparatus or improper contrivance will be liable to a penalty referred to in Regulation 7.1 of the General Regulations.

Procedures for the testing of Drugs will involve both "random" and "spot" tests on Exhibits. At the discretion of the RASV there will be blood testing of Exhibits prior to competing and/or blood and urine testing at the end of the competition.

(f) The RASV may make or cause to be made, any test of any Exhibit at any time, before, during or after competition.

Where Exhibits are tested for Prohibited Substances, the Exhibitor or Agent will be required to sign sample labels and sample identity cards relating to any samples taken from the Exhibits. Where the Exhibitor or Agent refuses to sign the sample labels and/or sample identity cards, the Exhibitor and/or Agent and/or the Exhibit shall be automatically disqualified.

(g) Competitors should be aware that particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser Drugs but analysis for all classes of Drugs will be included. The collection of samples may include taking blood from the jugular vein, urine collection and the collection of saliva.

The RASV may also select any Exhibit for examination for desensitized limbs. Any Exhibit found to have a limb or part of a limb desensitized by any means will be deemed to have competed under the influence of a Drug and penalised accordingly.

(h) An obligatory "Drug Testing and Enforcement Levy" is payable for each Exhibit.

The levy has been set at \$10.00 per Exhibitor for the 2009 Royal Melbourne Show.

TINTING OF COAT

124. Should the RASV be of the opinion that the coat of any Exhibit has been tinted in any way, the Exhibitor may be dealt with in accordance with the applicable Regulations.

ARTIFICIAL AIDS - SHETLANDS

125. No Shetland pony entered at the Show may use 'Artificial Aids' i.e. no head checks, tail sets or weighted shoes.

MARSHALLING AND JUDGING

126. Exhibits and/or Exhibitors entered in events shall be present in the designated Marshalling Area at least 10 minutes prior to the time specified as the starting time for the event in the timetable and shall be ready to move to the judging ring under direction of the Marshal. The Exhibits and/or Exhibitors not so presented shall not be permitted to enter the arena or to take part in the event.

Exhibits **MUST** be moved at a walk on any part of the Showgrounds other than the Main Arena or designated Exercise Areas.

All Exhibits must tie up and behave in an educated manner. Exhibits or riders behaving in a manner which could be dangerous to the public will be directed to leave the Showgrounds.

PRIZES

127. Prizes are awarded at the discretion of the judge and entry in a class does not guarantee a place.

EQUIPMENT

128. No spurs, other than dummy spurs not exceeding 20mm in length, may be used.

Whips shall not exceed 77cm in total length. The length should include the flap but exclude the keeper.

129. **ALL RIDERS** must wear approved safety helmets to the current Australian, European or American Standard, whilst competing and exercising. **NO OTHER HEAD GEAR WILL BE PERMITTED.** The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times.

SUITABILITY OF ATTIRE

130. Riders, drivers and contestants must be suitably attired. A rider, driver or contestant not suitably attired shall be precluded by the RASV from competing in an event. Riders, drivers and contestants shall wear at all times in the Arena whether during parades or otherwise, the same or similar attire as is worn in the judging ring in which they or the animals of which they are in charge were Exhibited. All attendants of led horses shall wear white coats or same or similar attire as is worn in the Arena during Horse Parades.

COMPETENCE OF COMPETITORS

131. The Chief Steward may at any time require a person who does not appear to be able to ride or handle any horse to dismount, allow other persons to handle the horse, or leave the ring.

LOCKERS

132. Lockers are available for Exhibitors at a fee of \$40 per night (incl. GST) during Show for the period of occupancy. **Note: A \$20 key locker deposit is payable per locker. These monies must be collected at the Horse Superintendent's Office prior to departure. Failure to collect bond at time of departure will result in forfeiture of bond.**

Lockers must be vacated and all gear removed as soon as possible but in any case not later than end of departure times for the applicable group, or such earlier time advised by the Horse Superintendent.

PARADES

133. There is one Harness Parade, one Clydesdale Parade and one Horse Parade during the Show. Exhibitors will be provided with numbered Parade Tickets in their Exhibitor package. Exhibitors **MUST** present one ticket per parade only. Exhibitors failing to parade all Exhibits will be fined \$50. Exhibitors must pay the penalty before they can exhibit in further classes.

Exemptions to parade can be applied for the Horse Superintendent's Office. Application for an exemption to parade doesn't guarantee approval of the exemption.

RESULTS

134. Where official RASV Score Cards are provided for recording of results, where possible, results will be made available as follows:

(a) Show jumping Classes - all exhibitors results shall be posted in the Horse Superintendent's Office.

(b) Hunting Classes and Turnout Classes - all exhibitors shall receive their own results and those of the winning exhibitor. Results can be collected from the Horse Superintendent's Office.

EXERCISING

135. (a) Exhibits may only be exercised in exercise areas provided. They shall not exercise on any other part of the Showgrounds.

(b) **ALL** riders must wear approved safety helmets to the current Australian, European or American Standard at all times when exercising, be it on the Main Arena track or in designated exercise areas. The retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times.

(c) **The exercise arena shall be under the direction of the Horse Superintendent, RASV Staff and directional signs. Failure to comply with directions may result in elimination of the offending Exhibitor.**

(d) **Exhibits MUST wear their neck number when exercising on the Main Arena, designated Exercise Area or Marshalling Area.**

TIMETABLE OF JUDGING

136. The RASV accepts no responsibility if judging times conflict with one or more Classes or events in which an Exhibitor may be entered. Where conflict does occur, it is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to notify a withdrawal from either event.

OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBIT

137. (a) Subject to (b), as at the Closing Date the Exhibitor must be the legal Owner of each horse referred to in the Entry Form.

(b) If the Exhibitor sells an Exhibit subsequent to the lodgement date of the Entry Form they MUST notify the RASV in writing of such sale no later than 14 days prior to the date of Exhibition, the RASV may, if requested in writing by the purchaser, but in its absolute discretion, amend the Entry Form by endorsing thereon the name of the purchaser as the Exhibitor of that Exhibit, and thereupon the purchaser is for all purposes deemed to be the Exhibitor and to be bound by the Regulations of the RASV. A fee of \$20 is payable on lodgment of the notification.

HORSE AMBULANCE

138. The RASV's horse ambulance is used exclusively for Main Arena emergencies.

ENTRY FORMS

139. (a) It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that Entry Forms are complete, true and accurate at the time of submission.

(b) A fee of \$20 (incl. GST) will be levied upon every incorrect or incomplete Entry Form that is required to be returned to the Exhibitor for completion.

(c) It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that all performance requirements are met and are relevant to the event entered.

(d) Upon receipt of entries, the RASV reserves the right to charge an administration fee for late withdrawals.

RIDING COMPETITORS

140. Riding competitors must ride an Exhibit that is entered and accepted in a saddle class. The Exhibit must be stabled on the Showgrounds on the same date the riding competition is held.

PROTESTS

141. A protest must be made to the Chief Steward in writing and accompanied by a \$50 deposit. Protests must be made within 24 hours of the later of the Show's commencement or the commencement of the applicable event.

Please Note:

At the 2009 Royal Melbourne Show all riding exhibitors must ride horses entered and accepted in the Saddle Section of the Show.

There will be no day exhibitors at the 2009 Show.

SECTION 1 - CLYDESDALES

AN EXHIBIT MAY ONLY BE ENTERED IN ONE ORDINARY CLASS (FOR WHICH IT IS ELIGIBLE BY AGE) IN THIS SECTION AND AS MANY SPECIAL CLASSES IN WHICH IT IS ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE.

AN EXHIBITOR IN AN ORDINARY CLASS MAY ENTER NOT MORE THAN THREE EXHIBITS IN SUCH CLASS OF WHICH ONLY TWO MAY BE SHOWN. NO REFUND OF THE ENTRY FEE OR NOMINATION FEE WILL BE MADE IN RESPECT OF THE EXHIBIT ENTERED BUT NOT SHOWN.

AN EXHIBIT CANNOT BE ENTERED IN A SPECIAL CLASS UNLESS IT HAS BEEN ENTERED IN AN ORDINARY CLASS.

AN EXHIBIT MUST COMPETE AND QUALIFY IN AN ORDINARY CLASS BEFORE BECOMING ELIGIBLE FOR CHAMPION PRIZES. MARES OR GELDINGS ENTERED IN THIS SECTION ARE ELIGIBLE FOR EXHIBITION IN SECTION 2 (HARNESS CLYDESDALES) UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.

THERE ARE NO PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITS ENTERED IN THIS SECTION BUT EXHIBITS WILL BE SUBJECT TO REGULATION 107.

EXHIBITS ENTERED IN THIS SECTION MUST BE FULLY REGISTERED AS CLYDESDALES IN THE COMMONWEALTH CLYDESDALE STUD BOOK, OR OTHER APPROVED STUD BOOK PUBLISHED OUTSIDE THE COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA.

EXHIBITORS MUST BE CURRENT FINANCIAL MEMBERS OF THE COMMONWEALTH CLYDESDALE HORSE SOCIETY. FOR PARTICULARS OF REGISTRATION IN THE COMMONWEALTH CLYDESDALE STUD BOOK, APPLY TO THE SECRETARY, COMMONWEALTH CLYDESDALE HORSE SOCIETY, PO BOX 109, BENDIGO, VICTORIA, 3550. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE PARADED (REFER TO REGULATION 134).
